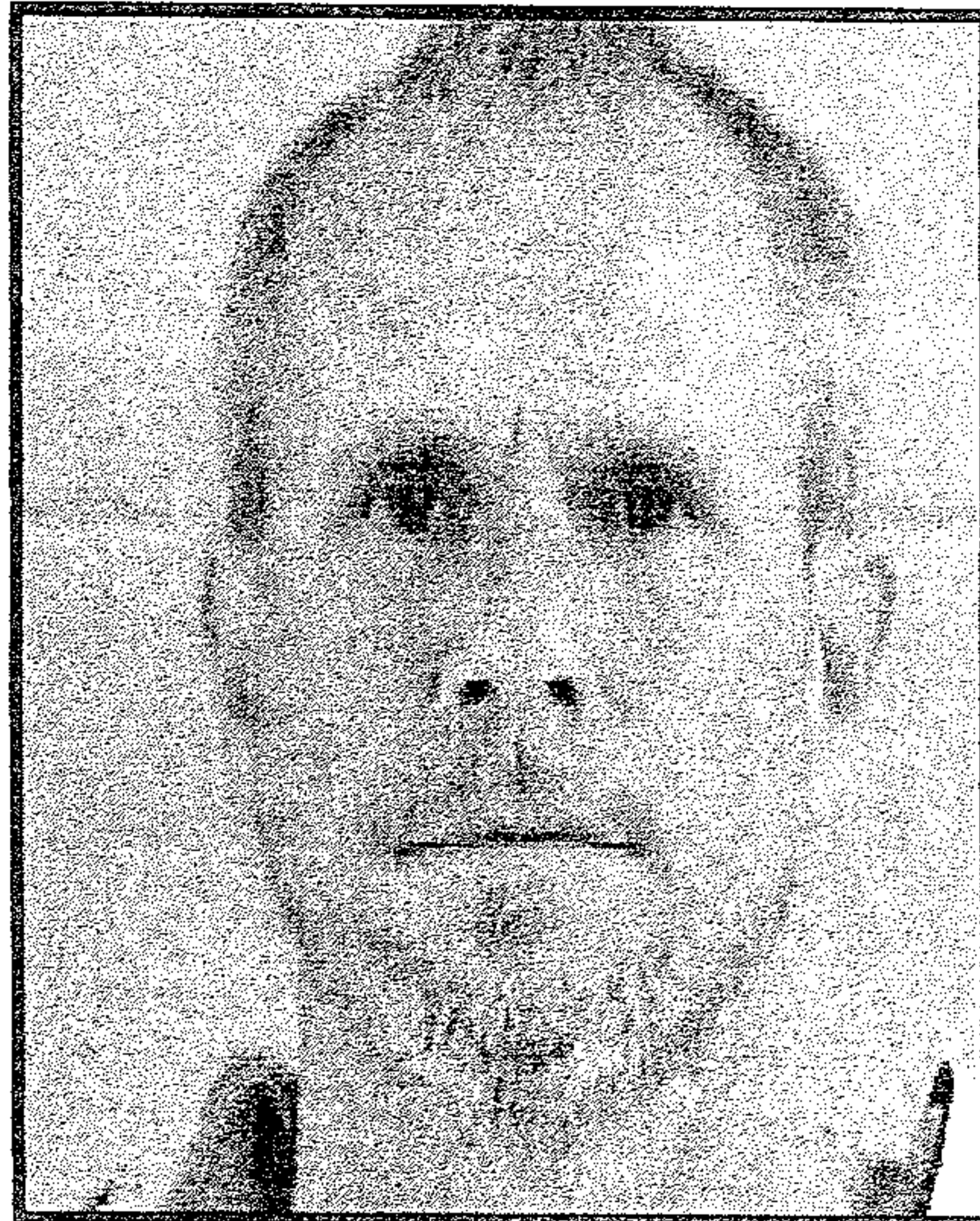

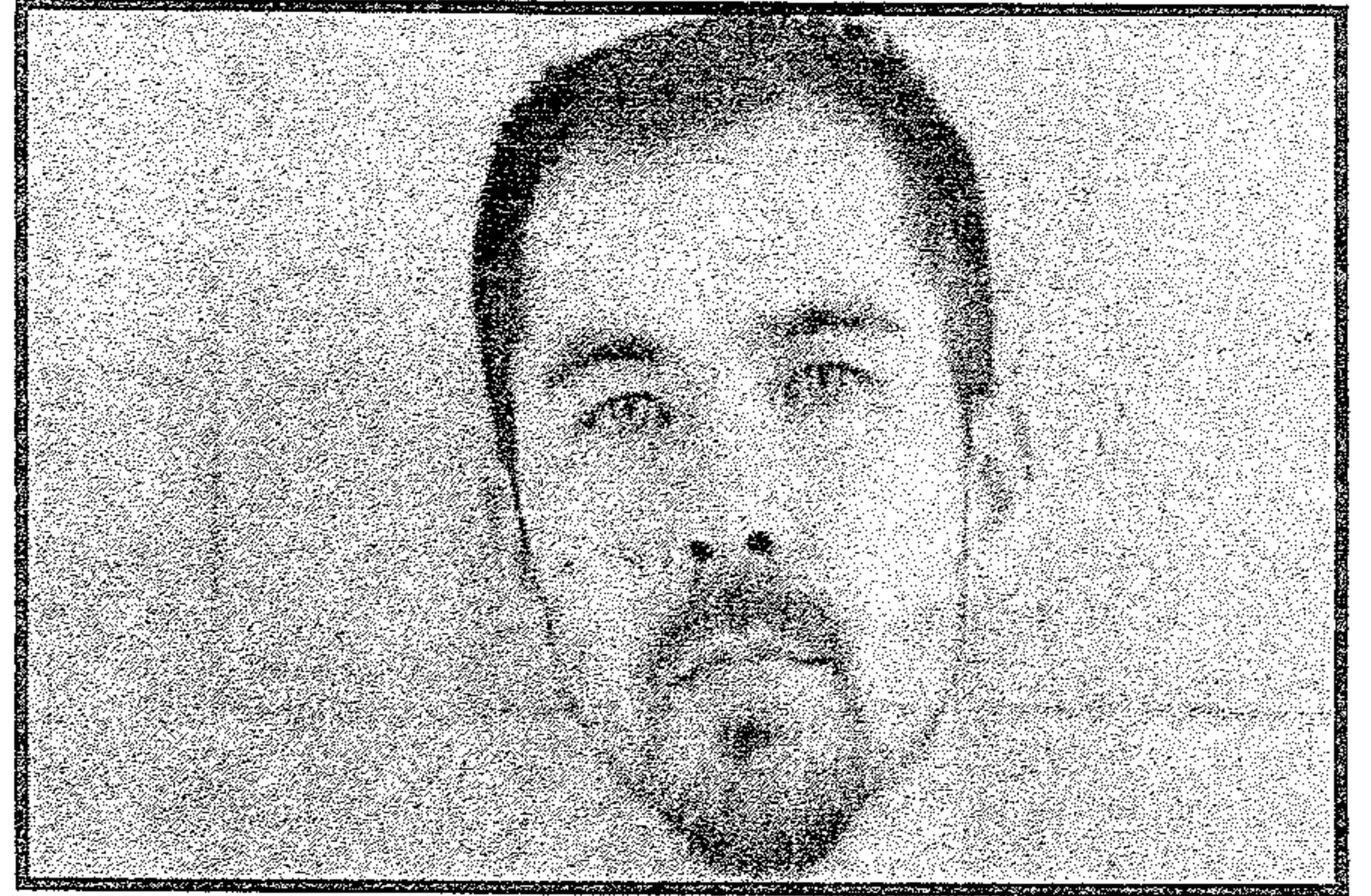

Asking for Help in Identifying Unknown Suspects

Back in December 2012, the FBI launched its Bank Robbers website featuring a gallery of unknown bank robbery suspects wanted by the Bureau. Because the FBI, in its own bank robbery investigations, focuses on the most violent and/or the most prolific serial offenders who often cross jurisdictions, the suspects included on BankRobbers.fbi.gov are a dangerous lot

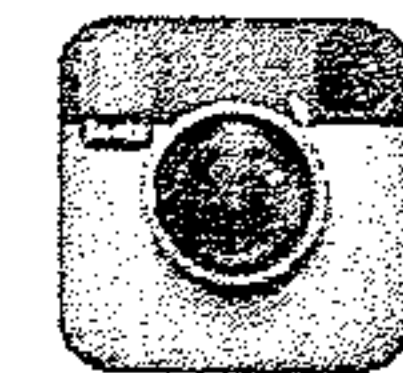


Brent Snyder, 33, Caldwell Road Loudon, was charged with Theft of Property.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, responded to Watson road for a past Burglary to a residence. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with the victim, who stated that sometime Between 5:45am and 4:30pm someone entered his residence and stole several firearms and a lot of ammo from various locations in his home. Subject stated that the total loss for the firearms was 2750.00 dollars and total loss of ammo to be around 1000.00.


Victim stated that there was several prescriptions that where in plain view but where not taken. Victim advised that he had a pair of Merrell

shoes and a camo hunting jacket taken also. Deputy did not observe any forced entry and victim stated that he never locks his residence. Victim stated that on the inside frame of the Smith and Wesson .38 special he had engraved the last four of his social security number. Victim stated that he had spoke with a Neighbor who stated that they did see a primer Dodge pickup 4x4 sitting along the road for a long period of time earlier in the day. 

and public assistance in identifying them plays a crucial role in our efforts to apprehend them.

Today, we're enhancing our efforts to publicize these dangerous criminals by launching our mobile Bank Robbers application for iPhones (plus iPads and iPods) and Android smartphones, which should make it even easier for the public—as well as financial institutions, law enforcement agencies, and others—to view photos and information about bank robberies in different geographic areas of the country. The app, which works with BankRobbers.fbi.gov, can be downloaded for free from Apple's app store or Google Play.

Using the app, bank robberies can be sorted by the date they occurred, the category they fall under (i.e., armed serial bank robber), the FBI field office working the case, or the state where the robbery occurred. If

the location services on your device are enabled, you can view a map that shows the relevant bank robberies that took place in your geographic area. You also access surveillance photos, physical description information, robbery details, and the FBI's wanted poster for each suspect. Users can also select push notifications to be informed when a bank robbery has taken place near their location.

The app also provides quick access to a link directly to the FBI online tips page so users can contact us immediately if they have information on any of the robberies or suspects.

Some of the unknown bank robbers currently being sought by the FBI include the following:

A suspect, wanted for nine bank robberies in Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia, displayed at various times handguns and even a sawed-off shotgun during eight of those robberies.

Another suspect, wanted in connection with 11 bank robberies in Pennsylvania, either carried or wore a semi-automatic handgun while verbally demanding money. Details

In California, a suspect who reportedly wears various disguises has committed four robberies at California banks while displaying a handgun. Details

And in Phoenix, this subject entered a bank, pushed an elderly woman out of his way, and pointed a handgun at bank employees and customers demanding money. Details

"Our new Bank Robbers mobile app is another tool we can

use to help mitigate ... suspects who pose the greatest safety threats to the public." Gregory Adams, FBI Violent Crimes Unit

According to the FBI's bank crime statistics for 2015, there were 4,091 robberies, burglaries, and larcenies committed under the federal bank robbery statute in a variety of financial institutions—including commercial banks, savings and loan associations, credit unions, and armored carrier companies. Demand

notes were a favorite tool used by bank robbers (2,416 times), but actual firearms were used 877 times, the threat of weapons was used 1,762 times, and explosive devices used or threatened occurred 108 times.

furnish substantial assistance in the commission of the felony by informing the co-defendant where the victim would be. Sgt. Lynette Ladd LCPD, made the arrest.

Man sentenced to 30 years in Federal Prison for drug trafficking, firearm and witness intimidation

On Aug. 19, 2016,

Gregory Harold Moore (Moore), 47, of Surgoinsville, Tenn., was sentenced by the Honorable R. Leon Jordan, U.S. District Court Judge, to serve 360 months in federal prison following his convictions for conspiracies to distribute methamphetamine, hydrocodone, oxycodone and oxymorphone, as well as conspiracy to threaten bodily injury to a person in retaliation for suspected cooperation with law enforcement and engaging in intimidating and threatening conduct with the intent to influence or prevent testimony in an official proceeding and possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking offense.

According to his plea agreement on file with U.S. District Court, Moore admitted that between May 2015 and August 2015 he sold an approximate total of two ounces of methamphetamine, spread out over four separate occasions, to an individual working with law enforcement. In August 2015, Moore told this individual that he could provide him/her with three ounces of methamphetamine the next time they met (and currently had two ounces of methamphetamine). A federal search warrant was executed at Moore's Surgoinsville residence during which law enforcement agents found approximately 48 firearms, over \$24,000.00 in cash, approximately 190 hydrocodone pills and a silencer. Moore was arrested and taken to jail on the same day.

While incarcerated on these charges, Moore engaged in a significant number of telephone calls, which were recorded on the jail system. During these recorded phone calls, he directed others, including co-defendants, Pamela Moore, 47, of Surgoinsville, Tenn., David Allen Davis, 47, of Church

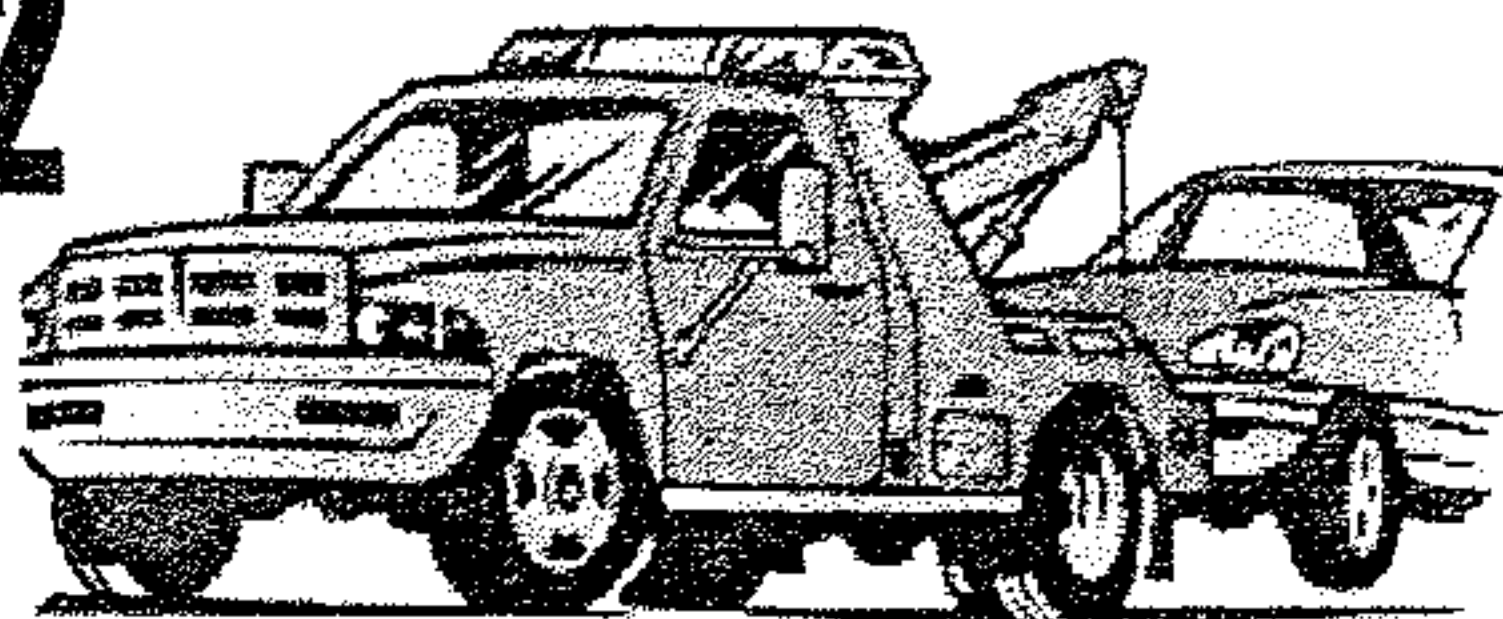

Sex offender

Jason Reynolds, 34, Crock Road Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Sex Offender Registry.

Mr. Jason Reynolds was interviewed at the Loudon County Justice Center in reference to reports that he had been using the social media application Grindr. Mr. Reynolds was advised of his Miranda rights and was asked about the social media site. Mr. Reynolds advised that he had downloaded the Grindr application in the summer of 2016. Mr. Reynolds is a registered sex offender in the state of

Tennessee and reports to Suzie Miller with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office yearly. Mr. Reynolds' record was checked and no information regarding any emails or social media applications was provided by Mr. Reynolds. Mr. Reynolds had reported on May 26th, 2016 to Suzie Miller. Mr. Reynolds had signed the registration paperwork indicating that he understood the requirements of the sex offender registry. When asked why he did not update the information in accordance with the requirement, he stated he did not know he had to provide that information. Mr. Reynolds' phone showed the phone number to be different than the one reported in May 2016. It appeared that the number had been changed on or about August 10th, 2016. Mr. Reynolds has forty

eight hours to update his phone record with the Sheriff's Office and three days excluding holidays to update email and social media information. This did occur in Loudon County.

Hill, Tenn., and Kathy Denice Jones, 50, also of Church Hill, Tenn., to collect pain pills and methamphetamine that were not located during the search of his residence in order to hide them from the police and be sold to raise profit and/or to collect other drug debts for Moore while he was in jail. Additionally, Moore told his wife, Pamela Moore to spread the word as to the identity of the person he believed

was working with law enforcement and get another co-defendant Donnie Dwayne Wallen, 38, of Church Hill, Tenn., to cause bodily injury to that person for cooperating against Moore. In particular, Moore wanted Wallen to "beat his brains out," and "beat the brakes off" the individual because he/she was a "narc" and a "snitch."

During another recorded jail call between Moore and Jones, Moore estimated that there was over \$30,000 worth of pills hidden at his residence. He told Jones that the police only found a little over \$20,000 in cash during the search because he had invested the rest in drugs. Law enforcement agents

returned to Moore's residence and continued their search, locating 355 oxymorphone pills, 357 oxycodone pills and 7.4 ounces of methamphetamine which had been hidden by Moore. In a subsequent recorded meeting, Davis told Pamela Moore that the value of all of the drugs seized by the police was likely at least \$50,000.

Davis, Jones and Wallen all met at Jones' residence in Church Hill to discuss Moore's directions. During the meeting, Jones stated that Wallen was "prepared to go ahead and beat the h*** out of the guy, you know leave him for dead" but just wanted to make sure it was the right person. Wallen stated that he
