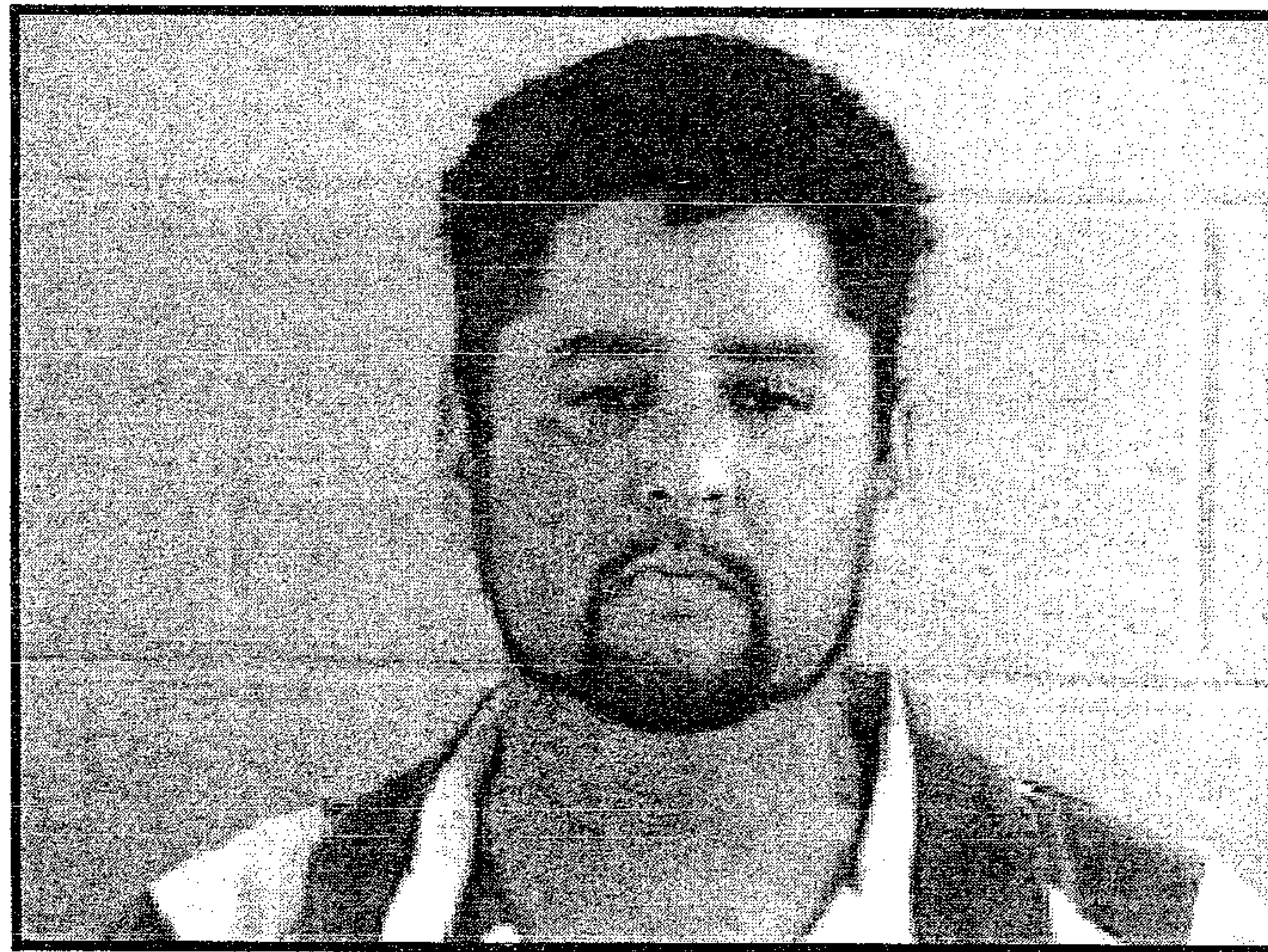
Caught on tape: Loudon man charged with attempted burglary of West Hills Market

A Loudon man was charged with the attempted burglary of West Hills Market following an investigation where he was shown on video surveillance trying to force his way into the neighborhood corner store on New Year's Eve.

Jeremy Lyn Galyon, 34, Steekee School Road, Loudon was charged with attempted burglary and felony vandalism.

According to affidavits filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on December 31st, 2010, at approximately 1:47 AM, Jeremy Galyon kicked the front door several





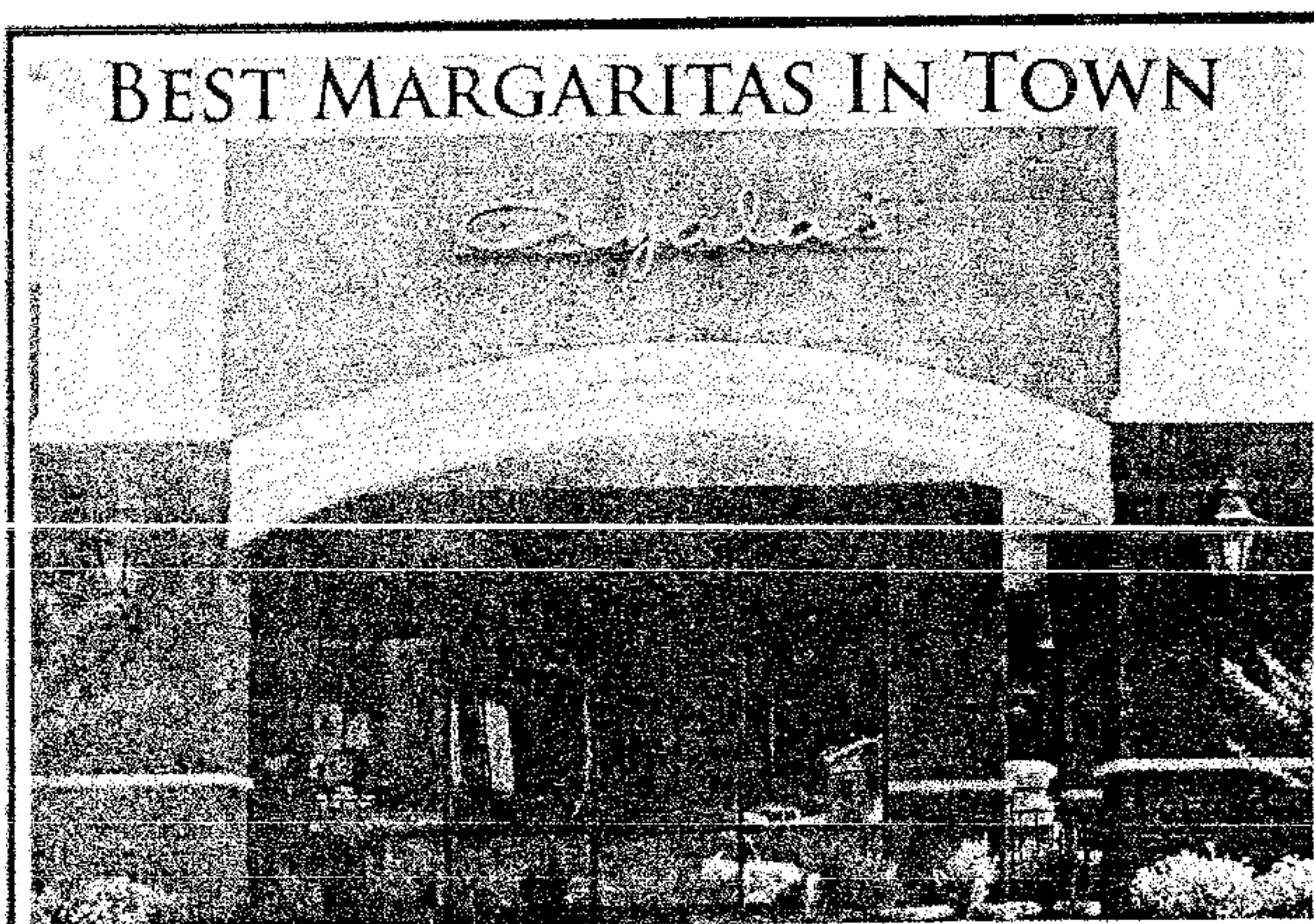

According to reports, Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO observed a white Mercury Cougar traveling north on Highway 11 and paced it at 50 mph in a 45

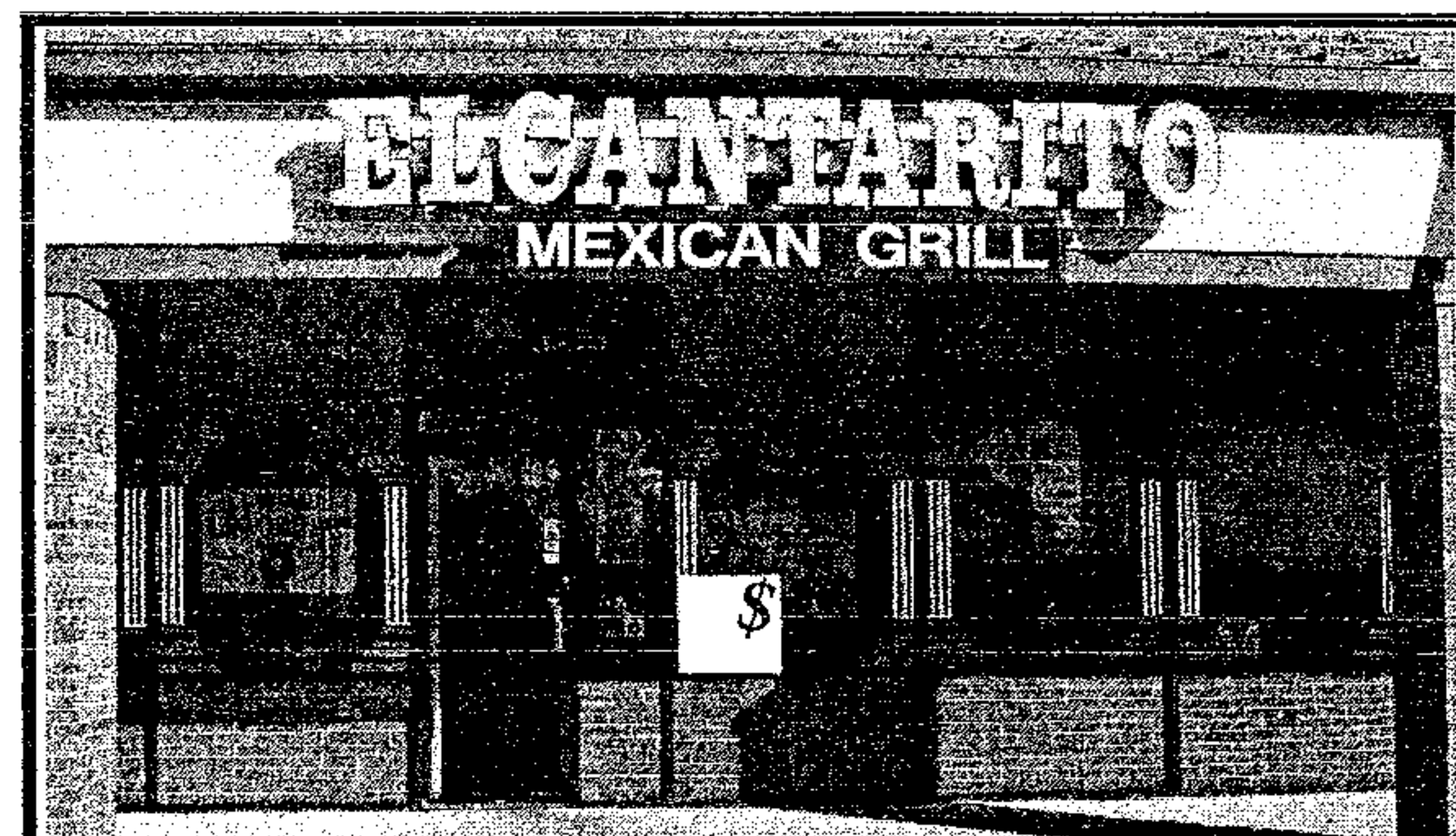
mph zone. The officer stopped the vehicle at Old Midway Road and made contact with the driver, Logan Richard Holbert.
