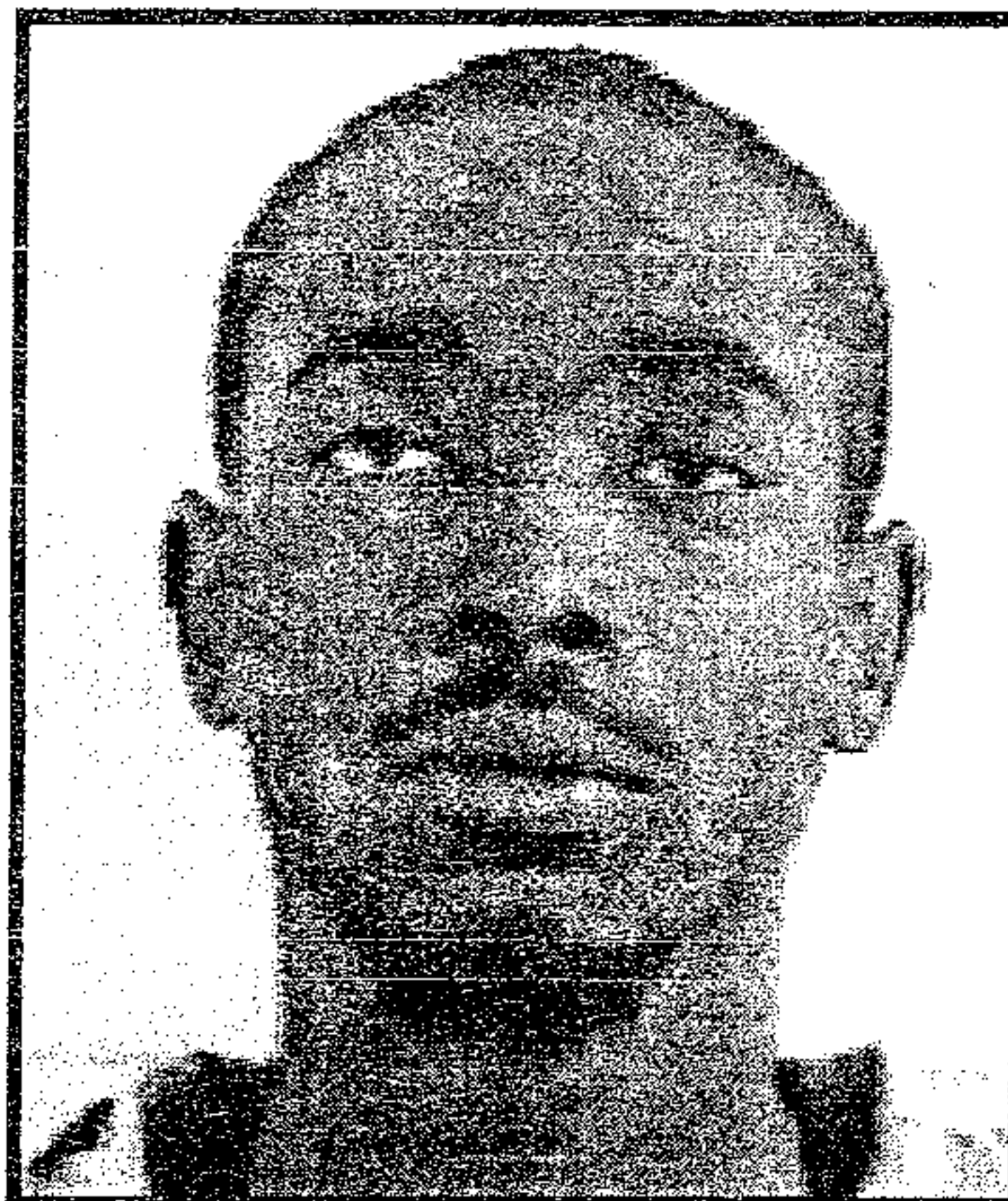
Shoplifting call nets 3 on various charges, including 1 for aggravated robbery

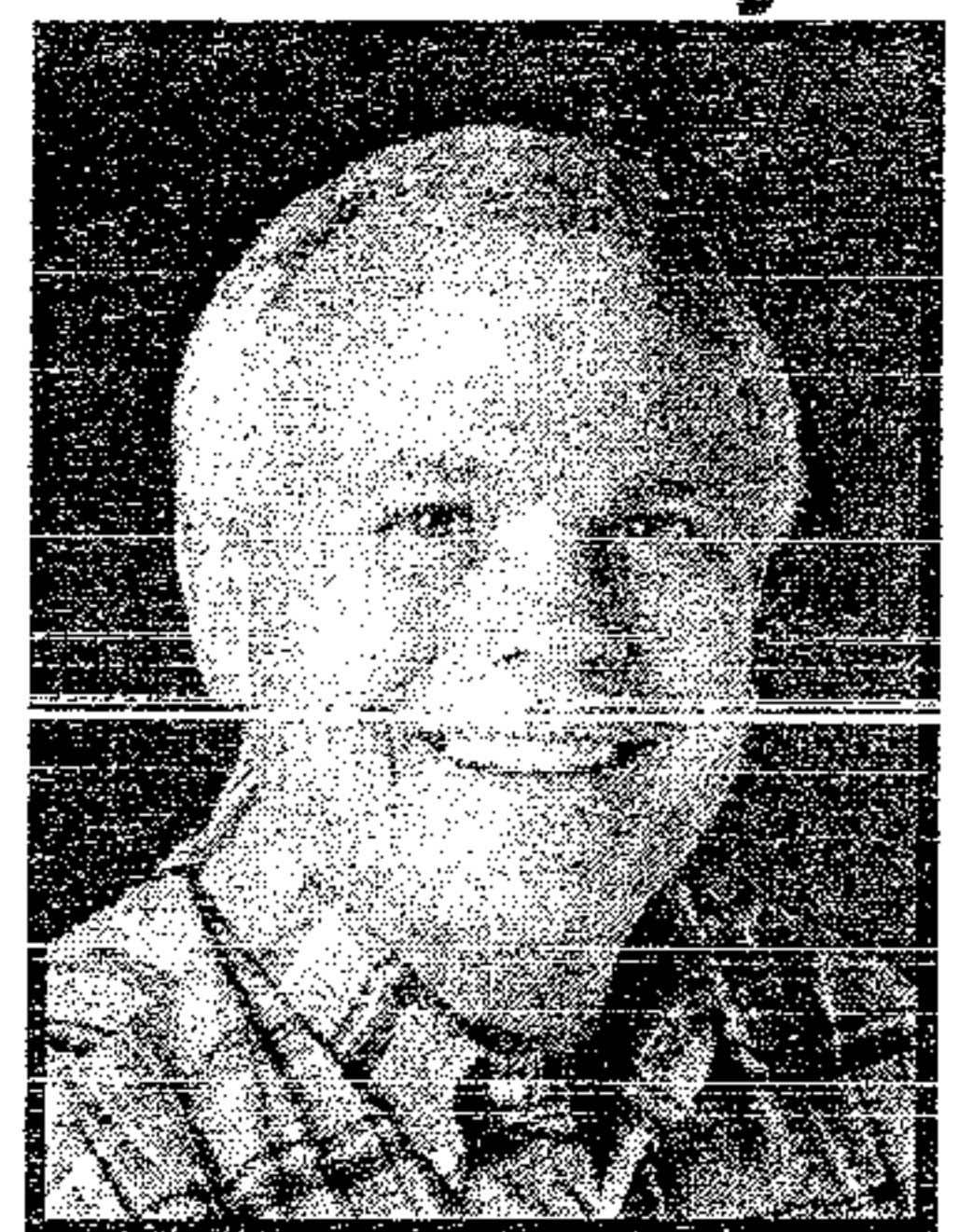



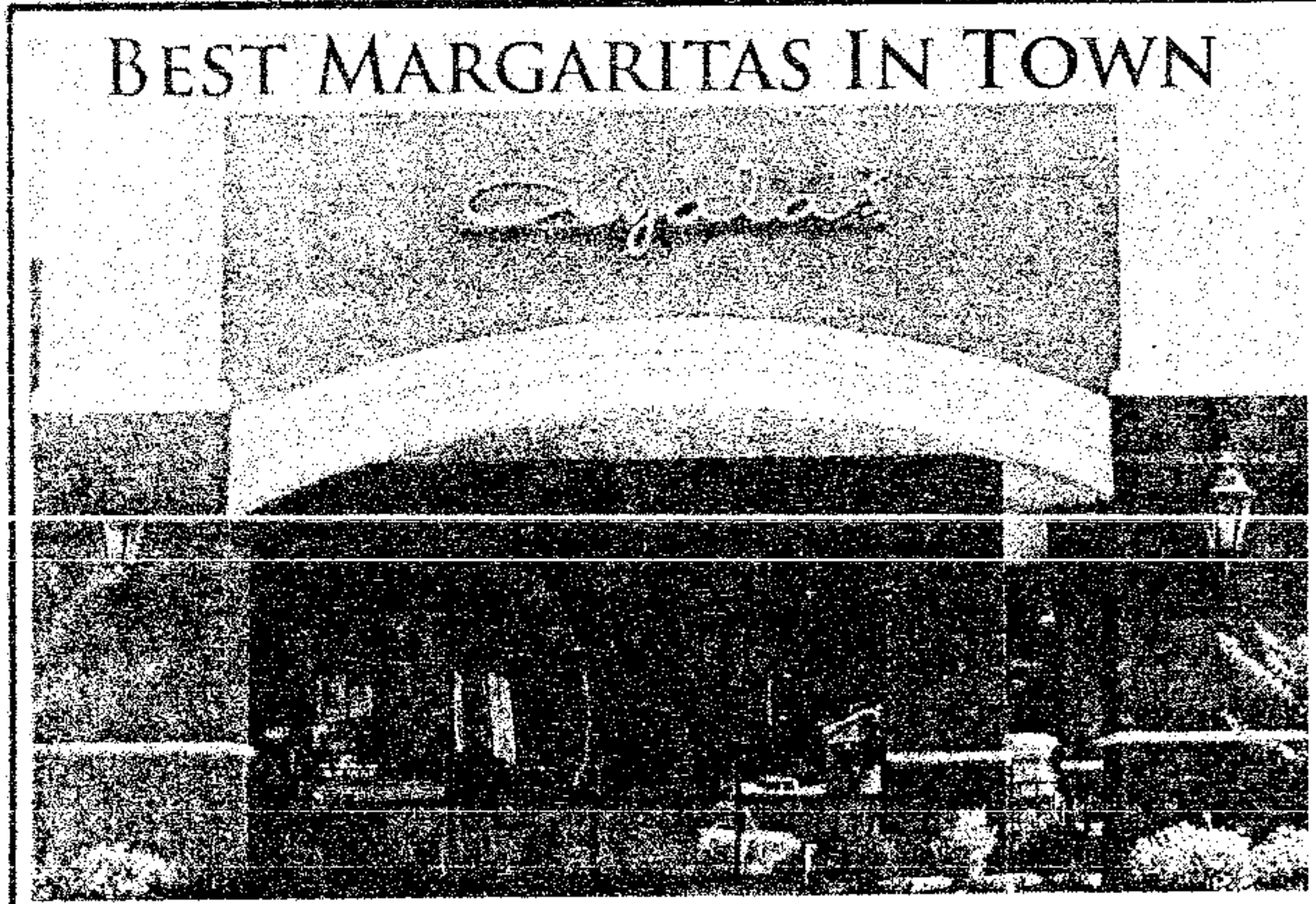

Busted

Robert Thomas Key, East Churchwell Avenue, Knoxville was charged with theft and two warrants for aggravated robbery and aggravated assault.

Tremon Antonio Hall, 25, Aqua Street, Athens was charged with criminal impersonation.

According to affidavits filed by Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO and Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on December 29th, 2010, Loudon County Dispatch gave out a call of shop lifters leaving the Walmart in Lenoir City. The vehicle description given was a green Saturn 4 door, with at least 2 male occupants.

Investigator Ezell made contact with the vehicle at the intersection of Shaw Ferry Road and Highway 11 and stopped the car at Midway Road. Upon making contact with the occupants, the lawman asked if they had any ID. The driver, Greg Berry and the front seat passenger, Robert Key both handed the officer Tennessee ID Cards.

The rear passenger advised he did not have any ID. Investigator Ezell asked for his social security number and

he said he didn't know his number, but he could give his name and date of birth. He gave the name Renardo Green and a date of birth of 10/11/1988.

A check through NCIC showed Greg Berry had a revoked drivers license and he was taken into custody. Robert Key was found to have warrants out of Lenoir City and was taken into custody. The rear passenger, Renardo Green was asked to exit the vehicle.

Once he was out, a Tennessee ID Card was located where he had been sitting with the name of Tremon Antonio Hall. A check through NCIC revealed Mr. Hall was wanted out of Knox County for violation of probation. He was then taken into custody.

Officer Jeremy Dishner, LCPD arrived on scene and found multiple items from Walmart that Loss Prevention advised had been stolen. LCPD took over the theft investigation at that time.

Records indicate, Robert Thomas Key was observed by Walmart Loss Prevention taking men's shirts and kid's jeans and concealing them in his jacket. Then he left all

points of sale and exited the store. The total amount was \$82 and no restitution was sought.

According to affidavits filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on December 21st, 2010, at approximately 8:00 PM, the victim and a witness arrived at the witness's house on Browder Hollow Road in Lenoir City. Robert Key was waiting outside. The victim agreed to give Mr. Key a ride home. Mr. Key directed him to drive to the dead end of East 5th Avenue and when Mr. Key started to get out of the vehicle, he pulled a razor type blade and placed the

blade on the victim's right small finger and the blade left a slight cut on his finger, placing him in fear for his safety and further bodily harm.

Mr. Key demanded the victim give him his stuff, meaning his backpack and wallet. Key grabbed the backpack, which contained a \$1200 Mac Book Pro and some headphones valued at \$300. The wallet contained \$25. Key then exited the vehicle and ran into the woods. The victim tried to stop Key by backing his vehicle while Key was getting out, but he escaped.
