## Remaining 2 suspects charged with cutting copper from home

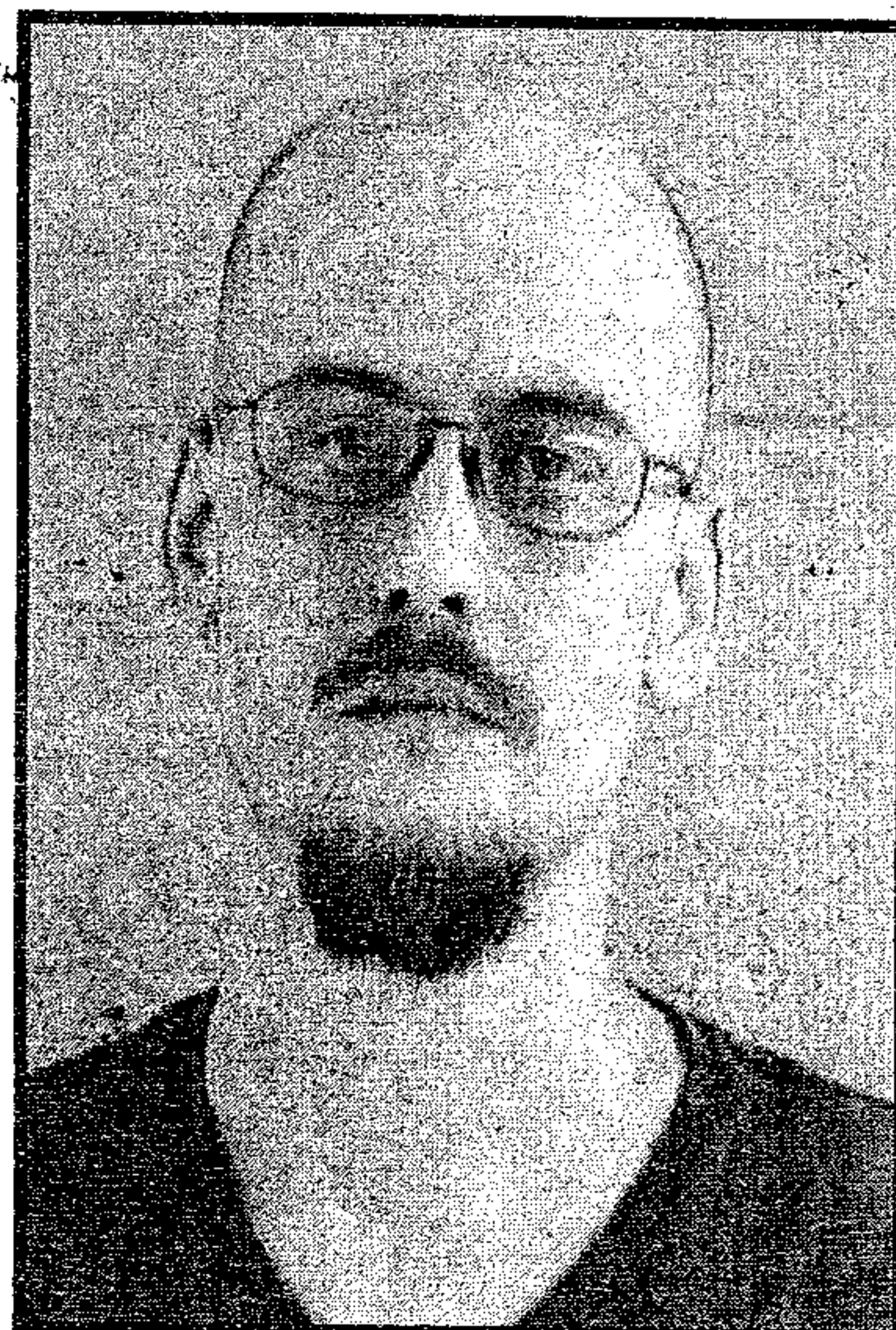
The final two of the three men accused of cutting copper wire out of a home on Jim Dyke Road in mid-July have been taken into custody to face multiple charges in Loudon County.

vandalism over \$500. According to affidavits filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID; on July 13th, 2011, during interviews conducted by Investigator Russell and Investigator Conway Mason of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, both Jennings and Jones advised they had gone to 3823 Jim Dyke Road

where they took wire from the garage and from under the house by cutting it from the walls and floor.

The two men, who were accompanied by a third man identified as Christopher D. Maples, also are accused of taking copper wire from the kitchen and bathrooms.

With consent to search a green Chevrolet Cavalier that was

driven to the house, law enforcement officials found copper pipes and wire matching the missing items from the residence in the trunk, along with a set of bolt cutters and a crowbar.

Deputy Chuck Butler, LCSO arrested Jennings Friday and Deputy Robert Gray, LCSO served the warrants and arrested Jones Tuesday at the Loudon County Jail.

Maples was charged with theft over \$500, vandalism over \$500, and possession of burglary tools on July 16, 2011.

Davis Steven 'David' Turner, 40, Loudon Highway, Kingston was charged with DUI 1st offense and violation of implied consent.

According to reports, Saturday, at approximately 12:30 AM, Officer Samuel Harrison, LPD noticed a Mazda traveling at a high rate of speed passing the BP Station on Highway 72.

The officer got a radar reading of 73 mph as the car continued to accelerate past the interstate. It passed a pickup truck in a no-passing zone while still going very fast.

Officer Harrison tried to stop the vehicle prior to the landfill but it refused to stop, continuing west on Highway 72. It eventually pulled over near Matlock Bend Road.

The driver, identified as Davis S. Turner advised he had been at the American Legion celebrating his wife's birthday and had had a couple beers. Mr. Turner had a very strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and breath, slurred

well as from lawyers and other cops. I suppose this is no different than if I worked in a factory, a hospital, a grocery store or if I just sat on my couch and watched local television.

I too was once a "potty mouth" (I'm ashamed to say) for many years after receiving Jesus. In January, when Angie and I truly surrendered our lives to the Lord, it took me a while to change some of the "descriptive verbs" I was constantly using. I have to pray EVERYDAY and ask God to take control of my tongue for His glory. I'm still a sinner and far from perfect. I caught myself just last week at work using a word that I knew was wrong the second it left my mouth, I just said it before I thought. I apologized to my partner for saying the word and again asked God to forgive me and help me speak only what is pleasing to Him.

### Regulations

The TWRC was presented the 2012 sport fish proposals at its August and September meetings by the TWRA.

In addition to establishing next year's fishing regulations, the TWRC will consider options concerning a possible fishing guide license that were presented during the September meeting held in Jackson.

Frank Fiss, Assistant Chief of TWRA Fisheries, presented options for a fishing guide license for the commission's and public's consideration. The fishing guide license options presented were 1) no change to existing rules or no guide license required; 2) fishing guide license

required (\$200 for residents, \$1,000 for non-residents); and 3) fishing guide license required (the same fee of \$200 for residents, \$1,000 for non-residents) and guides would need to meet qualifying criteria. Those criteria included for discussion were proof of insurance, background check, first aid/CPR training, and boating safety training. Discussion at the September meeting was centered around the guide license for designated tailwater fisheries.

TWRA staff has reviewed the recommendations from the Commercial Fishing Advisory Committee. The volunteer committee is entirely comprised of nine members of the commercial fishing community and was

recently established by the Tennessee General Assembly. Responses to those recommendations will be presented to the TWRC.

In other agenda items, in an effort to create uniform regulations in areas where wild hogs have been established, the agency is presenting a proclamation. The proclamation recommends the incidental taking of wild hogs during the scheduled deer season on Alpine Mountain Wildlife Management Area (WMA), Skinner Mountain WMA, and Standing Stone State Forest.

A proclamation will be voted on to establish the McGlothin Largen WMA. Gerald Largen has donated approximately 112 acres to TWRA and the State

of Tennessee and the WMA name is a combination of the family names of his parents. The McGlothins and Largens have owned the property for almost 50 years. The property is located in Roane County along the main channel of the Tennessee River downstream from Kingston.

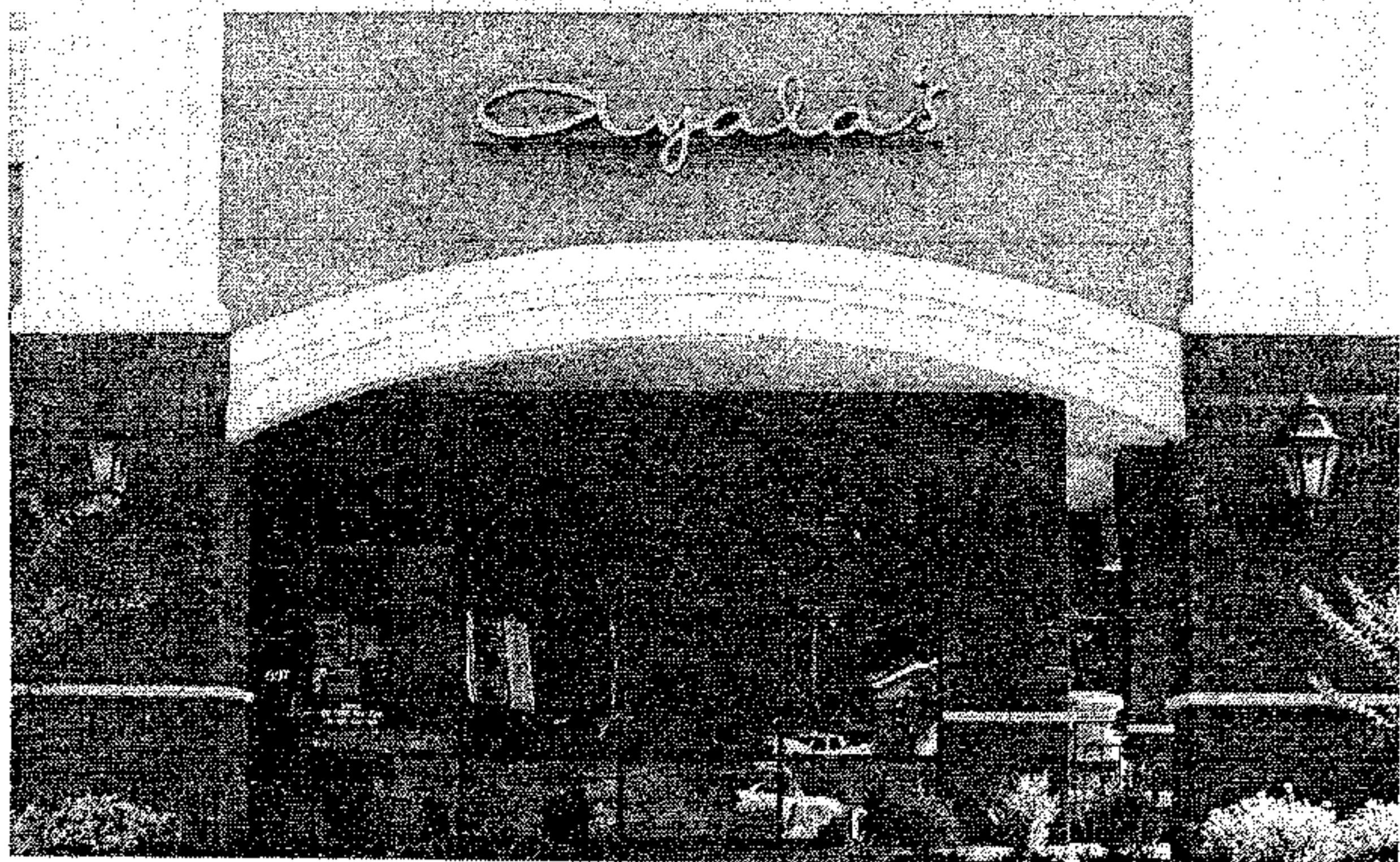
TWRA staff will present information



crash with property damage. Ms. Schleick's black GEO had run off the right side of the roadway and through a barbed wire fence, before it hit a steel gate and came to a final uncontrolled rest in a field.

Upon arrival at the scene, Trooper Miller spoke with Loudon County Corporal Watkins and Deputy Branam. During the vehicle inventory for tow, a large plastic bag containing several medications was discovered. The medications were serequel, oxycodone, and zolpidem. Ms.

Schleick was transported to the Sweetwater ER.

During an initial interview, Ms. Schleick was extremely lethargic and stated she took the prescription medication zolpidem prior to driving. The implied consent law was read to her and she refused.

Trooper Miller was advised Ms. Schleick would possibly be transported

to the University of Tennessee Medical Center for further care and have a possible orthopedic follow up. Trooper Miller then spoke to the Loudon

County Jail and was advised if Schleick was scheduled for follow up orthopedic care she would not be accepted at the jail.

Ms. Schleick was told
