“Pill Hill” alive & well, couple charged after drug raid

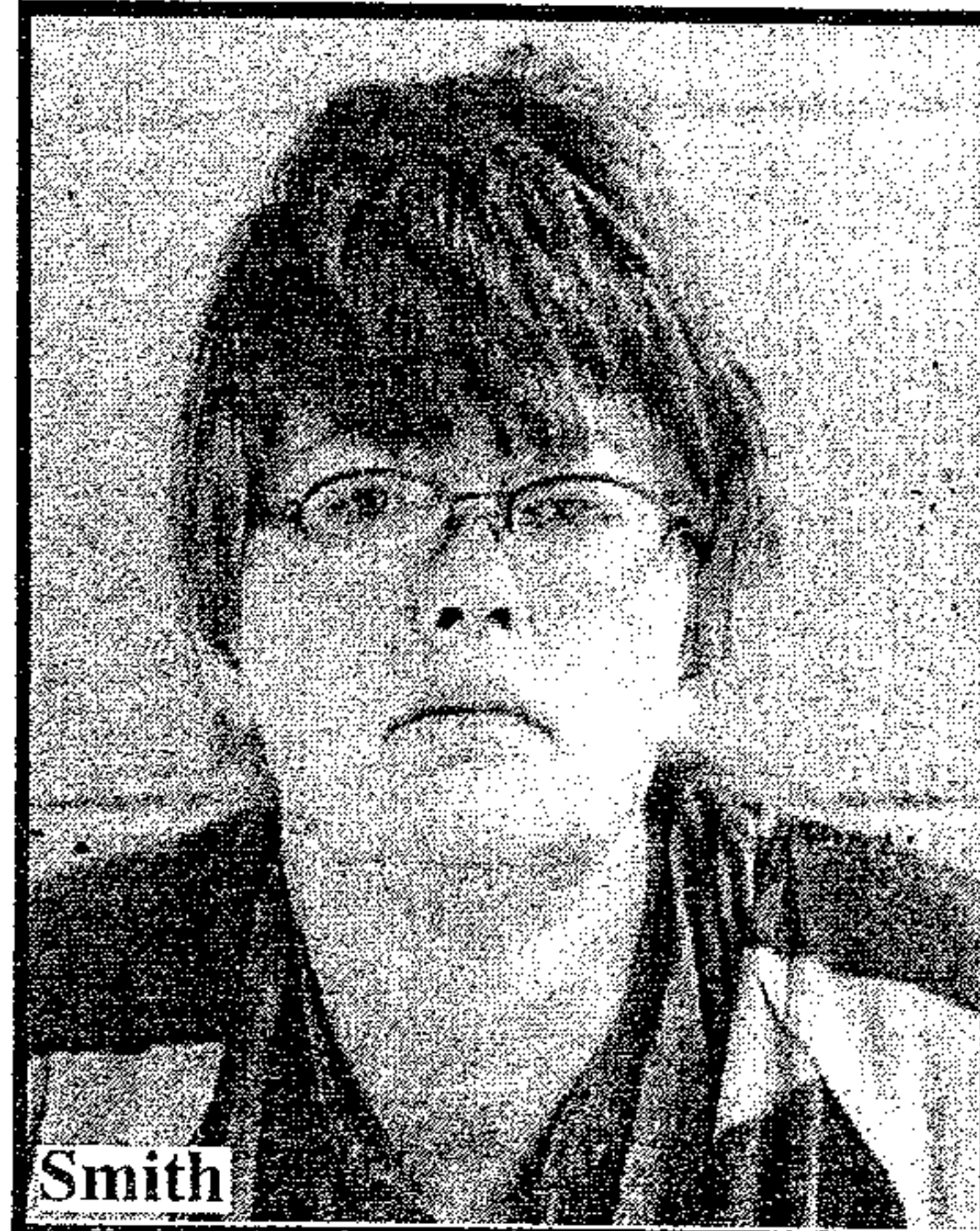

was charged with possession of schedule II oxycodone for resale, possession legend drug without a prescription, violation of the drug free school zone law, and maintaining a dwelling where narcotics are sold or possessed.

Angela Devore 'Angie' Smith, 39, McGhee Square Apartments, Kelly Lane, Lenoir City was charged with maintaining a dwelling where narcotics are sold or possessed, and violation of the drug free school zone law.

According to reports, the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit, assisted by the Loudon County Sheriff's Officer K-9 Unit, and Lenoir City Police Department, conducted a search warrant Monday afternoon at the residence of Angela Devore Smith and Ricky Wayne Malone, located at McGhee Square, 225 Kelly Lane, Apartment 12 H in Lenoir City. During the search, a round plastic bottle containing a total of 31 round

blue pills identified as 30 mg. oxycodone and one yellow oval pill identified as 10 mg. hydrocodone was found on the floor next to the recliner in the immediate area of Angela Devore Smith. A round silver metal tin containing eight round blue pills was found in the right front pocket of Ricky Wayne Malone's pants. One oval peach colored pill wrapped in cellophane was found inside Angela Devore Smith's purse.

Nineteen white round pills identified as promethazine was found in the bathroom inside another pill bottle.

No prescriptions for the medications were found at the residence.

Text messages found on cellular phones belonging to Angela Smith and Rick Malone indicate the two were selling, buying and/or trading illegal pain medication.

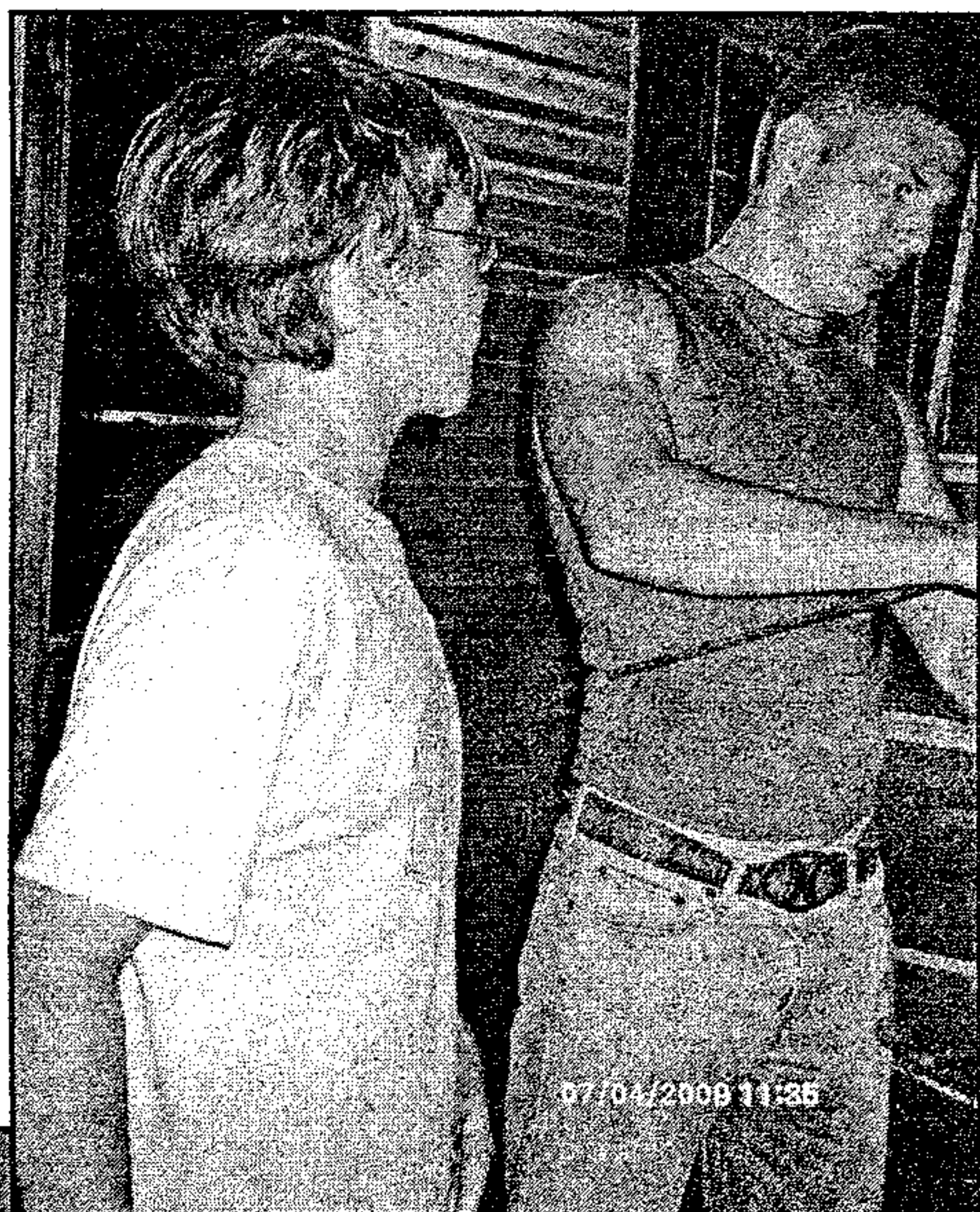
The residence of Angie Smith and Rick Malone is less than 1000 feet from the real property of the Lenoir City Elementary School.

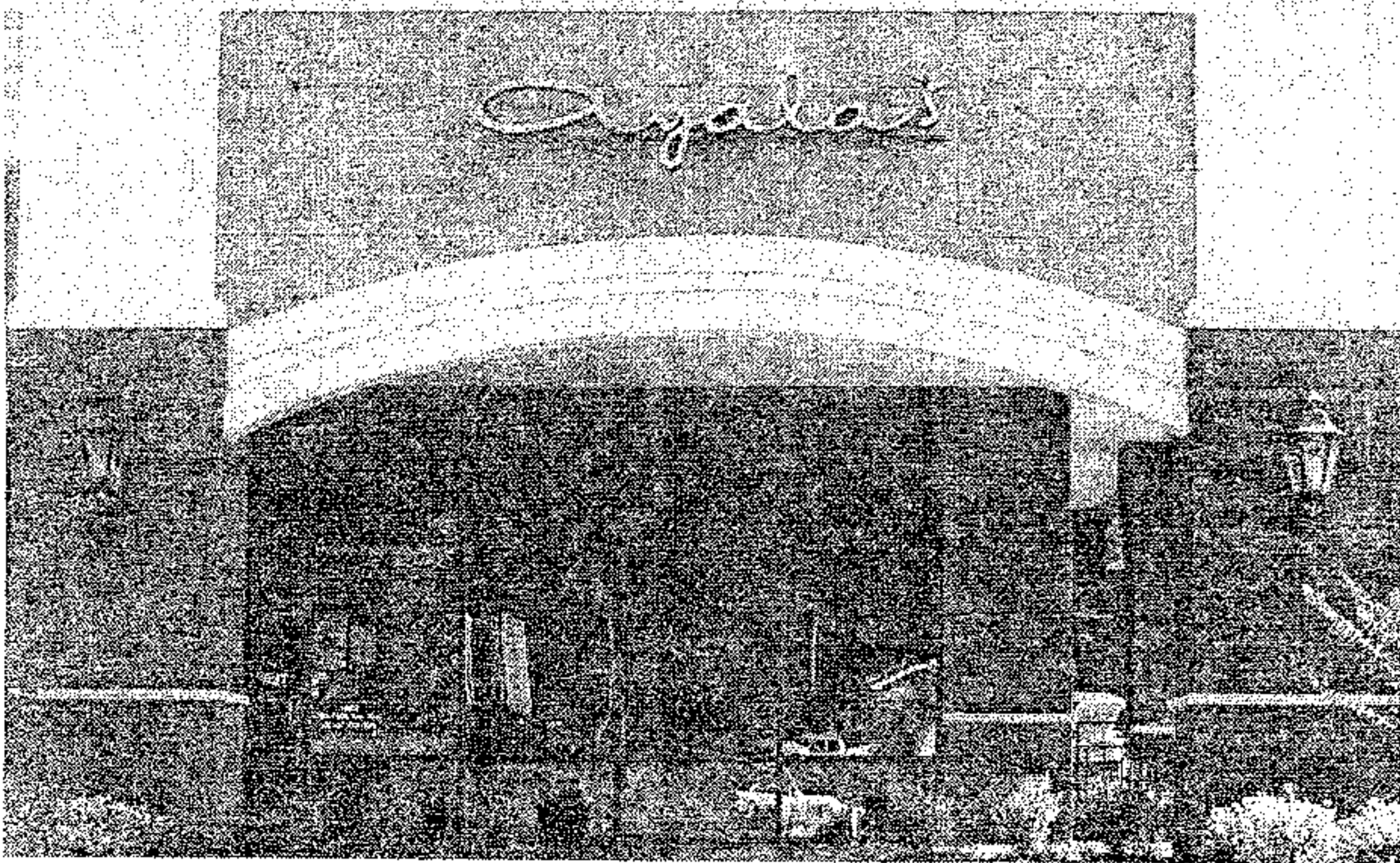



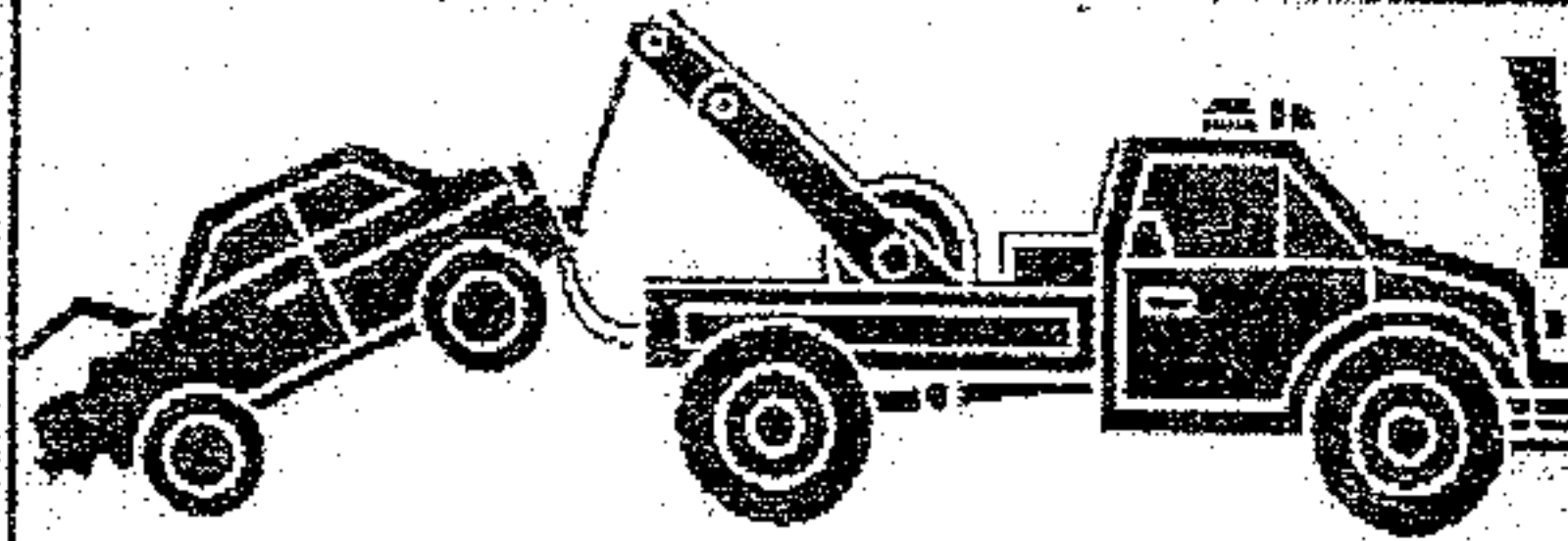
