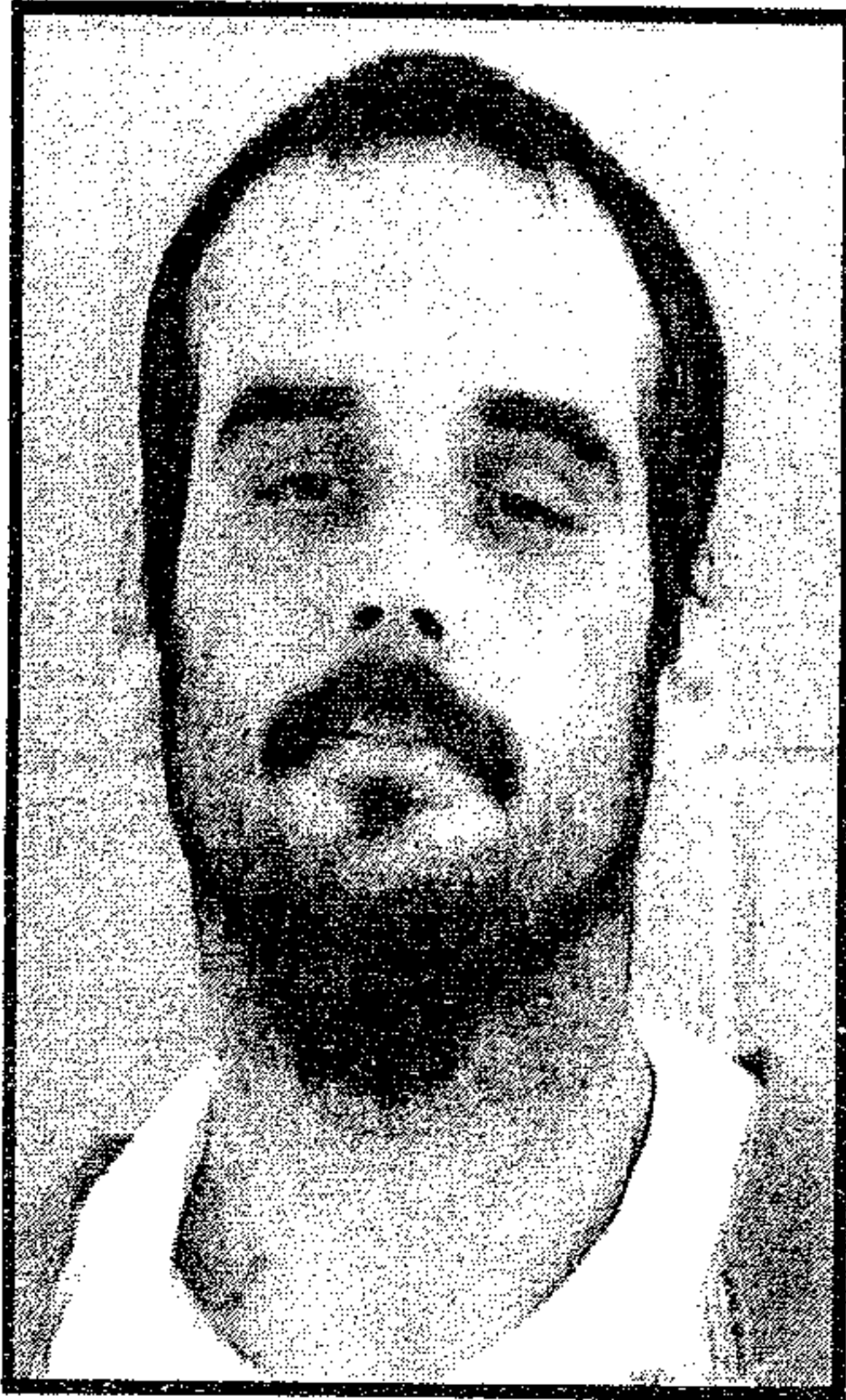

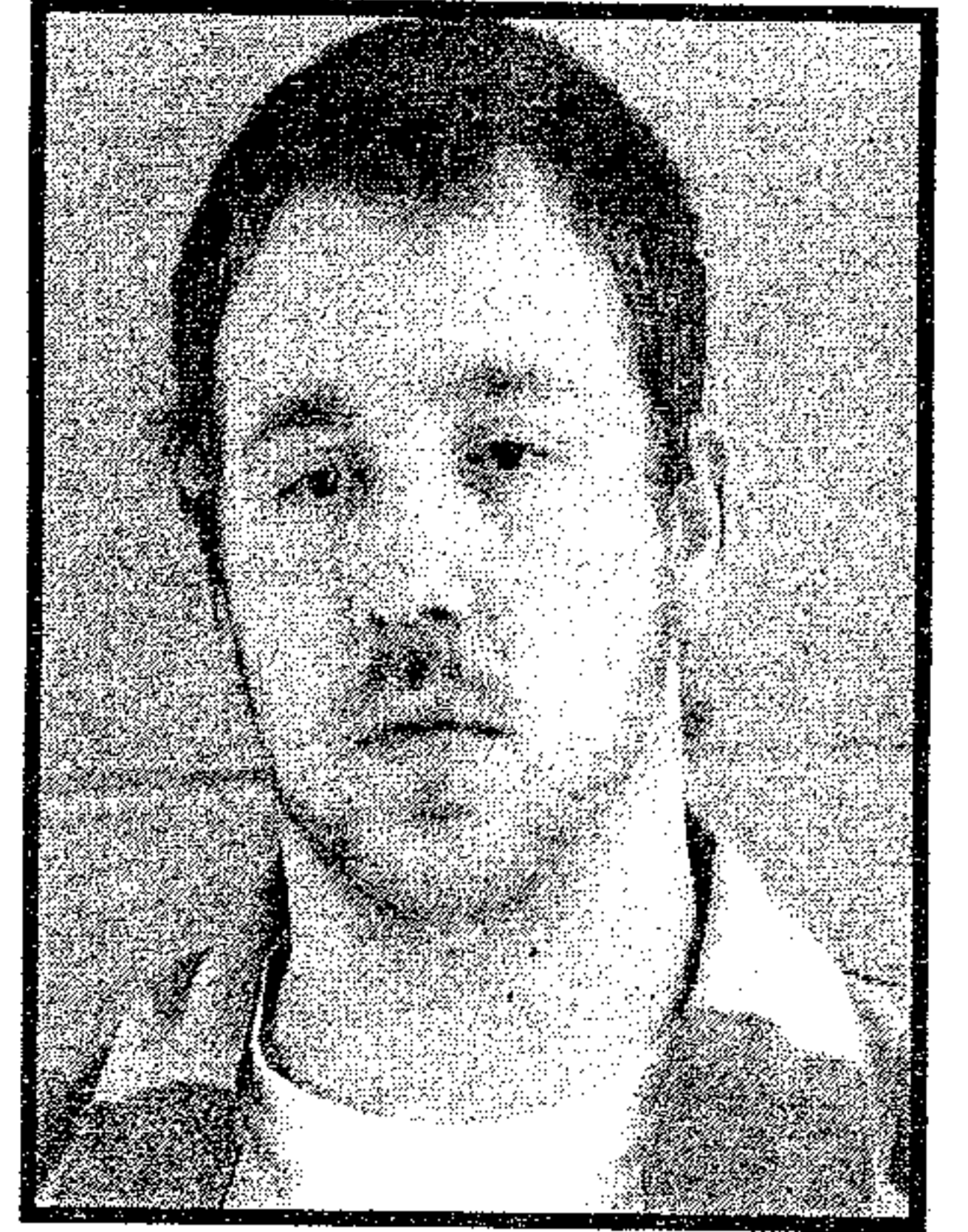

Batteries

Mr. Russell stated sometime between October 1st and October 14th, 2011, someone pushed the chained gate to the substation open and took four Alpha Premium Cell batteries valued at \$620.

The officer noted no entry was made to the substation. The theft is under investigation.

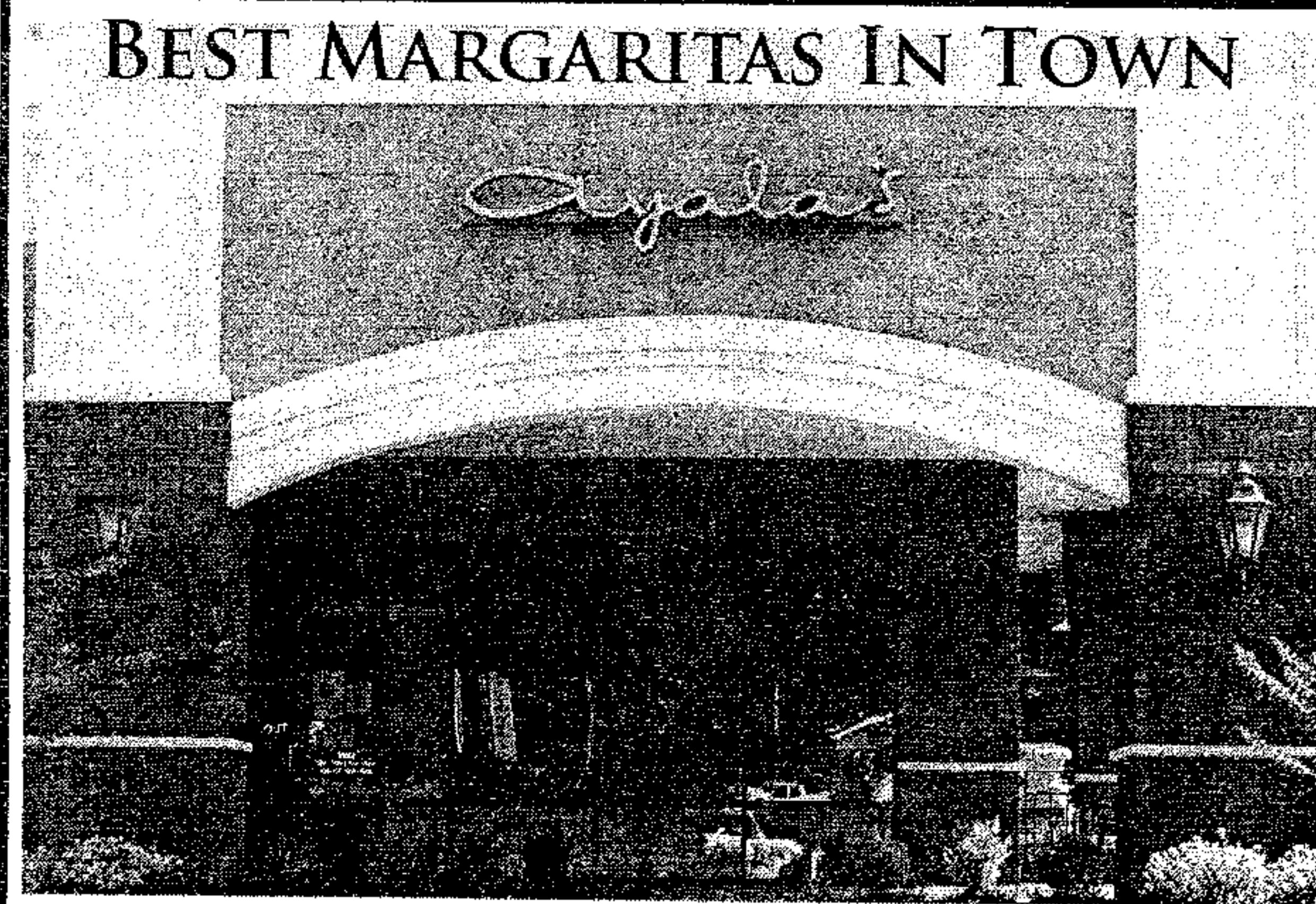

Deputy Olwin Norman, LCSO served the warrants and made the arrests Wednesday at the Loudon County Jail.


