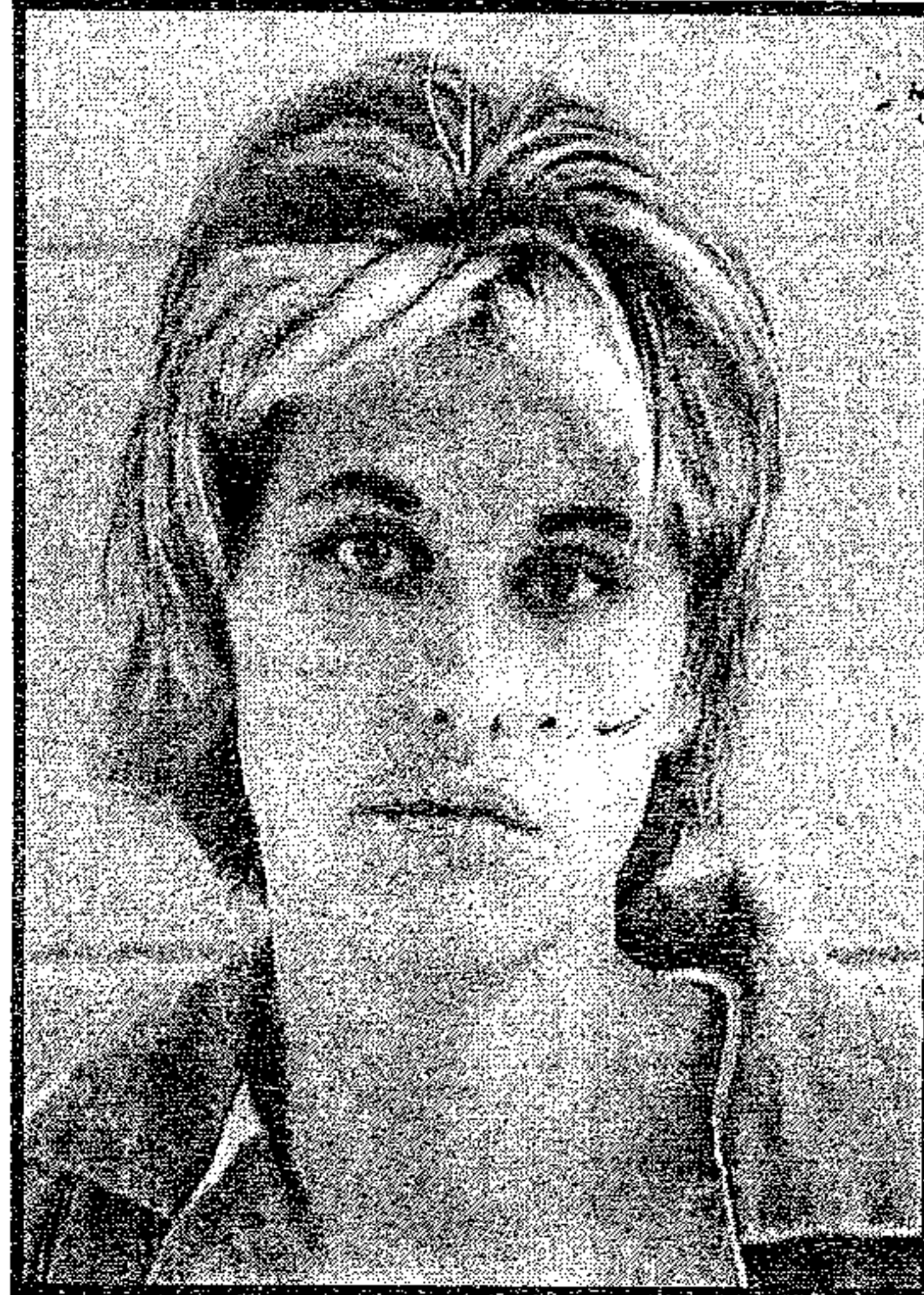

## Mom gets charged with suspended and sends sex offender to get kids

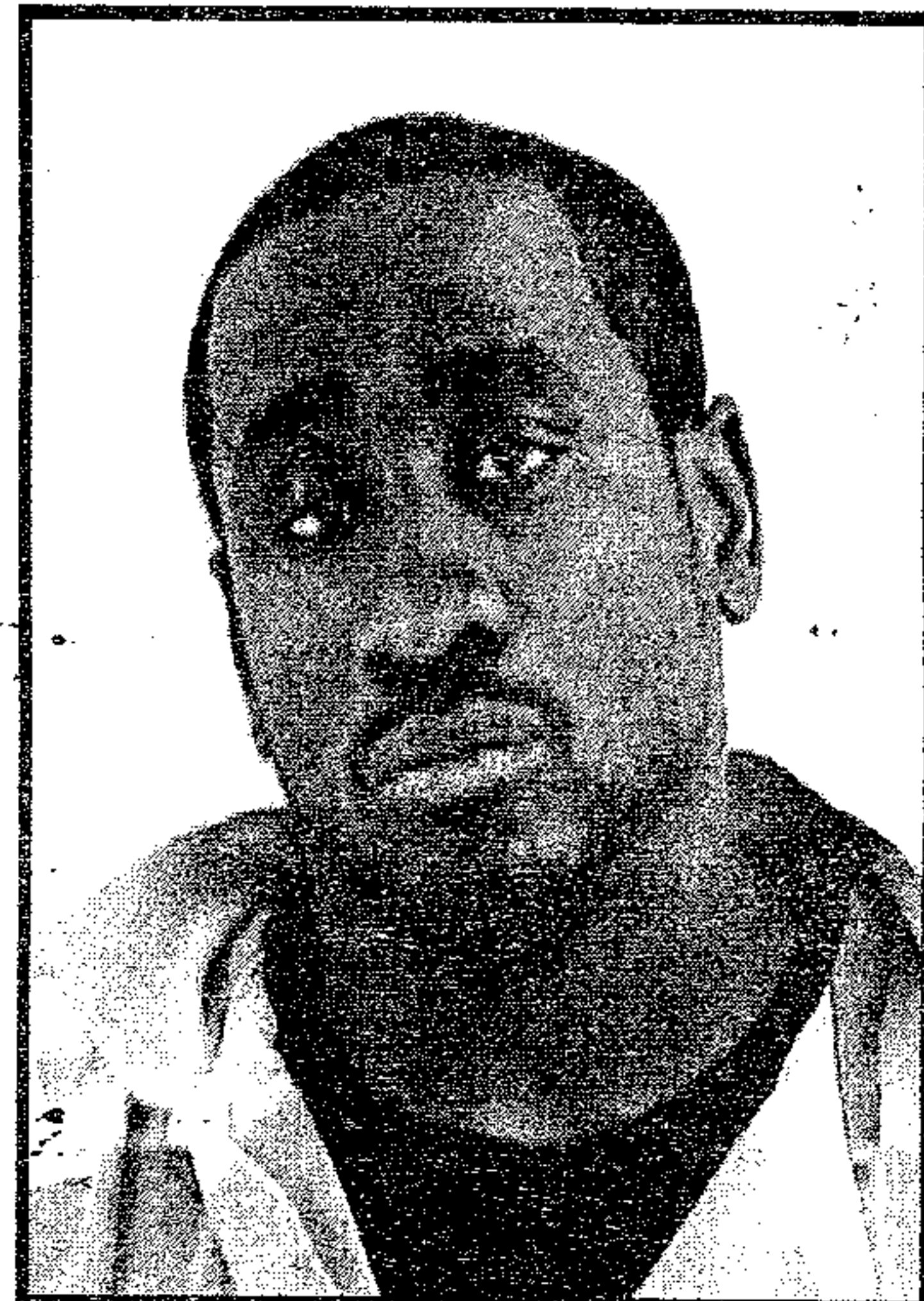
Sex offender nabbed when asked to get kids

Mary Ann Scott, 29, of Friendship Road, Lenoir City was charged with driving on (see Mom & Sex Offender pg. 6)

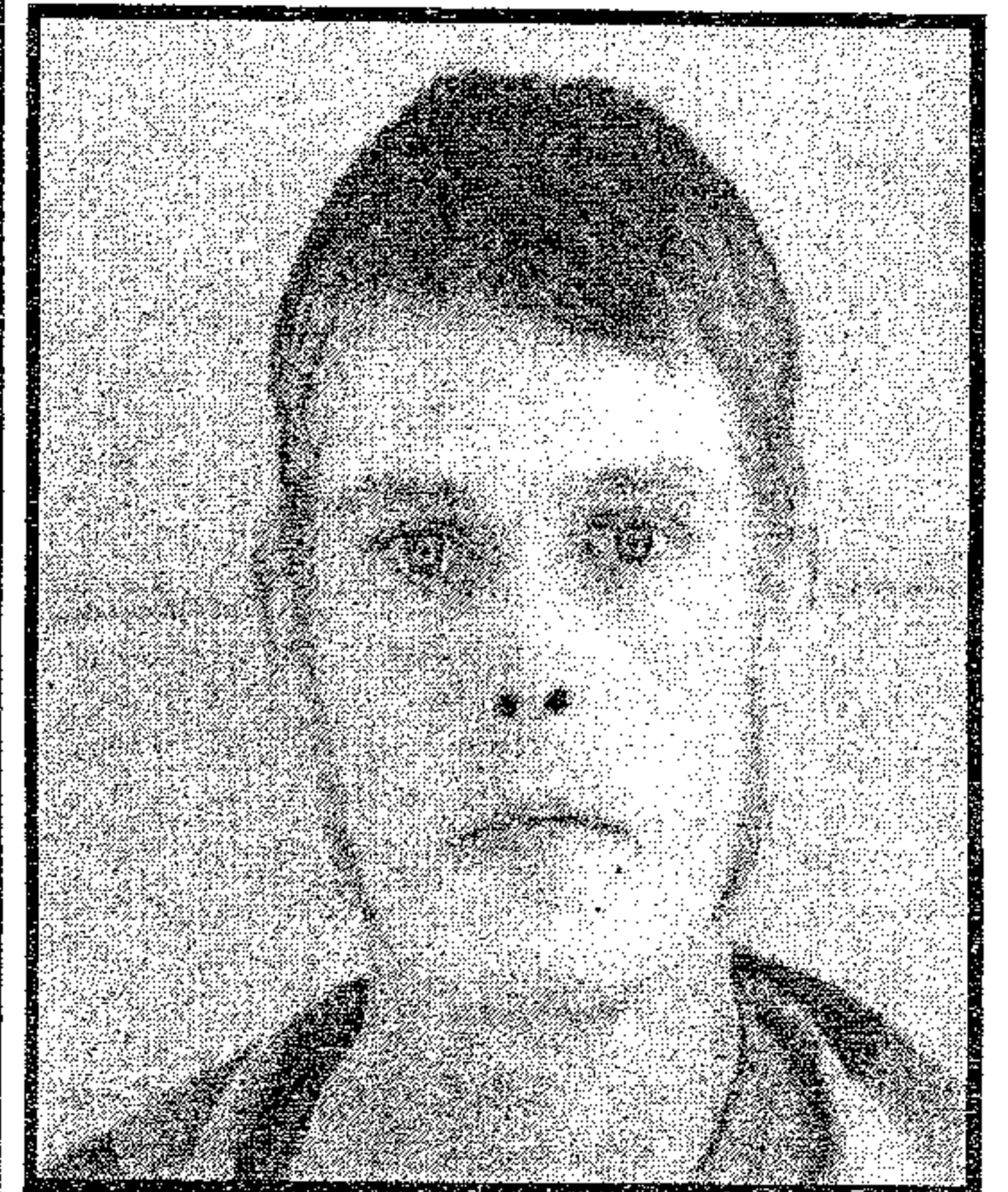

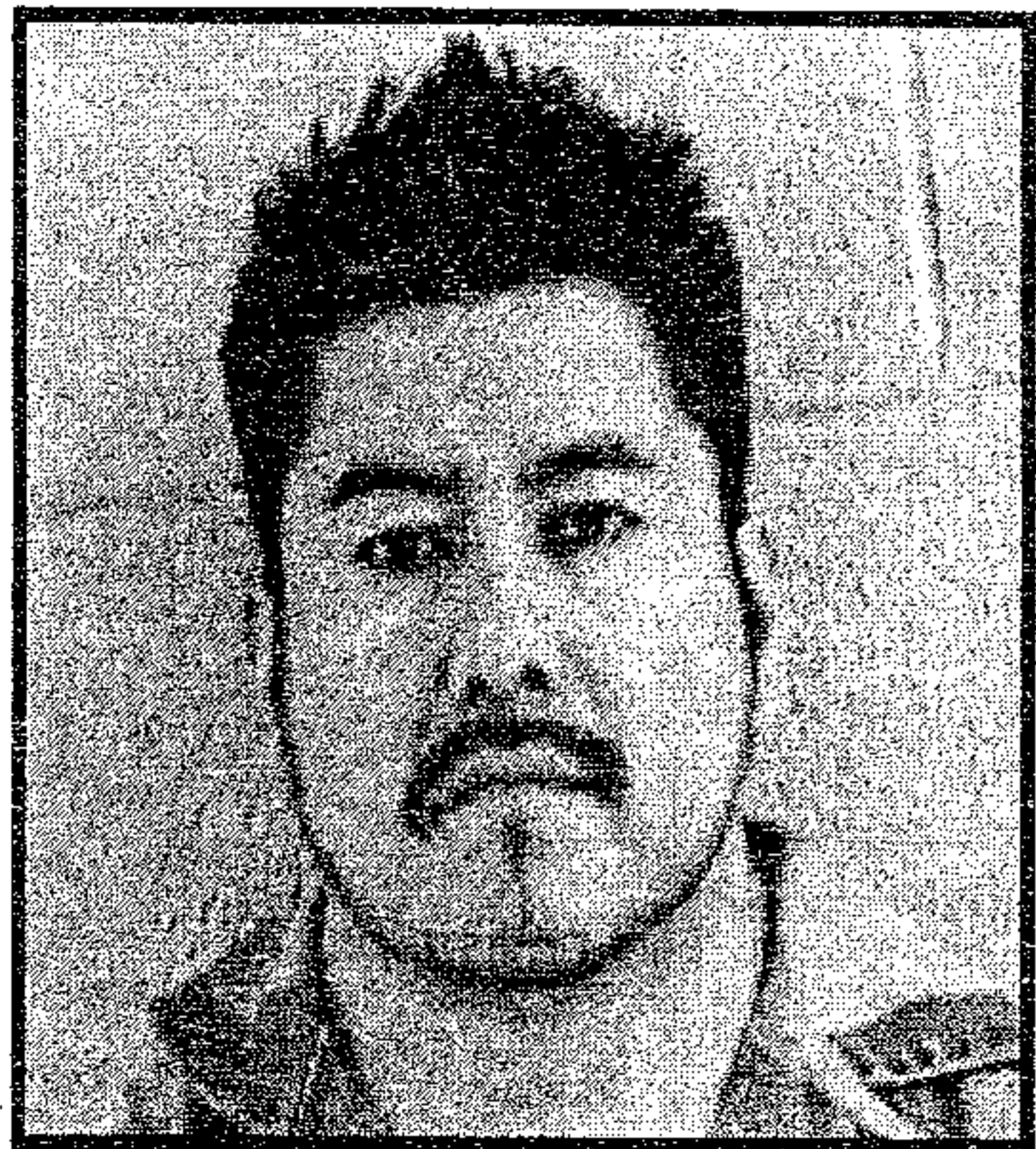

Conference Oct. 22-26 at the Sheraton Music City in Nashville.

SEAFWA is an organization whose members are the state agencies with primary responsibility for management and protection of fish and wildlife resources in 15 states, Puerto Rico, and the

U.S. Virgin Islands. More than 500 persons are expected to attend.

SEAFWA conducts an annual conference each fall to provide a forum for presentation of information and exchange of ideas regarding the management and protection of fish and wildlife resources throughout the nation,

but with emphasis on the southeast.

Representatives from state and federal agencies, citizen's organizations, universities, and private wildlife research groups will present their latest findings relative to resource management, both through scientific research and actual case histories. Fisheries and wildlife scientists will present peer reviewed papers at their respective sessions, agency enforcement personnel exchange information on tactics and mutual problems. Agency attorneys will discuss the latest developments in wildlife law and other pertinent legal issues, and information and

education personnel address relative communication, marketing and public relations matters.

The conference provides a well balanced exchange of ideas and information of significant benefit to the conservation community in its efforts to manage fish and wildlife resources.

rose slightly due to a small decline in employment," Commissioner Davis said. "There were seasonal gains in employment in areas like education, along with losses in leisure and hospitality. The net result was little change in the state's employment picture."

University of Tennessee Economist Bill Fox states there are positive indicators despite the

increase in the unemployment rate. "There is some good news associated with the increase in durable goods manufacturing during the month. Year over year, Tennessee's employment growth rate continues to show better performance than the nation."

Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural Employment

August 2011 to September 2011

Month-to-month in-

creases occurred in government, up 19,500 jobs; educational and health services was up 3,400; and durable goods manufacturing increased by 1,400. From August to September leisure and hospitality decreased by 5,500; administrative, support, and waste services was down 1,000; and merchant wholesalers of nondurable goods declined by 700 jobs.

Major Changes in Estimated Nonagricultural

**Employment**

September 2010 to September 2011

Year-over-year increases took place in professional and business services, up 7,900 jobs; local government educational services was up 6,400; and educational and health services increased by 6,000. Employment decreases took place in retail trade, which decreased by 4,400; nondurable goods manufacturing was down 1,800; and federal government declined by 1,200.





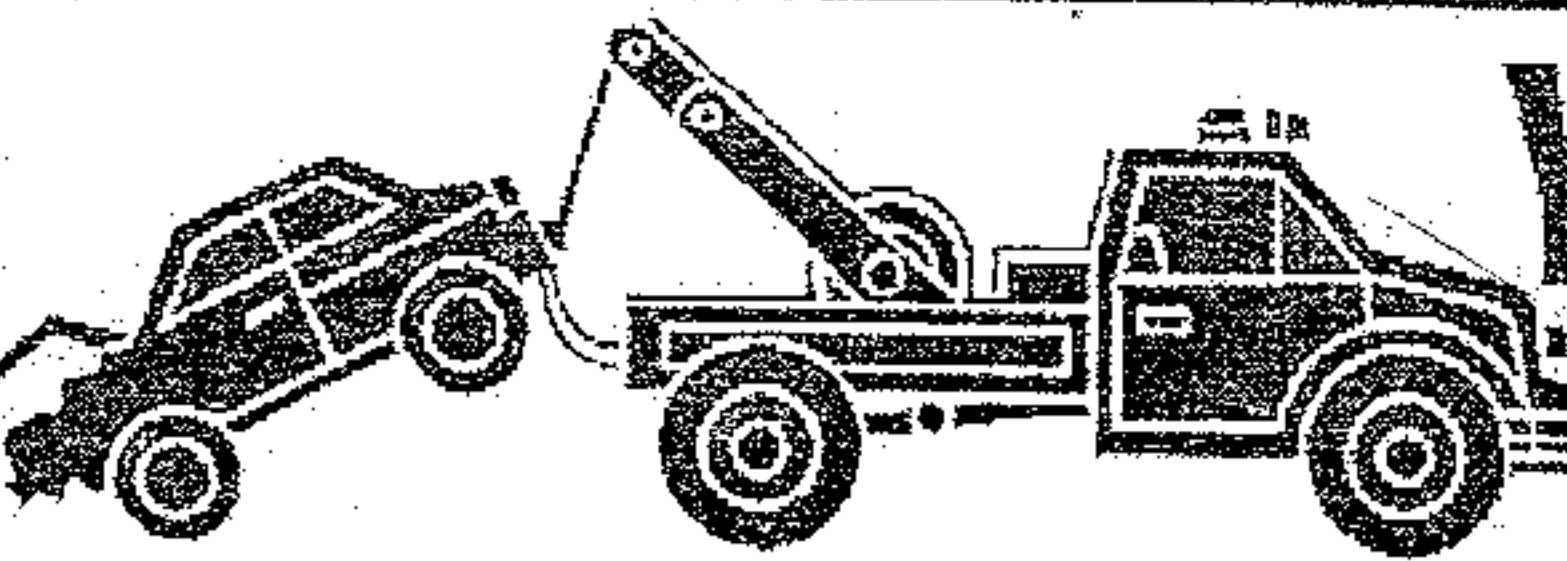
