Sunnyside Road, Philadelphia was charged with vehicular assault.

According to an affidavit, on Thursday, around 3:40 PM, Sgt. William Evans, LPD responded to a wreck with injury call at Highway 11 on the Tennessee River Bridge and found the two vehicles, a motorcycle and a silver 4-door Mitsubishi

sedan with severe front end damage, sitting in both travel lanes.

The motorcycle was laying on it's side in both travel lanes with the driver badly injured and laying in the north-bound lane.

The driver of the was sitting in her vehicle and was identified as Ms. Angela P. Coker, who advised she had no injuries and refused medical treatment.

Ms. Coker admitted driving the and hitting the motorcycle and she was unsteady on her feet and had slurred speech.

Ms. Coker further admitted she had taken several medications including carisopridol, diazepam, roxicet, and oxycodone, and advised she was on her way home from a pain clinic in Knoxville.

Coker performed

poorly on field sobriety tasks and was transported to Fort Loudoun ER where she submitted to a blood test.

The driver of the motorcycle was transported by Life Star Helicopter to UT Medical Center's Trauma Unit.

Coker was initially charged with DUI following the crash, More charges may be pending.



According to reports, Sgt. Jerramie Bowen, LCSO, was dispatched to Highway 321 near the Blount County line in reference to a strong armed robbery/car jacking Tuesday and met with the victim and Blount County deputies.

The victim, Edward Woodard, Pea Ridge Road, Maryville told authorities he'd left his house around 9:00

PM, to go fishing at the Fort Loudon Dam. As he crossed into Loudon County on Highway 321, he saw a black Honda on the side of the road and a man was waving him down so he pulled in behind the vehicle, got out of his truck and walked up to the Honda. The man then pulled a small black handgun and told him not to move.

A passenger got out of the Honda, walked past Mr. Woodard, around the trailer of his truck, got into his truck and drove off towards Lenoir City. The man with the gun held him about 5 minutes, then left towards Lenoir City also.

Mr. Woodard walked back into Blount County and stopped at the Dollar General Store, which was closed, then to Uncle Dave's Market, which was also closed. He then flagged down a person who took him to Highway 321 at Glory Road where he was able to call police.

The truck was described as a gray 2011 Dodge four door pickup. Attached to the truck was a 12' black mesh trailer with a 36" Scagg walk behind mower along with a 52" Yazoo Kee red mower. The trailer has a drop gate with 2' high side mesh on it and two red poles. It also contained an Echo weed trimmer, an Echo leaf blower and an Echo edger.

The total value of the loss was estimated at \$25,000. The crime was turned over to a investigator.

Free Youth Deer Hunt Registration Underway for Humphreys, Trousdale Events

NASHVILLE --- Youth between the ages of 10-15, who are hunter safety certified and who have never harvested a deer, are eligible to win a special hunt for the opening day of the Tennessee Young Sportsman Deer Hunt on Saturday, Oct. 29, the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency has announced.

A total of 42 young hunters will be selected to participate in one event to be held in Humphreys County and another in Trousdale County near the Smith County line.

The Humphreys County hunt will have 30 youngsters to be selected for participation as a gracious landowner has again donated his property for this hunt for 30 young hunters. The private farm incorporates a variety of wildlife management practices and totals more than 2,000 acres of prime deer habitat. In addition

to the hunt, participants are allowed to take part in a Friday night cookout and campout (participants must provide their own camping gear).

In addition to the Humphreys County hunt, 12 additional lucky hunters will have the opportunity to hunt in some prime deer habitat in the Trousdale County hunt.

Both locations will have a Friday night cookout and campout (participants must provide their own camping gear). Breakfast and lunch will also be provided on Saturday.

TWRA will hold a drawing and the winners will be notified by Oct. 15. Confirmation packets will be sent to the successful participants that will include directions and a list of items to bring along with area hotels. Winning hunters are responsible for providing the appropriate Tennessee hunting license and must be accompanied by a non-hunting adult at least 21 years of age or older.

Interested hunters may complete an application and mail it to the following address: Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, Youth Deer Hunt Giveaway, P.O. Box 40747, Nashville, TN 37204. Applications can also be faxed to (615) 781-6543. All applications must be received by Oct. 12. 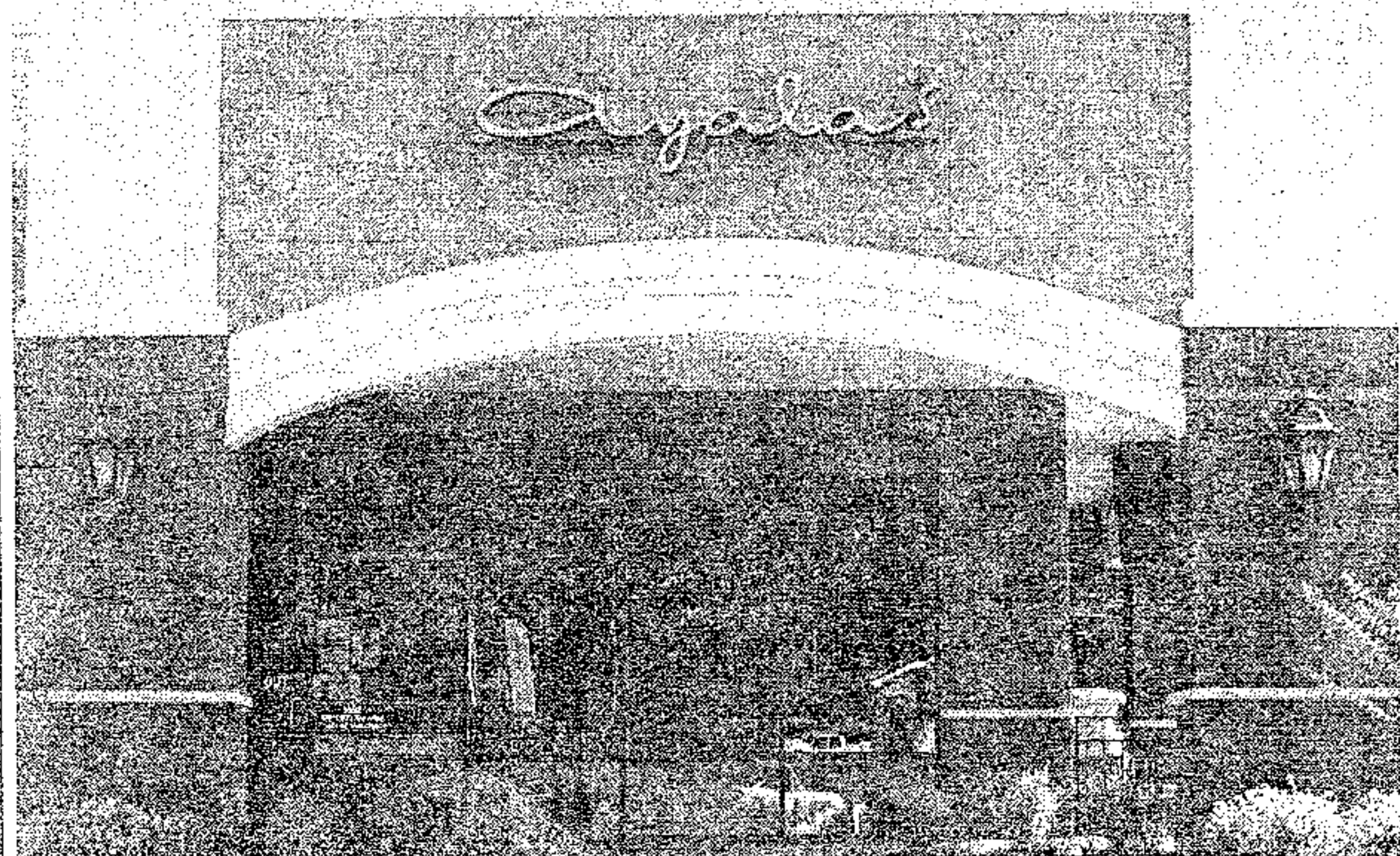

Permits are not required for burning in containers such as a metal barrel with a 1/2" mesh screen cover.

Anyone needing to burn within an incorporated city should contact

city authorities about any local burning ordinances. Many towns and cities have their own burning regulations that supersede the Division of Forestry's burning permit program.

Permits are free of

charge and may be obtained by calling the phone number for the county in which the burning will be done or by filling out the online form (only available in select counties).

Burning permits

are available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., except on holidays. Permits may be obtained in advance for weekends and holidays.

For information on what materials may NOT be burned in Tennessee, please visit Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation's Open Burning Guidelines by going to burnsafetn.org.

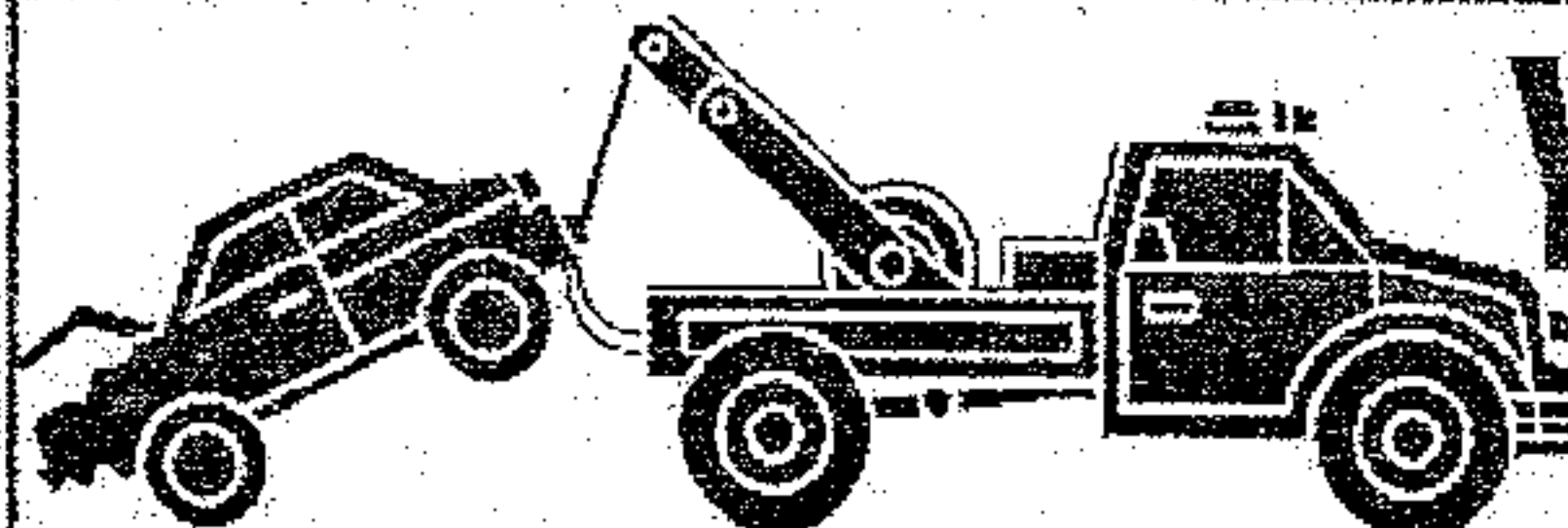
