According to reports, Officer Brandon Nix, LPD observed a green Chevy pickup driving on the shoulder of Highway 72 Sunday, around 11:45 PM. He followed it and witnessed it cross

the yellow line several times, then he engaged his emergency equipment and stopped it at the Interstate 75 North onramp. The driver was identified as Antonio Ochoa.

Ochoa had an odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and breath, bloodshot, watery eyes, was unsteady on his feet and did poorly on field sobriety tasks.

Mr. Ochoa stated he'd drank several alcoholic beverages and a check of his license came back revoked.

Ochoa consented to a breath test and his results registered .18%.

Ochoa's passenger, Mr. Leobardo, also had an odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath and person, bloodshot watery eyes, and was unsteady on his feet.

The pair were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Officer April Farmer, LPD was also on the scene.

Mr. Cantrell stated, he'd consumed alcoholic beverages and had snorted hydrocodone pills.

Cantrell was deemed a danger to himself and others around him due to his level of intoxication and he, along with Hull, was transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy Hall.
