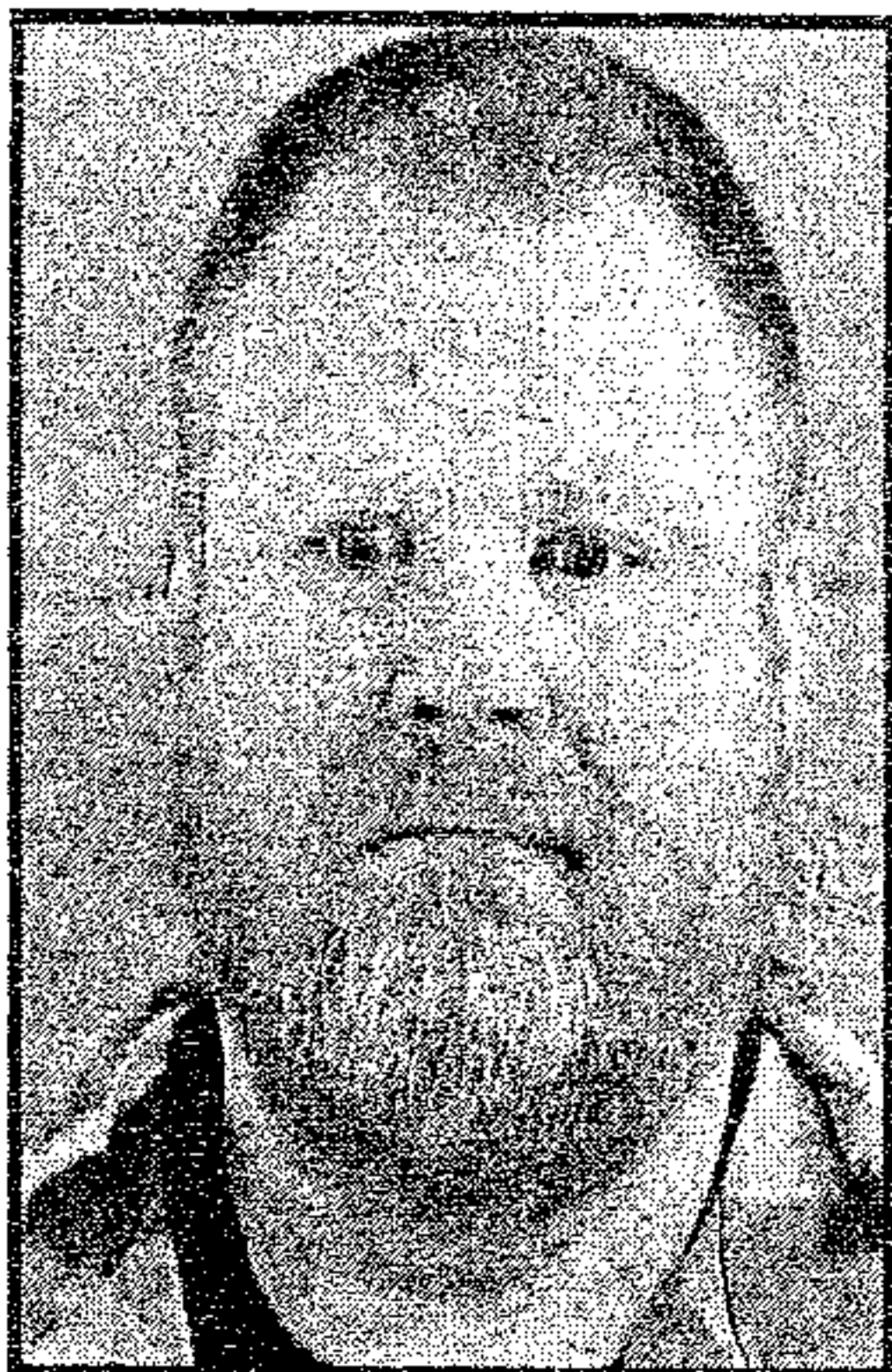

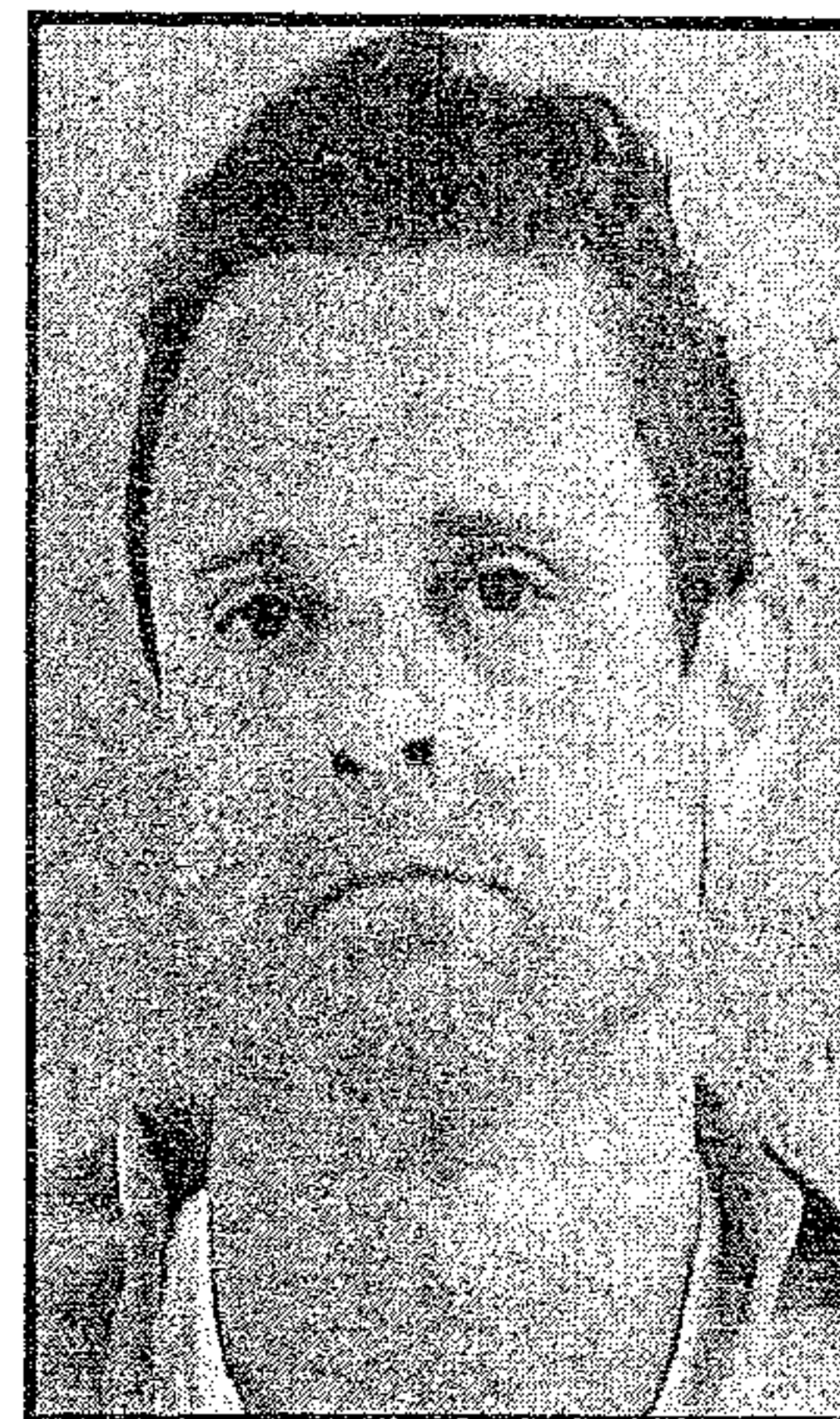

Jamy Stewart Wilson, 39, Cedar Grove Road, Loudon, was charged Tuesday, with theft under \$500 x 2, and possession of schedule II x 2.

According to affida-

vits, filed by Stephen Lane, Wal-Mart Loss Prevention, on November 21st, 2011, the Wal-Mart maintenance department found containers that held NDS video games in the garbage can in the men's bathroom. They contacted Mr. Lane and handed over the containers. Mr. Lane went back to view the security tapes and found where Mr. Wilson entered the video section of the store and placed five games into the sling on his right arm, go into the bathroom and then leave the store without paying for any

of the items. Mr. Lane states the items were not returned by Mr. Wilson and is seeking restitution in the amount of \$99.81.

On November 22nd, 2011, Mr. Wilson entered Wal-Mart again and Stephen Lane observed him take a bra from the ladies department, remove it from it's hanger, then stuff it into a sling on his right arm. When Mr. Wilson began to exit the store, passing all points of sale, he was stopped by Stephen Lane and police were called.

Officer Jamie Whitt, LCPD, arrived on scene and while patting Mr. Wilson down she discovered a white container in his left pants

pocket containing two large white, round pills, marked with Watson/932, believed to be 10 mg. oxycodone and four small white, round pills, marked with 54 and 142, believed to be 10 mg. methadone. Mr. Wilson was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Waldrop reportedly stated he approached her vehicle, pulled on the door and yelled at her. Waldrop was taken into custody.

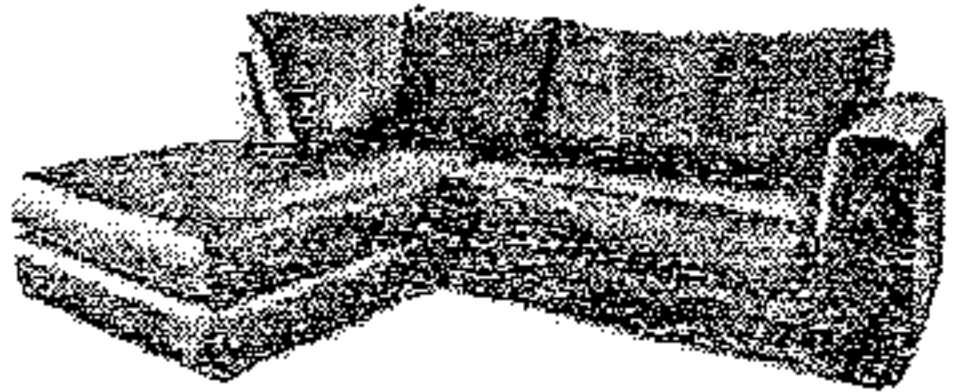

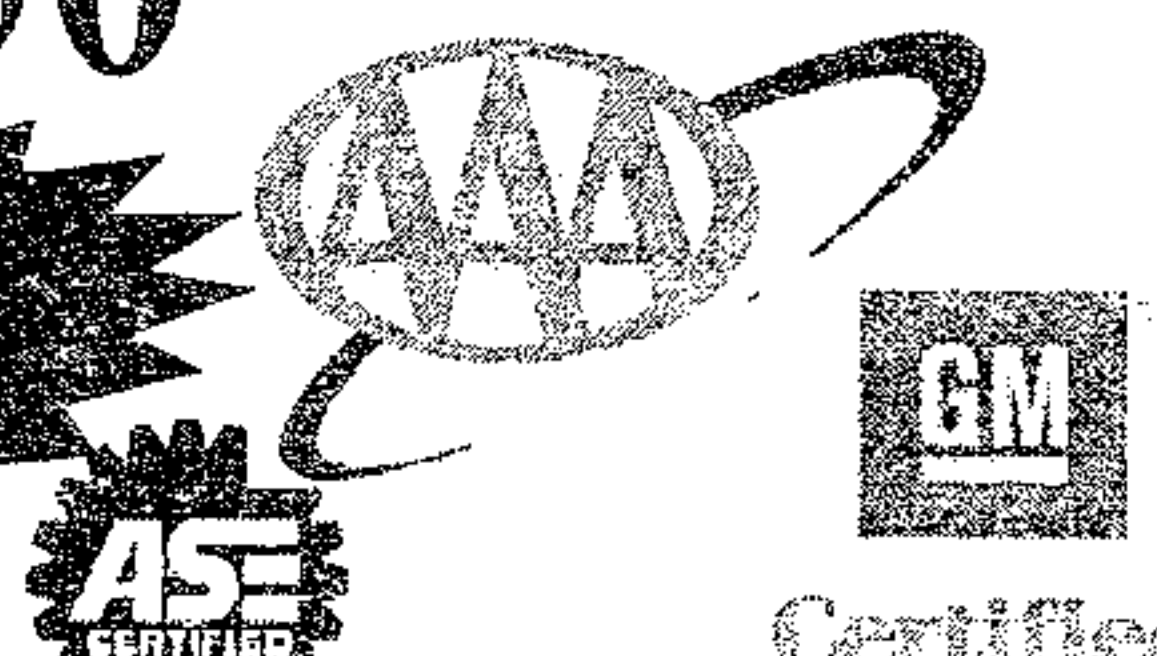

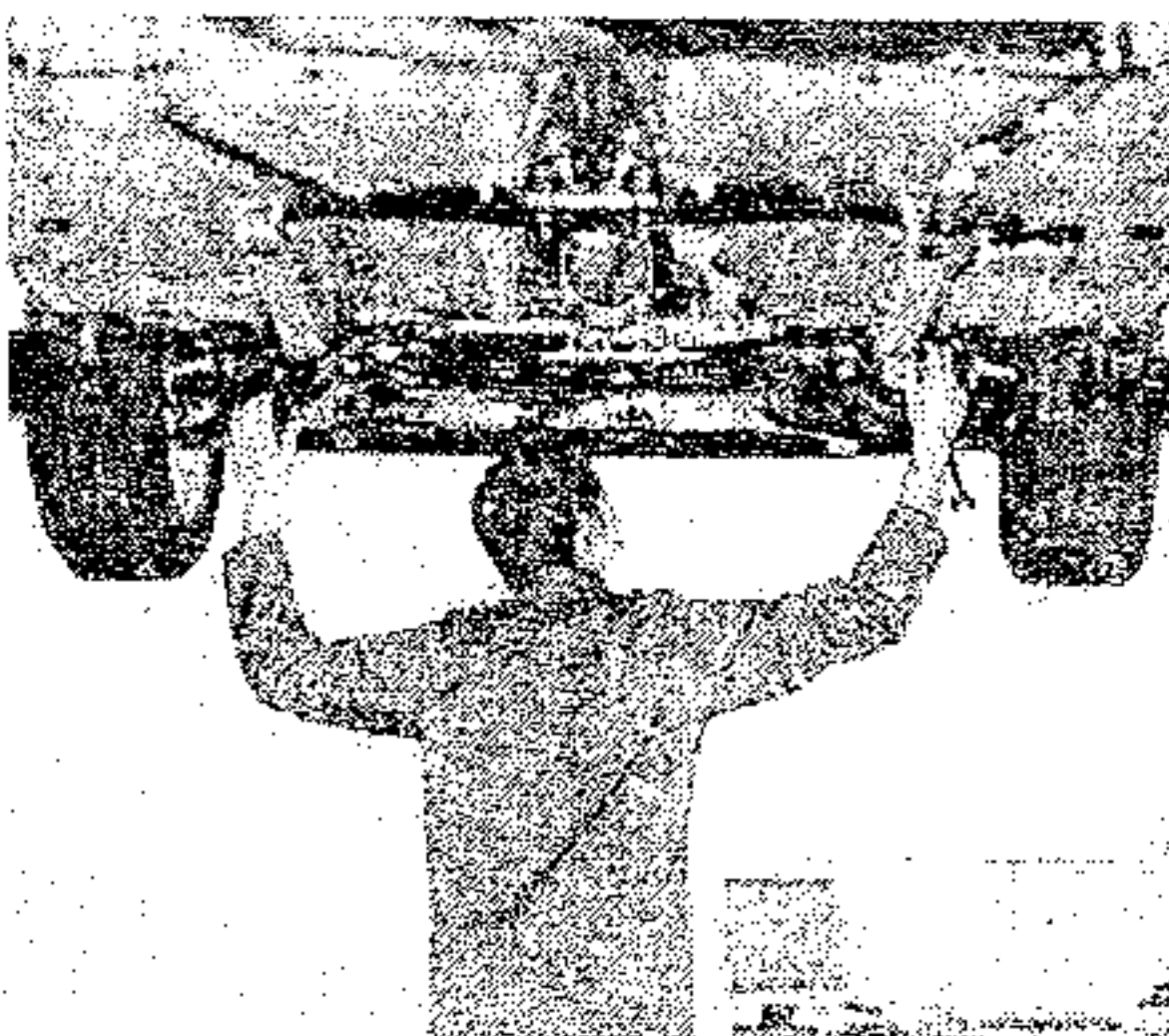

It finally dawned on me what was going on; he was dreading his turn to share because he didn't receive any Christmas gifts. There was no joy and excitement, just obvious fear and embarrassment. I could see it on his face and in his eyes

and I could almost feel the pain.

When it was his turn to share I watched as he stumbled through naming something that we all knew was not true. He tried to hide his embarrassment with a lie but I could see right through it. Others did too and even began to call him out on his claim.

I felt horrible as I'm sure our teacher did at that moment but it was too late.

Imagine what it must have felt like to be that boy! Imagine how many kids will wake up this Christmas to a sack full of nothing? There's a lot of hurting families this year. God can really use us if we will just let Him.

Last week I encouraged Christians who were thankful for the blessings in their life to do something nice for someone else in the name of Jesus during Thanksgiving. If you did, I bet it felt good and God blessed you.

I'm worried that our world will continue to go

to hell in a hand basket unless we as Christians decide that we want God to be involved in our decisions, our lives, our finances and our future. There is not a larger coalition of Christians somewhere that is responsible for working with God in regards to our children, our community or our nation. It is you, it is me, and it is the person who sits beside you on Sunday morning that has to quit playing church and **BE THE CHURCH!**

After Jesus was crucified and raised from the dead He spent forty days on earth with the disciples. 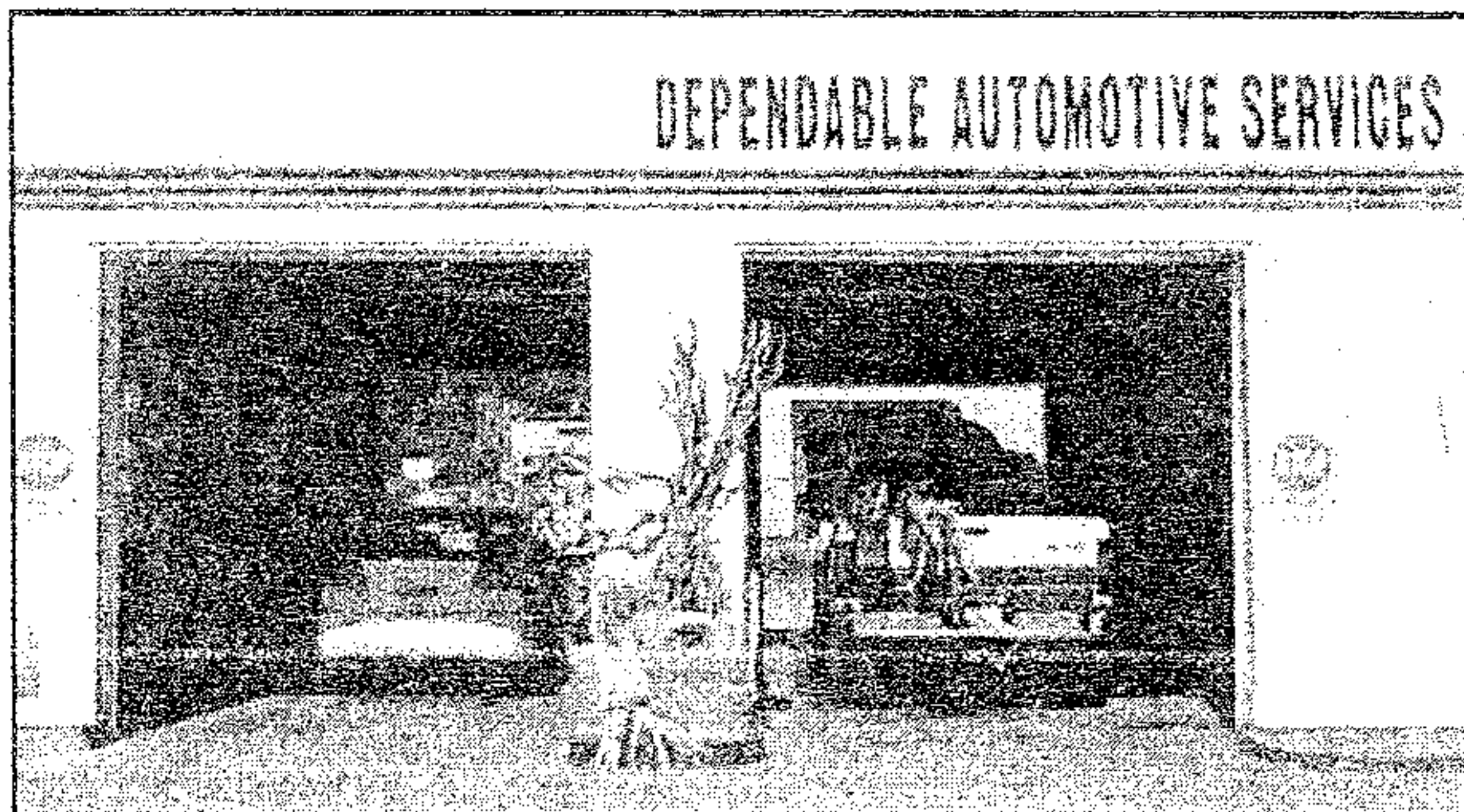

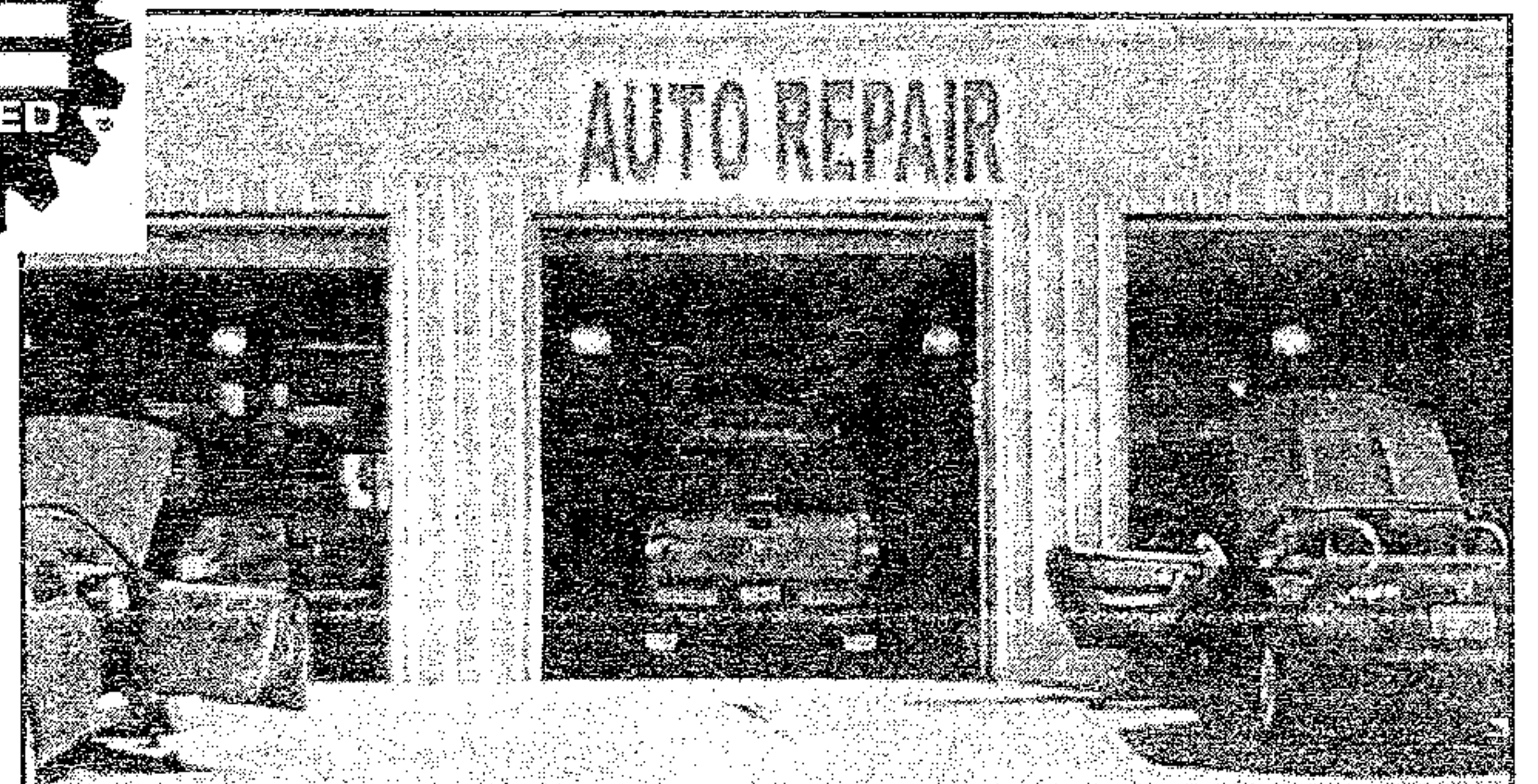

Matthew Bingham was taken into custody and duly charged.


