Rifleman

stopped the vehicle in the Adesa Auto Auction parking lot and identified the driver as William D. Frederick, Jr.

The officer ordered Frederick out of the vehicle after smelling an alcoholic beverage on his person, then found a loaded Ruger long rifle in the small of Frederick's back.

Mr. Frederick performed poorly on field sobriety tasks and was taken into custody. He refused a blood alcohol test.

There was no indication as to whether or not Mr. Frederick had permit to carry a firearm.

Crain performed poorly on field sobriety and was placed under arrest, after which a search of his person produced a thin metal pipe with residue inside it from Crain's pocket. Crain reportedly advised the pipe was his one-hitter.

Crain submitted to a blood test at Fort Loudoun ER before being transported to the Loudon County Jail.
