



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates more than one million people in the United States are living with Human Im-

munodeficiency Virus, or HIV. One in five of those people living with HIV is unaware of his or her infection. Despite increases in the

total number of Americans living with HIV in recent years, the annual number of new HIV infections has remained relatively stable. Yet these new infections still continue at far too high a level, with an estimated 50,000 Americans becoming infected with HIV each year.

Tennessee has not escaped the HIV/AIDS pandemic, with cases reported in every county of the state. Figures through the end of 2010 show 23,891 Tennesseans have been diagnosed with HIV. Of this number, 16,483 Tennesseans are currently living with HIV, and to date there have been 7,408 deaths among Tennesseans infected with this virus. As in the rest of the country, African Americans in Tennessee are the most disproportionately affected by HIV, with 65 percent of the 886 new HIV/AIDS reported cases in Tennessee in 2010 within this population.

A person may feel toll-free at 1-800-525-perfectly healthy for 2437, Monday through several years after be-coming infected with p.m., Central time.

HIV, and may be at risk for passing the virus on to others. The only way to know for certain if an individual is infected with HIV is to be tested.

The Department of Health offers confidential HIV testing at all county health department clinics, which also provide counseling with a trained health care provider on ways to reduce the risk of HIV infection, and help link HIV-infected individuals with medical care.

Other sites that offer HIV tests can be found online at www.HIVtest. org. Mobile phone users can send a text message with their zip code to "KNOWIT" (566948), and within seconds will receive a text message identifying a testing site near them.




Loudon Dam Tuesday. The complainant called back and advised dispatchers the vehicle had just run off the road near
