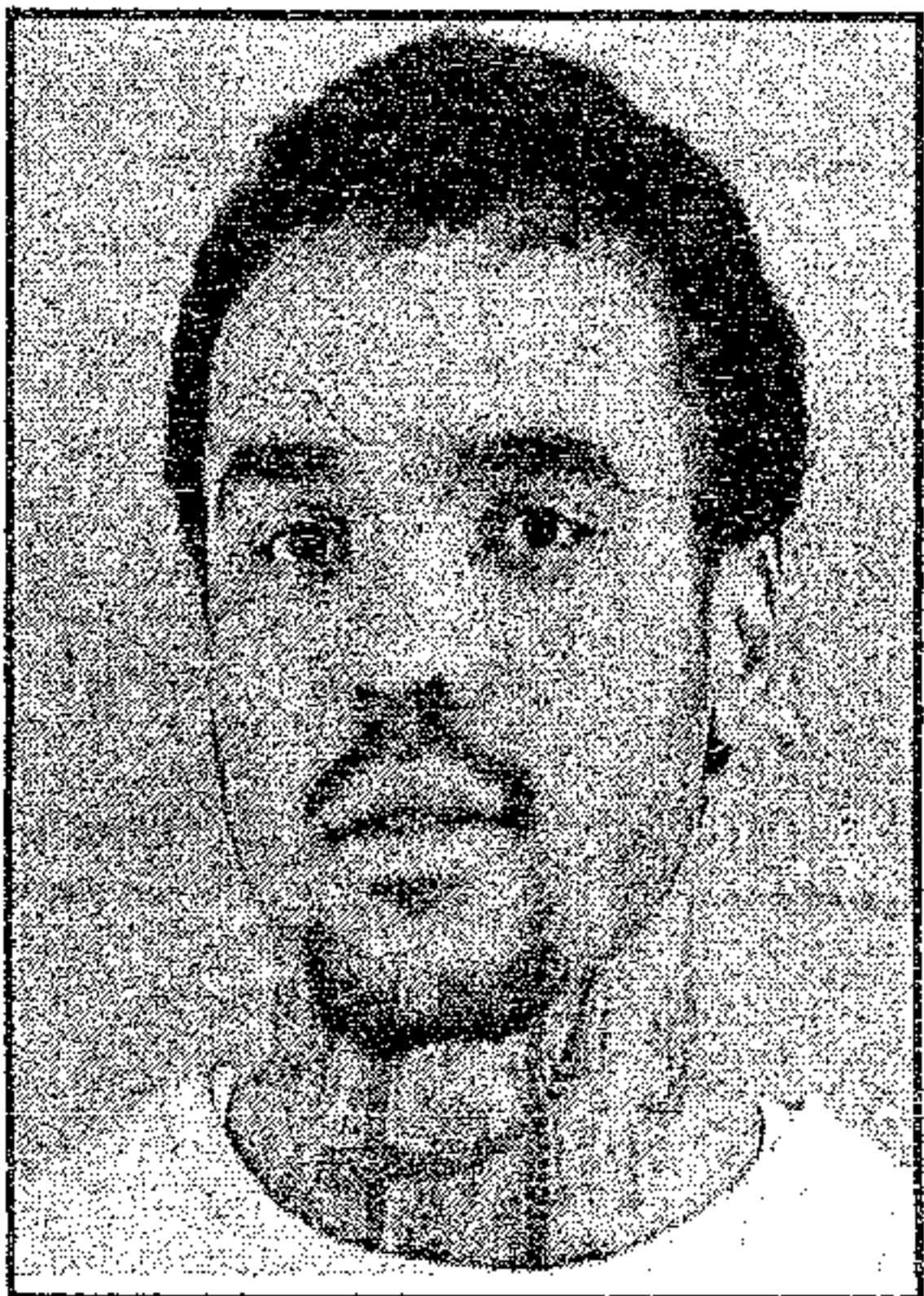

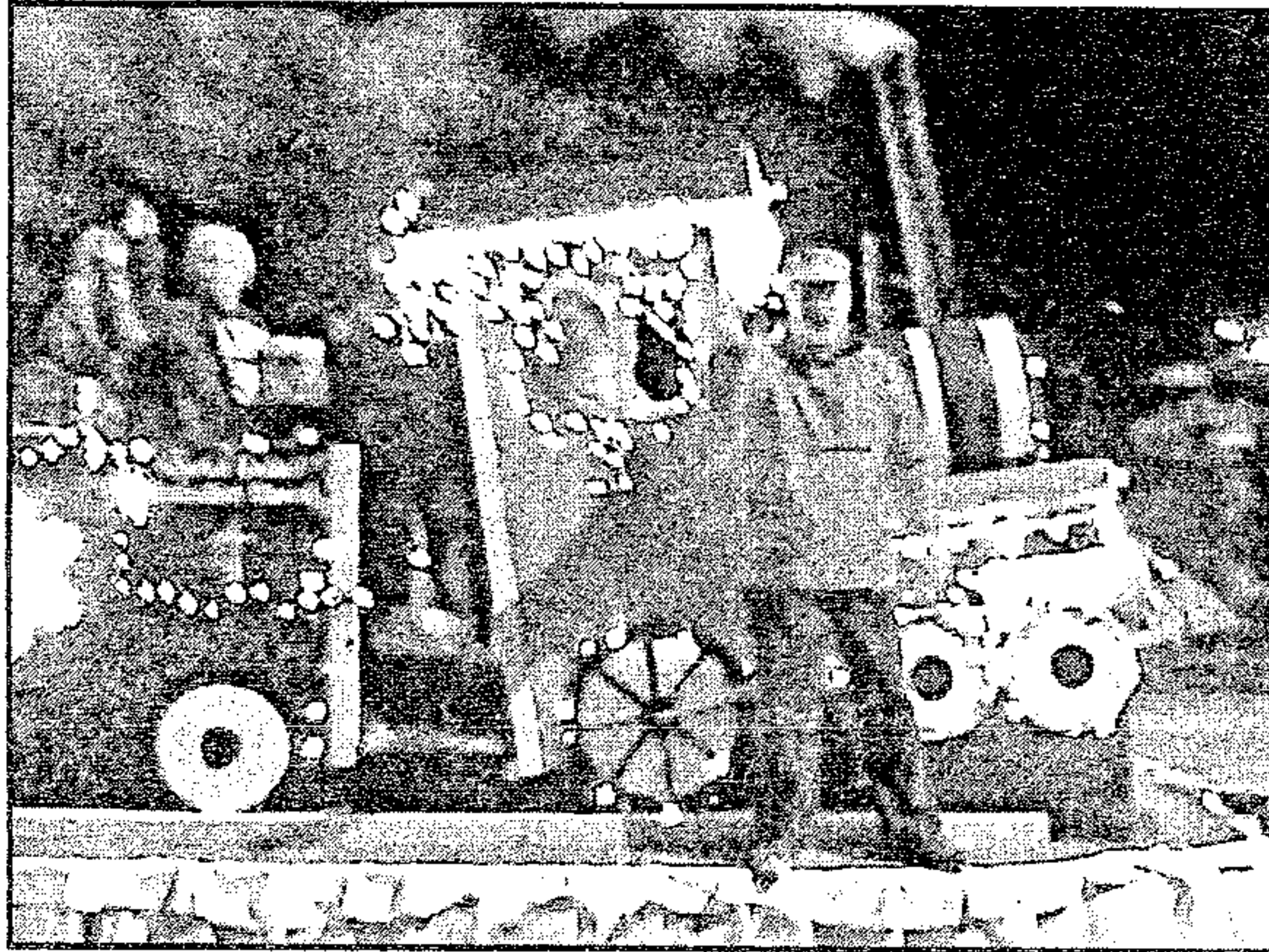

Kimberly Ann Loviolette, 44, of Mills Court, Lovettsville, VA, was charged with possession of schedule II methadone, possession of schedule IV Clonazepam, possession of schedule IV Xanax, possession of schedule IV Valium, and possession of schedule VI.

Officer Bennie Houser, LPD made the arrest.

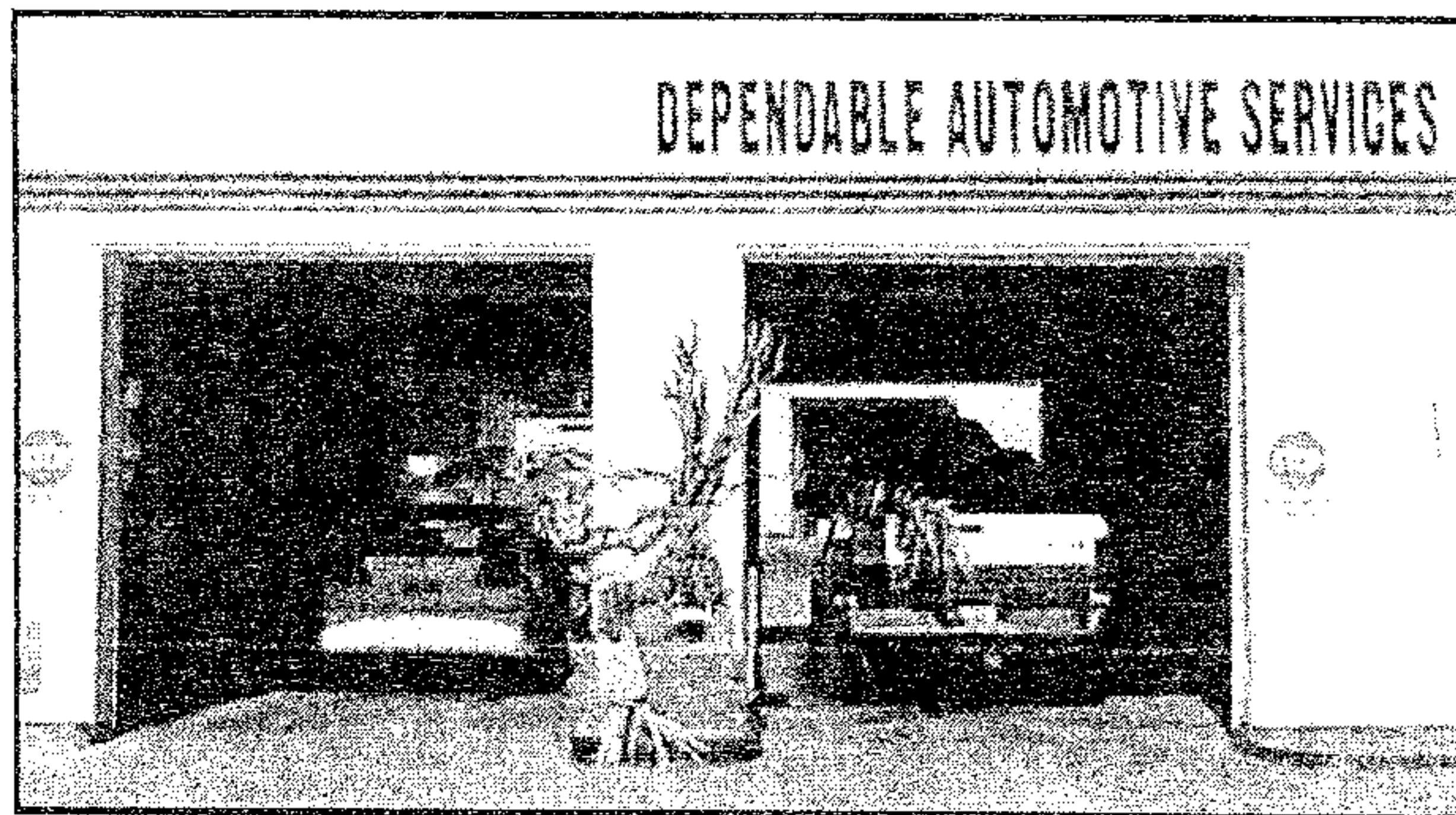

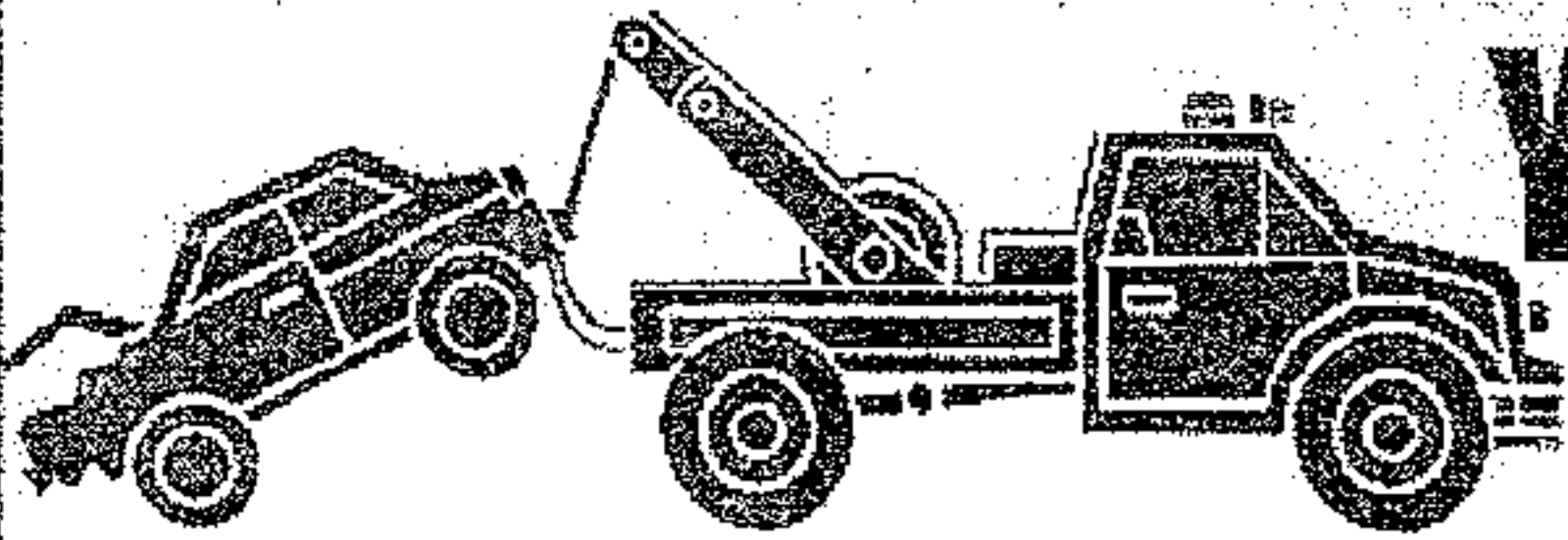

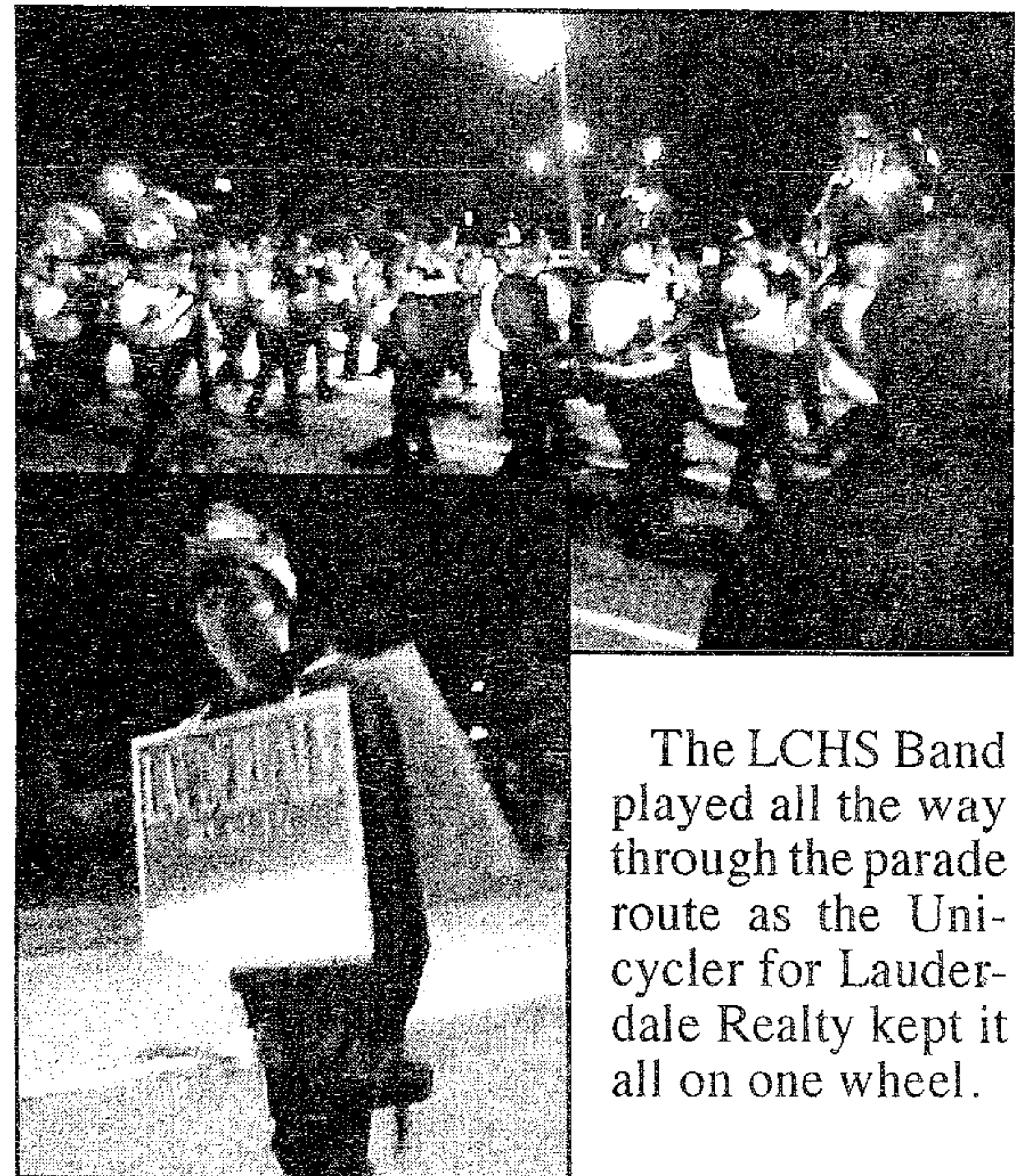

According to reports, Officer Jason Felts, LCPD responded to US Cellular in reference to a theft. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with the complainants Kimberly Lance and Edwin Gwin, an agent for US Cellular. During the course of the officers investigation the officer found that Gary Hampton and Randall Wells entered the US Cellular Store and Hampton was keeping the clerk, Mr. Gwin, occupied while Randall Wells entered the store room and removed several phones. The phones included an HTC Wildfire valued at

\$390, a HTC Merge valued at \$375 and two Motorola Electrify phones valued at \$599 each.

Ms. Wells then sold one of the Motorola Electrify phones to Kimberly Lance for \$140 at Game Stop in Lenoir City. Mr. Hampton was with Ms. Wells when she sold the phone at Game Stop. Ms. Wells had the other Motorola Electrify phones in her possession with Mr. Hampton at Five Guys Burgers and Fries and when contacted about it Mr. Hampton was in possession of the \$140 from the previous sale.

Ms. Wells was also in possession of the other two phones, HTC Wild-

fire and HTC Merge that were located in her purse.

Randall Branagon Wells, aka Randy, 25, of Vale Street, Loudon, was charged with theft over \$500.

Gary Marquis Hampton, 22, of Riverbend Road, Loudon, was charged with criminal responsibility for facilitation of a felony.
