Pillbillies

According to reports, Officer Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF spoke with Sharon Campbell during a narcotics investigation in Lenoir City. Ms. Campbell stated she was in possession of 45 thirty

milligram Oxycodone pills that were given to her by Gary Leach from his prescription. Ms. Campbell does not have a prescription but was found to be selling large amounts of Oxycodone and receiving medication as payment

from numerous individuals on a monthly basis. These pills were payment for paying for Mr. Leaches trip to the doctor and medication costs.

Mr. Leach reported to Agent Deboer he had gone to a pain clinic in

Chattanooga and received approximately 196 thirty milligram pills. Mr. Leach then distributed the pills to several people in the vehicle with him. By his own admission Mr. Leach gave 30+ oxycodone pills to at least 2 occupants of the vehicle. The pills were recovered and believed to be given to these individuals as payment for pills given to him in the last month.

Agent DeBoer also spoke with Amy Voyles and during a search found a container with 10 blue pills believed to be oxycodone along with a cut straw and pill crusher.

Gary Wayne Leach, 46, of E. Central Avenue, Lafollette, was charged with sale and

delivery of schedule II. Sharon Campbell, 37, of Ivey Dale Road, Lafollette, was charged with possession of schedule II.

Amy Lynn Voyles, 28, of N. Hwy 25W, Duff, was charged with possession of schedule II and possession of drug paraphernalia. Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD made the arrests and filed the charges.

In another bust, Agent Deboer observed the occupants of a white Chevy Tahoe meet with individuals in a white Honda Accord in the back of a parking lot on Hwy 321. The agent observed what appeared to be a hand to hand transaction take place between these occupants and followed the vehicle. While behind the vehicle the agent observed the window tint was darker than

Report

to 16 fatalities during last year's Thanksgiving Day holiday period. If the 2011 preliminary number holds true, it will

mark the lowest number of fatalities on record during the Thanksgiving holiday. Previously, the fewest number of vehicular fatalities was seven,

which occurred during the 1983 Thanksgiving Day period.

The 2011 Thanksgiving holiday reflect the time period from 6 p.m.,

Wednesday, November 23 through midnight, Sunday, November 27, 2011. Six people, including four vehicle occupants, were killed in six fatal crashes during this year's Thanksgiving holiday period. The six crashes occurred in Coffee, Henry, Knox (three), and Madison counties. (The wreck in Madison County was a deer-related fatality.) Four of the six crashes (67%) involved alcohol. One pedestrian and one motorcyclist were also killed.

In 2010, there were 16 fatalities during the four-day Thanksgiving holiday weekend and 10 fatalities were recorded in 2009. The highest number of people killed during a Thanksgiving holiday period happened in 1966, when 34 people died in crashes on Tennessee roadways.

The Tennessee Highway Patrol kicked off the holiday period with a high-visibility enforcement campaign, including bar checks, line and saturation patrols and stationary observations. Additionally, State Troopers conducted more than 60 sobriety and driver license checkpoints across the state.

Beginning at midnight on Thanksgiving Day

(Thurs., Nov. 24) through midnight on Sunday, November, 27, the THP issued 1,366 citations for speeding and 165 seatbelt violations for motorists age 18 and over, and apprehended 60 driving under the influence (DUI) violators statewide. State Troopers also assisted 450 motorists on Tennessee roadways.

On the eve of Thanksgiving, the THP Chattanooga District achieved its goal of reducing the number of interstate service calls from 77 in 2010 to 58 this year, by strategically placing troopers on Interstate 24 and Interstate 75 during the heaviest travel period (3 p.m. - 11 p.m.). They also utilized five Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) message boards and 10 fog zone message boards to further enhance a law enforcement presence.

As of December 2nd, preliminary statistics indicate that 860 people have died on Tennessee roadways in 2011, a decrease of 123 deaths compared to 983 fatalities at this same time a year ago.

Please note the official traffic fatality count may rise due to delays in reporting from municipalities and classification of traffic fatalities.

regulation and stopped the Tahoe. The driver was identified as Martin Davis. Mr. Davis had slurred speech and his eyes were blood-shot. The agent asked for permission to search the vehicle. The passenger of the vehicle was identified as Kenneth Sparks. Found in the center console was 2 bags containing 3 pill bottles in each. Three of the bottles belonged to Mr. Davis and three of them belonged to an unknown individual. These bottles contained approximately 137 Oxycodone thirty milligram pills, 79 Alprazolam pills and 56 Ibuprofen 800mg pills. Neither Mr. Davis or Mr. Sparks claimed possession of the narcotics so both were charged.

Kenneth Lee Sparks, 45, of E. Central Ave, Lafollette, and Christopher Martin Davis, 42, of Rose Hill Drive, Lafollette, were charged with possession of schedule II Oxycodone for resale, possession of schedule IV Alprazolam for resale, and possession of a legend drug. Officer Brendan Deboer, 9th DTF made the arrests and filed the charges.

In yet another bust, according to the report, Agent Jeff Vittatoe, 9th DTF stopped the driver of a 2000 Honda Odyssey that was stopped off Hwy 321 for crossing over the white line of the road. As the agent approached the vehicle he observed a passenger in the vehicle trying to hide items within the vehicle.

Samuel West and all

four passengers were asked to exit the vehicle and be patted down for weapons. As Samuel West exited the agent observed a cut straw in the floor of the vehicle on the driver side. The vehicle was owned and operated by Samuel West with the cut straw containing a white powder substance believed to be Oxycodone. Further investigation revealed Mr. West was also in lawful possession of Oxycodone tablets prescribed to him and that all parties in the vehicle were involved in the unlawful obtaining and distribution of schedule II controlled substances. A passenger, Jason McCarty exited the vehicle and the agent observed something in his left hand. When asked what he had, Jason stated it

was a straw and gave it to the agent.

Samuel Kenton West, 40, of Adam Hollow Road, Pioneer, was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia.

Jason Lee McCarty, 31, of Coolidge Road, Lafollette, was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia. Agent Jeff Vittatoe, 9th DTF made the arrests and filed the charges.
