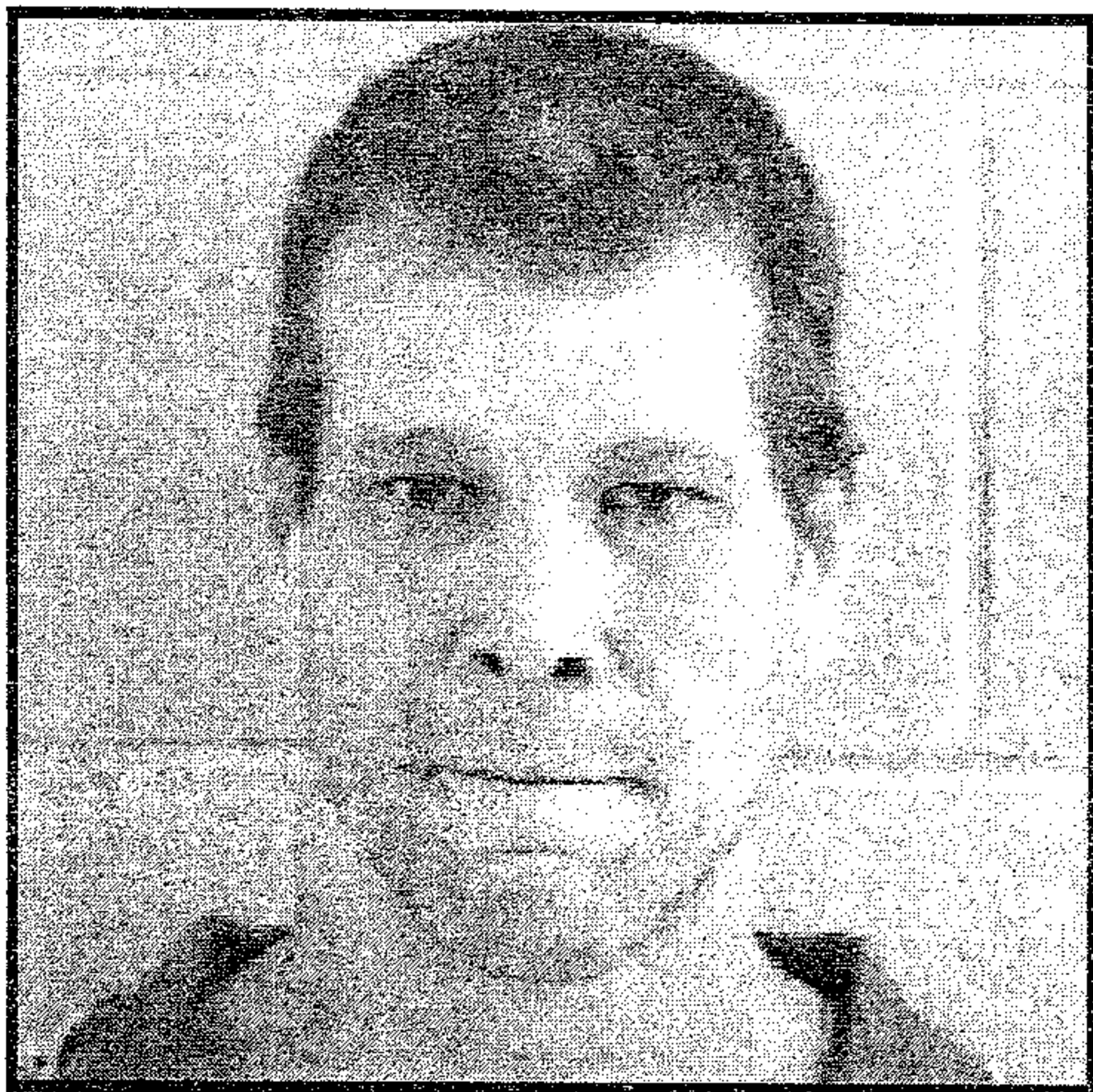


Stabbing opens up can of worms for local man

A Lenoir City man's alleged violence got the eyes of the law turned upon him after he reportedly stabbed another man at a Philadelphia residence in late January. Subsequent investigation led lawmen to a Philadelphia inn and while interviewing witnesses about an assault the man was involved in, information was revealed that he had also been allegedly forging stolen checks.

Ronald Lynn Helton, Jr., Mincey Street, Lenoir City was charged with aggravated assault and forgery.

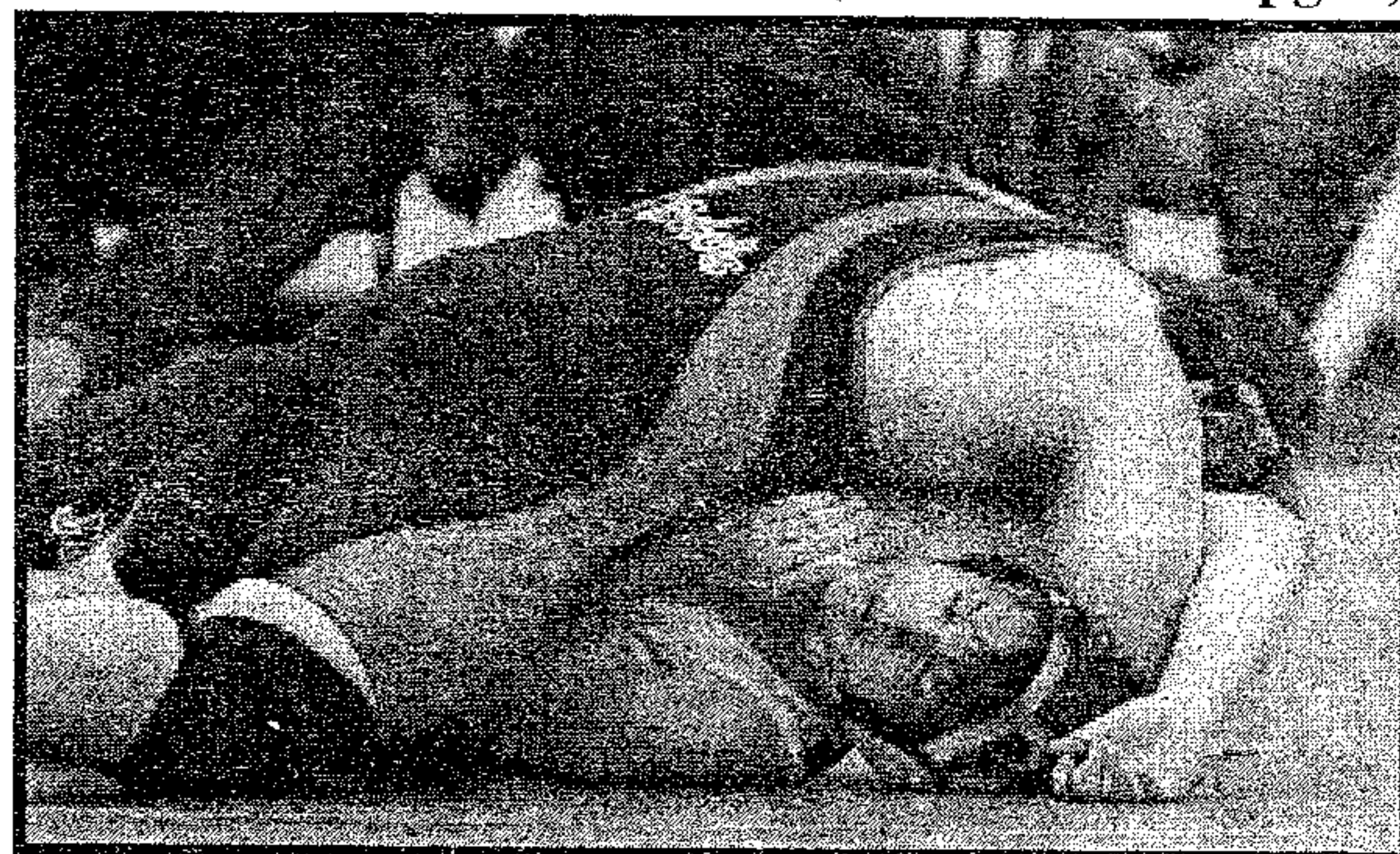

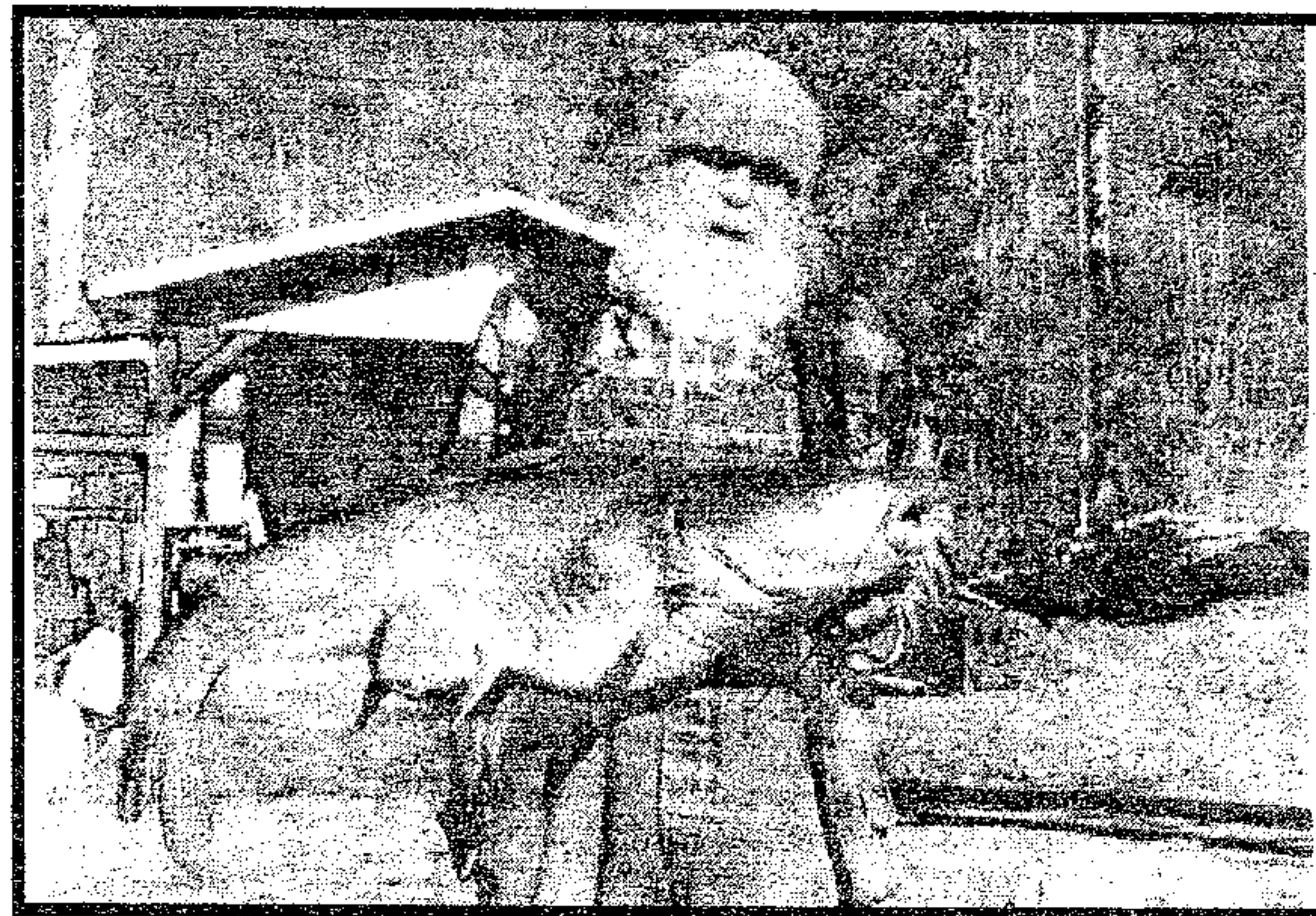

the state's fish hatchery programs will be on the agenda when the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission convenes Feb. 23-24 in Nashville.

The commission will hold committee meetings beginning at 1 p.m. on Feb. 23 in the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency Region II Ray Bell Building. The formal commission meeting starts at 9 a.m. on Feb. 24. The public is invited to attend each day.

TWRA Montgomery County Wildlife officers Jereme

Odom and Dale Grandstaff will be at the meeting and answer questions from commission members on the agency's involvement, along with Kentucky and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in the investigation of trophy deer being poached off Fort Campbell. A video from a December press conference will be viewed.

Bobby Wilson, TWRA Fisheries Division Chief, will give a presentation highlighting the improvements in the statewide cold water and warm water fish production program within the state over the past six years. The report

will include the progress to this point and future plans for the program.

The commission will hear an update on the Cumberland River Aquatics Center in Gallatin with the current projects and upcoming plans for the facility.

The February meeting will mark the final scheduled one for three TWRC members. Mike Chase (Knoxville), Johnny Coleman (Livingston), and Mike Hayes (Samburg), are scheduled to have their commission appointments conclude at the end of February.

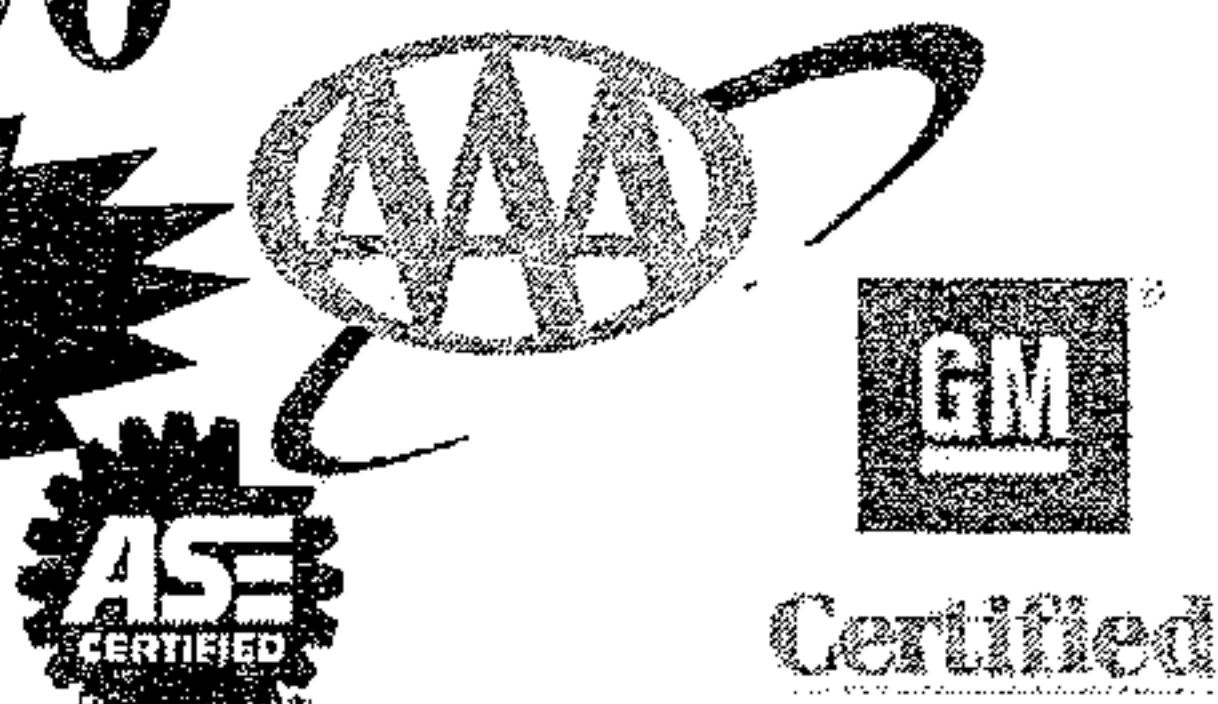

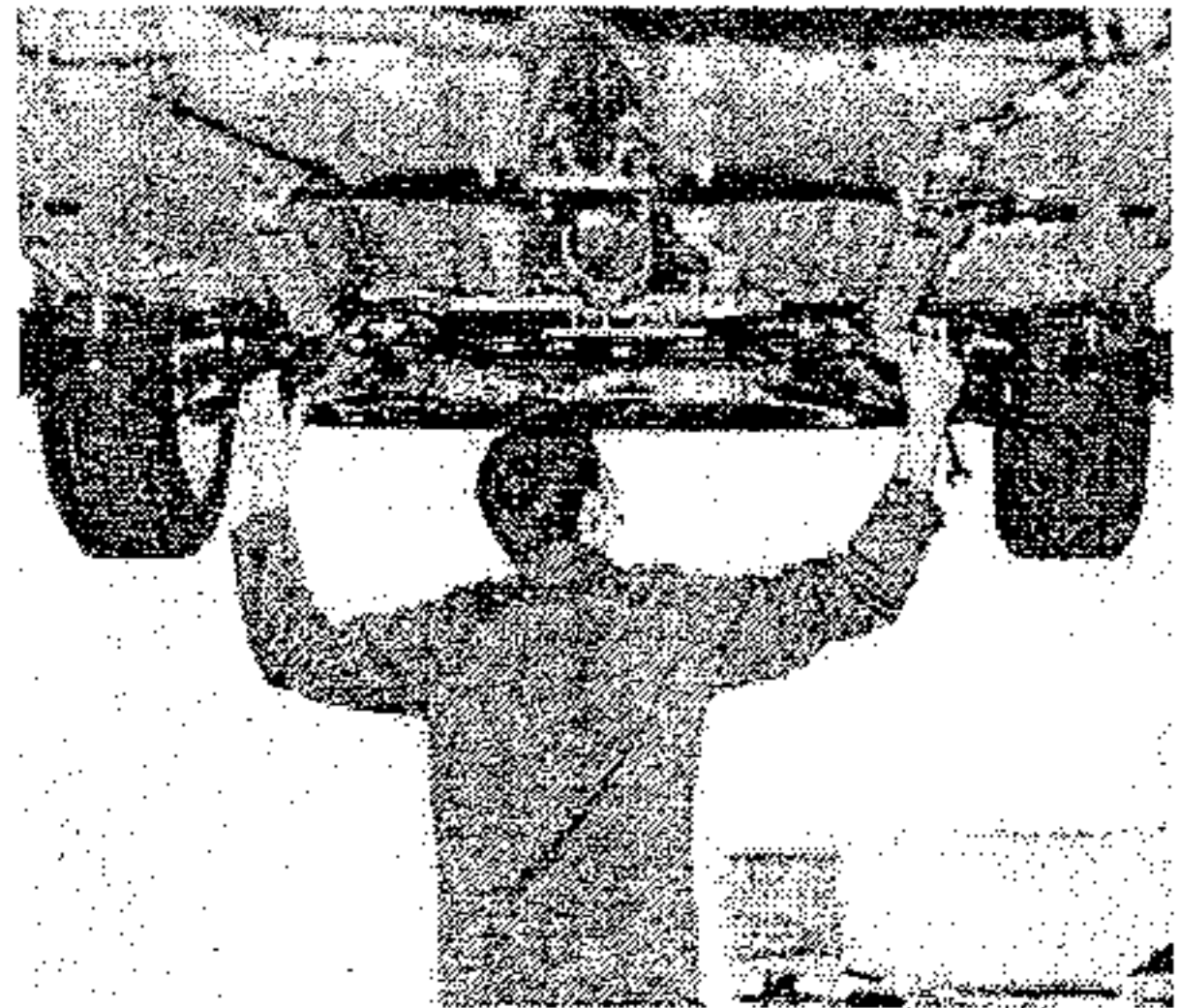

Helton

According to affidavits; on or about January 24th, 2011, Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO-CID and other Loudon County deputies were dispatched to Christian Street in Philadelphia to investigate a stabbing where the victim had received a stab wound to his back and was taken to Park West Hospital for treatment.

Records indicate the victim had gotten into a fight at a residence on Christian Street and witnesses stated Mr. Ronald Helton was involved in the fight and had stabbed the victim. Helton fled the scene before the arrival of law en-

forcement.

The victim's ID was found in the yard and blood was found in the grass.

After processing the crime scene, LCSO's Detective Jeff Russell, Deputy Brandon Dixon and Lt. Upton proceeded to Park West Hospital to speak with the victim. He advised he was at a Christian Street residence and got into an altercation with several subjects. The victim was shown a six person line-up and immediately picked out the photo of Ronald Helton, Jr. as the person who had stabbed him.

According to other records, on January 25th, 2011, at approximately 8:00 AM, Lt. Upton was at the Sunrise Inn on West Lee Highway in Philadelphia investigating an assault case on Mr. Helton. While there, he talked with the owner of the Sunrise Inn who advised Mr. Helton had produced three different checks for rent and cash. The checks were written on the account of Mr. Brad Evans of Loudon and the account was from Green Bank. The checks were stolen from Mr. Evans and forged. On January 17th, 2011, Helton produced check number 1020 on the stolen account and presented it for payment and cash to the Sunrise Inn for the amount of \$202. The check had his name and driver's license number on it.

The checks were used without the consent of the victim, Brad Evans.

Deputy Brad Rayfield, LCSO served the warrants and made the arrest Tuesday.

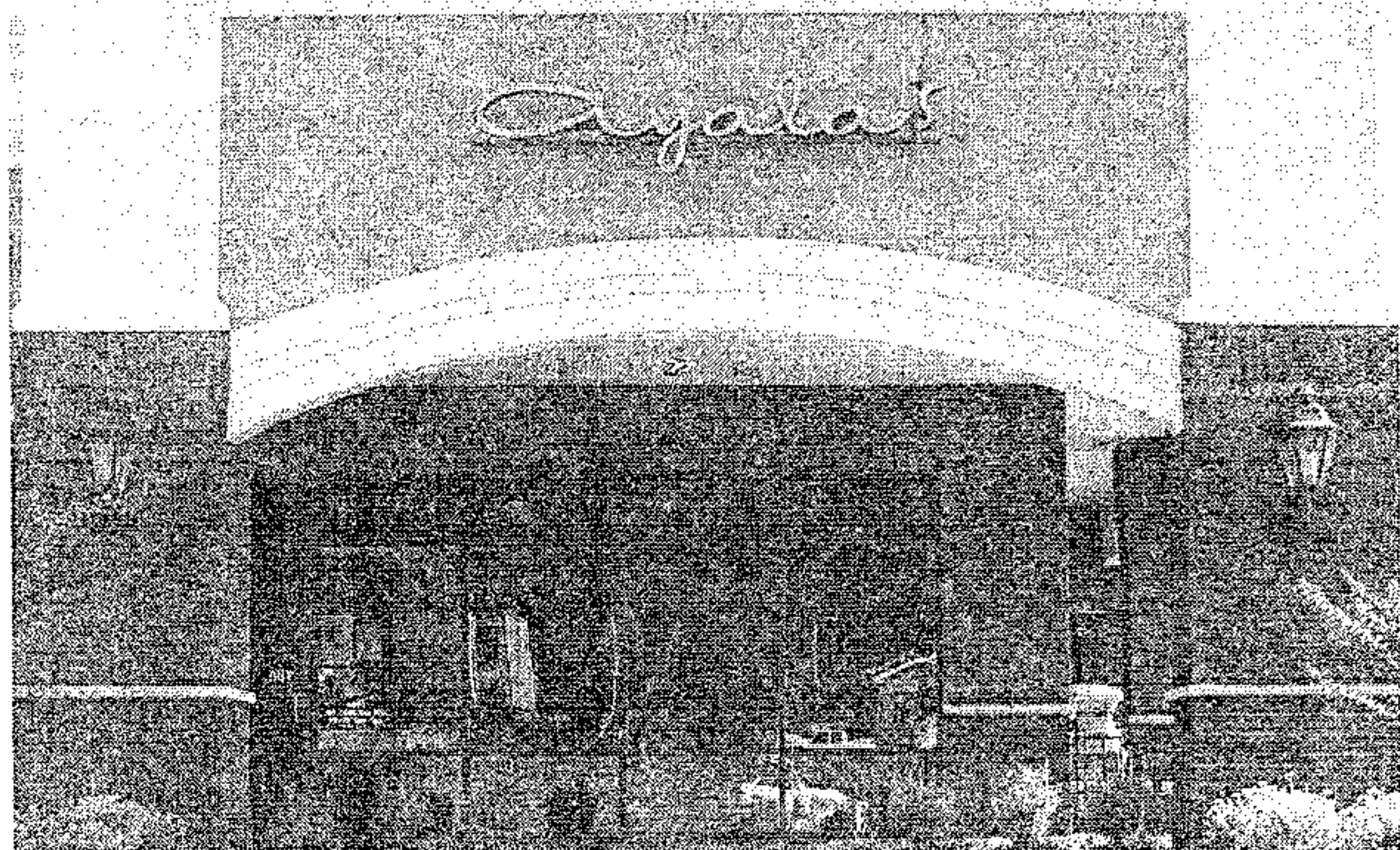
