

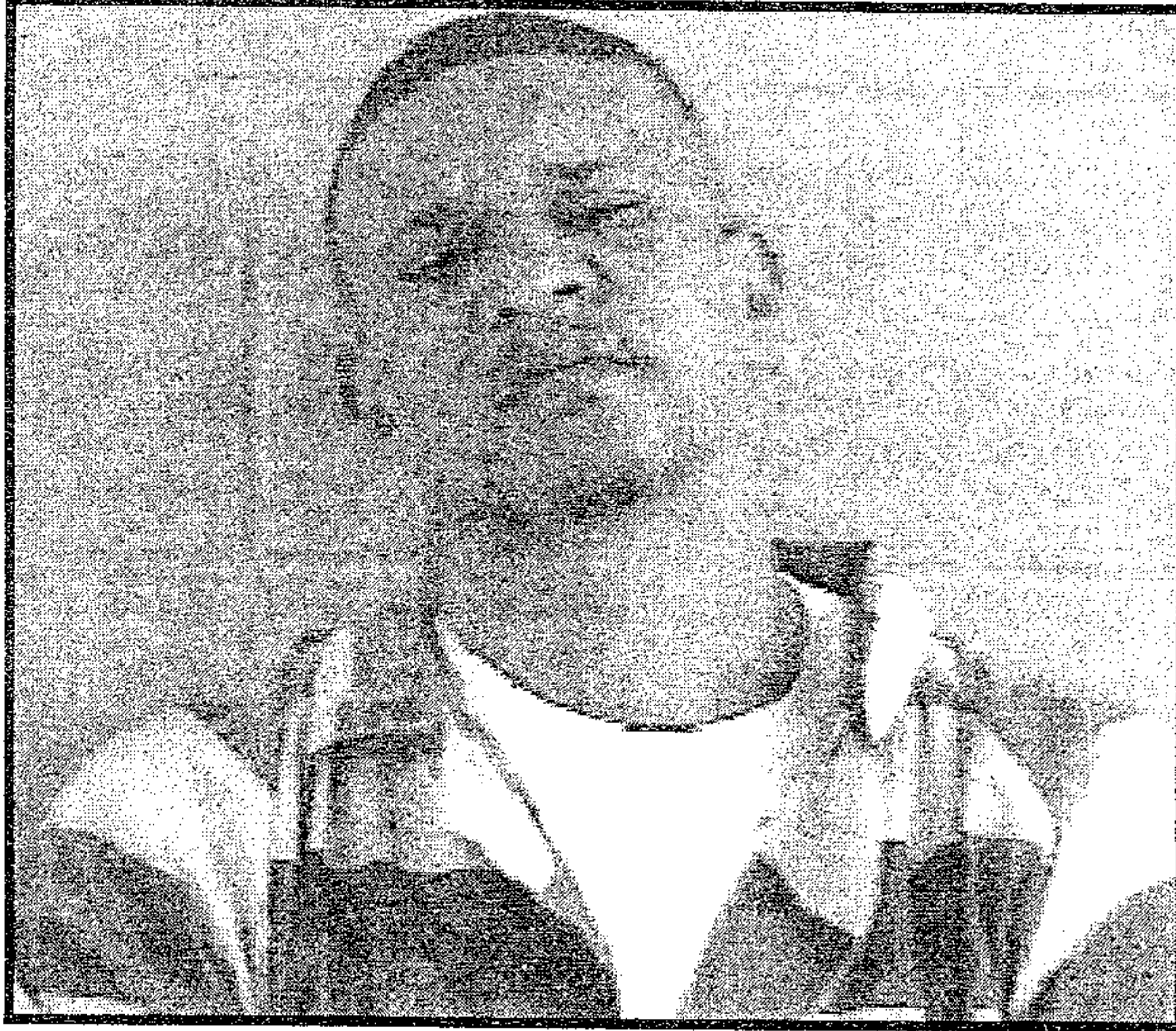

NASHVILLE – Tennessee Gov. Bill Haslam announced the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has

granted his request for a disaster declaration for Knox and eight contiguous counties in Tennessee following the severe

Unlicensed drivers continue driving

From driving under the influence of alcohol and having no insurance, to driving unregistered vehicles, unlicensed drivers continue to use the roadways despite not following the law and becoming legally licensed to drive in the State of Tennessee.

Mario Eduardo Ca-

hue-Garcia, 21, North G Street, Lenoir City, was charged with driving without a license.

According to reports, Saturday at approximately 5:48 AM, Deputy Robbie Lane, LCSO was on Highway 72 near the Interstate 75 south bound off ramp when a maroon Saturn

pulled off the ramp and almost hit him.

Deputy Lane ran the registration and the tag came back to a GMC Jimmy. He stopped the Saturn on Highway 72 at Corporate Park Drive and made contact with the driver, Mr. Garcia.

Mr. Garcia told the lawman he didn't have

a license or insurance, and the car belonged to his uncle. He went on to say they took the license plate off their truck and put it on the car to drive it to work.

Deputy Lane ran Mr. Garcia's identification number with dispatch and it came back unlicensed. Mr. Garcia

Mr. Garcia also received citations for financial responsibility and driving an unregistered vehicle.

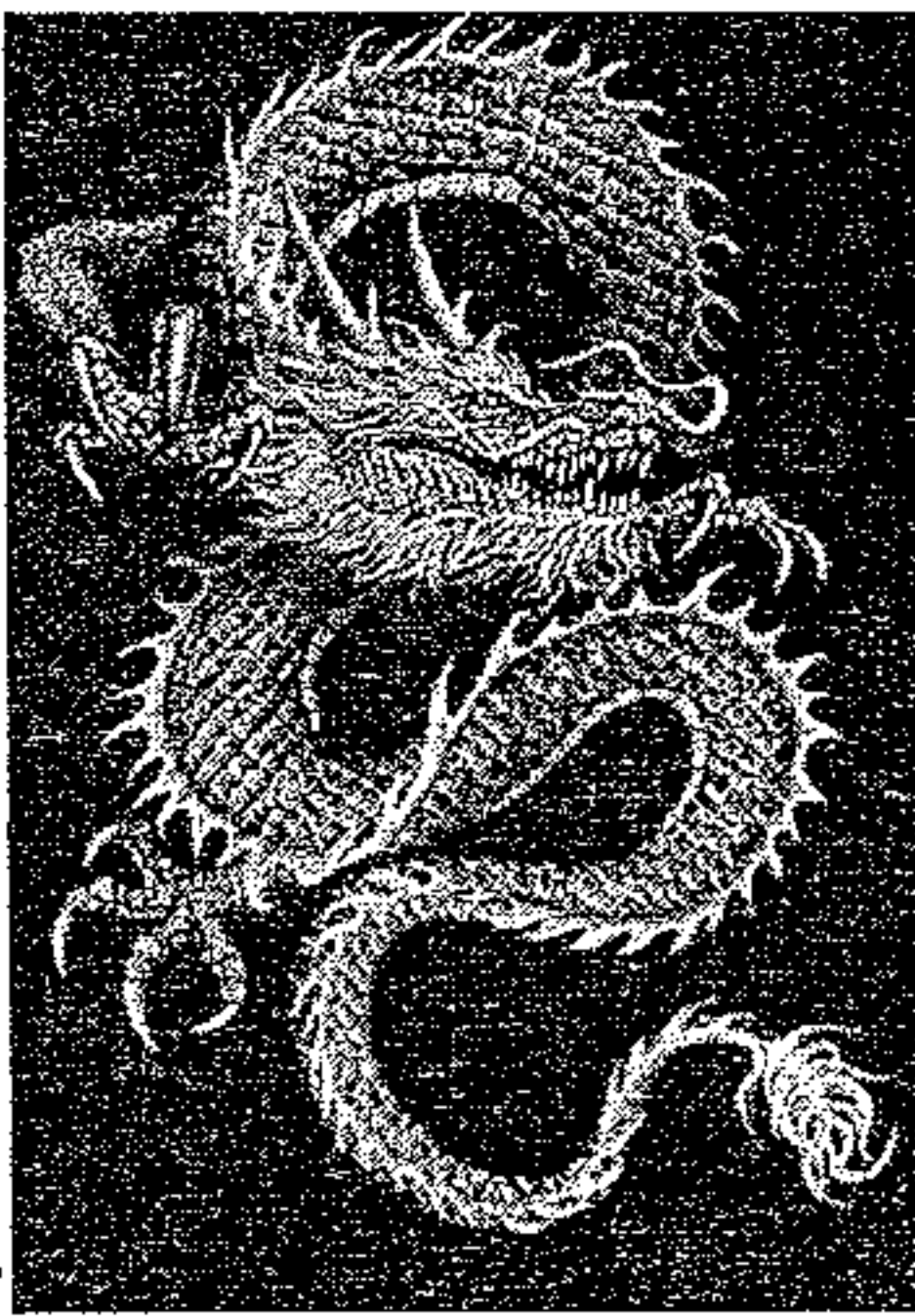

substance hydrocodone, and possession of schedule IV controlled substance alprazolam.

According to records, Officer Kevin Condee, LCPD noticed a burgundy Ford Focus swerve into the oncoming lane twice while traveling on City Park Drive. After activating his emergency lights he saw the back seat passenger, later identified as Travis Del-

ane Brown, making furtive movements, as he appeared to be attempting to conceal something under the seat or in his pants.

The officer stopped the vehicle at the overlook. He spoke with Brown and the other occupants in the car and for officers safety, Brown was asked to exit the vehicle so he could be checked for weapons.

storms and flooding in February.

"The notice we received from the federal government is welcome news for Tennesseans in these counties," said Haslam. "I'm pleased the federal government has granted this declaration to provide them some relief."

An SBA disaster declaration makes homeowners and businesses affected by the disaster eligible for low interest

loans. In this case, the rate for homeowners will be 2.56 percent or 5.12 percent, depending on whether they can get credit elsewhere, and business rates range from 4 to 6 percent.

SBA declarations make victims in adjacent counties eligible for aid as well, so the declaration includes the Tennessee counties of Anderson, Blount, Grainger, Jefferson, Loudon, Roane, Sevier and Union.

Those affected have until May 23, 2011, to apply for relief from physical damage and until Dec. 23, 2011, to

apply for relief from economic injury caused by the Feb. 28, 2011, storms and flooding.

following last year's bipartisan effort that led to the First to the Top legislation and the Race to the Top award. We have many great teachers in Tennessee, and we can have even more.

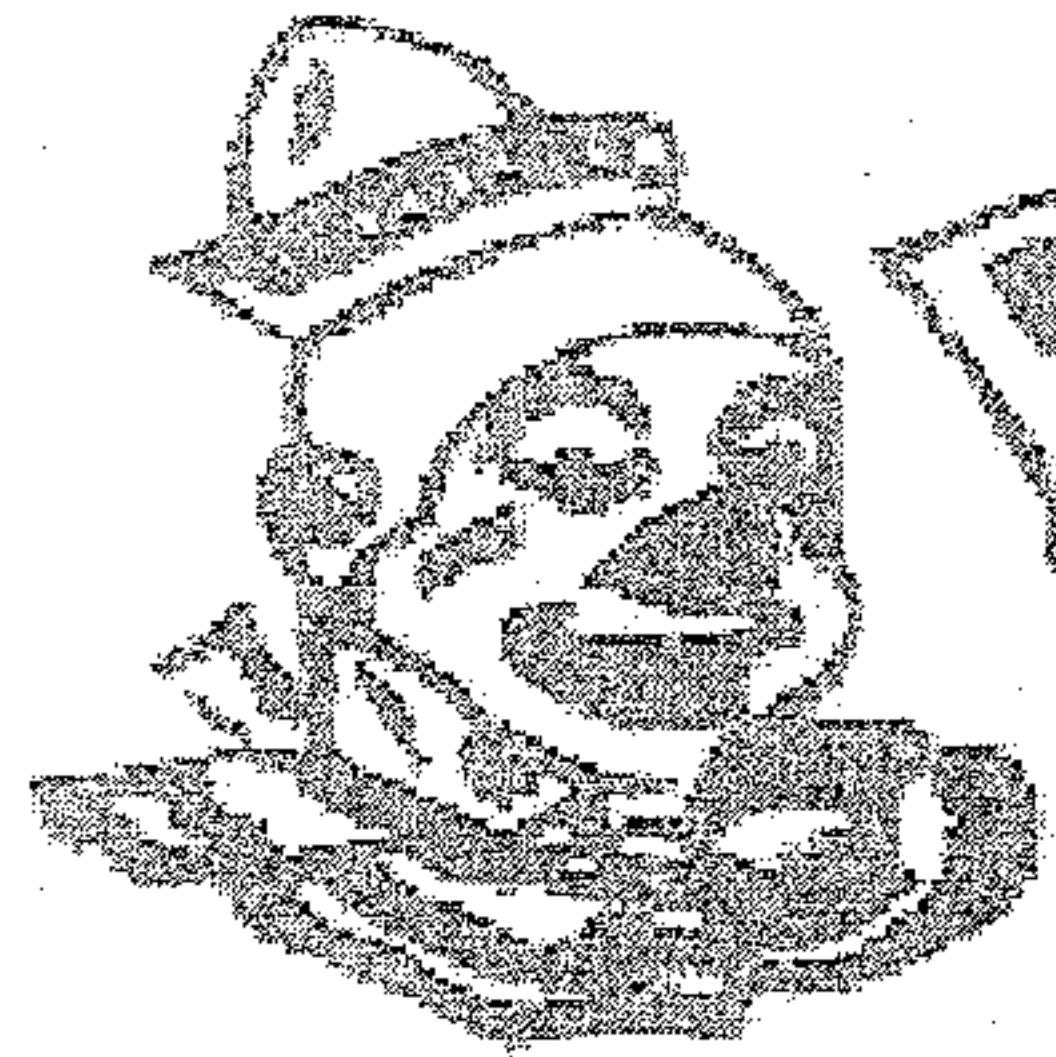
"If our goal in education is to grow the number of college graduates and provide a better educated work force for employers looking

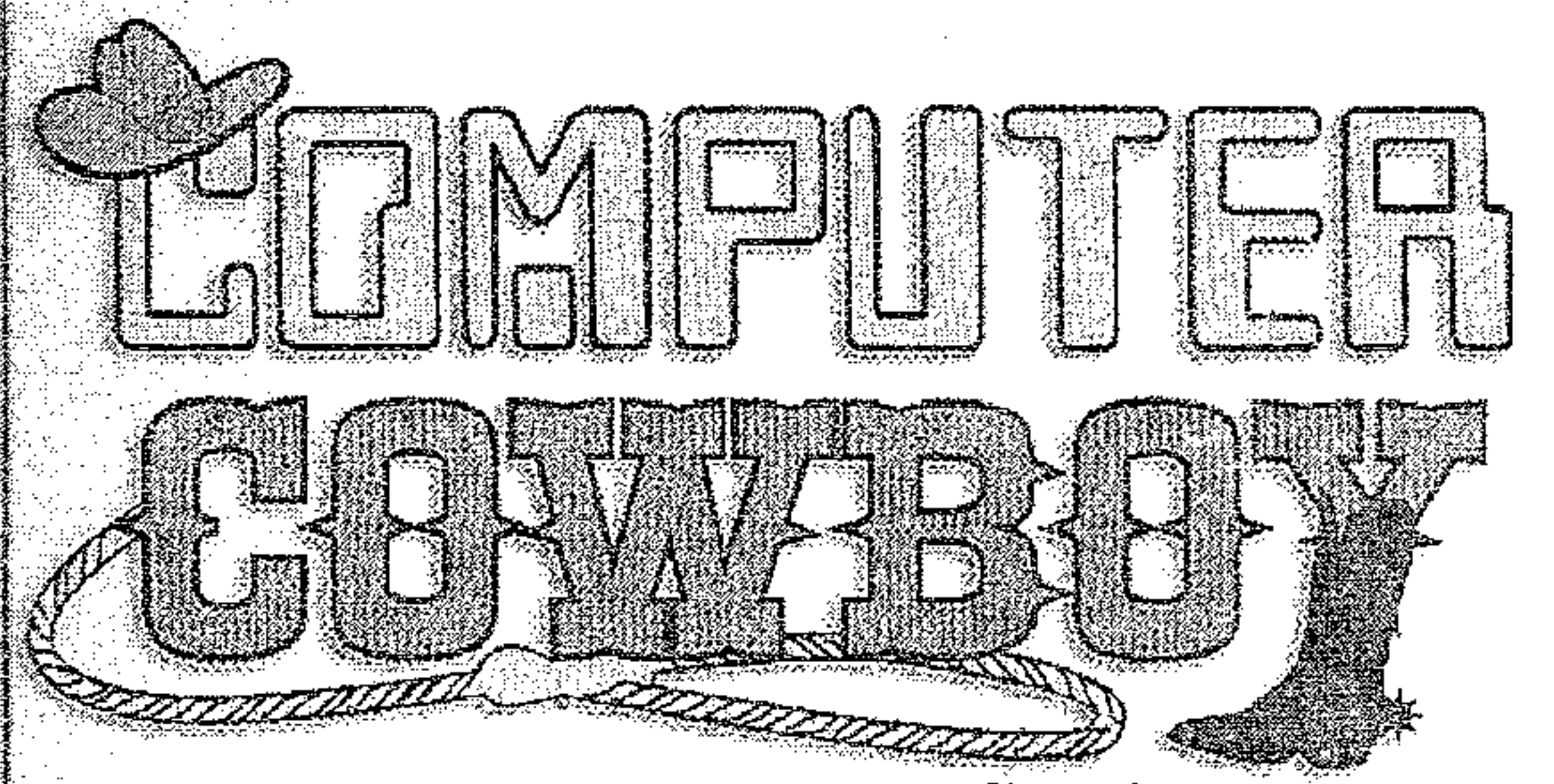
