fied as Benjamin Greer.

The passenger of the vehicle was identified as Johnnie Rhondda Duckett. A check was run and showed Duckett to have too many purchases of pseudo products for 2011.

In the weeks prior the drug task force has encountered an abnormally large number of people traveling from neighboring counties, specifically Monroe County, to purchase Sudafed from Loudon area

pharmacies. During these encounters these individuals have been found to possess numerous types of illegal narcotics, drug paraphernalia and dangerous chemicals and precursors used in the manufacture of methamphetamine.

Ms. Duckett reported she was receiving \$50 for the box of Sudafed she purchased from a meth cook known to the officers through prior investigations.

Upon arrival at the jail Ms. Duckett was searched and she

was found to have a plastic bag containing 4.5 grams of white powder that tested positive for meth and a glass pipe.

Johnnie Rhondda Duckett, 38, of Daughtery Springs Road, Tellico Plains, was charged with promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine, possession of schedule II (meth) for resale, possession of drug paraphernalia and introduction of narcotics into a penal facility.

During a search of the driver, Mr. Benjamin Greer officers

found a hypodermic needle along with a small plastic bag containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana in his shirt pocket. A search of the vehicle resulted in locating a .25 caliber handgun under the driver's seat and a machete next to the drivers seat. Also found was numerous types of drug paraphernalia to include cut straws and a digital scale. Mr. Greer was found to be a convicted felon.

Benjamin E. Greer, 30, of Daughtery Springs road, Tellico Plains, was charged with possession of a firearm by convicted felon, simple possession of schedule VI, possession of drug paraphernalia and prohibited weapon. Officer Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF made the arrests.

ultimately stopped and confronted, the odor of marijuana wafted out of his car and he was found to be in possession of the illicit weed.

After he removed the plastic cover on the console Deputy Hall discovered approximately 12 grams of marijuana hidden in a natural void under the center console. The driver, identified as Zachary Keylon claimed the marijuana as his.
