

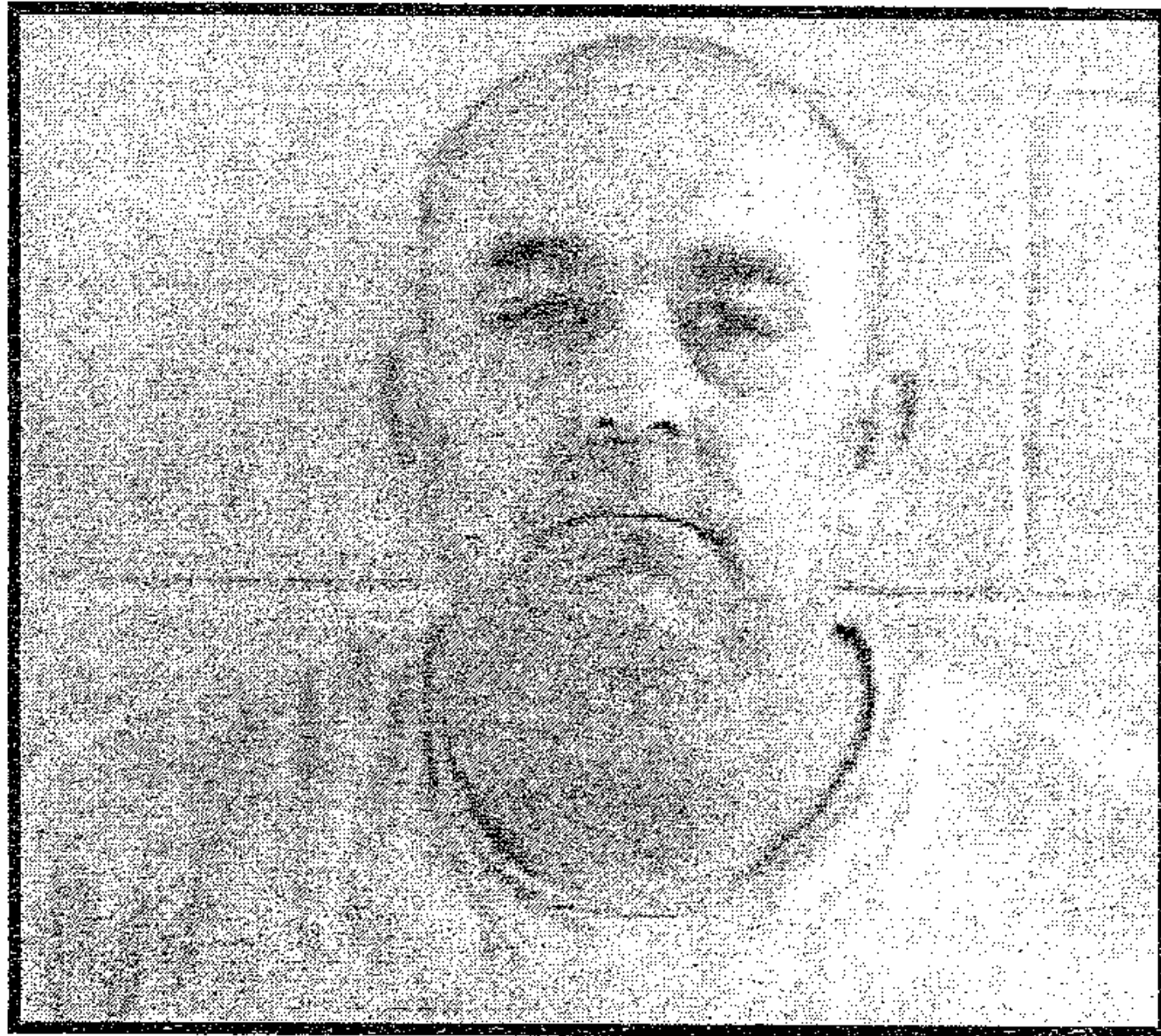
Burglary faked to cover money stolen for drugs

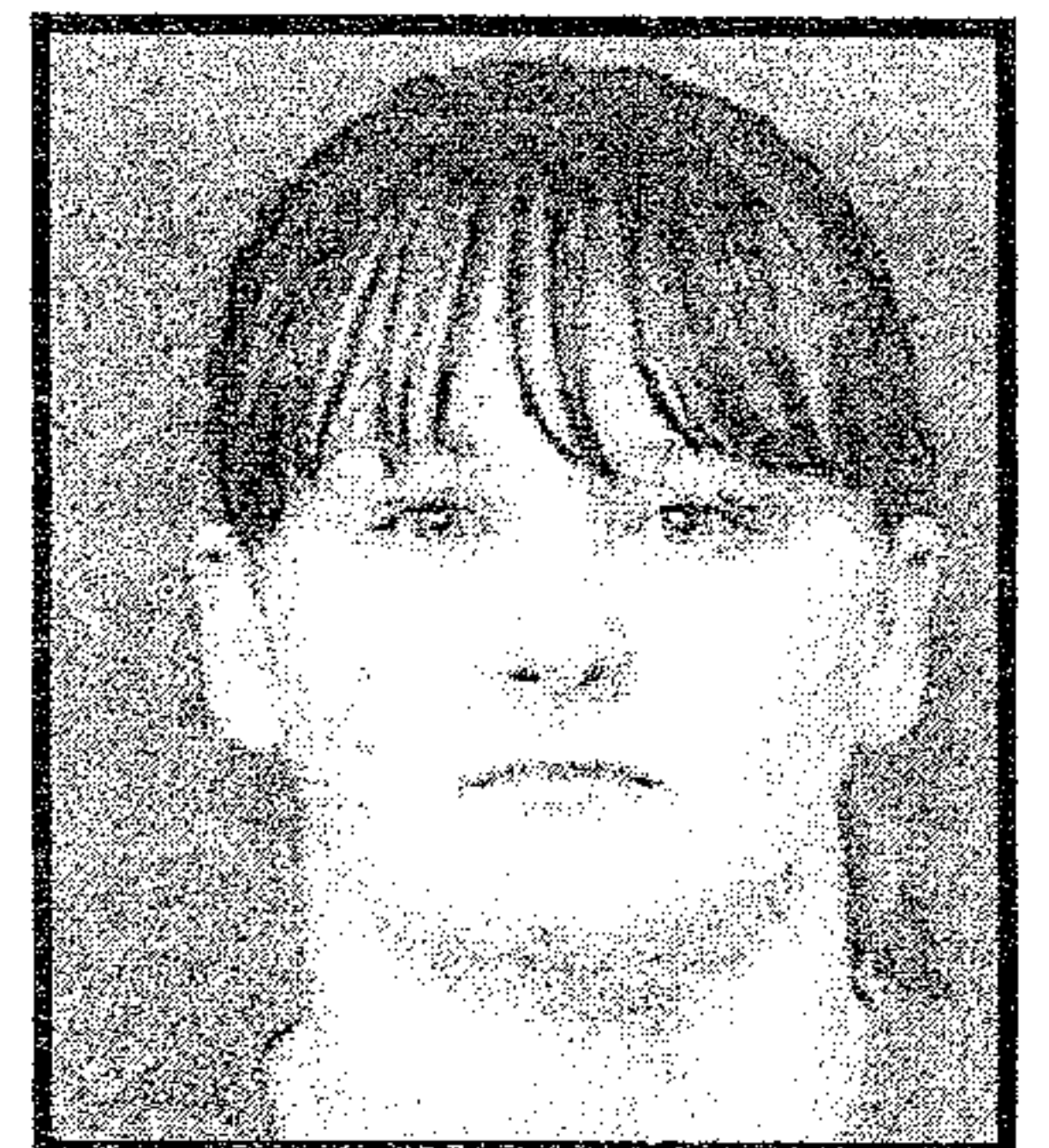

handgun while under the influence, and unlawful possession of a handgun.

According to reports, Officer Kevin Condee, LCPD responded to Chili's Restaurant in Lenoir City on a report of intoxicated individuals inside the restaurant. According to the restaurant manager there were four adults and one child there and three of them were falling asleep at the table.

Officer Condee made contact with the group after they left the restaurant and began to get in their vehicle, which was owned and operated by Jeremy Voiles.

Mr. Voiles had slurred speech and was unsteady on his feet. Mr. Voiles said he and his friends had been to Chattanooga to a methadone clinic and admitted he ingested methadone, which was apparently causing his intoxication.

Voiles was going to drive in his intoxicated state and would have posed a danger to the other people in the car and the public at large had he been allowed to drive away. Voiles admitted there were narcotics inside the car and said he had no problem with the officer searching it.

Officer Condee reported he discovered a Lorcin .380 semi-automatic pistol with a

loaded magazine in a zipper pouch of Voiles backpack in the front floorboard, easily within Voiles' reach. A large hunting knife with a blade length of approximately 12"-15" and a metal knuckle style handle was found tucked between the driver and passenger seat, also within Voiles's reach.

The officer also found two prescription bottles containing methadone, and both were prescribed to Voiles. Voiles was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Hannah Noelle Dressel, 19, Sunnywood Drive, Nashville was charged Saturday with DUI 1st offense, possession of alcohol underage, and violation of implied consent.

According to reports, Sgt. Jeramie Bowen, LCSO was dispatched to Interstate 75 at the 76 mile marker about a possible

drunk driver by an off duty officer from Knox County. Sgt. Bowen made contact with the red Mazda just past the 76 exit and witnessed the vehicle cross over the shoulder line.

When he turned his blue lights on, the Mazda swerved and almost hit the guard rail.

The driver was identified as Hannah Dressel and there was a strong odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. A bottle of Knob Creek Whiskey was in the seat and there was also a diet Coke bottle with a strong odor of alcohol inside of it.

The sgt. asked Dressel where she was going and she stated she was going to Massey Hall on the UT campus.

Ms. Dressel had very slurred speech and when asked to exit the vehicle she had to use it to keep her balance. She did poorly on field sobriety and refused implied consent. Ms. Dressel was placed under arrest.

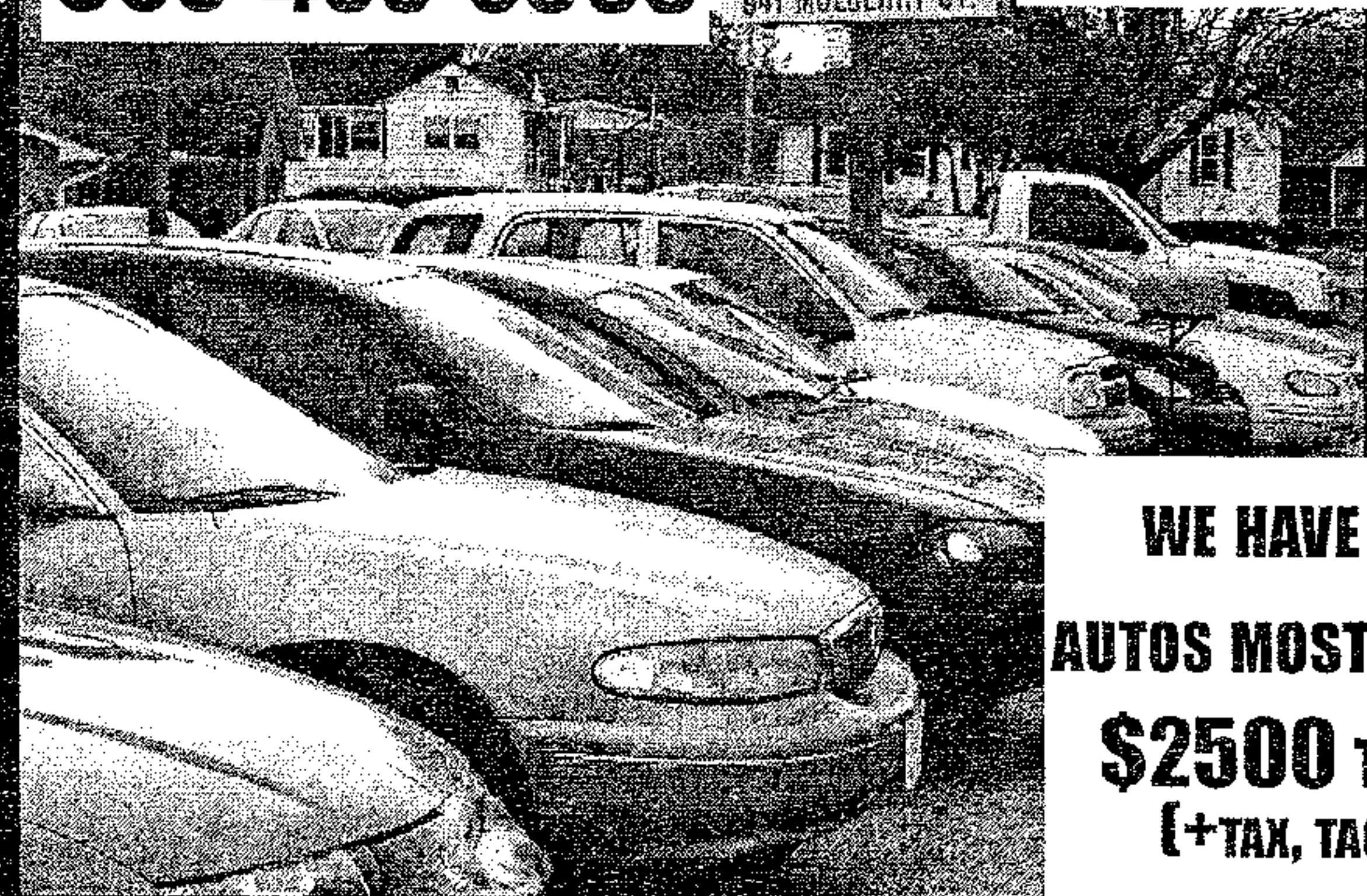

 ruary 5th, 2011, Mr. Larry Robinson reported to the Loudon County Sheriff's Office that his home he shared with a roommate had been burglarized. Mr. Robinson gave a verbal statement to Deputy Smith that an unknown person entered the residence while he was taking a shower by breaking the sliding glass door. He went on to say the only item he could find missing was \$350

cash that belonged to his roommate.

During the investigation, a witness was located and gave a statement saying she heard the door break, but didn't see anyone on the back deck of the residence.

On February 23rd, 2011, Detective Cosner spoke with Mr. Robinson about the incident and he admitted he took the money to buy drugs and he broke the glass to indicate someone came in and took the money.

Larry Robinson turned himself in at the Loudon County Jail Sunday, where Deputy Bruce Padgett, LCSO took him into custody.

According to records, around 12:35 AM, Saturday, Deputy Jason Goddard, LCSO witnessed a black Mazda RX8 traveling west on Highway 95 near Rudd Road at a high rate of speed. Radar clocked it at 64 mph in a 40 mph zone.

The deputy turned

around and attempted to catch up to the Mazda and it continued traveling west at a high rate of speed. It turned left onto Steele Road and continued speeding.

Deputy Goddard turned his emergency equipment on and the car pulled over. The driver was Jeffery Harris. Mr. Harris told the officer he was trying to run from him to keep from getting a speeding ticket.

Harris had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath and advised he'd drank twelve Bud Light Beers. He performed poorly on field sobriety tasks and was placed under arrest.

Mr. Harris had four passengers in the vehicle with him and they were all under the age of 18. Two passengers were 16 and the other two were 17 years old. There was an open case of Bud Light in the car and two of the underage passengers had consumed alcohol.

Mr. Harris was read the Tennessee Implied Consent Advisement and he agreed to a blood test. Deputy Goddard transported him to Fort Loudoun ER for the test and then on to jail.
