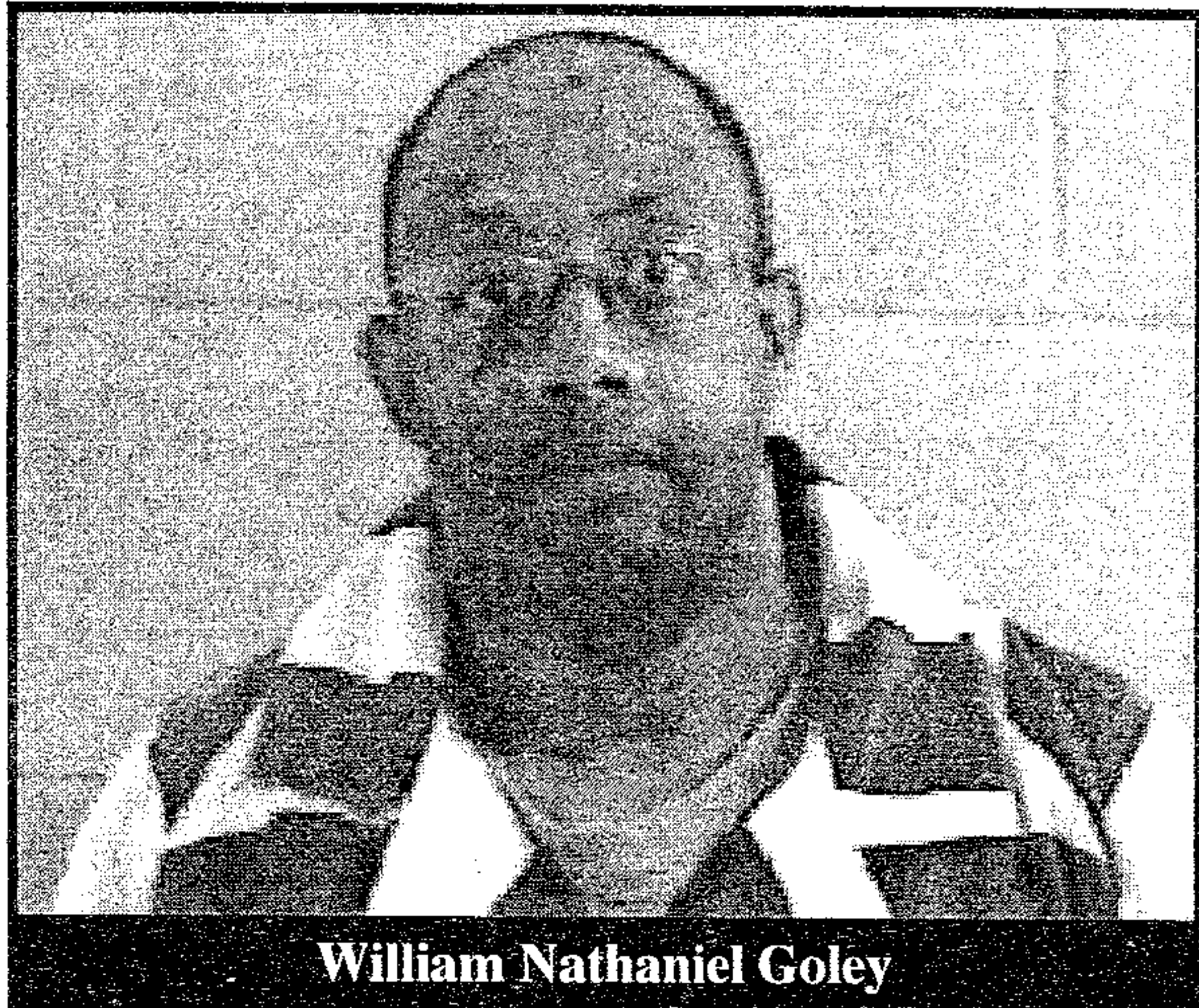


## Man charged with breaking in, beating ex with bat

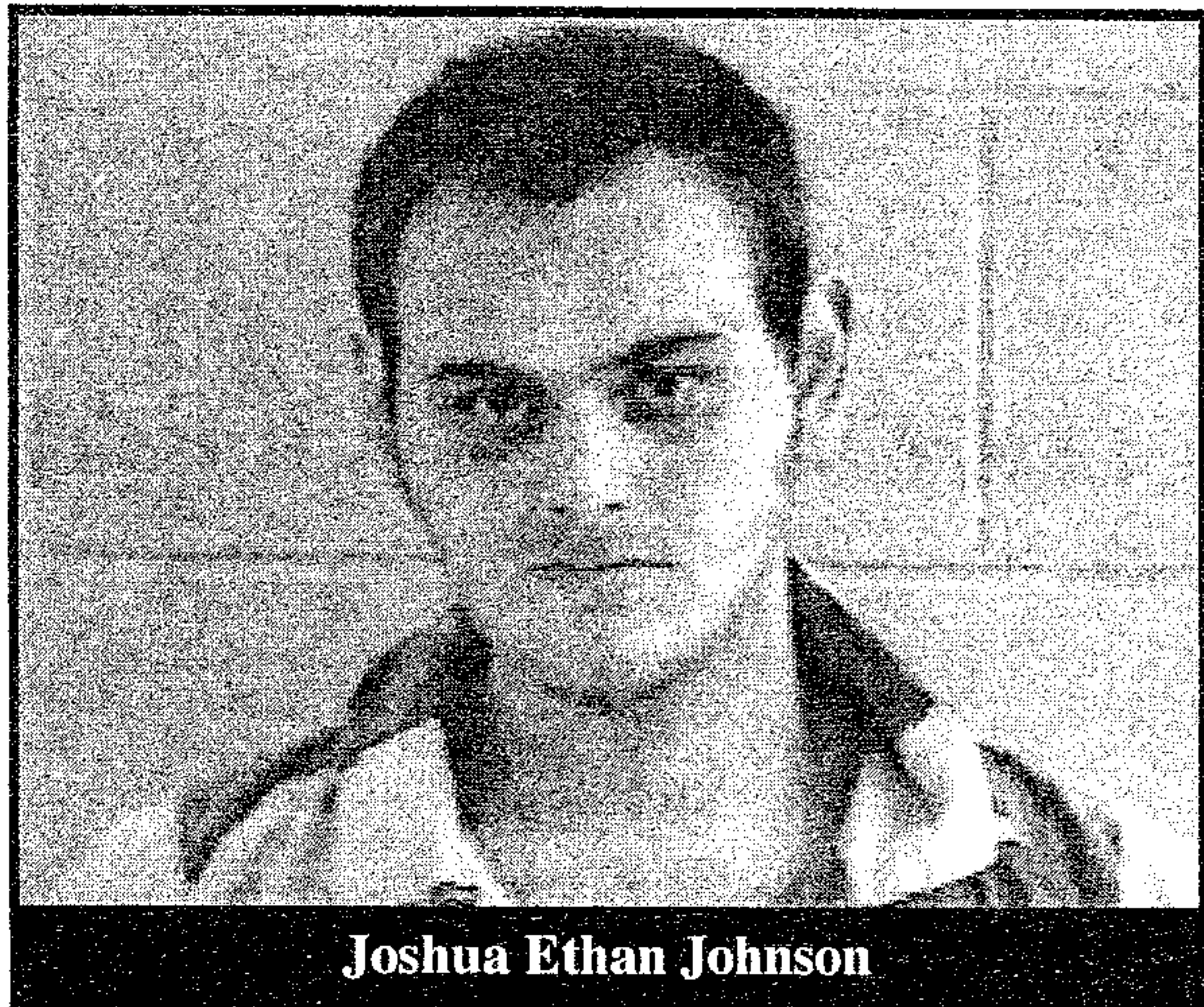

Officers tried to give Mr. Swaney field sobriety tasks and he almost fell on his face

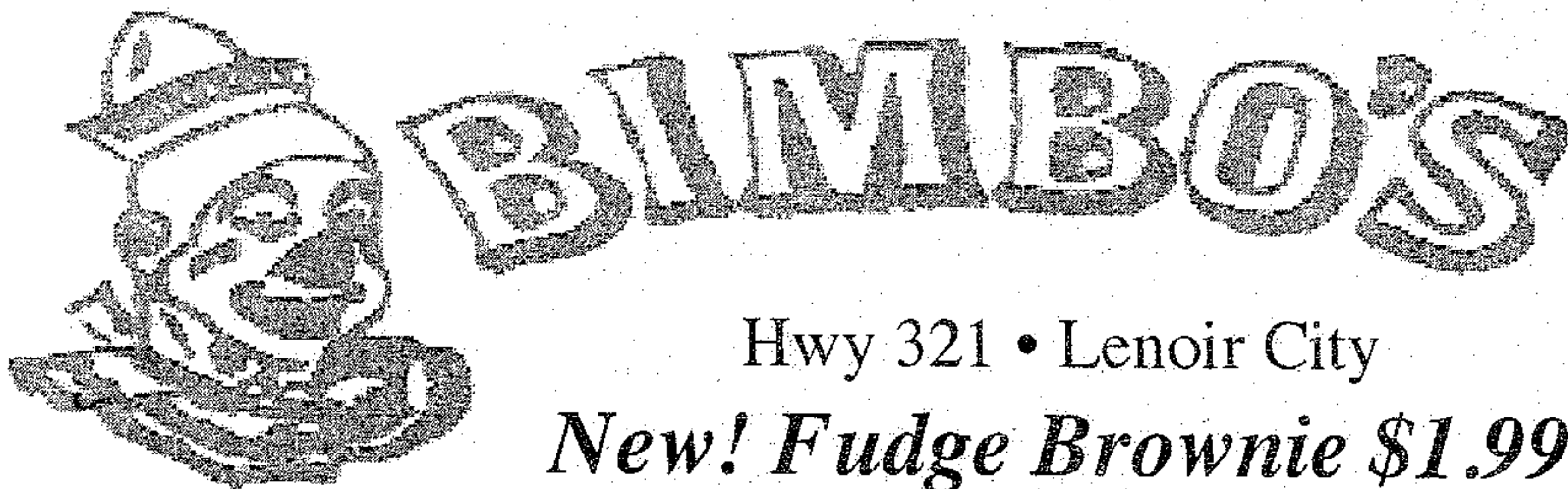
3 times, hence they stopped the test for his safety.

### Missing

little smears of paint were found.

According to reports, Deputy Rondel M. Branam, LCSO responded to Edith Lane In Lenoir City Saturday on a theft call. The victims, Mr. Christopher Brittain and Ms. Lynzie Robinson told the deputy they have been in the middle of painting the inside of their home. They hired a group of people to do the work for them and they started the job on March 21st, in the morning hours.

The painters were let in the house by either Mr. Brittain or Ms.

Robinson on each occasion and were left alone to do the work.

Saturday, at approximately 6:00 PM, Mr. Brittain noticed some items were missing and others had been moved. After the couple looked through certain areas in the home where precious items and cash were kept, they discovered a lot of things were gone.

In each area of the home where items were discovered missing there were smears of white paint or sheetrock putty.

The couple advised the painters had no reason to be inside any cabinet,

the bathroom area, or the garage, where some smears were found and from where the items were missing.

Approximately \$950, prescription medication, one pair of princess cut 1/4 karat diamond earrings, a pearl necklace, and a pair of pearl earrings were found missing.

Mr. Brittain gave a list of possible suspects that were in the home during that week.

A crystal dish, a pair of sunglasses, and two black jewelry boxes were taken into evidence.

Investigator Charles Cosner was made aware of the events at the residence. The total value of the loss was estimated at \$2500.

### Caught

son, 19, Get Good Hollow Road, Loudon was charged with aggravated burglary x 2, theft of property \$10,000-\$60,000 and criminal responsibility for conduct of another.

According to reports, Saturday, at approximately 4:50 PM, Mr. Marc Leatherwood arrived at his residence on Clear Branch Road in Loudon and found three males inside his home.

Mr. Leatherwood observed two of the males, go out the back door and run into the woods. They were later identified as juveniles.

The third male, identified as Joshua Ethan Johnson, was seen running from the residence by Loudon County Sheriff's deputies, who took him into custody.

While they were in-

side the residence the three males ripped into the walls and ceiling and cut the copper electrical wiring from the home.

The total estimated amount of damage to the residence and the cost of the copper was approximately \$30,000.

Some of the copper wiring was recovered in large tote bags still inside the house.

Mr. Leatherwood stated he did not give anyone permission to enter the residence or remove the copper wiring from his home.

Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID made the arrest at the scene.

The two juveniles were arrested on the same charges and transported to the Loudon County Juvenile Center.




