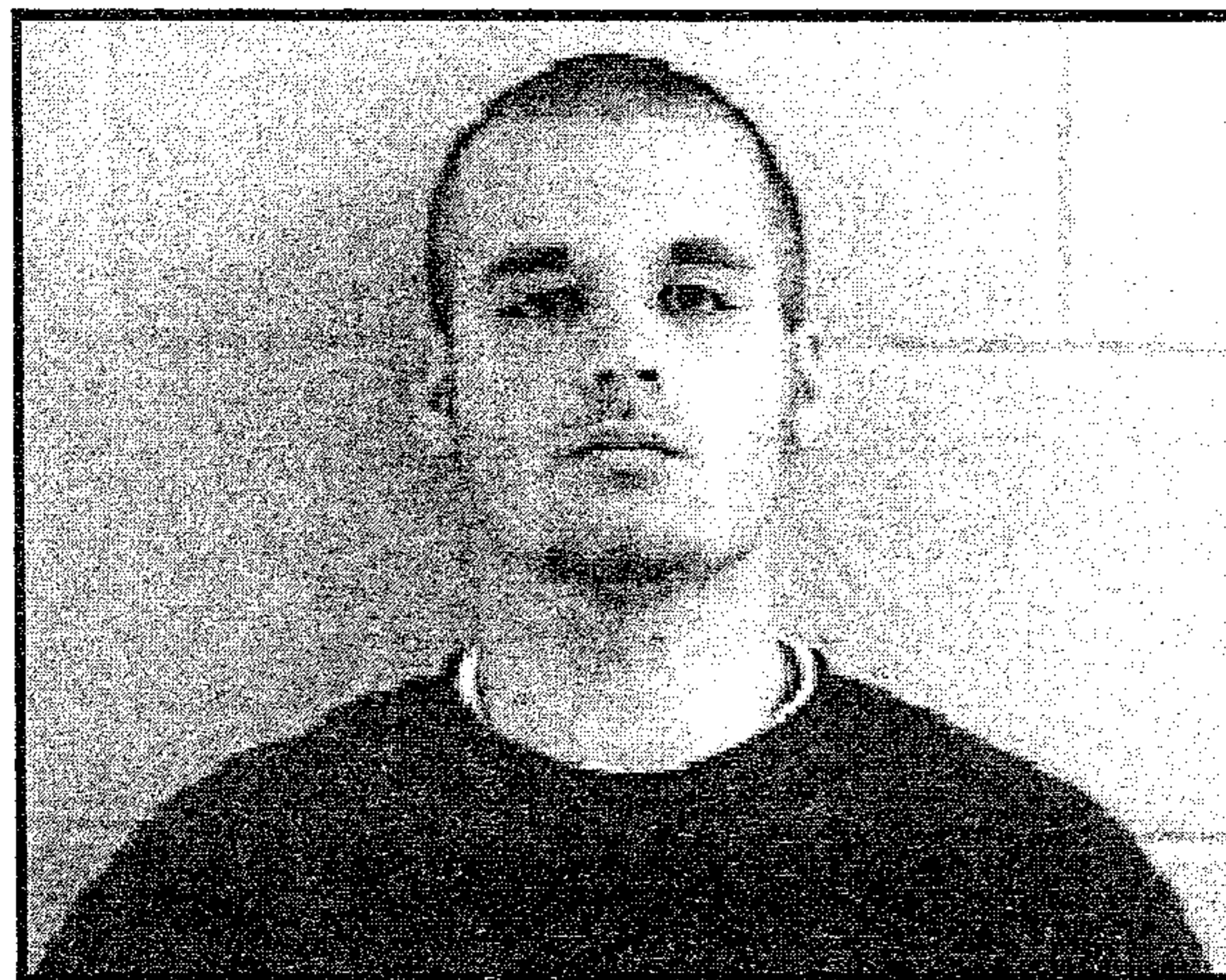
Toddler found in intersection, father found 2 hours later, asleep

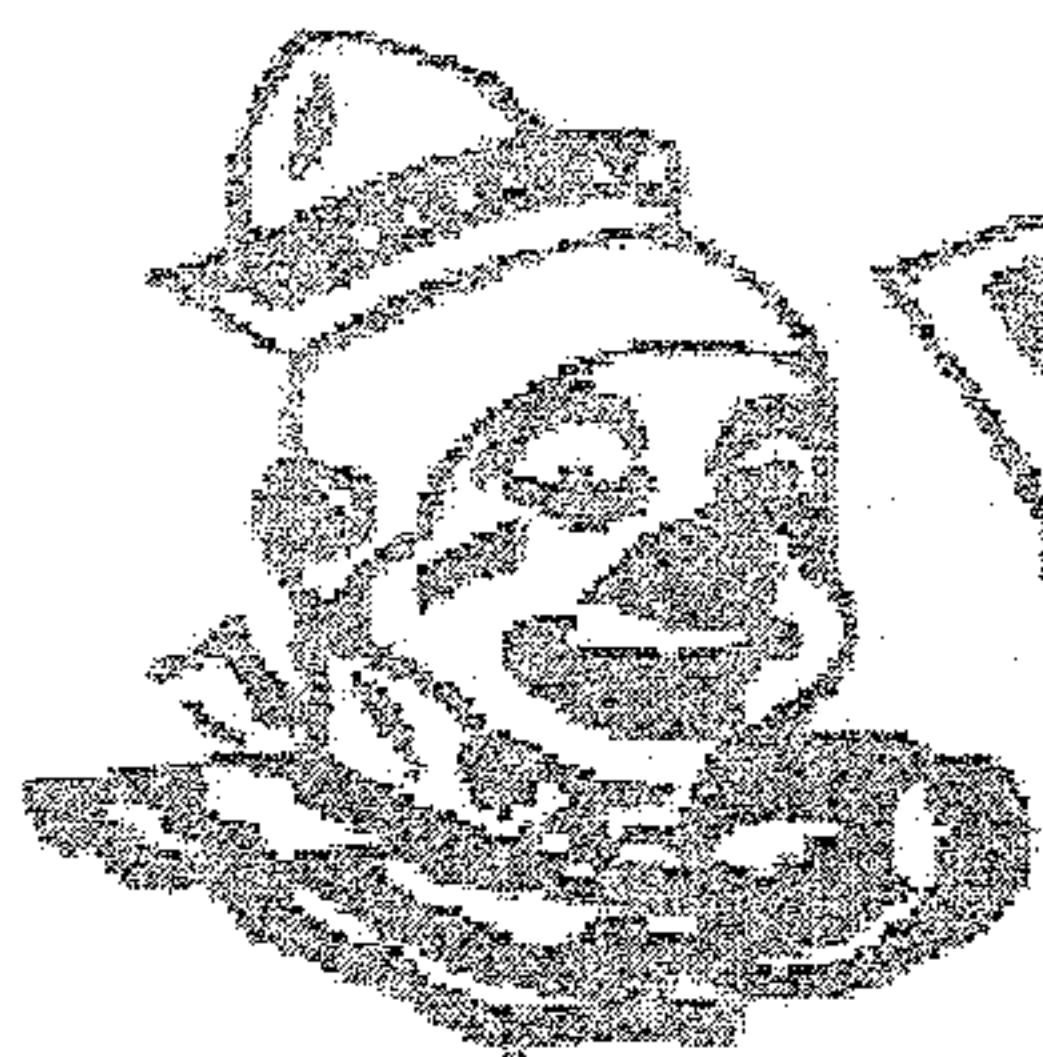

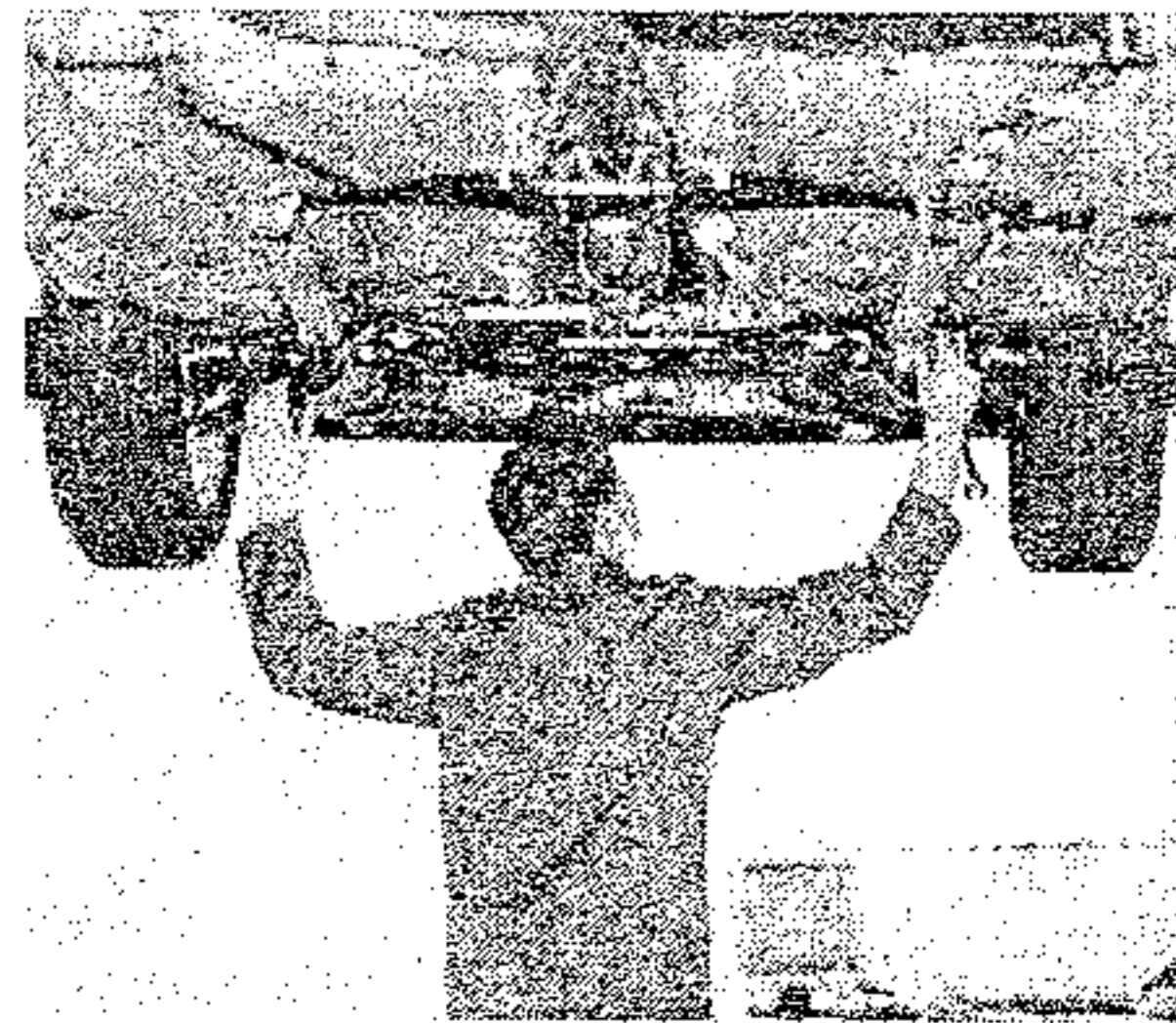

Detective Fine made the ar-

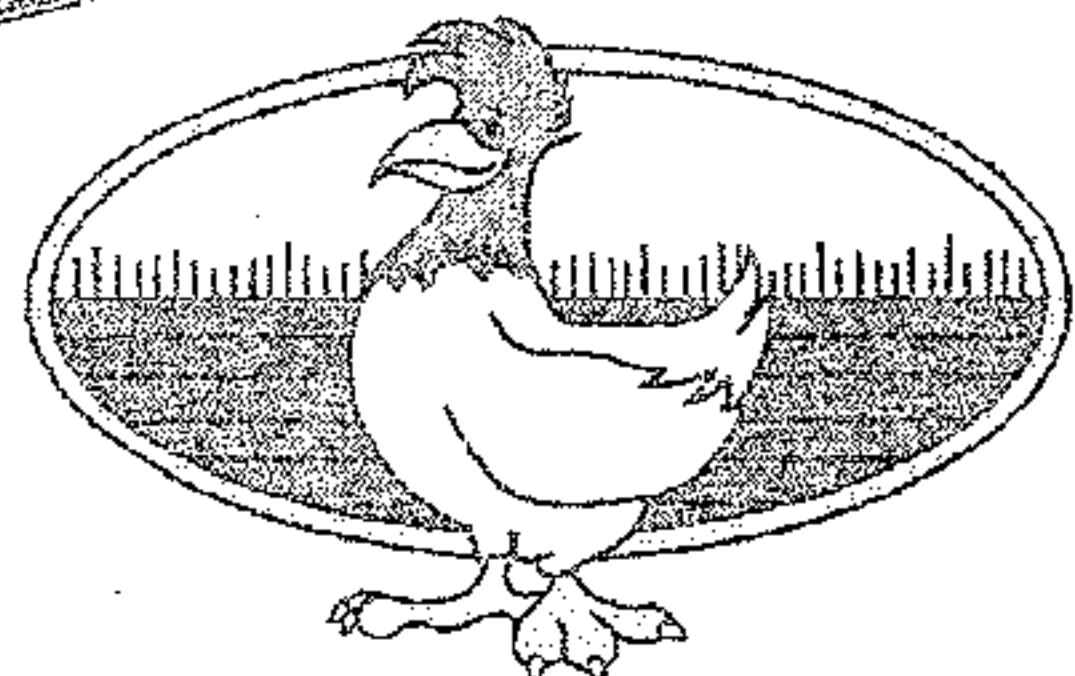

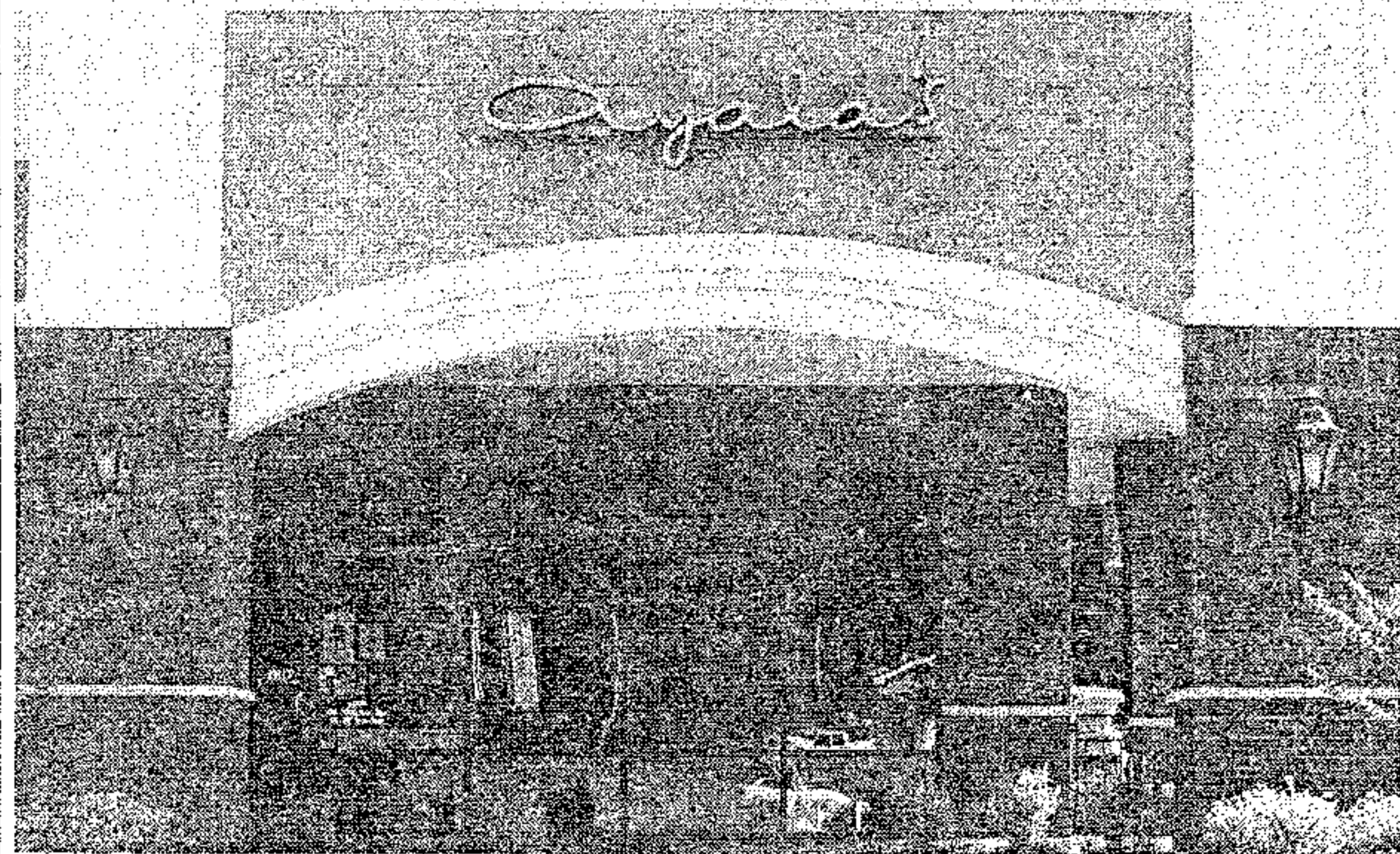

According to reports, a 74 year old Tecumseh Way, Loudon woman told Deputy Chad Petty, LCSO a cleaning business came into her home Tuesday, between 1:30 PM, and 3:00 PM, to clean her house Saturday and around 10:30 AM the next day she discovered her gold and diamond wedding band had been taken from her residence without her knowledge or consent.

The estimated value of the wedding band is \$6000. The case was turned over to a investigator.

Charged

Amy Marie Scarlett, 43, Ivy Avenue, Lenoir City was charged Thursday with DUI 2nd offense, violation of implied consent, simple possession of schedule VI, and possession of a legend drug without a prescription.

According to reports, Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD was dispatched to a motor vehicle accident on Old Highway 95 and upon arrival found a gray Chevy Corsica on the wrong side of the road with Amy Scarlett behind the wheel.

Ms. Scarlett had

slurred speech and glassy eyes and when the officer asked her to exit her vehicle she almost fell down. Officers had to assist Ms. Scarlett to walk to the rear of her vehicle.

Officer Gentry then asked her if she had any injuries or needed to be checked by EMS and Scarlett said no.

Ms. Scarlett was placed under arrest and read the implied consent form. She refused to give a blood sample.

An inventory search of Scarlett's vehicle was conducted and one marijuana cigarette was found along with six white pills identified as carisoprodol.

sible physical domestic. Upon arrival, the deputy spoke with Amanda Hart, who advised she and her husband got into a verbal argument and she shoved him before he grabbed her by the arms. While he was holding her arms she began head butting him

in the face.

There was redness and some minor bleeding to the victim's lips. He told the deputy the same story.

Mrs. Amanda Lee Hart was deemed the primary aggressor and was transported to the Loudon County Jail.



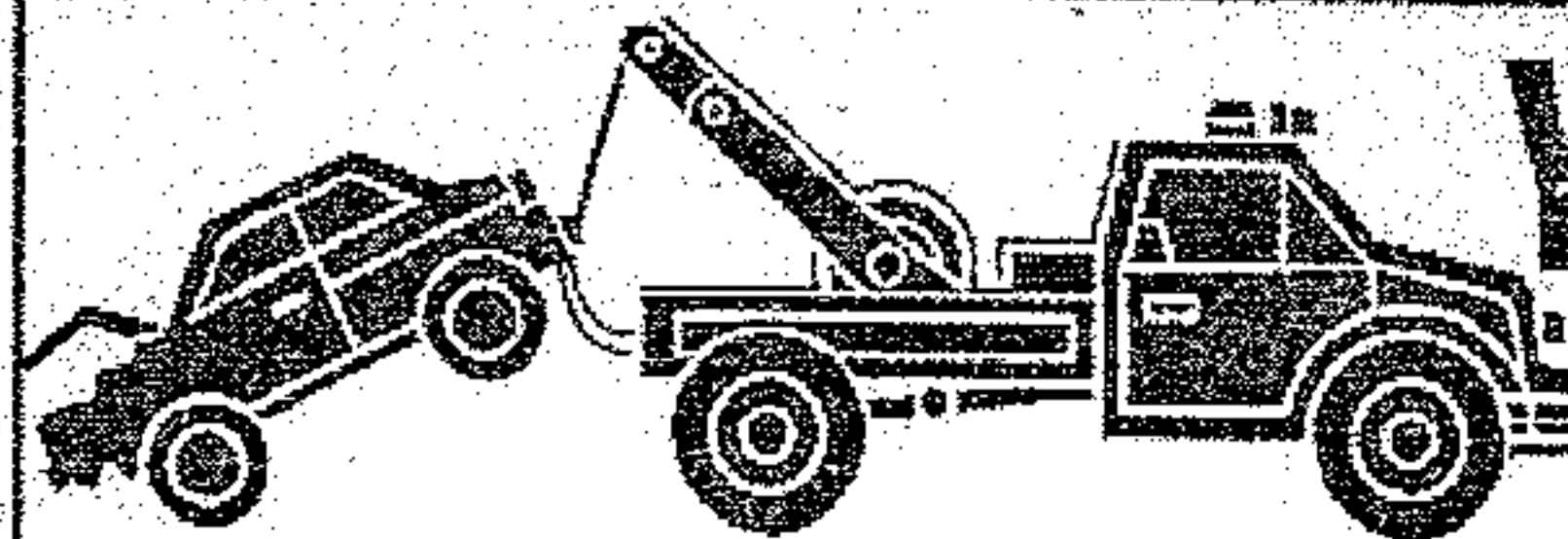
