

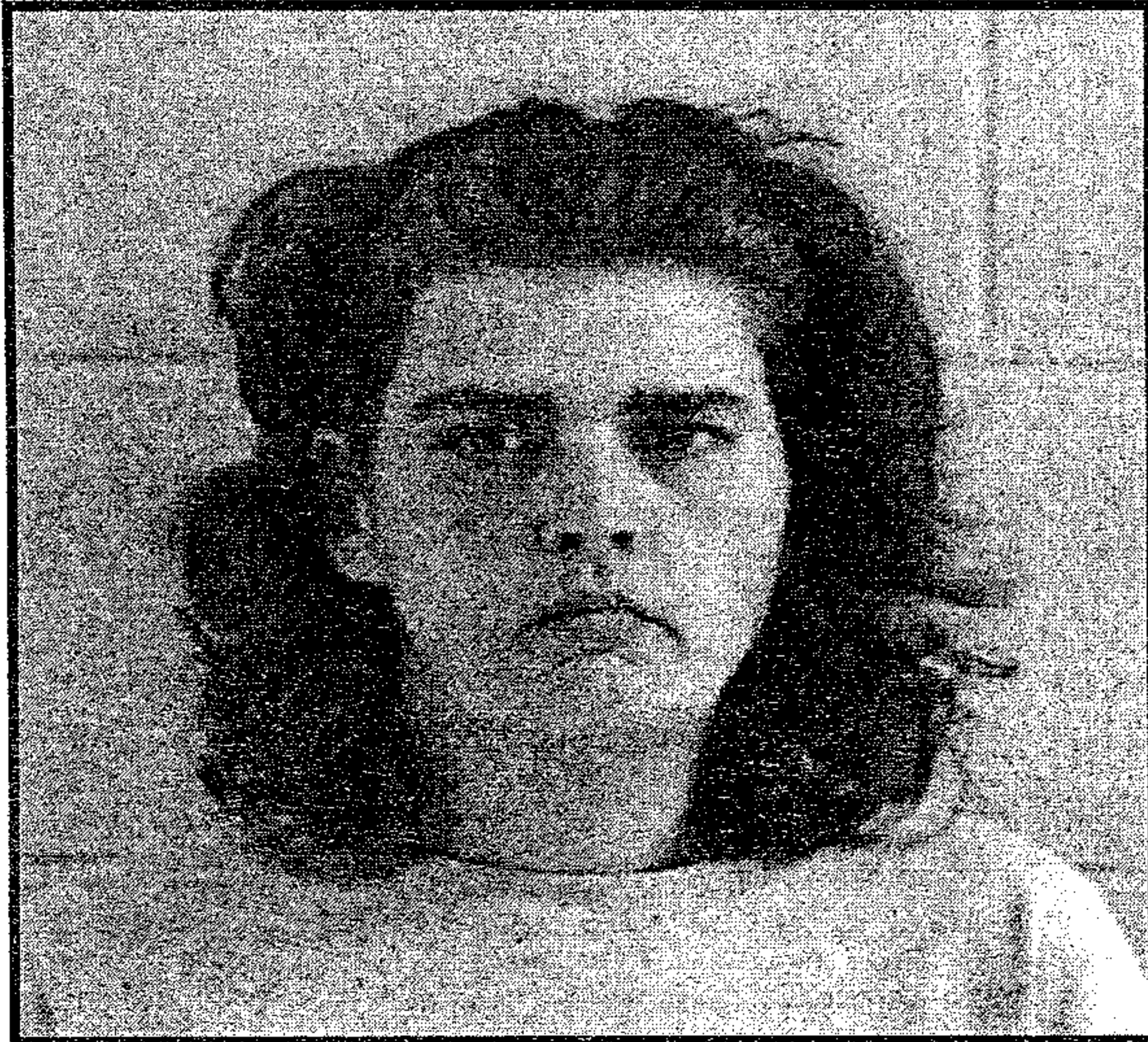

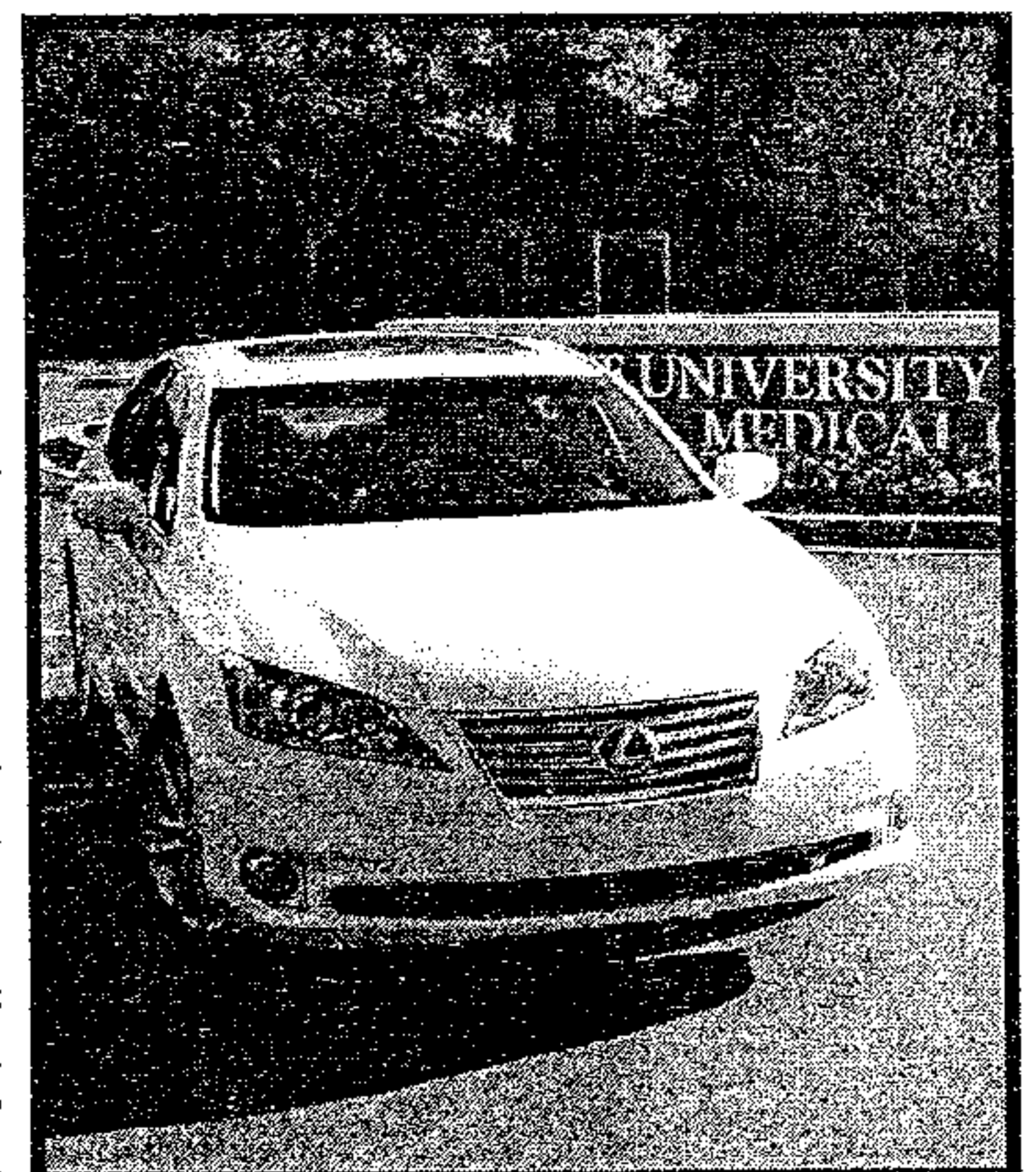



ring out of the jewelry box and then took it to Cash N To Gold in Lenoir City.

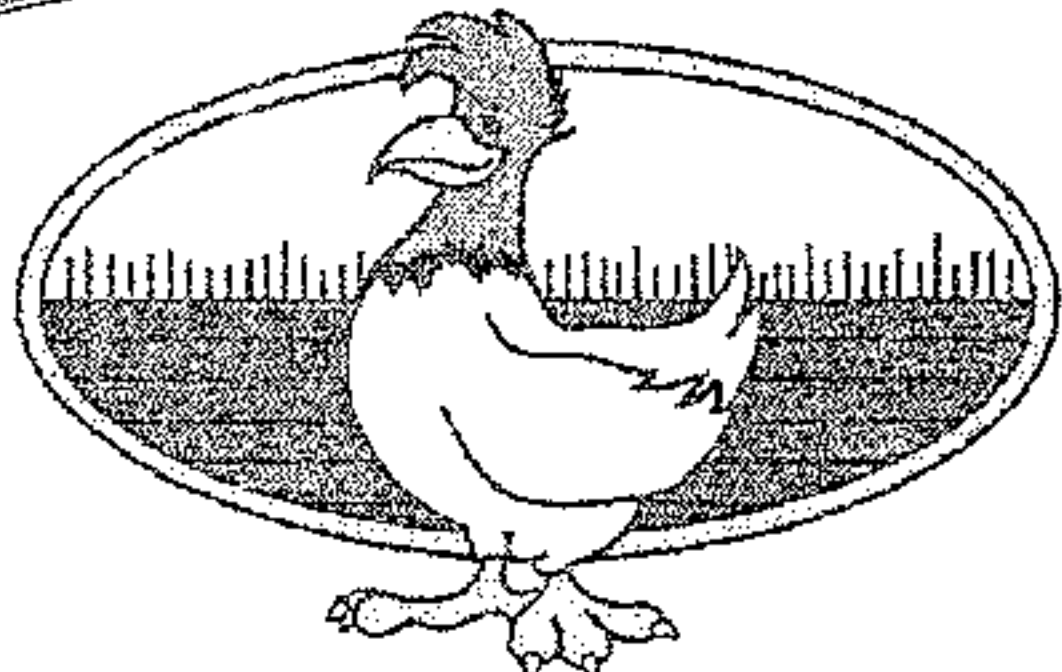
