day with promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine.

Patricia Ann Cole-County man, Road 439, Athens was charged with possession of schedule II hydrocodone.

According to reports, Agent Brendan De-Boer, 9th Drug Task Force observed two individuals purchase a psuedoephedrine based product from the Rite-Aid in Loudon. The two were traveling together but entered the store

separately, and each waited for one to come out of the store before the other went in.

The red GMC the couple was traveling in was also parked a long distance from the store and the occupants were acting in a suspicious manner that law enforcement has seen on a regular basis with people buying pre-cursors for manufacturing methamphetamine.

Agents from the 9th DTF conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle on Highway 11 at the

CO-OP. Agent DeBoer identified one of the passengers as Bobby Brakebill. The officer recognized the name from a prior pre-cursor purchase about one week earlier.

Mr. Brakebill advised of his Miranda Warnings and he advised he purchased the box for an individual in Sweetwater with the knowledge it was going to be used to manufacture methamphetamine. Brakebill also stated he made purchases for the same person at least two times prior.

Agent DeBoer identified the woman as Patricia Coleman. Ms. Coleman was seen trying to conceal something in her hand while she was sitting in the front seat.

When asked, Coleman produced a white

pill, tentatively identified as hydrocodone, that she didn't have a prescription for. Ms. Coleman had also purchased a psuedoephedrine based product but had not been charged in connection with the purchase at the time of the report.




