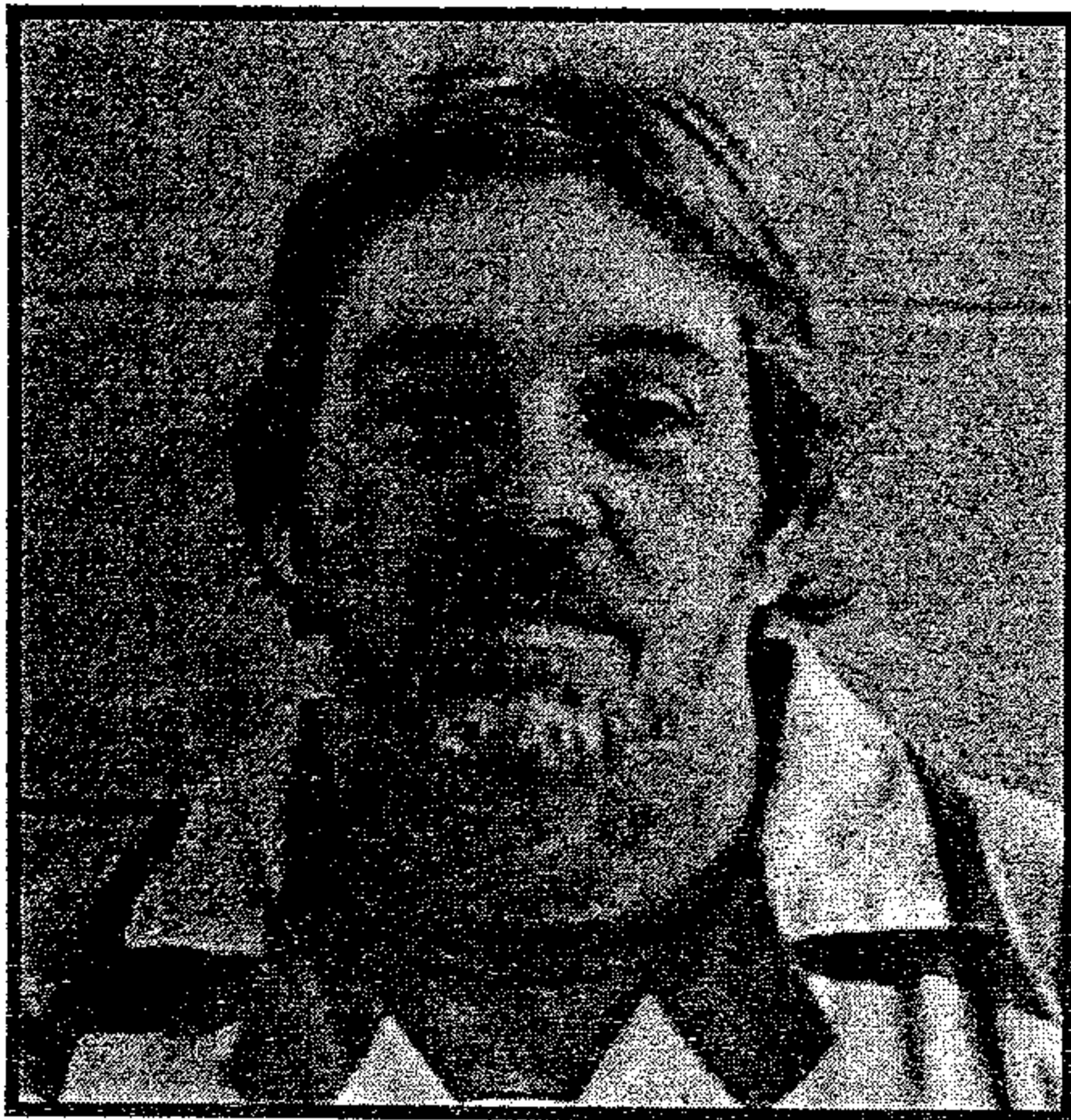

A local man was charged with vandalism after he allegedly damaged a door at his former residence.

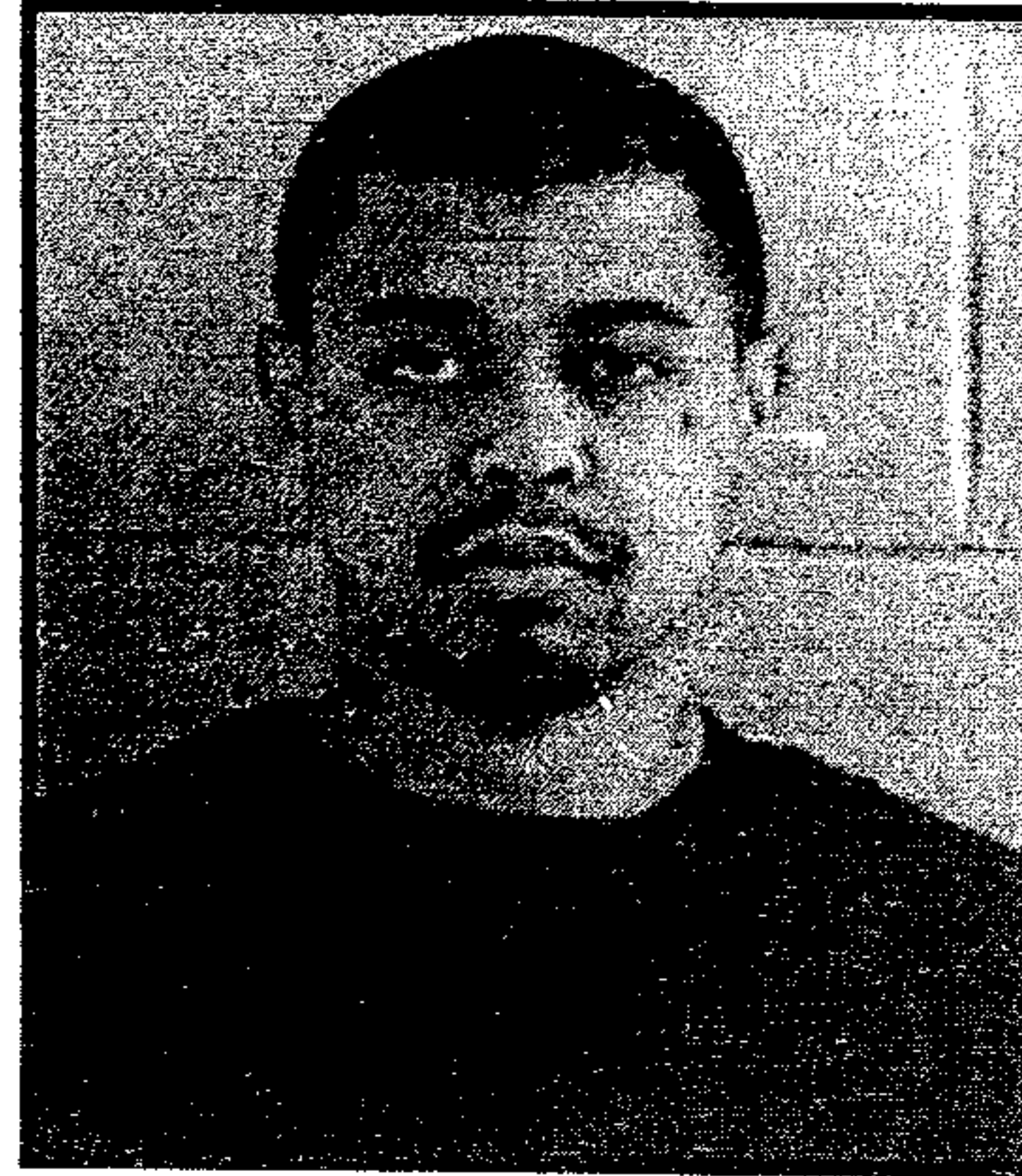
Robert Eugene Perkins, 44, Nelson Street, Lenoir City was charged with vandalism under \$500.

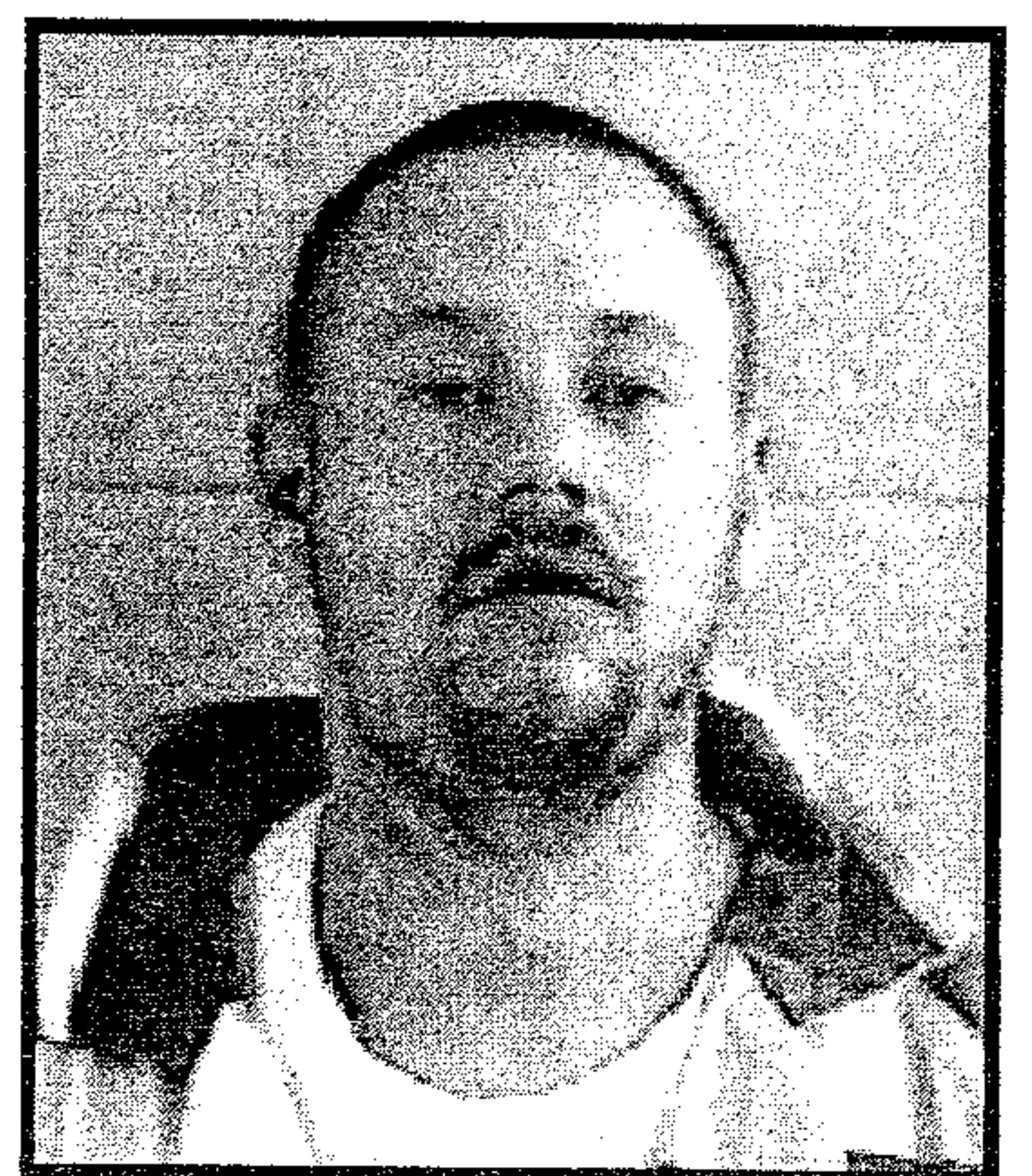

Once at the jail, a straw, used for snorting drugs was found in Ms. Lynn's bra and it contained an unknown drug residue.
