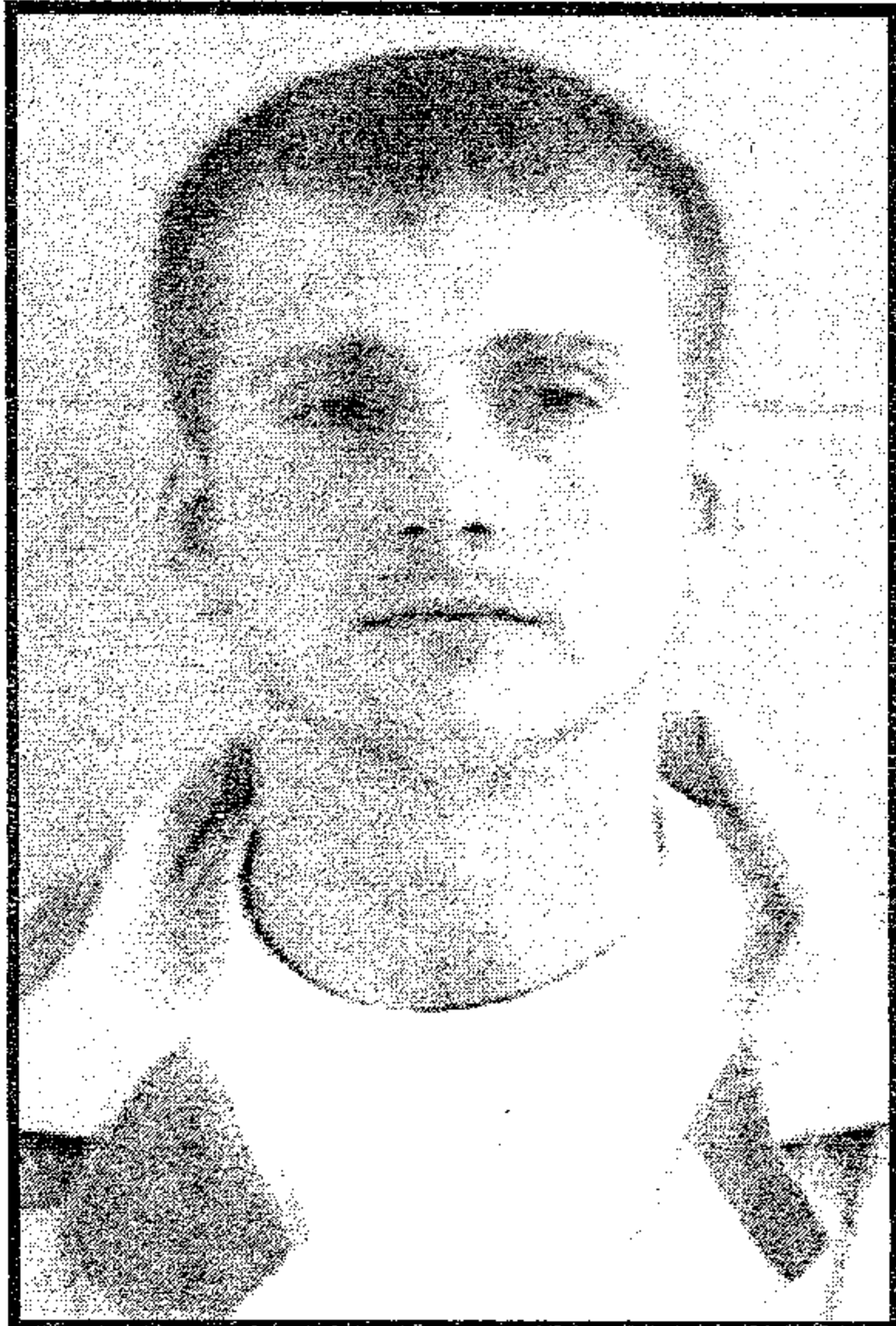


Employee charged with dipping in till

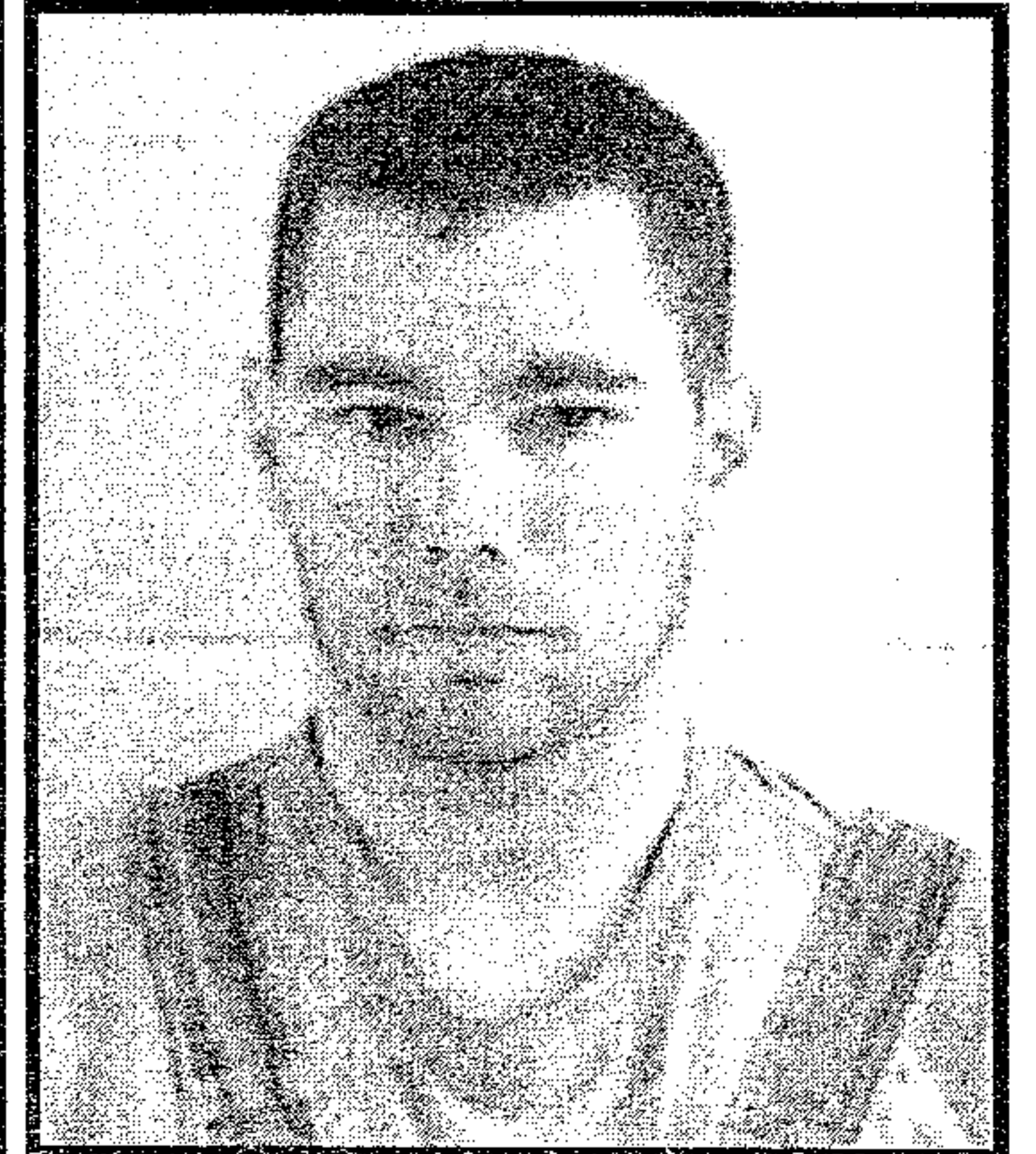
Police hit pay dirt with pillbilly's purse

in the cup holder. The driver, Mr. Aldridge, had a strong odor of beer on his breath.

Pillbilly

Chris Jenkins, LCSO was at the Marathon on Highway 321 when he was advised by the clerks that two individuals were inside a blue Nissan Altima with North Carolina tags. Deputy Jenkins started

a casual conversation with both occupants and noticed they were very nervous, confused, and unsteady on their feet.

The lawman reported he identified the couple, with the female being identified as Ms. Melissa Ann Marlow. A check of her license through NCIC revealed Ms. Marlow had outstanding warrants in Knox and Blount Counties and she was placed into custody for the outstanding warrants.

The man, who was the owner of the Altima, gave verbal consent to search the vehicle. K9 Diego was deployed for a drug sniff and alerted to the driver and passenger side windows. The K9

also alerted to a black purse in the passenger side floorboard.

There was a cigarette case inside the black purse and in the zipper pocket of the case were two yellow rectangular pills with the markings R 039 believed to be xanax. Also in the purse was a gold case containing three white rectangular pills with the markings G 3722, which were also believed to be xanax, and two blue and white oval capsules with the markings K 29 believed to be phentermine.

There was also a blue pill bottle with the name of another person, containing 3 and 1/2 yellow rectangular pills with markings R 039

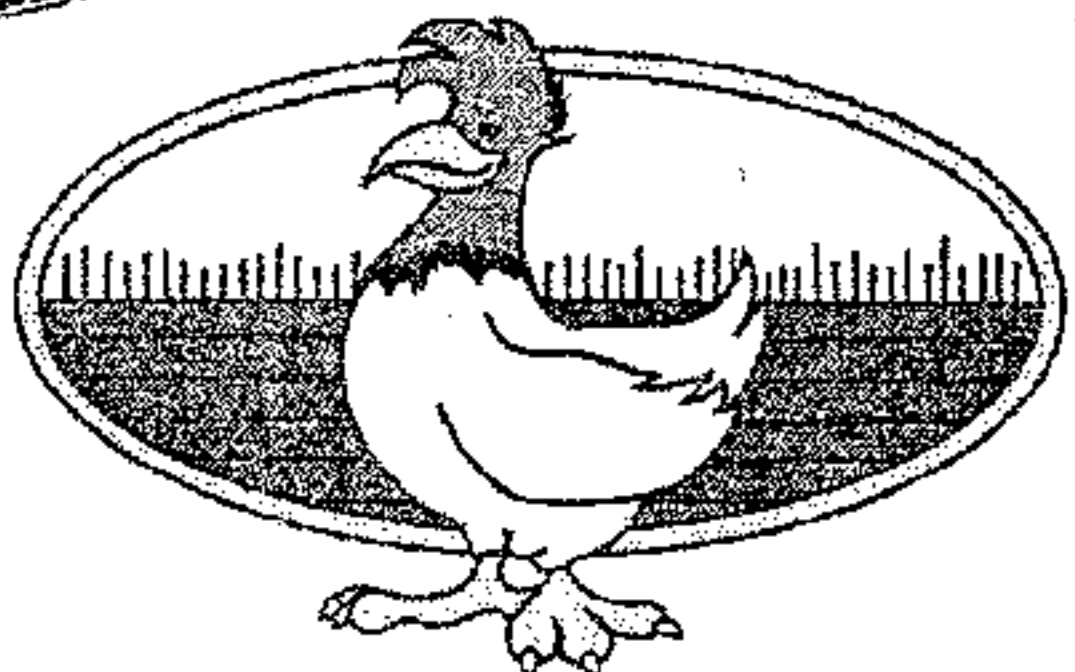

17, 2011 for high school students from across Tennessee. The students will be introduced to many outdoor activities at the event to be held at the TWRA Montgomery County Shooting Complex near Clarksville.

Among the activities that the students will become acquainted with will include boating, hunting, trapping, archery, photography, marksmanship, plant identification, forestry, camping, water quality, trap shooting, skeet shooting, wildlife identification, and several classes with wildlife and fishery biology as the topic. The summit is designed to deepen the

students' appreciation for outdoor-related activities.

Students will participate in hands-on classes that teach the importance of the natural resources and their management. Instructors will be wildlife and fisheries biologists, wildlife officers, college professors, professional shooting coaches and experts from specific fields of interest. Students can plan on each class they sign up for to be two to four hours in length and will include hands-on application in that subject.

Once students are accepted to the program, they will be able to attend at least 10 classes during the week. During this week, the students

will have the opportunity to gain certification in many different programs. TOYS will provide youth opportunities to learn more in depth about hunting, fishing, and shooting. Students, who are interested in a career in the natural resources field, will also enjoy the experiences that normally are not learned until they are members of the work force.

The TWRA is hosting TOYS in cooperation with the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Foundation (TWRFF).

The cost to attend TOYS is \$300 for the week-long experience. Applicants will be required to pay a deposit of \$150 to the TWRFF.

Students will be housed in a hotel in Clarksville and bused each day to the TWRA complex. All meals are covered in the fee.

Parents or guardians will be required to bring students into town on Sunday night and pick them up either Friday night at the awards ceremony or the following morning. Rooms will be available, for a fee, if parents wish to attend the banquet Friday evening and stay the night. Students will be required to be picked up by 10 a.m. on (Saturday) June 18.

Enrollment is limited to 100 students and if an application is not accepted, refunds will be returned in full. If an ap-

plication is chosen, the successful applicant will be sent a password and web address to the location of the scheduling packet. Students will select their classes of interest and pay the balance of the cost of the program.

Students will be assigned a roommate with two students to a room. If applicants have someone they know they would prefer as a roommate, it should be indicated on the application. Applications can be downloaded from www.tnwildlife.org or www.twrf.net.

believed to be xanax. A white, blood test strip bottle was found in the purse and it contained two white rectangular pills with markings G 3722 believed to be xanax, three yellow oval pills with markings V 3601 believed to be lortab, one white oval pill with the markings Watson 385,

also believed to be lortab, and two yellow round pills with markings of E 63 believed to be klonopin.

There was also a change purse inside the black purse that contained a clear plastic wrapper with a peach colored half pill which Ms. Marlow claimed was methadone.

Also in the purse was a

pill bottle with the name Lisa Lespier. The pill bottle contained twenty blue and white oval capsules with markings K 29 believed to be phentermine for which Ms. Marlow did

not have a prescription, nor did she have prescriptions for any of the other medications even though she claimed ownership of the narcotics.

Marlow was placed un-

der arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

LCSO Investigator Shane Ezell and Deputy Daryl Smith were also in attendance.
