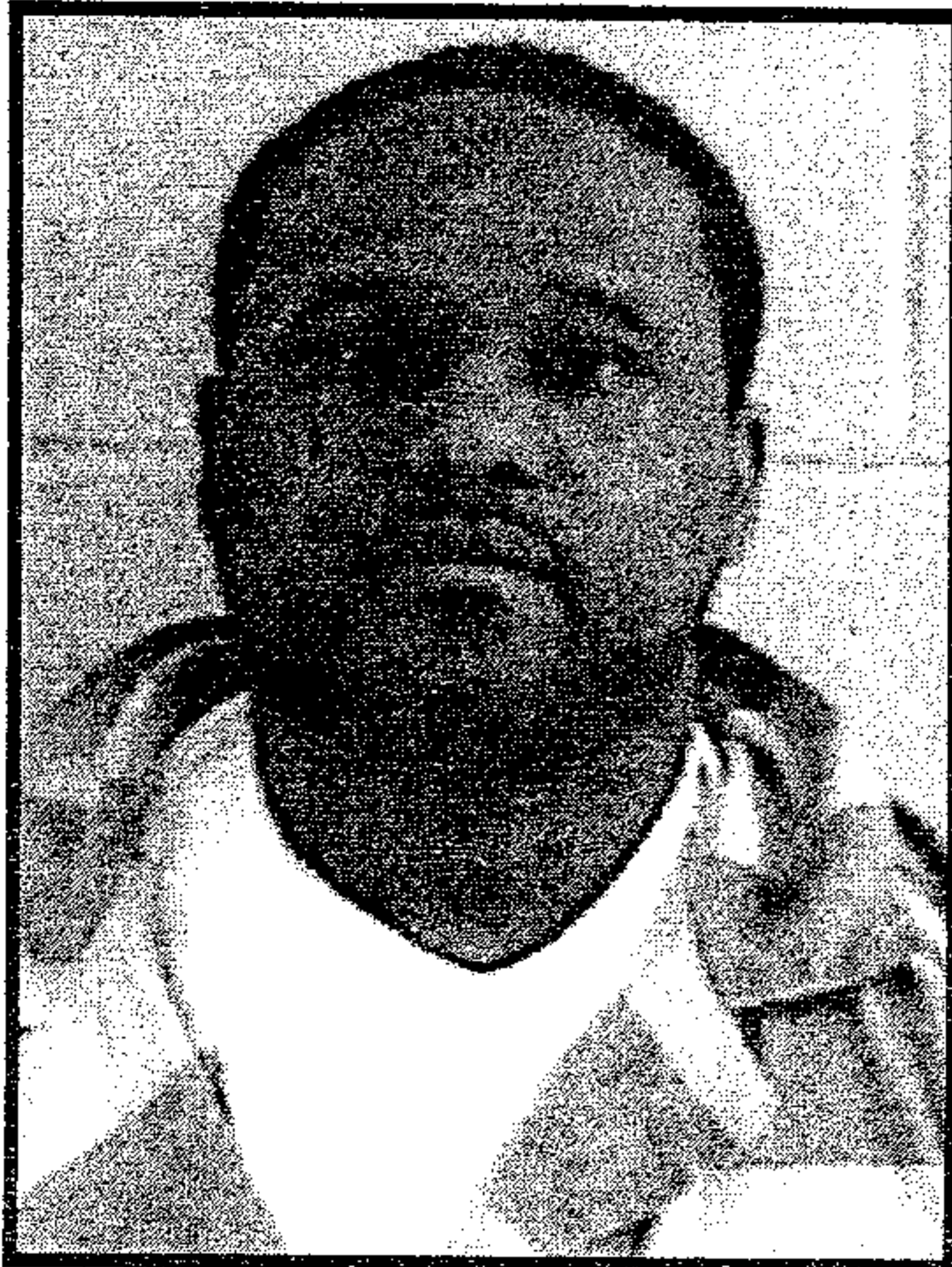

Postsecondary Access and Success/Career and Technical Education, a total of thirty-three school districts across the state, both individual and in consortium, will use these funds to support new and innovative career and technical education opportunities.

"We want to encourage our students to

form real-world connections that motivate them to take what they learn in the classroom and apply it to achieve more in the global economy," Education Commissioner Kevin Huffman said. "These grants build on Tennessee's opportunity to transform our schools and create a more seamless path between high school, postsecondary

education or training, and the workforce."

The Perkins IV Secondary Reserve Fund will supply a total of \$1.6 million in funds to career and technical focused activities in this year's awarded districts. Districts were awarded on a competitive basis and will receive grant awards ranging in from \$5,000 to \$100,000 based on

their proposal. The Lenoir City school district is one of the 2011-2012 recipients.

Districts will use funds towards such initiatives as developing secondary to post-secondary transition programs, implementing new or innovative programs of study that include STEM and Green technology, integrat-

ing rigorous standards and learning communities built on First to the Top initiatives, and increasing enrollment and completion of non-traditional students in career and technical education.

Based upon statements from the victim and two witnesses, it's believed Myers and the victim were both at the residence when Myers approached the victim and assaulted him.

**Regulations**

to make the changes

based on recommendations from the Norris Lake Fisheries Advisory Committee (NLFAC).

The NLFAC, a community-based group of advisors to the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, made the recommendation to implement an 18-inch minimum length limit on smallmouth bass with a creel limit of five from Oct. 16-May 31. From June 1-Oct. 15, there

will be a 20-inch minimum length limit with a creel limit of one.

The change replaces the 17-22 inch slot limit. The daily creel limit

for largemouth/smallmouth in combination remains five per day on Norris Reservoir. The regulations will be re-evaluated in 2015.



**Stolen**

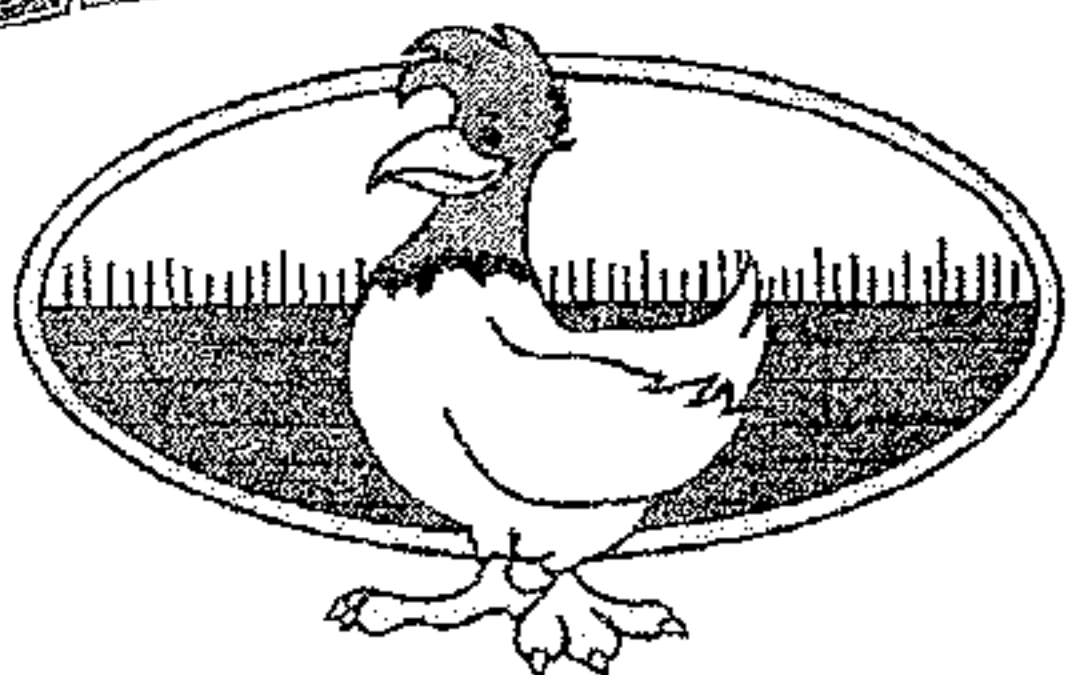
According to records, Deputy Craig Brewer, LCSO responded to McCrary Street in Philadelphia Friday to meet Lynne Marlow in reference to a theft.

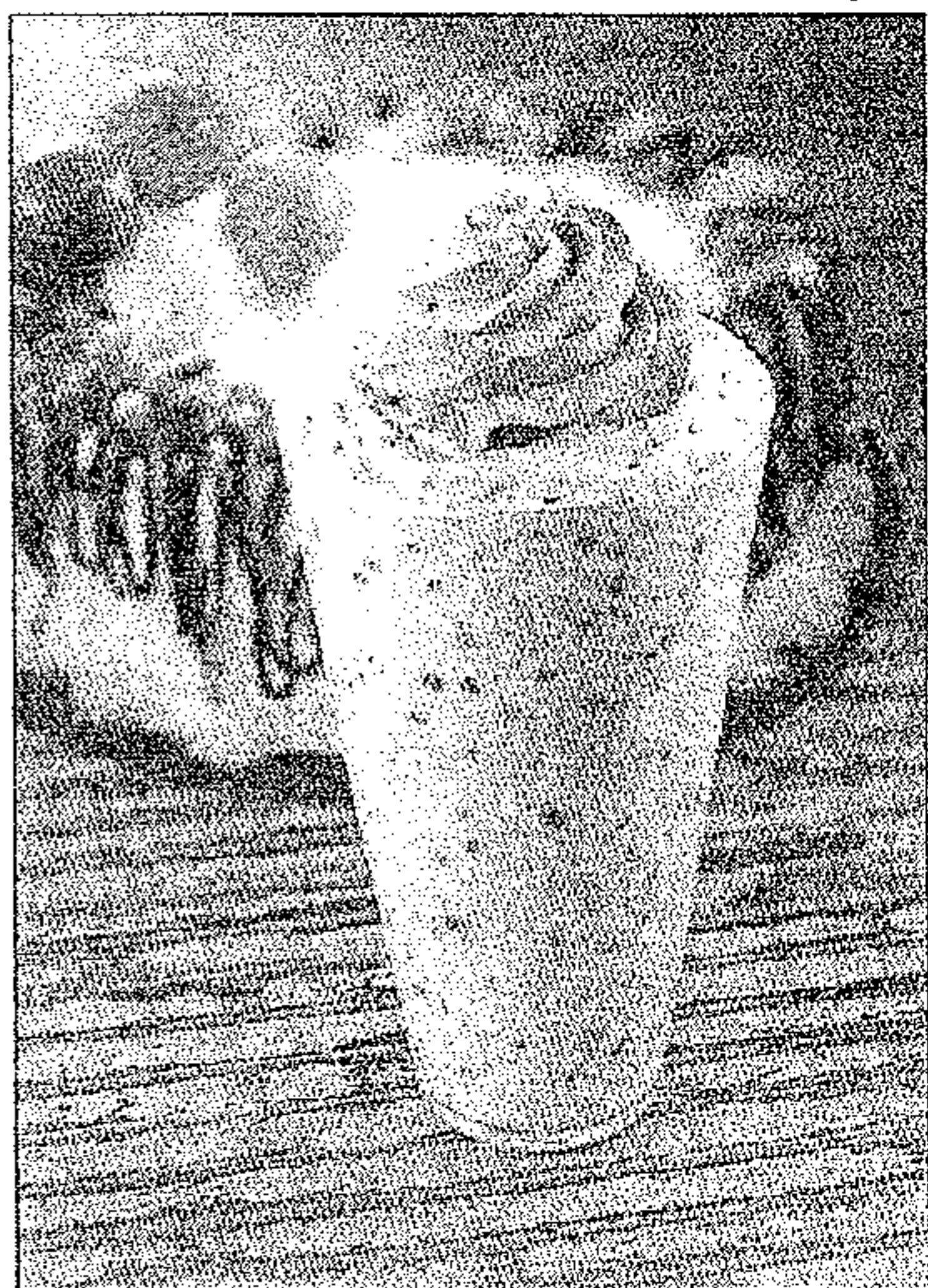

with possession of schedules II, III, and IV for resale, criminal impersonation, and possession of schedule VI.

According to records, on Thursday, at approximately 2:55 AM, Officer Emily Lawson, LCPD was traveling east on McGhee Boulevard behind a red Dodge Charger. When they approached the intersection with Kelly

Lane, the Charger entered the left turn lane but proceeded straight through the intersection. The vehicle turned left onto Highway 321.

When Officer Lawson asked the driver (see Pair cont. pg. 7)

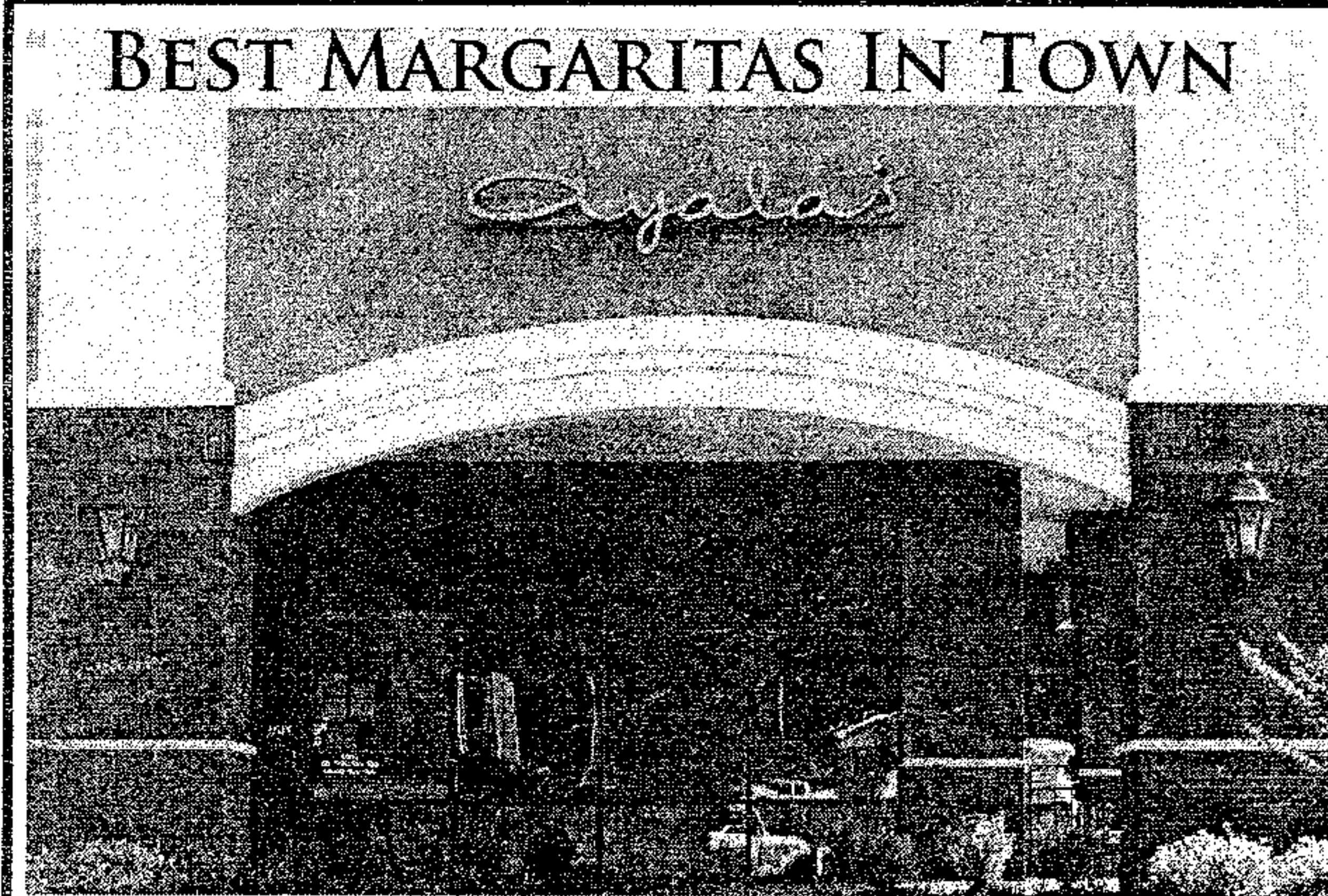

and his passenger for identification Mr. Mosley presented a valid Michigan drivers license, but the passenger stated he'd left his wallet at his cousin's house and had no form of ID. He said his name was Nathaniel Tavon Myles and his birth date was April 15th, 1988. He had difficulty spelling his name and advised his license were suspended.

Upon running the man's name and date of birth through NCIC to check for warrants as well as obtain a physical description from

the driver's license, the physical weight of Nathaniel Myles did not match the passenger, but the license was valid. The man eventually gave his real name of Javon Anthony White and advised the reason he lied was because he was on probation in Michigan.

During the investigation of Mr. White's identity, both men were asked to exit the vehicle. K9 Deputy Billy Hall, LCSO and his partner Draga had already arrived on the scene and had begun performing a perimeter sniff of the Charger. K9

Draga alerted to exterior areas of the vehicle.

Officer Lawson asked Mr. White if they had been smoking marijuana in the vehicle and he said there was a small amount of "weed" inside the car, which prompted a search. A small clear plastic baggy containing a green leafy substance identified as marijuana by Mr. White was found in the console.

Two red bottles, one with a pharmacy label to a Charmaine Pritchett, which contained prescription promethazine-codeine cough syrup were found in a grocery bag in the front

passenger floorboard.

A gray Samsonite duffel bag was found in the trunk and it contained a packaged box of Ramen noodles that was partially opened. Further inspection of the Ramen noodle box revealed numerous clear plastic baggies of pills that were identified as oxycodone. A total of nine baggies, each containing approximately 50 pills, were collected from the Ramen noodle box.

One clear baggy was found in the front pocket of the duffel bag containing numerous pills identified as xanax. All the narcot-

ics and marijuana were photographed, seized and placed into evidence. Mr. Mosley and Mr. White were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. A warning citation was issued to Mr. Mosley for the traffic infraction.

Officer B. Brown, LCPD was also on the scene.

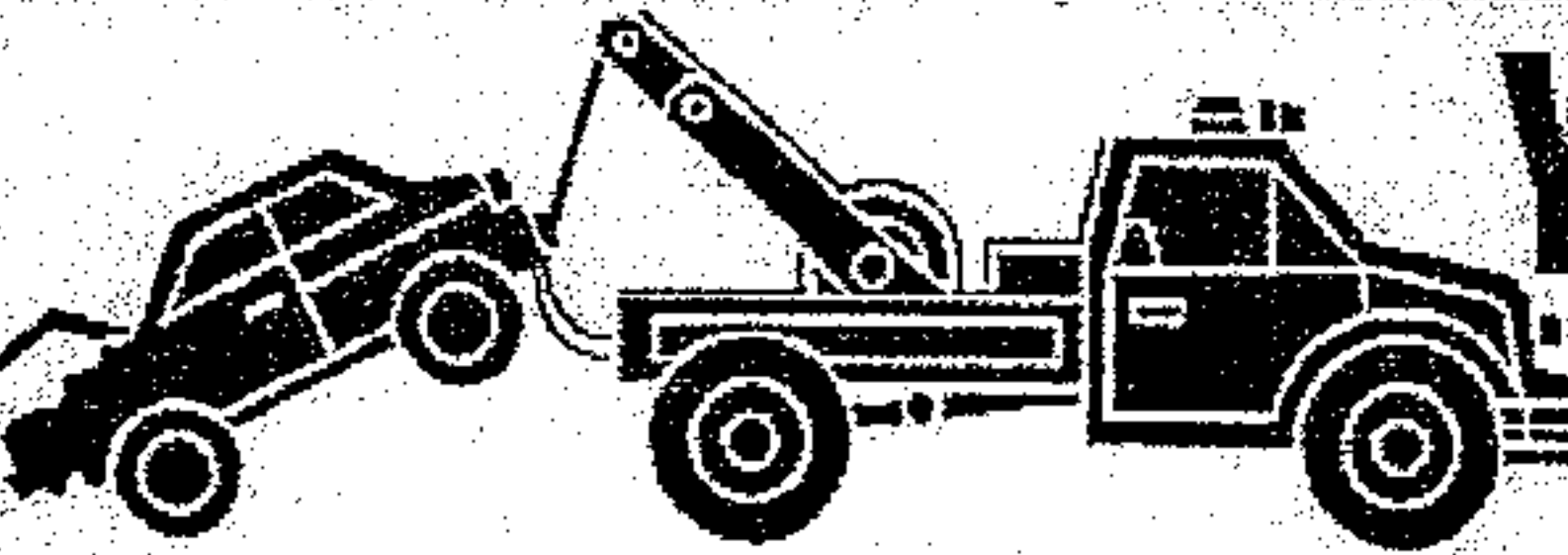
