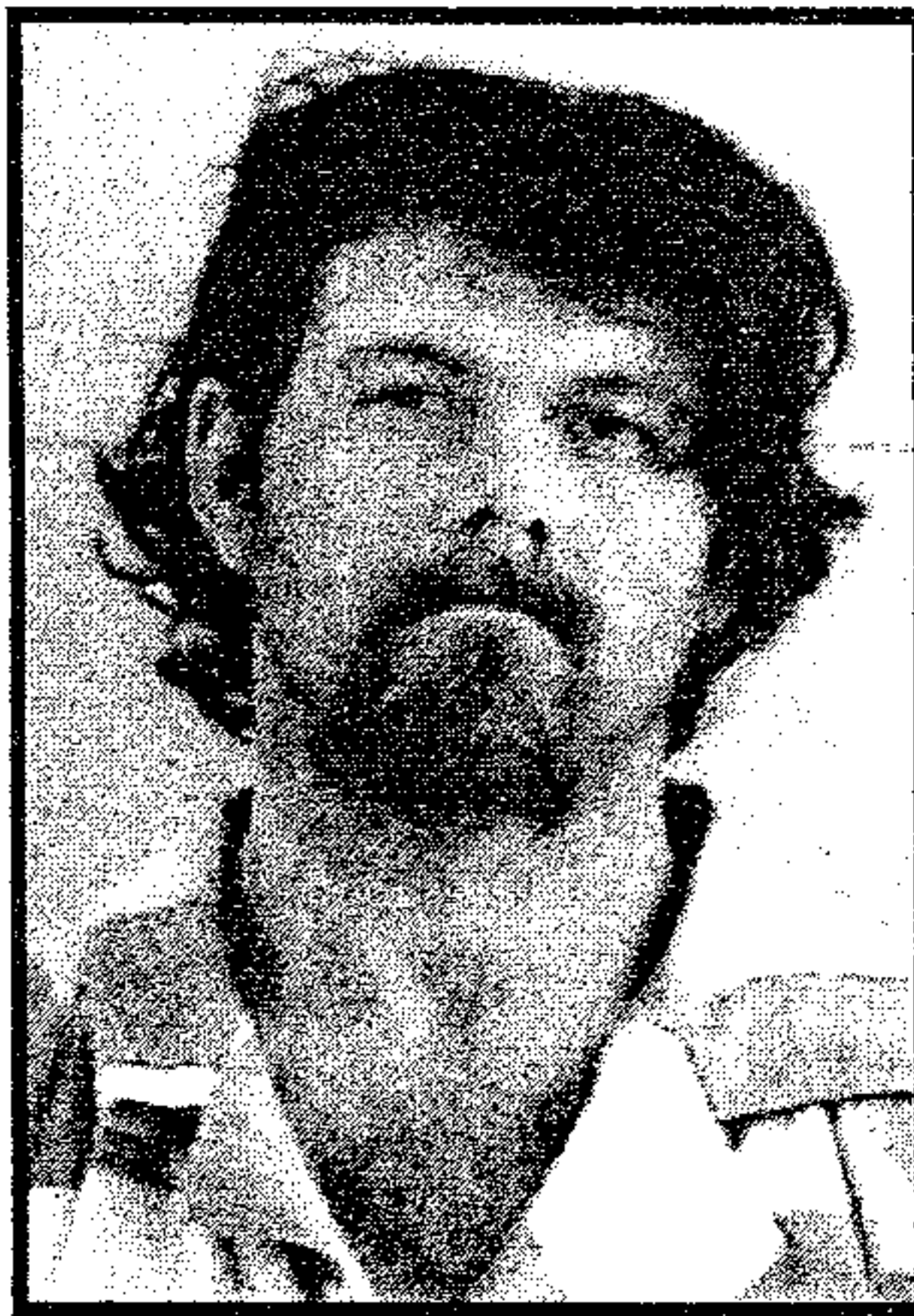

According to the reports, Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD along with investigators with Lenoir City Police Department and Deputies with the Sheriff's Office went to a Browder Hollow Road residence in an attempt to serve a felony warrant

on Kenneth Braden.

Officers received information that Braden was in the residence. Officers identified themselves as law enforcement and announced that if Braden did not come out a police K9 was going to be released inside the home.

After making entry into the home, Braden

was found hiding in a closet. Braden had to be pulled out of the closet by officers and had warrants for forgery and theft under \$500 x2 served on him.

According to the warrants for theft and forgery, filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on the 16th day of March 2011 Kenneth Ray Braden did exer-

cise control over a personal check belonging to a Lenoir City man. The check was forged by Braden with the victim's name and was written in the amount of \$200.

In another theft warrant, also filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; on March 19, 2011 Kenneth Braden took a ring that belongs to a Lenoir City woman and took the ring to a Cash for Gold business. Braden sold the ring for \$80 that had been reported stolen.

Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD made the arrest.



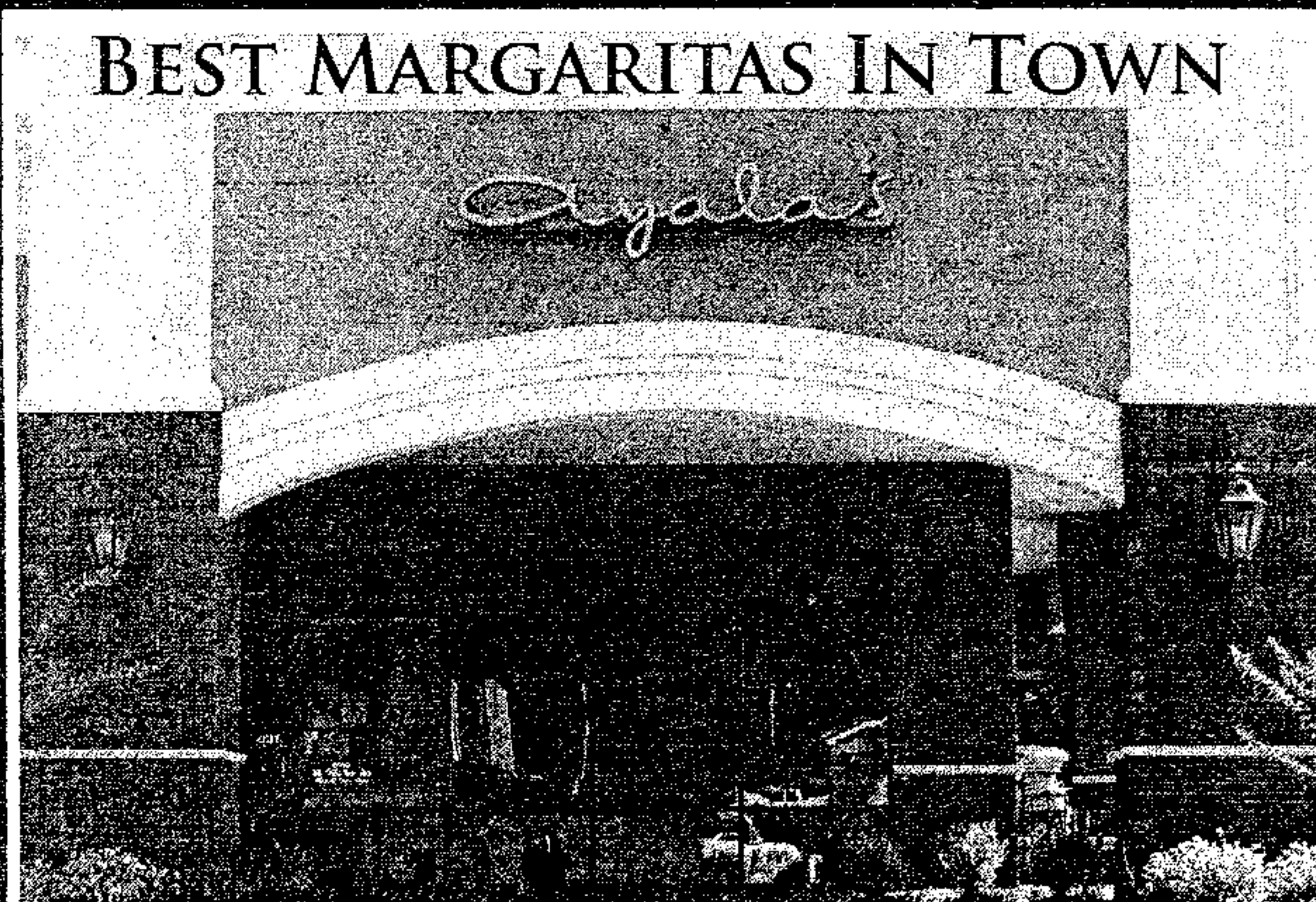

What to Do During a Tornado

If you are under a tornado WARNING, seek shelter immediately!

<p>If you are in: A structure (e.g. residence, small building, school, nursing home, hospital, factory, shopping center, high-rise building)</p>	<p>Then: Go to a pre-designated shelter area such as a safe room, basement, storm cellar, or the lowest building level. If there is no basement, go to the center of an interior room on the lowest level (closet, interior hallway) away from corners, windows, doors, and outside walls. Put as many walls as possible between you and the outside. Get under a sturdy table and use your arms to protect your head and neck. Do not open windows.</p>
<p>A vehicle, trailer, or mobile home</p>	<p>Get out immediately and go to the lowest floor of a sturdy, nearby building or a storm shelter. Mobile homes, even if tied down, offer little protection from tornadoes.</p>
<p>The outside with no shelter</p>	<p>Lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression and cover your head with your hands. Be aware of the potential for flooding. Do not get under an overpass or bridge. You are safer in a low, flat location. Never try to outrun a tornado in urban or congested areas in a car or truck. Instead, leave the vehicle immediately for safe shelter. Watch out for flying debris. Flying debris from tornadoes causes most fatalities and injuries.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><small>source: FEMA</small></p>
