Memorial Day

dozen cities and towns laying claim to being the birthplace of Memorial Day. There is also evidence that organized women's groups in the South were decorating graves before the end of the Civil War: a hymn published in 1867, "Kneel Where Our Loves are Sleeping" by Nella L. Sweet carried the dedication "To The Ladies of the South who are Decorating the Graves of the Confederate Dead" (Source: Duke University's Historic American Sheet Music, 1850-1920). While Waterloo N.Y. was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966, it's difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the

day. It is more likely that it had many separate beginnings; each of those towns and every planned or spontaneous gathering of people to honor the war dead in the 1860's tapped into the general human need to honor our dead, each contributed honorably to the growing movement that culminated in Gen Logan giving his official proclamation in 1868. It is not important who was the very first, what is important is that Memorial Day was established. Memorial Day is not about division. It is about reconciliation; it is about coming together to honor those who gave their all.

Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of

the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11, and was first observed on 30 May 1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. The first state to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890 it was recognized by all of the northern states. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war). It is now celebrated in almost every State on the last Monday in May (passed by Congress with the National Holi-

day Act of 1971 (P.L. 90 - 363) to ensure a three day weekend for Federal holidays), though several southern states have an additional separate day for honoring the Confederate war dead: January 19 in Texas, April 26 in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi; May 10 in South Carolina; and June 3 (Jefferson Davis' birthday) in Louisiana and Tennessee.



We have been blessed with an opportunity to GO to another nation to spread the gospel and this week we want to invite you to participate in a Mission for the Great Commission. God gives each of us different talents and abilities to use for His service. Christians who may not be able to GO can always support the ones that are Going by praying and supplying needs.

Angie and I will be joining nineteen other Christians from New Providence Bap-

tist Church and other churches in our area on a mission trip to an impoverished area in Guatemala to share THE GOOD NEWS of Jesus Christ while supplying needs to the people of those communities.

Many of the people in that area cook on an open fire inside homes that we would consider unfit for living. The children in those homes suffer respiratory problems from the constant smoke inside the homes. These people have no money and minimal opportunity to make money. Many of their children have no shoes. NO SHOES! As I am typing in my home office I just counted fifteen pair of boots and shoes, many of which I rarely wear.

Our mission on this trip is to build ventilat-

ed cook stoves in some of these homes and build chicken coops to hold numerous baby chickens. We will then give each family several small chicks to raise. They can then eat or sell the eggs to help support their families. I am told that we will have the opportunity to wash the feet of these children and provide them with a new pair of shoes, maybe their first pair. The cost of these efforts is solely based on God's children giving and sharing as we were commanded to

"Whoever receives one of these little children in My name receives Me; and whoever receives Me, receives sent Me."




