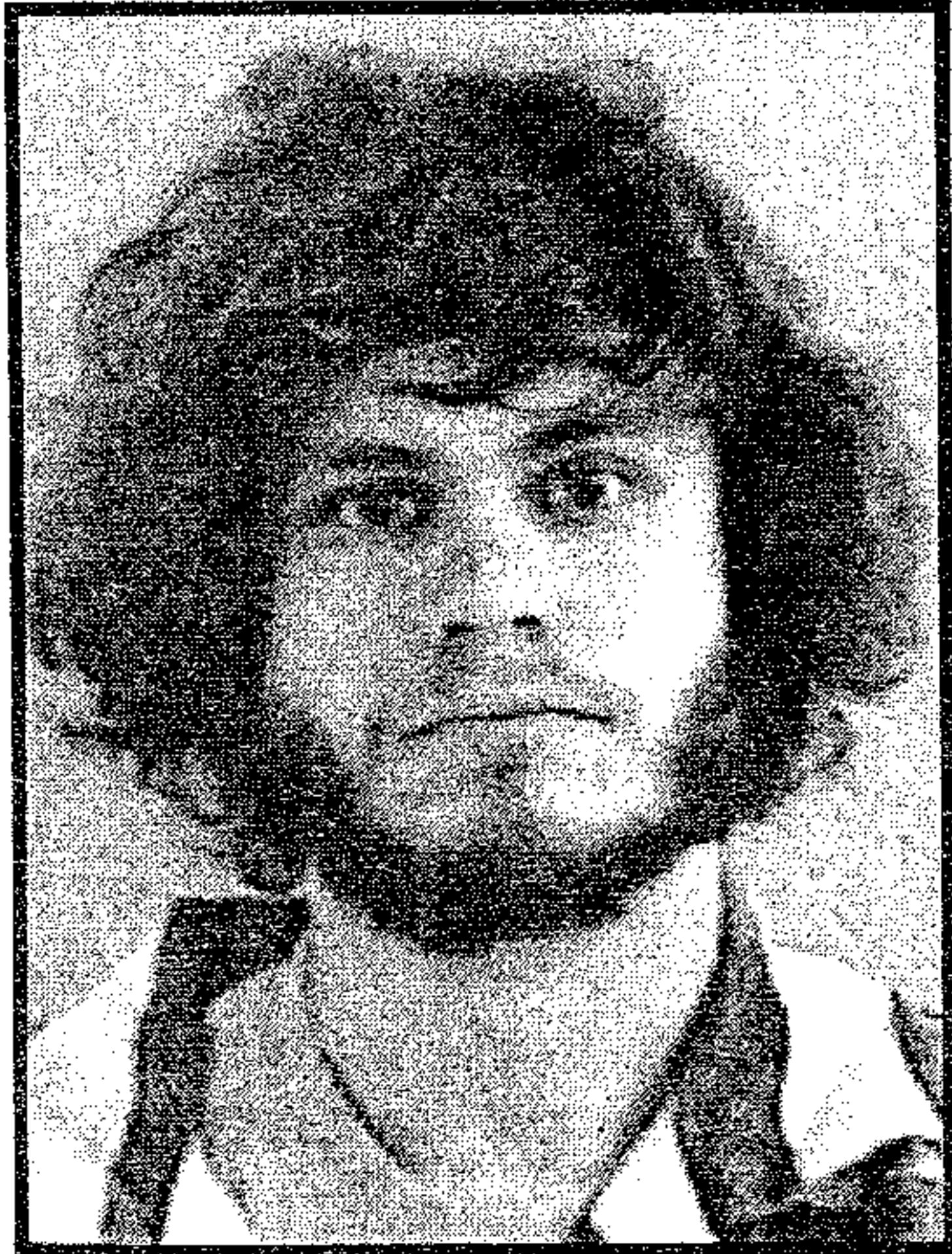
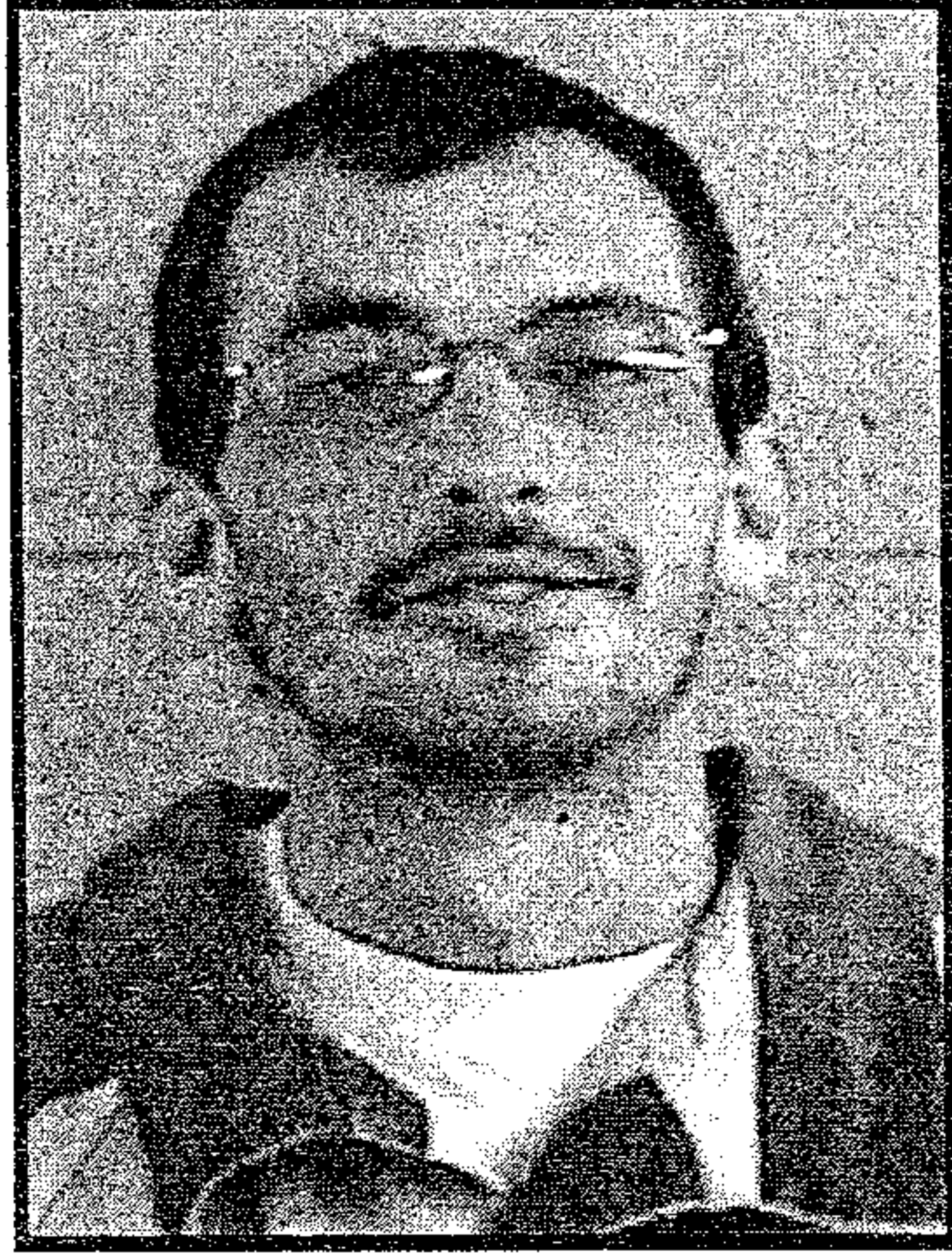


Update: 2 more charged with aggravated burglary

A young Loudon woman was jailed following an investigation into allegations she bought a vehicle from a Lenoir City car dealership, wrecked it, then sold it to be crushed at a salvage yard, all without having paid for it, nor having permission from the dealership to sell it.

home and vandalized it while looking for things to steal.

Jeffrey W. Olmsted, 22, Fog Hill Lane, Lenoir City and Joseph

F. Capps, 22, Allen Drive, Harriman were charged with aggravated burglary.

According to affidavits filed by Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID; Olmsted and Capps were arrested Sunday on warrants for an aggravated burglary that occurred on April 29th, 2011. After conducting interviews with

suspects and witnesses it was found that Jeffrey Olmsted, Joseph Capps, and Kayla Pennington, made forced entry into a residence on Fog Hill Lane in an attempt to steal items from that residence.

A witness saw them standing outside the residence and when he approached, they ran into the woods and later were placed into custody.

Ms. Pennington was arrested and charged

with aggravated burglary the day of the incident when she was spotted next door to the residence. (See story in yesterday's Daily Edition.)

According to an affidavit filed by Deputy Brandon Dixon, LCSO-CID; on April 20th, 2011, Mr. Marty Fugate, owner of Marty's Auto Sales, reported he had been attempting to repossess a 2001 Saturn Coupe valued at \$6080 from Kayla Viars for nonpayment.

Fugate advised Marty's Auto Sales received an anonymous call stating the vehicle had been wrecked and had been taken to Lankford's Salvage in Monroe County where it was sold.

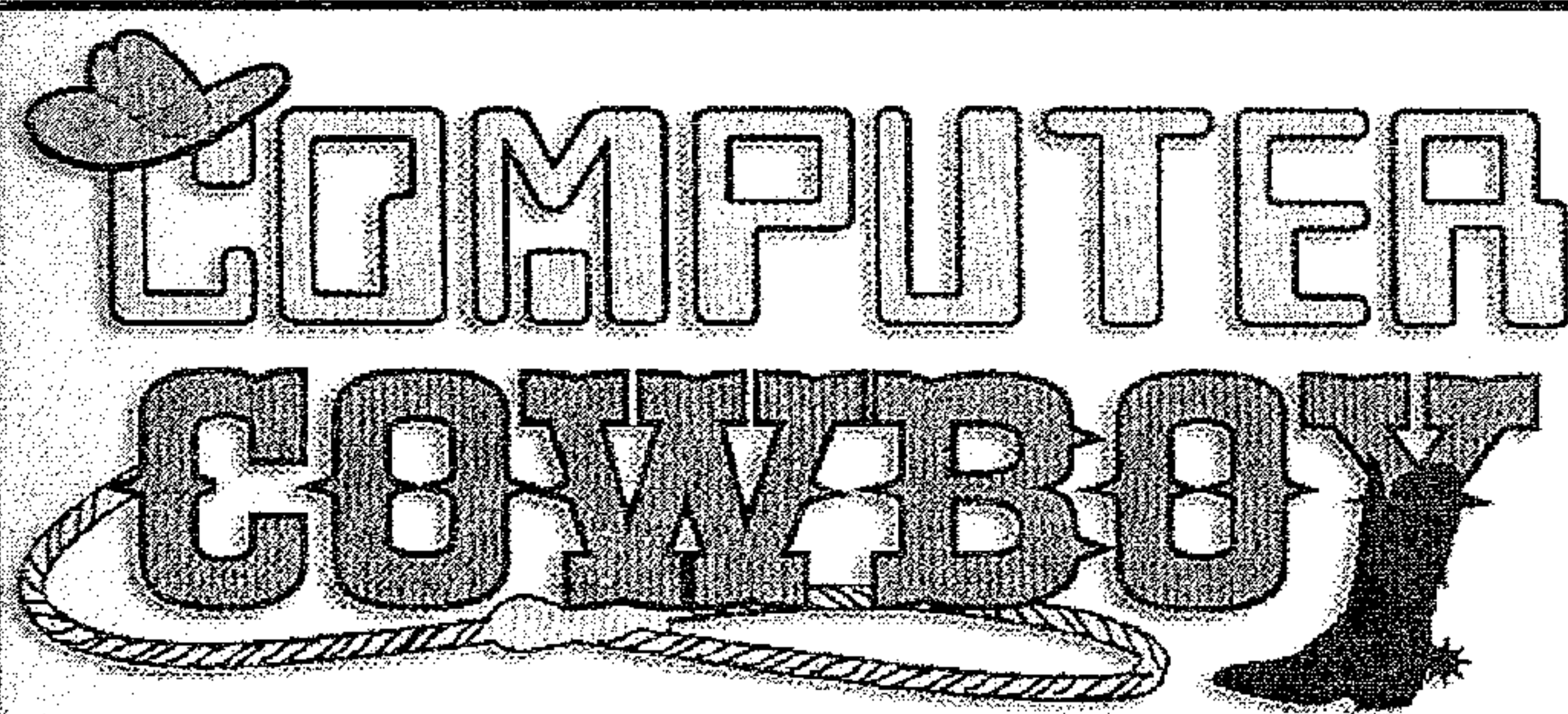
During the investigation, a witness identified to police, stated he had purchased the vehicle from Ms. Viars for \$100 and had taken it to be salvaged. He also stated he was accompanied by Ms. Viars who told him she couldn't sell the vehicle at the salvage

yard because she didn't have an identification card.

An employee at the salvage yard verified by photo lineup that Ms. Viars was with the witness when the vehicle was sold to the salvage yard on April 11th, 2011.

Ms. Viars did, with the intent to deprive the creditor, Mr. Fugate, sell the vehicle without consent of the creditor.

Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO made the arrest Sunday.

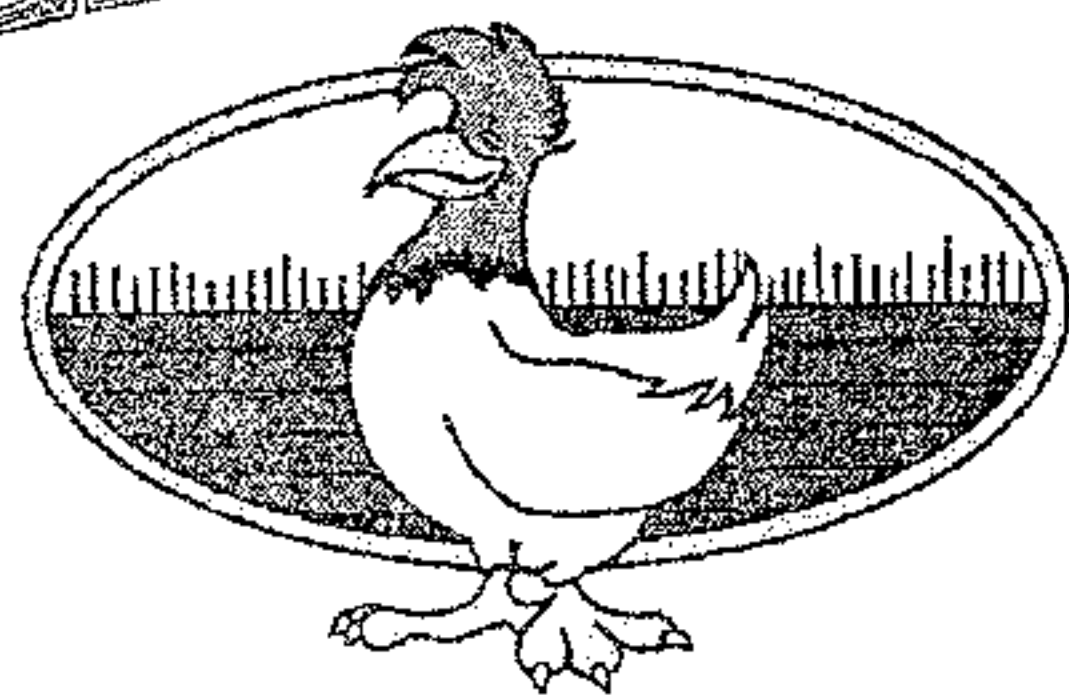

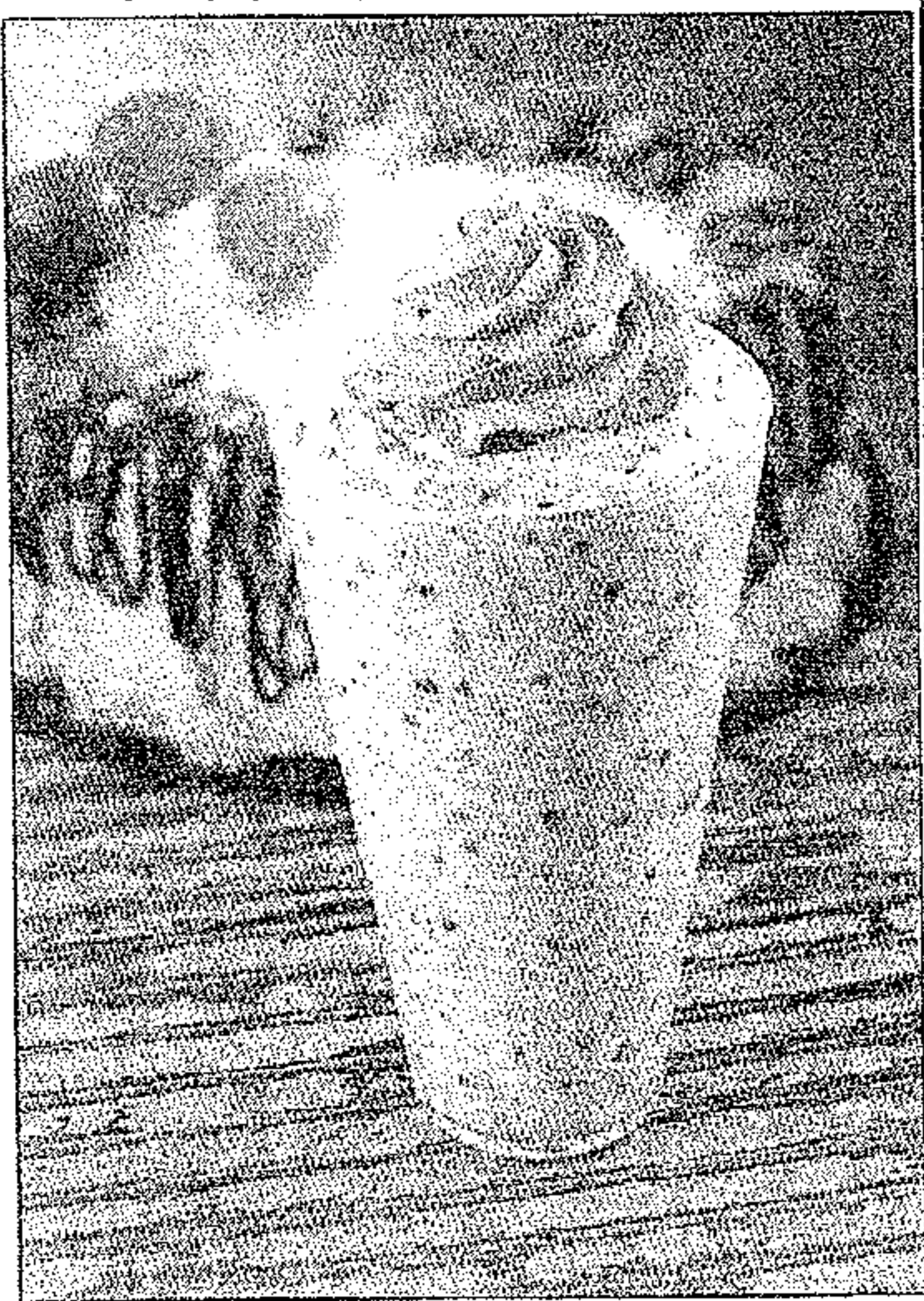

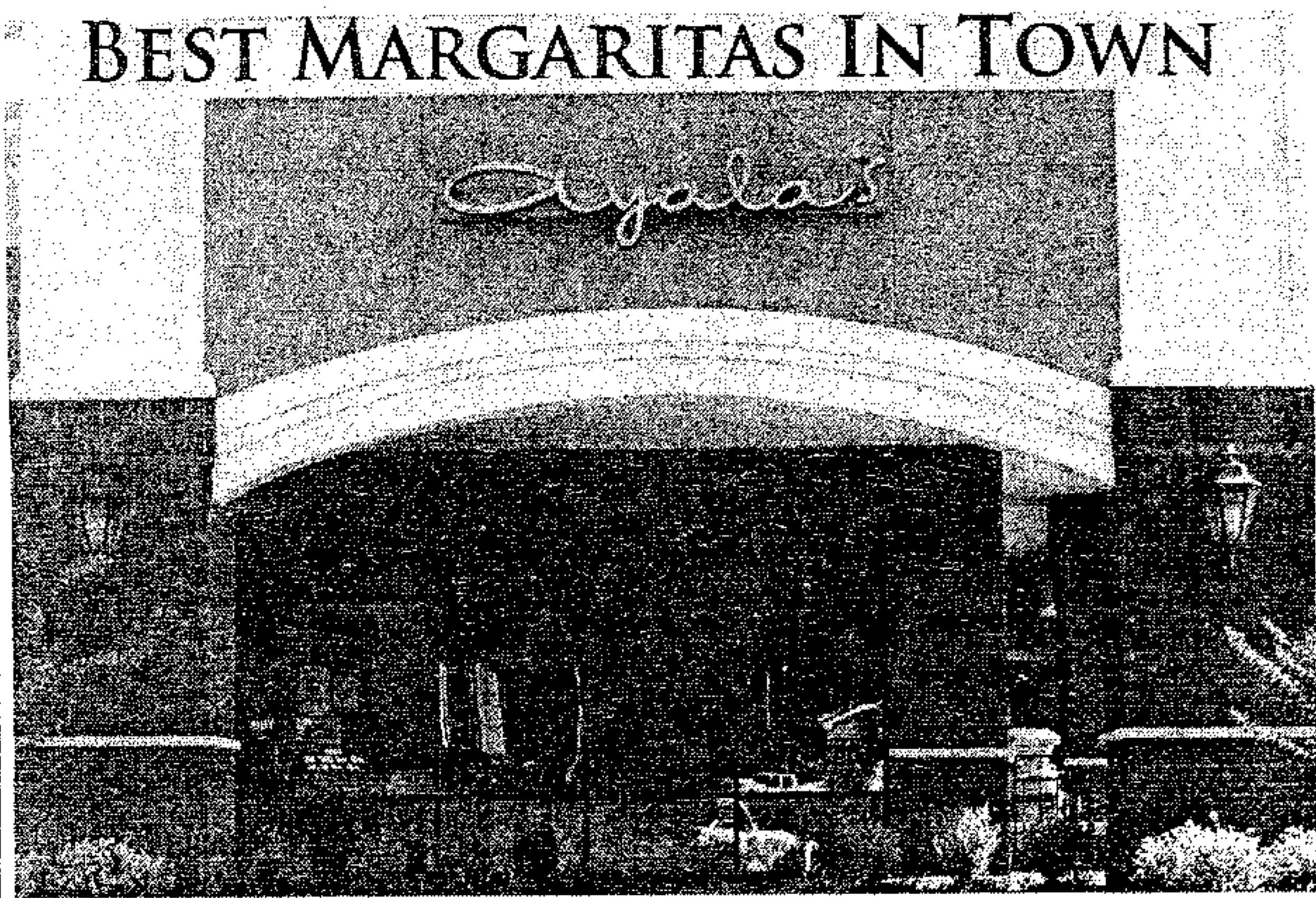

The report states, Saturday, around 9:47 AM, LCSO Deputies Olwin Norman and Lonnie Gaut were in F-Block due to the inmates smoking in the bathroom area. Christopher Fritts was one of four inmates caught in the bathroom area.

All four inmates were searched and while Deputy Gaut was

stated he'd obtained the marijuana from trading his commissary for it and he didn't know how it arrived inside F-Block. Fritts declined to write a statement.
