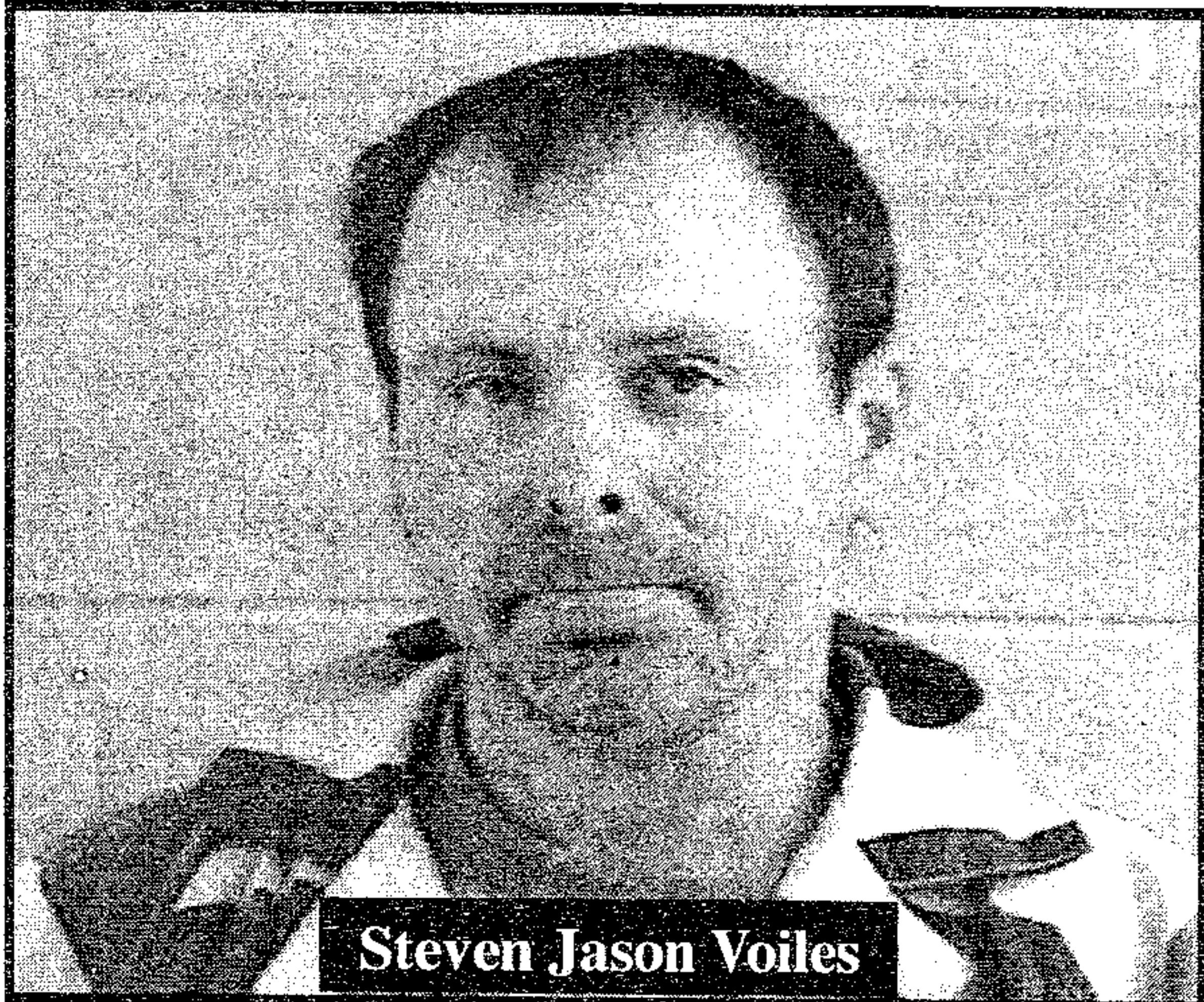


Expired tag leads to arrest for local with high speed chicken feed

of schedule II methamphetamine and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to reports, Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD observed a white Jeep Cherokee traveling east on Highway 72 with its license plate not properly affixed to the back of the vehicle and noticed the tag had expired in January 2011. Upon stopping the vehicle, the driver immediately got out and began acting nervous and fidgety. He identified himself as Steven Voiles but had no form of identification.

Mr. Voiles kept reaching in his pockets and had an odor of

an alcoholic beverage about his person. Officer DeBoer got verbal consent to search the man and felt a small plastic bag commonly used to package narcotics in his right front watch pocket, but before the officer could retrieve the bag, Mr. Voiles began to pull away and was quickly placed into handcuffs to avoid a struggle.

The bag was finally recovered and contained white powder that tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. Also found in Voiles' pocket was a piece of a pen which appeared to be a makeshift pipe that was used to smoke narcotics.

Mr. Voiles was arrested and read his

Miranda Warnings and he stated he purchased the substance at the TA Truck Stop by contacting a unknown male via a CB radio. The unknown male stated he was selling "High Speed Chicken Feed" which Mr. Voiles knew to be a code for uppers or methamphetamine.

Mr. Voiles advised he paid \$30 for it. He was given a citation for the improper registration and transported to the Loudon County jail.

Records state Officer Blake Norman,

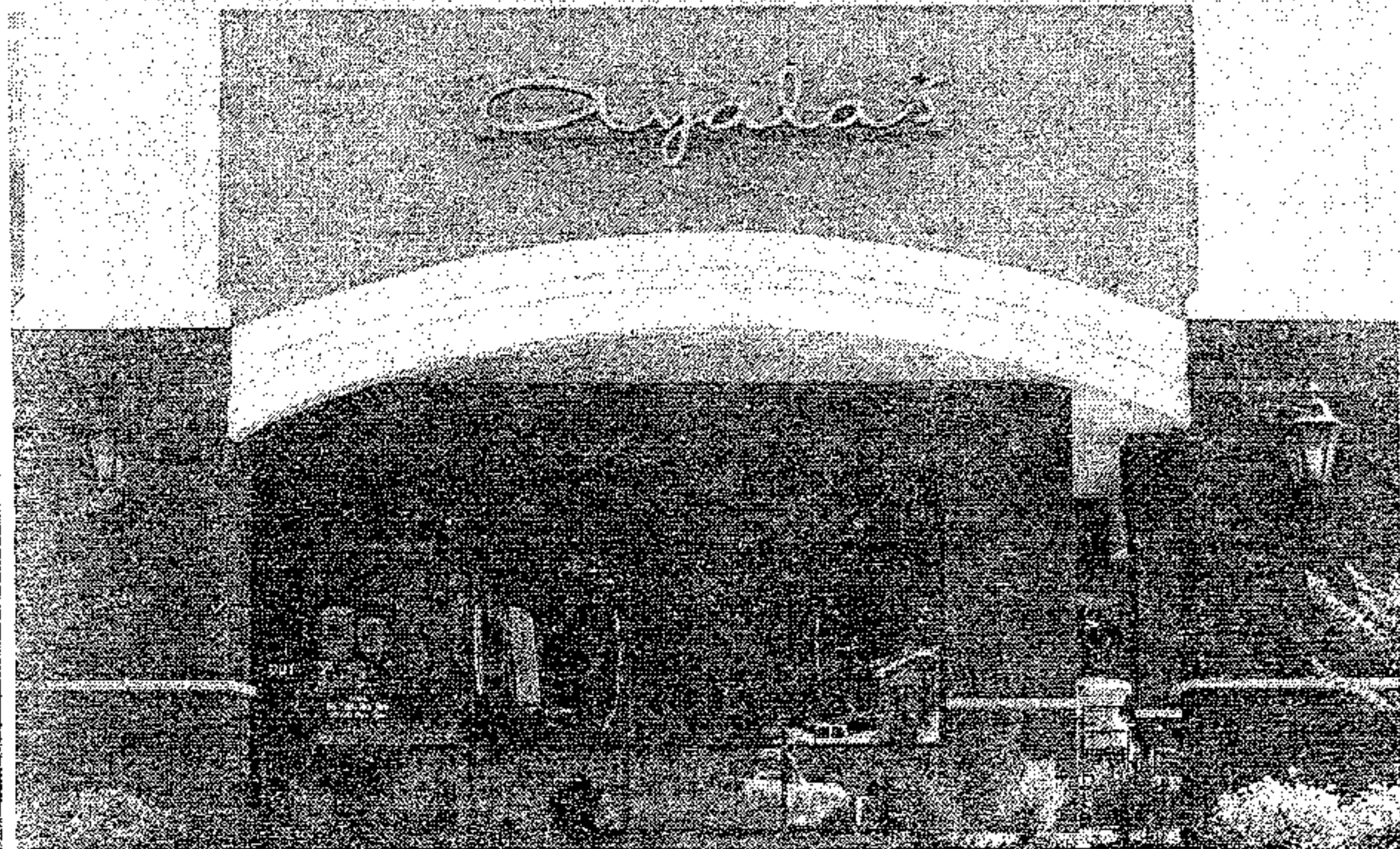
The officer ran Anderson through Loudon County 911 Center and

amphetamine manufacture and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to reports, around 4:51 PM, Sunday, Officer Jeremy Dishner, LCPD responded to Walgreens on possible narcotics activity. Upon arrival, a store employee advised Jonathan Jubar had concealed some items in his pants.

with possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of schedule IV drug.

According to records, Sunday at approximately 4:45 PM, Walgreens Pharmacy personnel called dispatch alerting Lenoir City Police Department Ms. Watson is a

frequent purchaser of pseudoephedrine and she was purchasing again. As Ms. Watson and her fiancée left the pharmacy, Officer Keith Sennett, LCPD stopped the blue Nissan Maxima in which she was a passenger.

Ms. Watson gave the officer consent to search her vehicle and she was found to be in

possession of one box of pseudoephedrine, a pill crusher, one knife, three razor blades, one clear tube full of white powder residue and one straw with the

same residue inside. All items recovered are commonly used for crushing or cutting pills to be snorted.

Ms. Watson also had 10 soma pills in an un-

marked bottle in her possession without a prescription.

Officer Sennett made the arrest. Officer Allen Bean, LCPD was also in attendance.

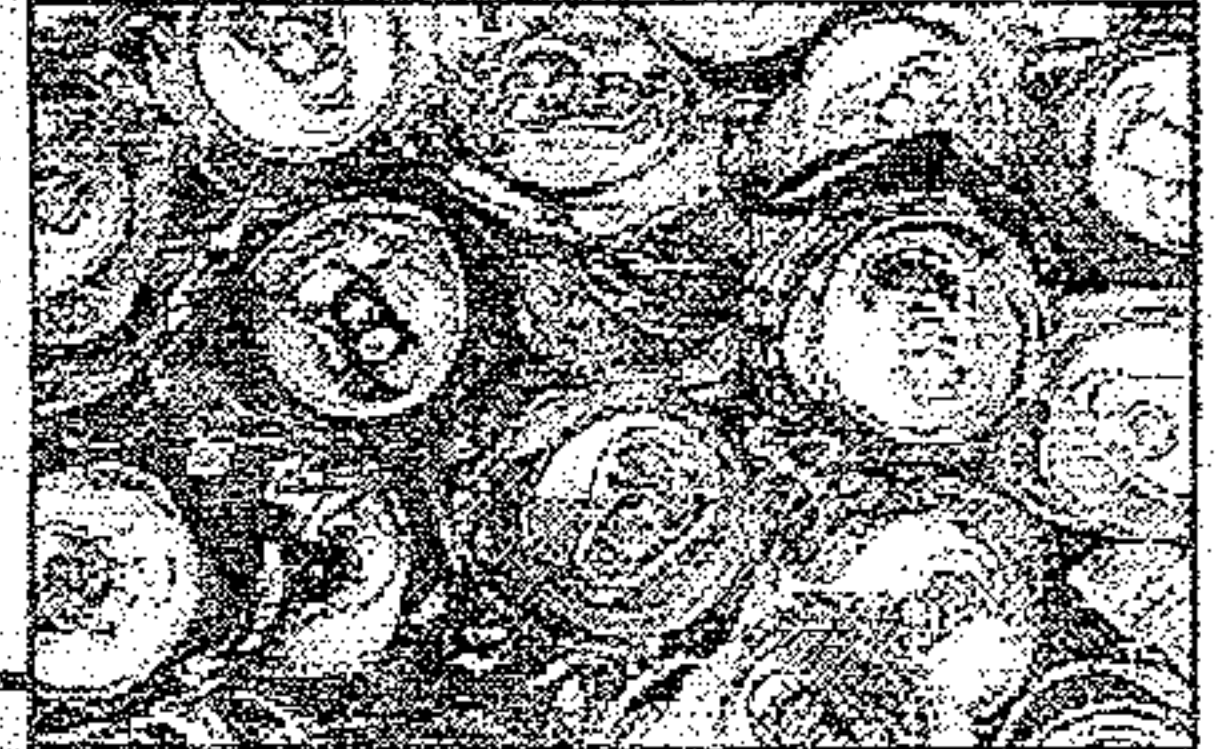

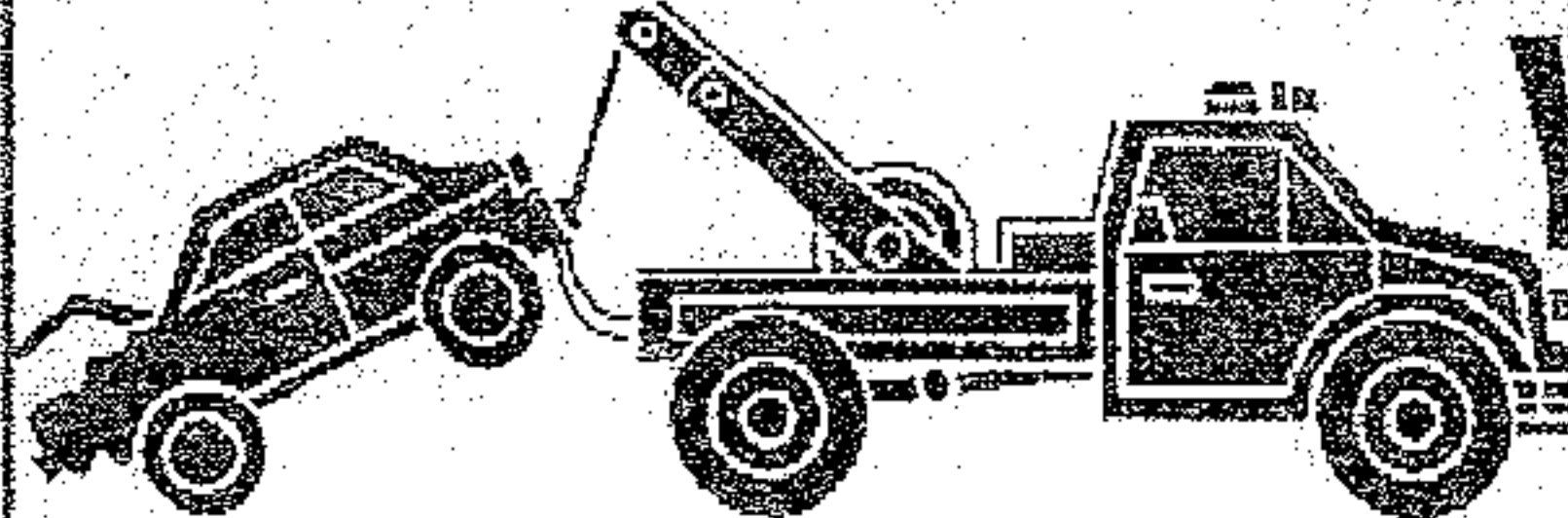
