the competition. Both spots were funded and produced by the Governor's Highway Safety Office (GHSO) in 2009. "Nailed" has won several awards including the ADDYs, Tellys, a Mobius Award, and a regional Emmy.

According to records, Wednesday, at approximately 6:53 AM, Deputy Jake Keener, LCSO arrived at the scene of a domestic disturbance on Sunnyside Road in Philadelphia.

Kayla Abercrombie stated her husband, Jessie Abercrombie, assaulted her then ran into the woods. She said Abercrombie threw a phone at her, hitting her in the face. He also punched her and told her she was going to die.

Mrs. Abercrombie

said she fought back and called 911 for help and said Abercrombie further threatened he would kill her if he went to jail. Deputy Keener reported he observed visible signs of the assault and the house was in disarray, with furniture overturned and things scattered on the floor.

The lawman found Abercrombie hiding in the woods near the house and Abercrombie told the deputy his wife was fighting him and he was hiding from her.

Jessie James Abercrombie was determined to be the primary aggressor and was transported to the Loudon County Jail. He also had an outstanding warrant out of Blount County.

The four winners, all Tennessee residents, were selected in a computer drawing from 6,840 applicants. The elk hunt is scheduled Oct. 17-21, 2011 at the North Cumberland Wildlife Management Area.

The participants for this year's hunt will be Richard R. Rutherford of Walland, Terrell S. Holt of Columbia, John Mark Alston of Knoxville, and Jody A. Moore of Loudon. Daryl Ratajczak, TWRA Wildlife and Forestry Division Chief, announced the winners.

The fifth participant will be the recipient of a permit that is donated to a Non-Governmental Organization, which this year was the Tennessee

Wildlife Resources Foundation. That permit will be auctioned on eBay. The auction period will run July 14-23. Fund-raising proceeds are designated for the TWRA Elk Program.

In other business at the meeting, the commission passed proclamations with new language that would allow for land purchases to take place without necessitating a proclamation change. Small tracts of land are sometimes purchased adjacent to Wildlife Management Areas when they become available, especially in West Tennessee.

Stacy Surgenor, manager of the Flintville Hatchery, gave an update on activities at the trout hatchery. Fisheries Division Assistant Chief Frank

Fiss gave an update on federal budgets that will eliminate much of the funding for Dale Hollow and Erwin hatcheries which supply trout to several popular fisheries in Tennessee. Both facilities are operated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS).

Trout stocking will continue as usual this year. Tailwater and reservoir trout fisheries will receive about 20 percent less trout in 2012 and even deeper cuts are projected for 2013.

Darren Rider, Boating Division Chief, presented a Memorial Day holiday weekend report. There were no boating fatalities recorded during the period. There were five accidents reported and boating officers made 20 boating under the influence (BUI) arrests.

Steve Nifong, Acting Law Enforcement Division Chief, presented an overview of the efforts of TWRA wildlife officers in response to the tornadoes in East Tennessee and the flooding in West Tennessee this spring.

The TWRC will not meet in July. The meeting schedule will resume Aug. 24-25 (Wednesday-Thursday) in Kingsport.

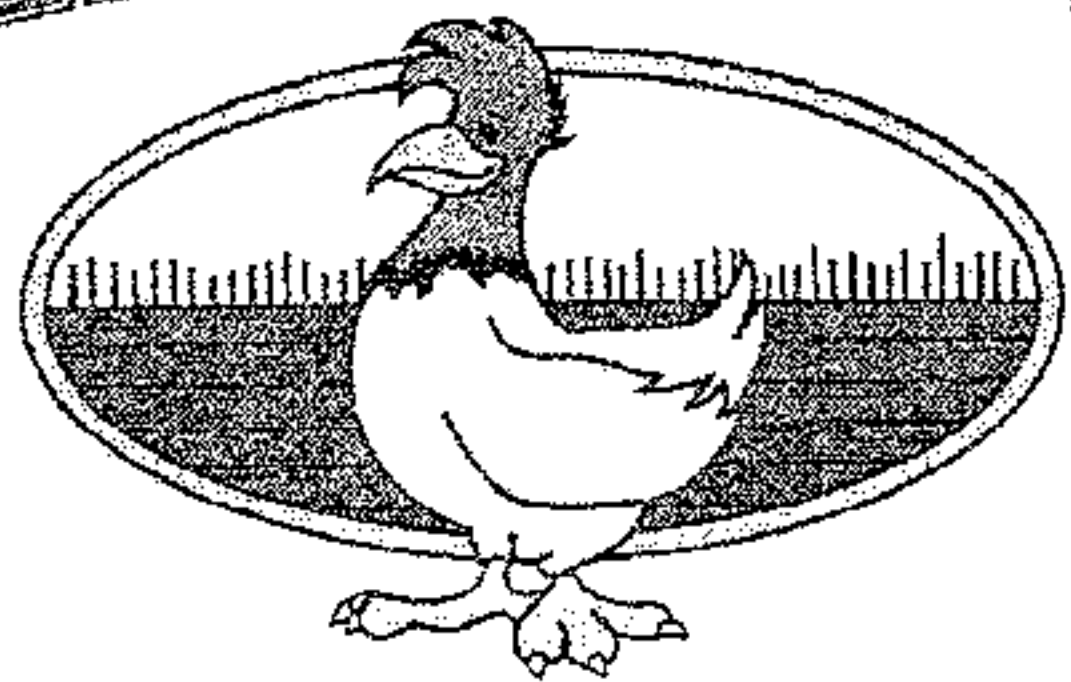

Hensley. The victims decided they didn't want to press charges on Chris since he brought the car back.

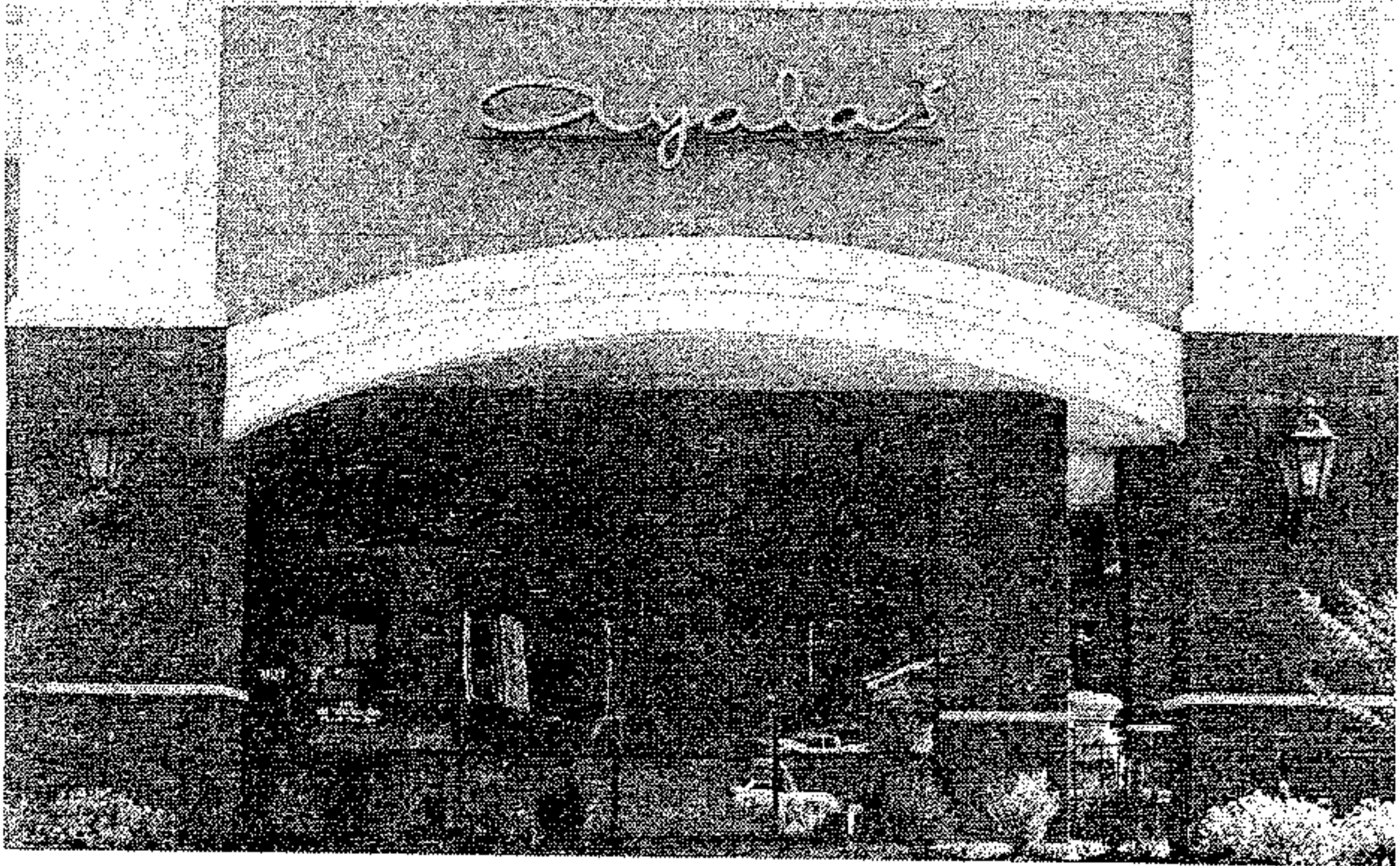
A check of Mr. Hensley's license, however came back revoked for failure to file for insurance after an accident. He was placed under arrest and duly charged.

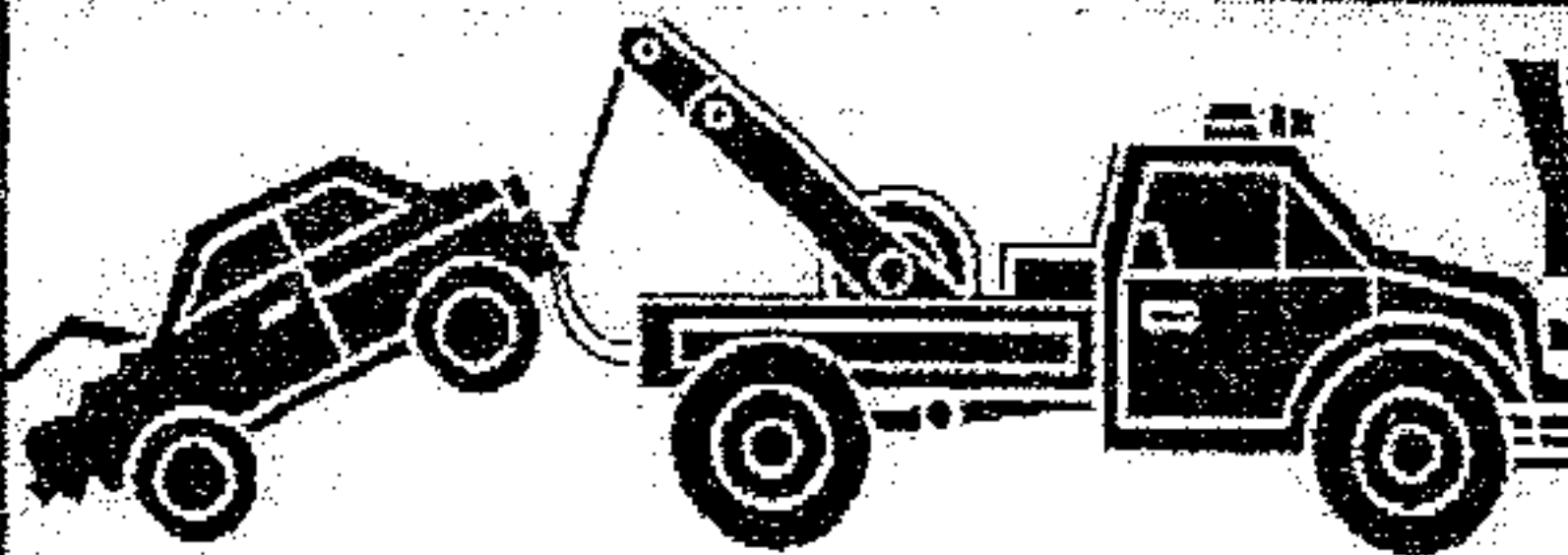
