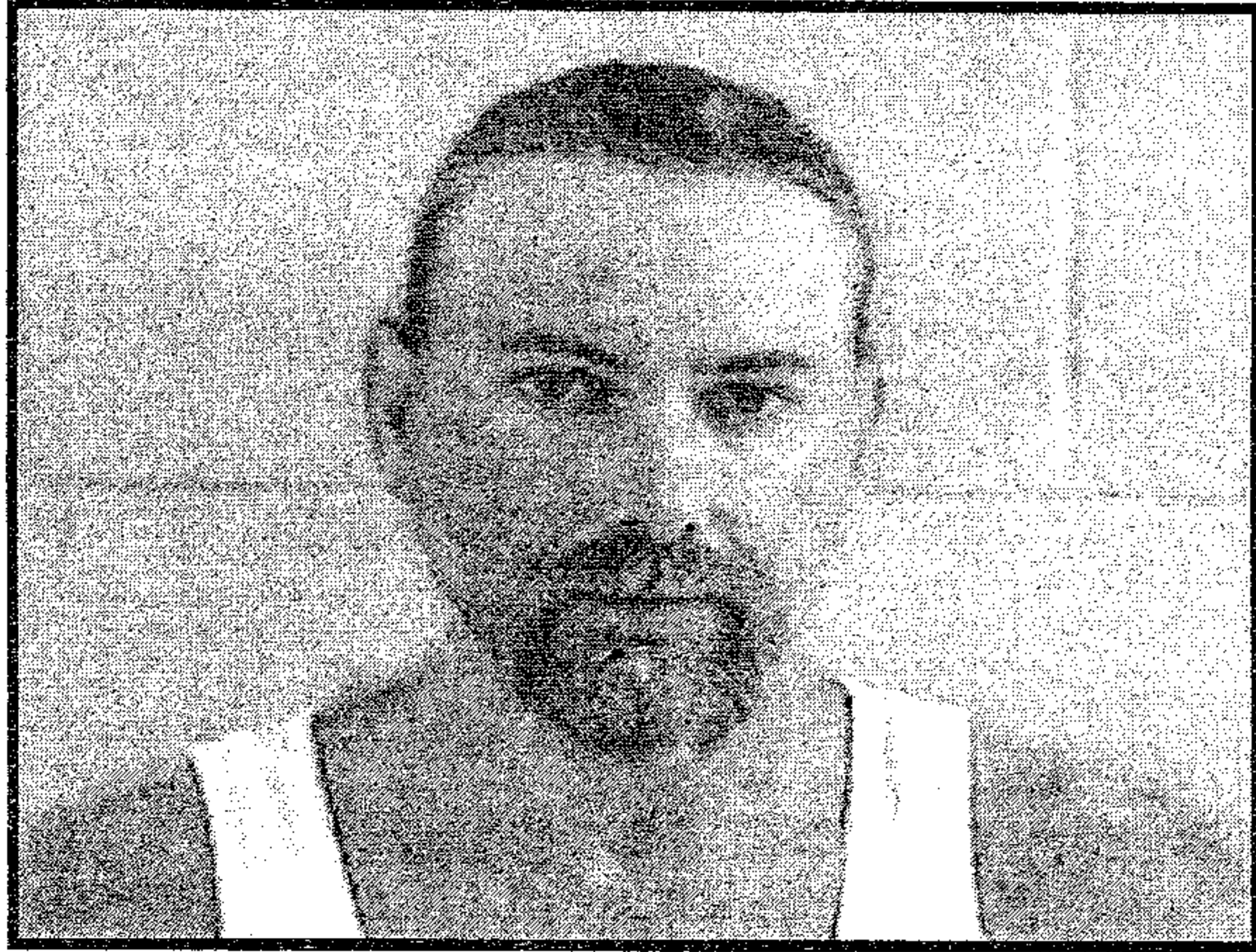

tance since July 2010 must wait until October 1 for the new program year to begin before they can re-apply for benefits.

"We are aware of the hardships many citizens face during the summer months where there is an increase in utility costs," said Tennessee Department of Human Services Assistant Commissioner Robert L. Matthews. "DHS is here to assist in any way possible."

LIHEAP regulations establish 150 percent of the poverty level as

the maximum income level allowed in determining eligibility. Income levels, maintained in the Federal Register by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, are viewable at <http://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty/11poverty.shtml>. Currently, a Tennessee family of four with a household income no greater than \$33,525 would meet eligibility requirements.

The program's mission is to assist low-income households -- particularly those who pay a high proportion of household income for home energy bills -- in helping them meet their immediate home energy needs.

Individuals also are served on a priority point system specifically targeted toward

households with members who are elderly, disabled and/or under the age of six. LIHEAP payments are made directly to the local utility company or energy supplier. Interested applicants need to contact the local agency that serves their community.

According to affidavits; on Thursday, June 23rd, 2011, a 15 year old female told Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID she was sexually assaulted by her mom's boyfriend, Michael A. Lorig, who lived with her and her mom.

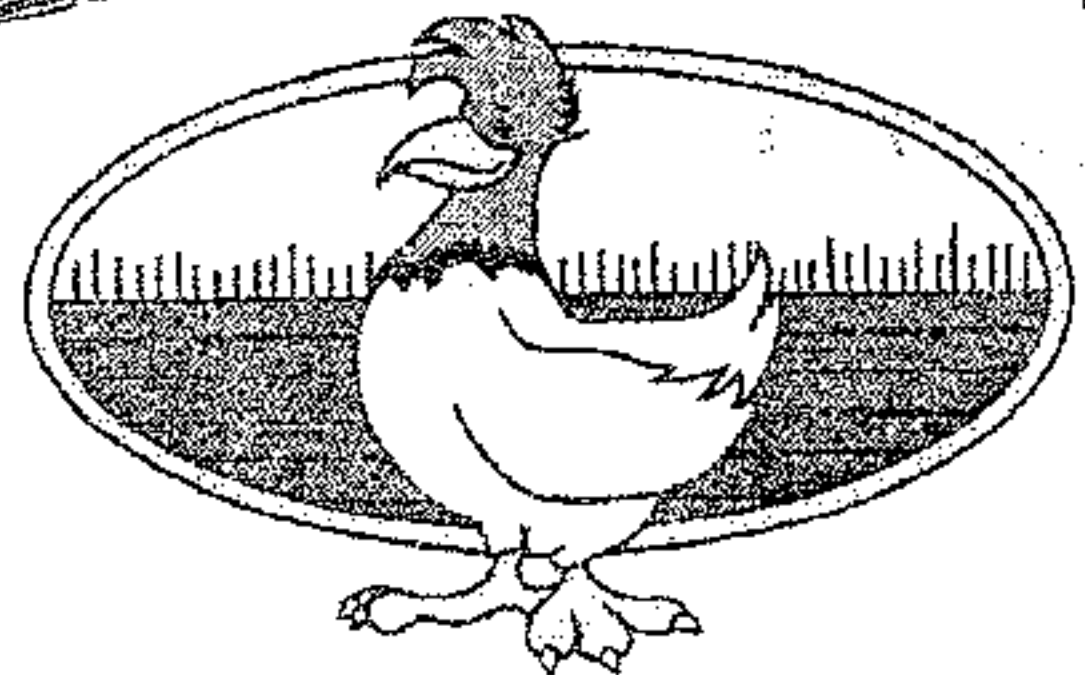

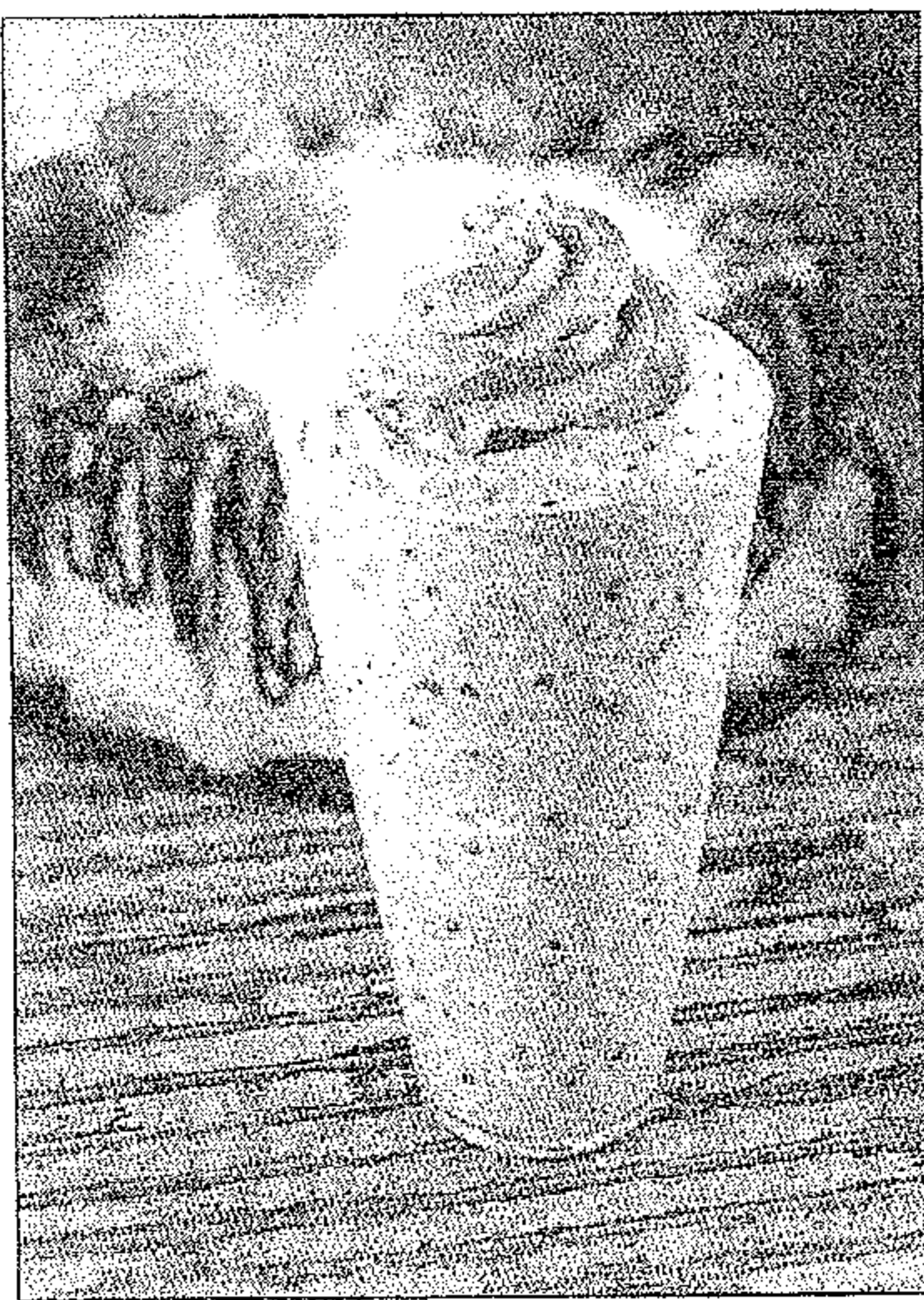

Substation

The complainant, Craig Alan Dunn, an employee of LCUB, stated someone broke into the substation and cut several ground wires that were made out of copper. One of the wires cut was hooked up to a transformer and due to it being hooked up to the transformer, when the wire was cut, it caused a spark, thereby causing the transformer to ignite on fire.

Deputy Bowman then notified Investigator Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID. During their investigation, Bowman and Cosner observed a small hole that had been cut in the chain link fence to make entrance into the sub station. They also

found where several copper ground wires were cut and removed from the premises.

The lawmen also found a knife on the ground next to the transformer, dropped by the unknown offender. Investigator Cosner collected all the evidence and took pictures of the damage.

The complainant stated there was around \$5000 in prop-

erty loss and damage. The investigation continues.

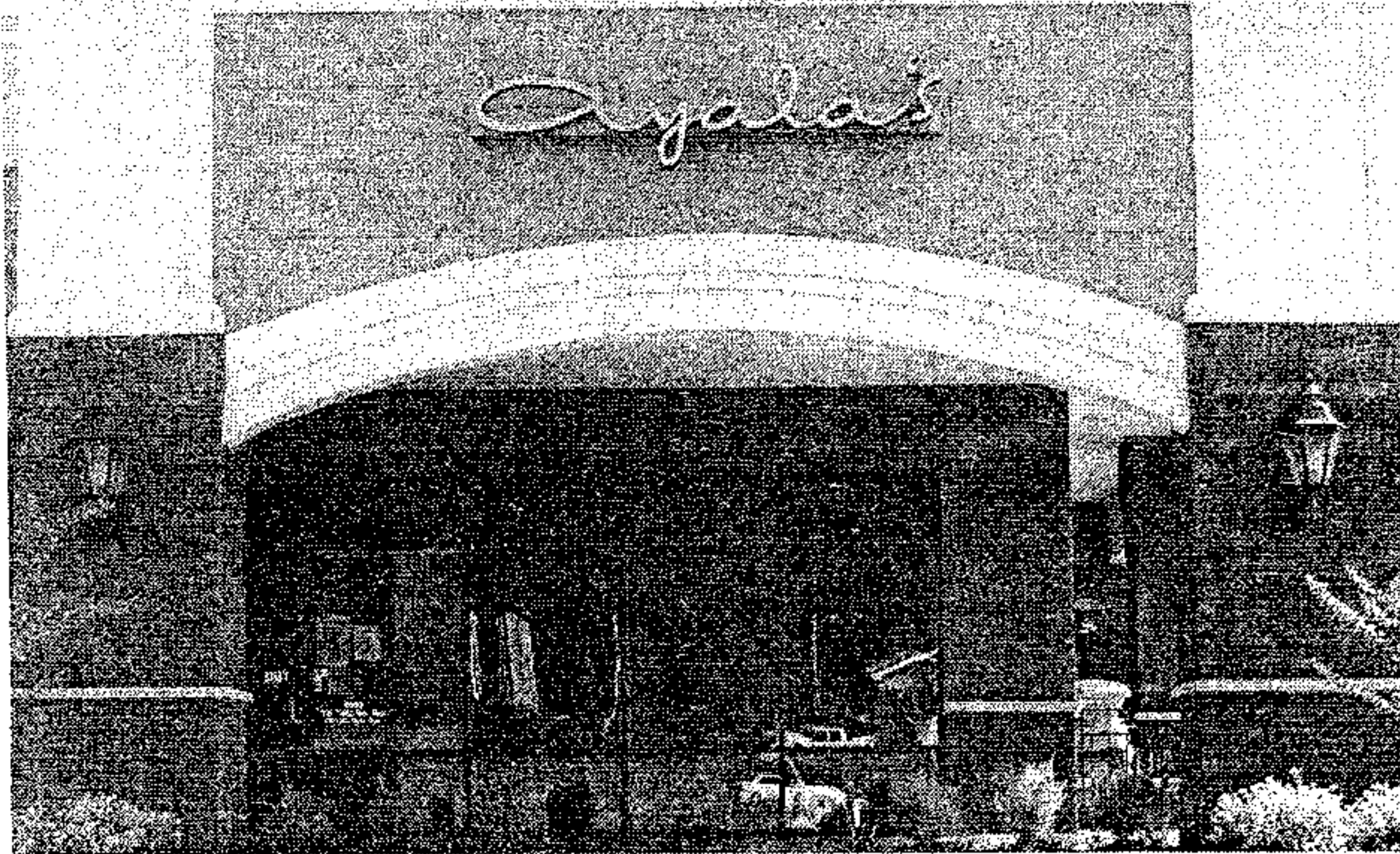

According to reports, Deputy Michael Watkins, LCSO was dispatched to Interstate 75 North in reference to a driver in a gray Dodge Ram 1500 who ran another vehicle off the roadway on Davis



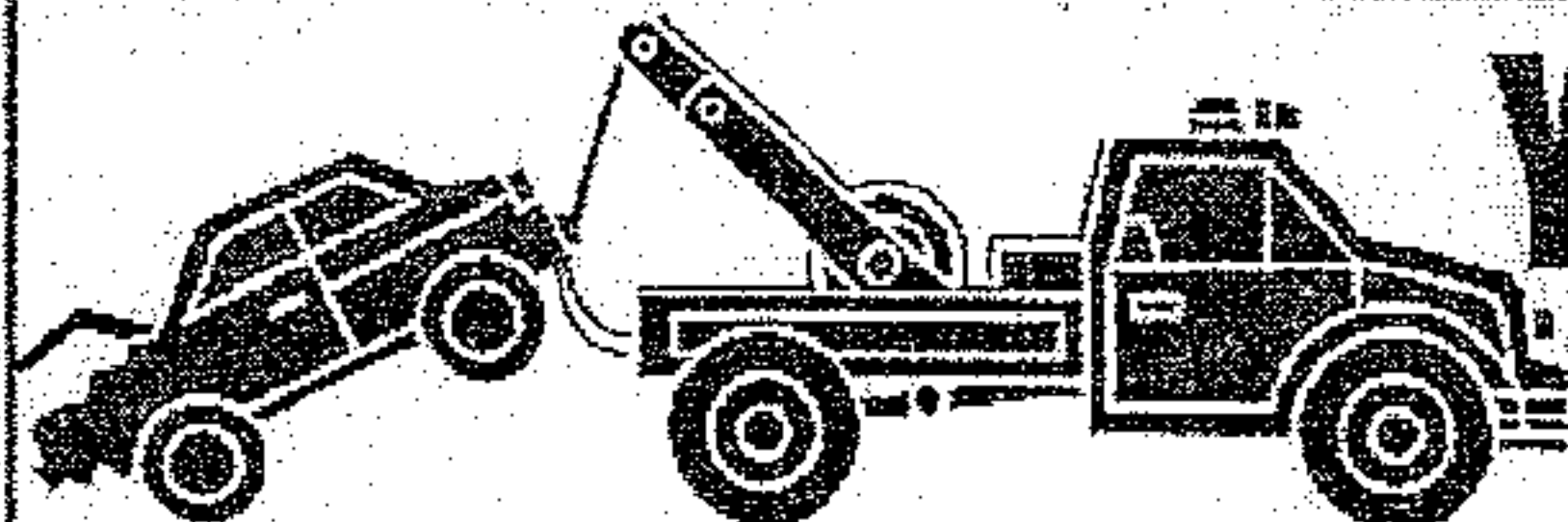
