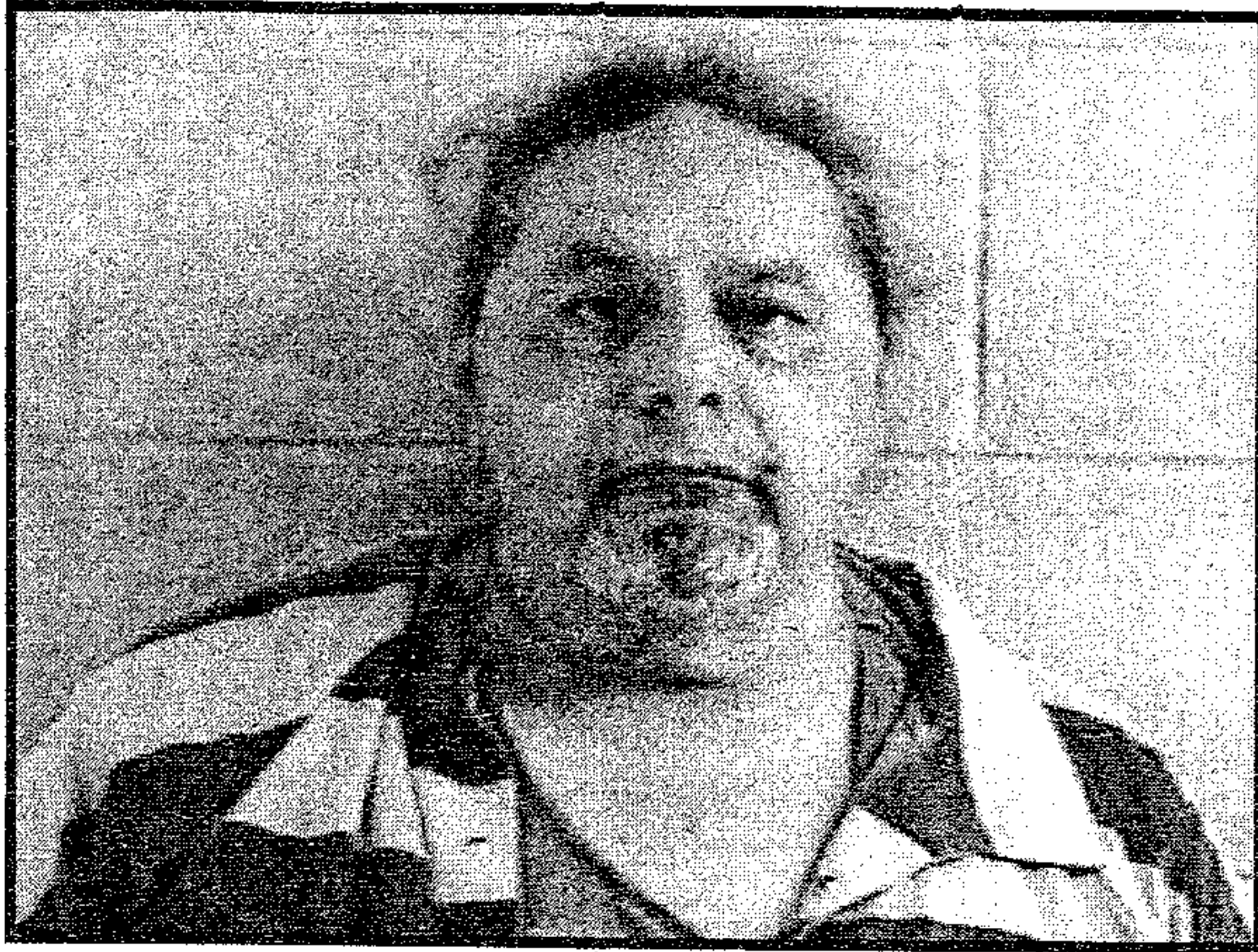

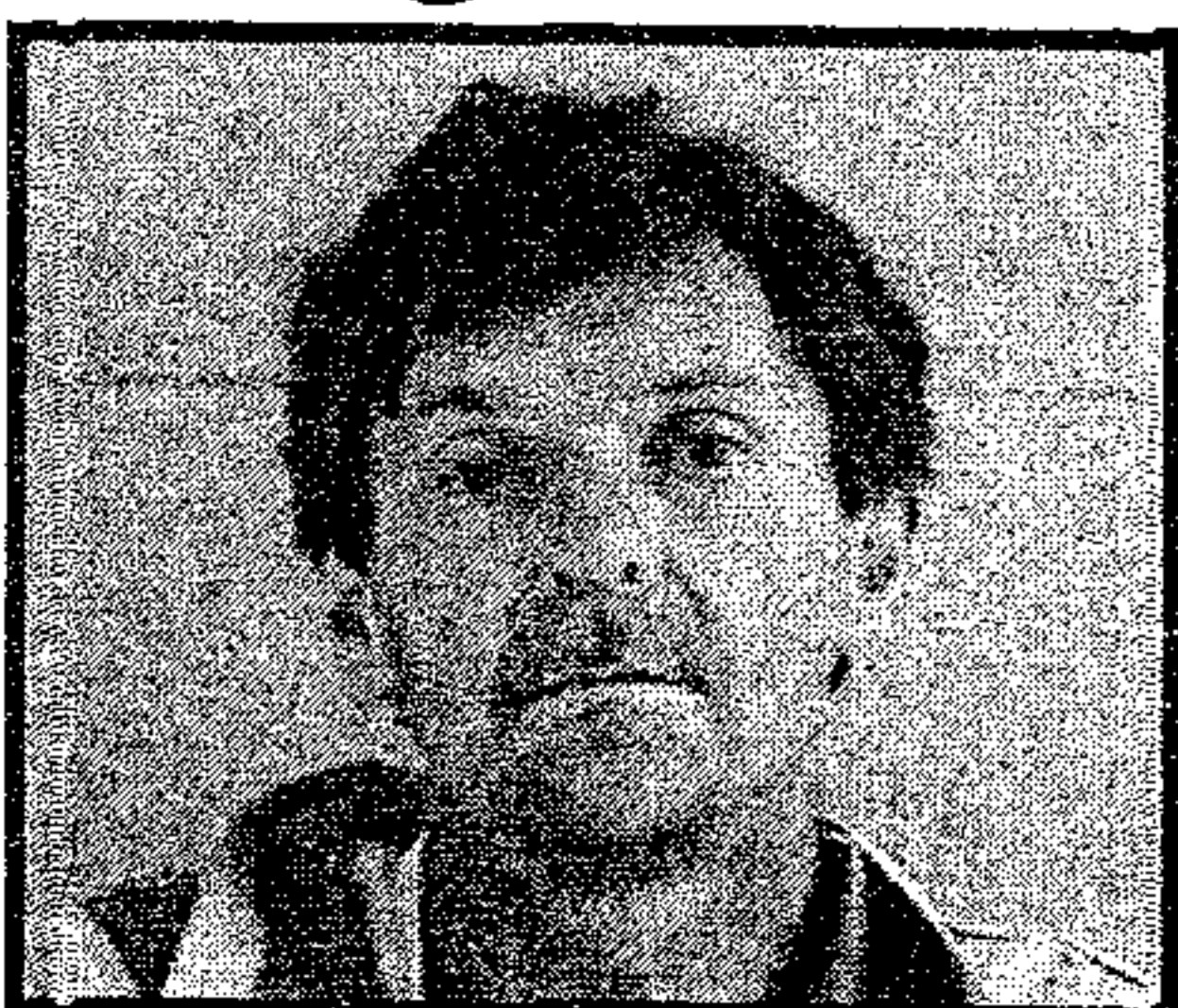

According to multiple affidavits; on Monday, May 30th, 2011, Officer Brendan DeBoer, LPD observed a blue Toyota Corolla traveling through the Country Inn and Suite's and Super 8 Motel parking lots at a unsafe speed and in an erratic manner. He made contact with the driver and immediately smelled the odor of burnt marijuana coming from the car.

The driver was identified as Alexsandr Stepenskiy and when asked to exit the vehicle he was unsteady on his feet, had slow, slurred speech and performed poorly on field sobriety tasks.

A plastic bag with a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana was found in Stepenskiy's wallet. Also found

in a pink bag belonging to Mr. Stepenskiy was a prescription bottle containing thin strips of paper that he stated was suboxone and a pill bottle containing numerous pills including oxycodone and xanax.

Mr. Stepenskiy was arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

According to records, Tuesday, at approximately 10:45 PM, Officer Emily Lawson, LCPD responded to Walmart, Highway 321, in reference to a theft by an employee. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with one of Walmart's Asset Protection employees, who advised another Walmart employee, Gailand Brede, had been observed on surveillance video concealing merchandise

in the maintenance area over a period of several days.

Records indicate on May 15th, 2011, at 4:40 PM, Mr. Brede was seen on video surveillance concealing two DVDs in his jacket pocket before he left in the maintenance department of the store.

Then on May 19th, 2011, Mr. Brede concealed a gun holster under a broom while sweeping the store. Then later, he concealed the holster under his jacket with the other DVDs.

On May 24th, 2011, Brede exited the store with the items and his jacket in his bag. There also were other items found to have been taken by Brede, which included a cake on May 17th, a package of Skittles May 18th, and on May 19th,

a Demolition Man. Mr. Brede couldn't provide a receipt.

According to the AP officer, when Mr. Brede was confronted about the larcenies on Tuesday, May 31st, 2011, he admitted to taking the items and wrote a statement of such for the officer.

The value of the items totaled \$48.21. Walmart wished to prosecute, a clerk was called and the AP officer swore to an affidavit.

Officer Lawson took Mr. Brede into custody and transported him to the Loudon County Jail.

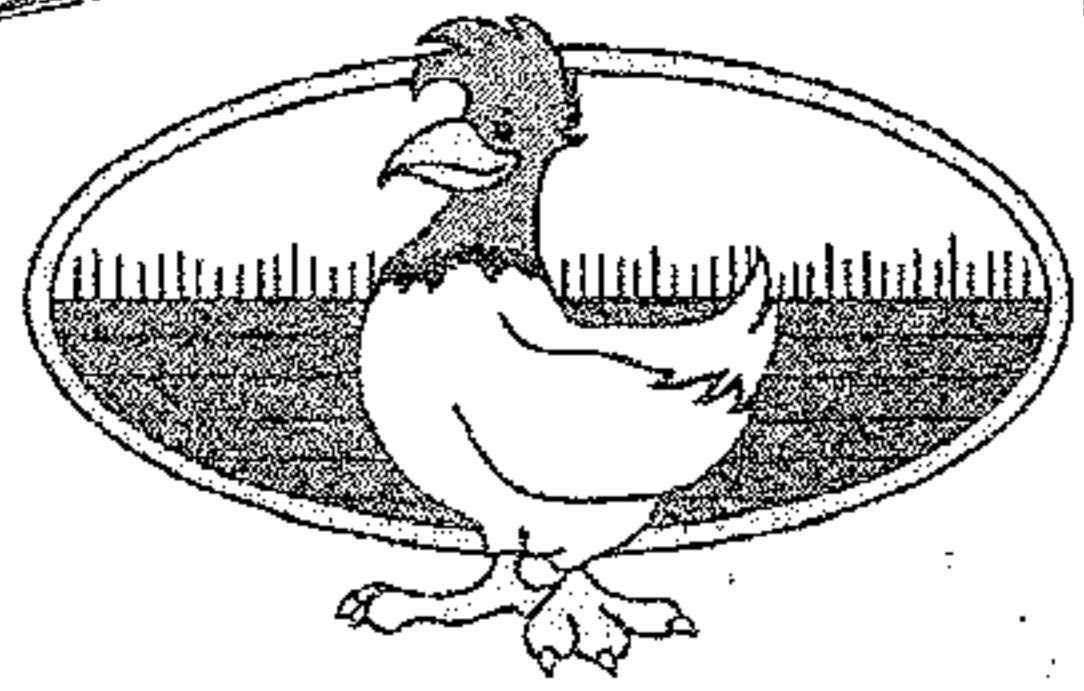

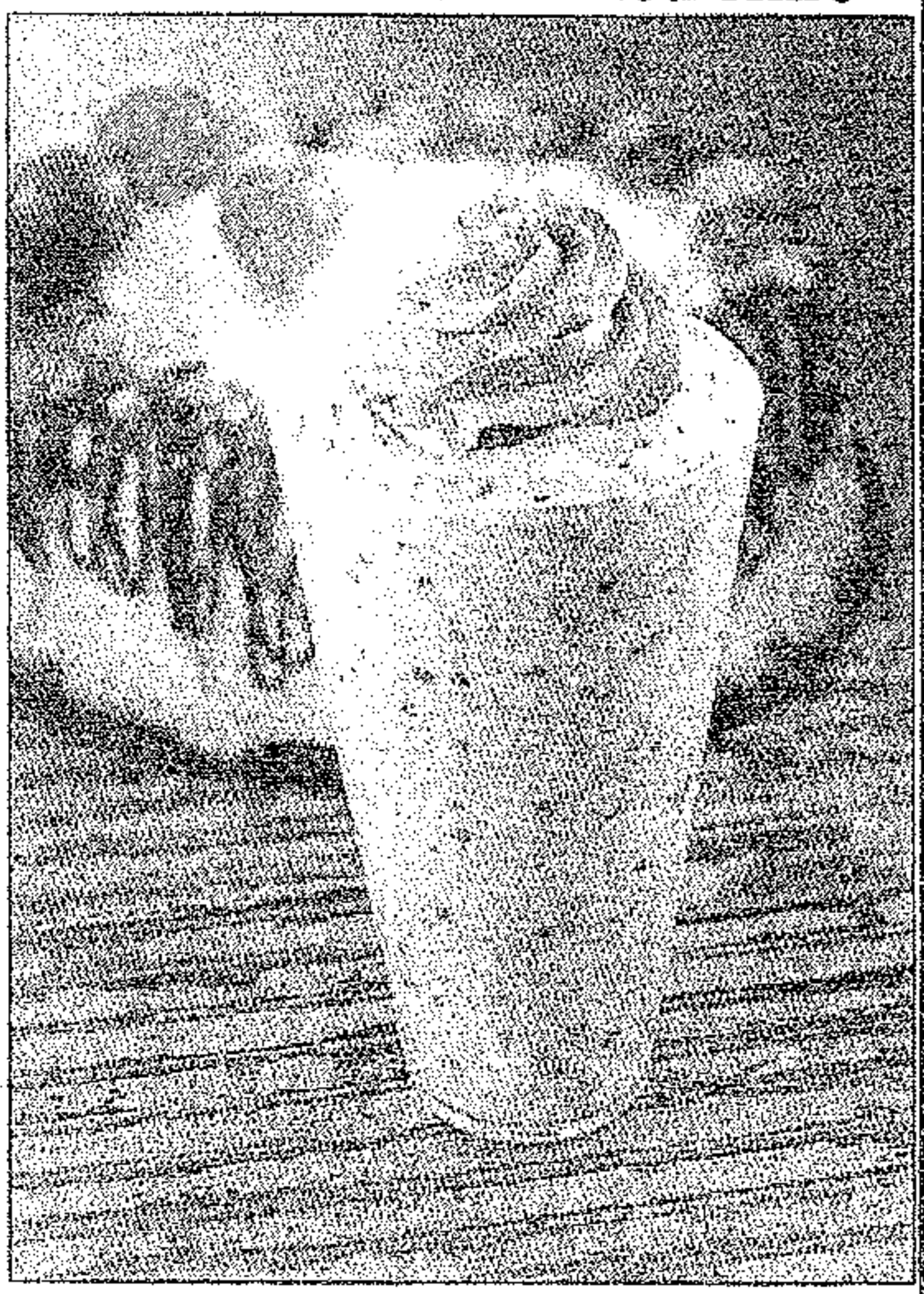

Staff members of the Office of Vital Records are also now taking and returning phone calls from customers statewide until 6:30 p.m. Central time Monday through Thursday to reach those who are not available by phone during traditional daytime business hours.

The Office of Vital Records registers and maintains original certificates of births, deaths, marriages and divorces that occur in Tennessee, and provides certified copies of these records to qualified individuals for a small fee. Anyone seeking a copy

of a vital record must present identification. The downtown Nashville office is the only location that issues delayed birth and death certificates when no record is found on file, amends all vital records and processes new certificates of birth resulting from legal action such as adoption or paternity determination. The Nashville office can also issue long form birth certificates for births that occurred anywhere in the state from 1914 to present.

"We're pleased to be able to offer extended hours to our customers seeking vital records," said Health Commis-

sioner Susan R. Cooper, MSN, RN. "These additional hours will help us better serve those Tennesseans who work during traditional business hours."

The Tennessee Office of Vital Records is located at 421 5th Avenue North in Nashville. The customer service counter is open from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday, and from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Please note that vital records staff members will not request money, credit card information or Social Security numbers over the phone. If someone

contacts you by phone and requests such information, as always, do not provide it since it may be a scam.

Tennessee's local county health departments will continue to issue short-form or abstracted birth certificates. Certified copies of birth, death, marriage and divorce certificates are also available by mail, and with additional fees, via

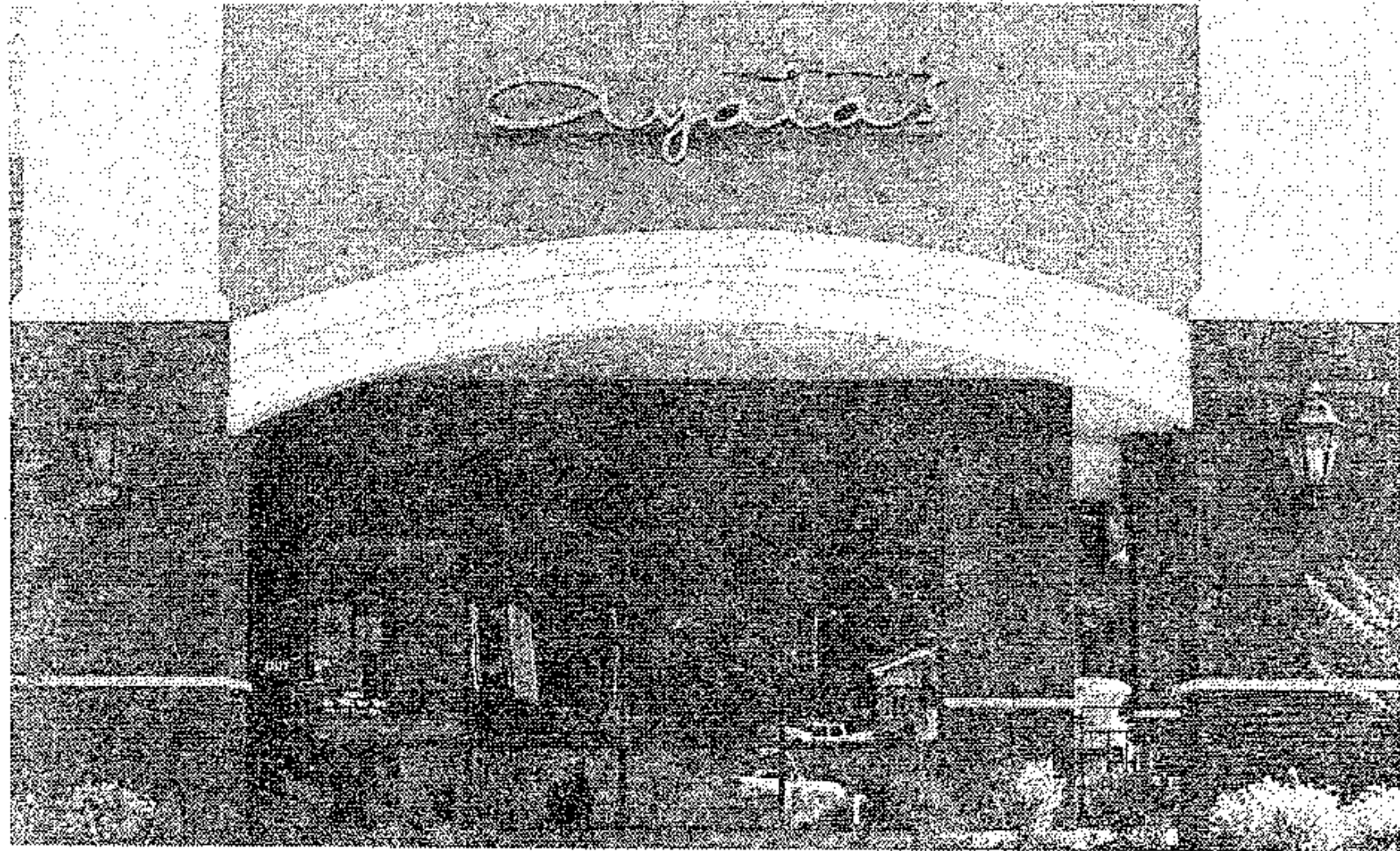

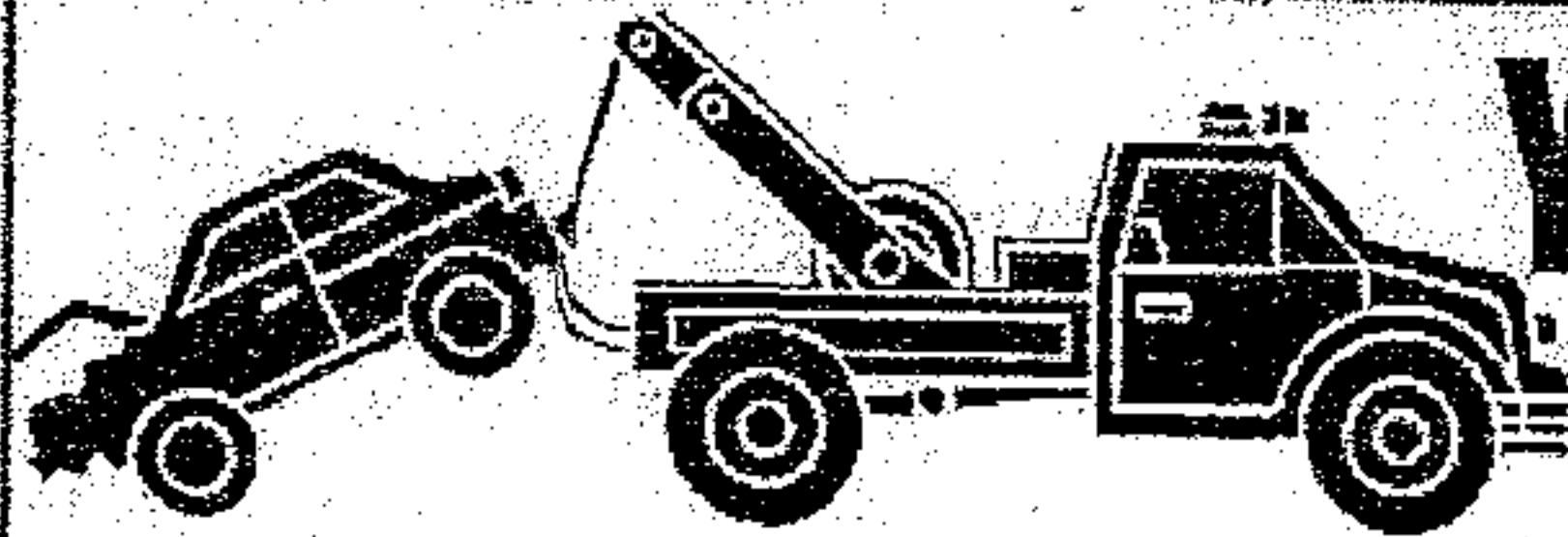
