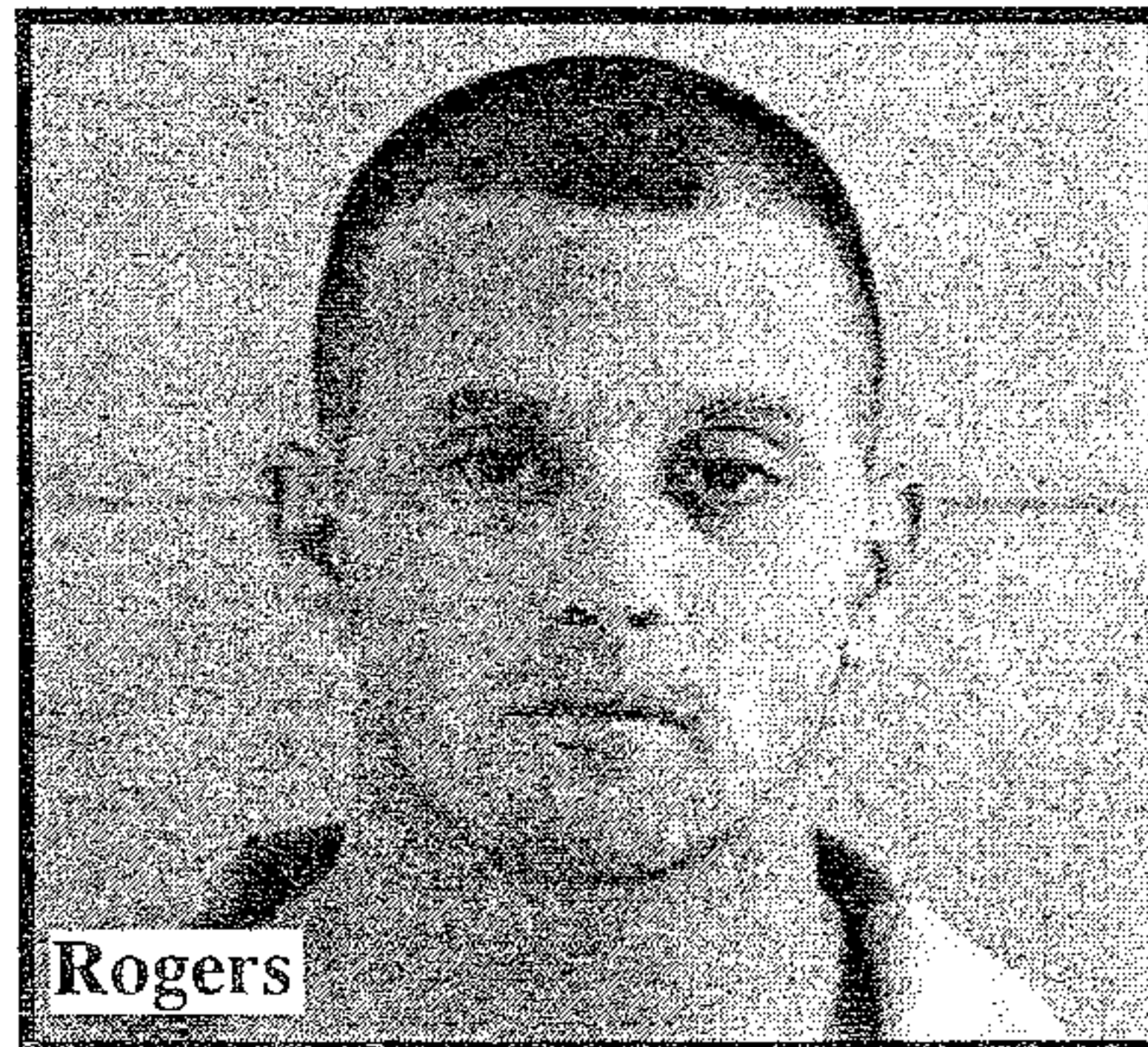

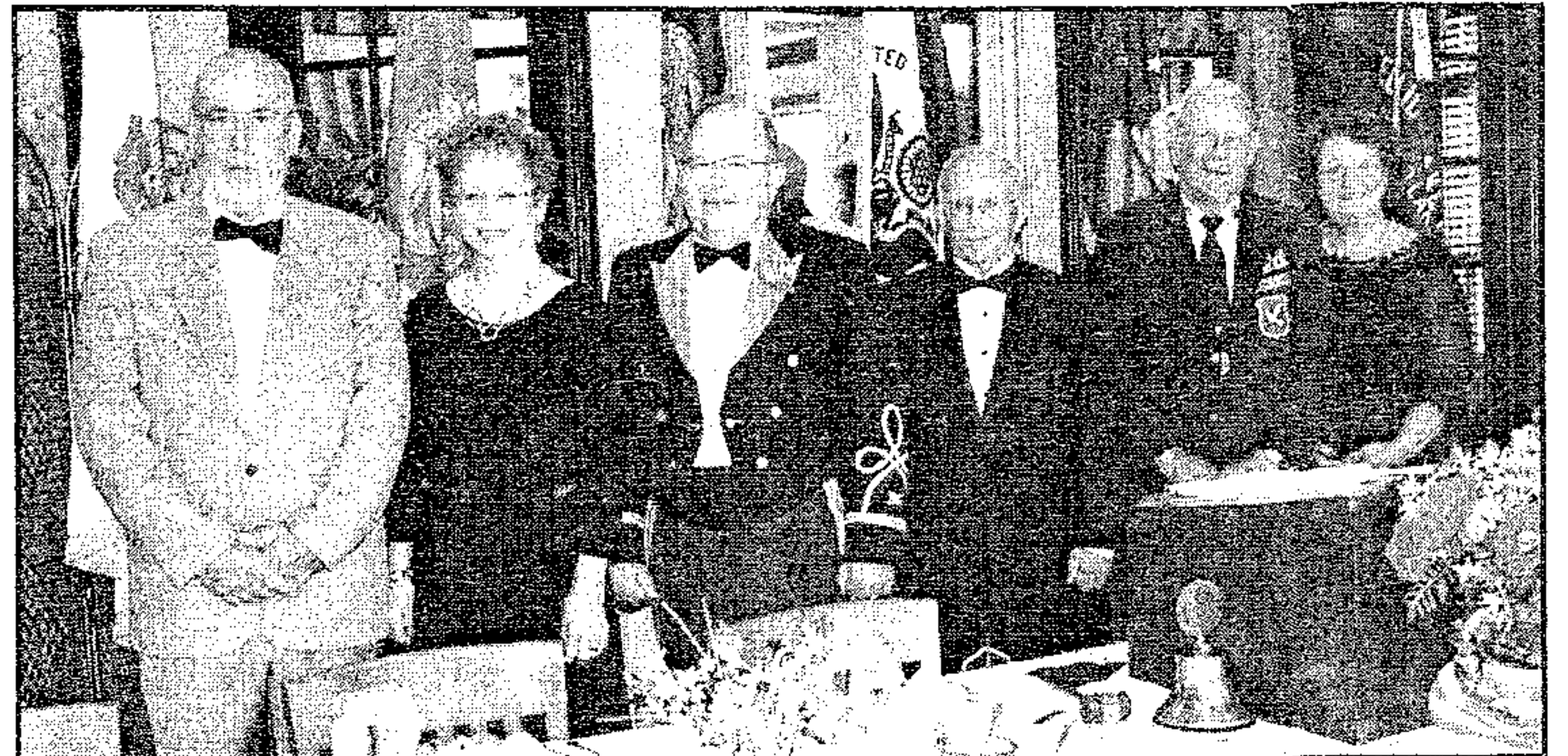

Did you or I ever share Jesus with them?

If you have known me for anytime at all then you know there was

a long period of my life that I made a lot of bad decisions too. I drank too much alcohol, talked with a filthy mouth, damaged relationships, destroyed families and many other things that I am so ashamed of. When you read this article maybe that is the person you think about and wonder what right I have to speak about the Lord. It wasn't that long ago that someone even emailed the pastor of my church to proclaim how sinful I was and how the church should not associate with me. I bet that doesn't happen to everybody!

I didn't get mad at that person. All they knew about me was the wrong that I had been doing. I deserved the criticism and agree with the person with the exception of one thing, sometimes we

forget how big our Lord really is. God is almighty and He has the power to forgive, to heal, and to use us for His glory if we will allow Him to. I fell on my face in January of this year and cried out to an Almighty God and asked for His forgiveness. I asked Him to wash my sins away and make me someone that He could use to lead others to salvation. I had to ask others to forgive me, some who probably never will. Each day I try to live in a way that others can see a change in my life, my attitude, my speech and my actions. Each day I fail God in some way but not as I use to, not by drinking any alcohol or hurting others.

or highlight Tennessee's cultural heritage during the past year.

The awards are given in three categories and recognize historic preservation projects, and books or public programming. The third category, the Commissioners' Special Commendation, recognizes significant achievements in historic preservation or history that do not fit into the other categories.

"The people and projects recognized have made exceptional contributions to historic preservation and to the study of Tennessee's fascinating history," said Patrick McIntyre, executive director of the Tennessee Historical Commission.

Grindstaff received the award for the McCollum Farmhouse.

In 2009, Timothy Grindstaff purchased and began a faithful and sensitive restoration of this frame farmhouse, originally built by Joseph McCollum in the 1850s. Located in Greenback, this mid-19th century farm had once been

the site of tours for area high school students, which was how Grindstaff first came to know the site.

The home was listed on the National Register in 1978, but had fallen into substantial disrepair. Grindstaff hired a structural engineer and retained many of the farmhouse's original elements during his restoration project.


Thomas D. Burchfield, 40, Vale Street, Loudon was charged with driving on revoked.

According to an affidavit filed by Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO-CID; on or about April 9th, 2011 an investigation began on Danielle Courtney involving the theft of jewelry she had been obtaining the jewelry by cleaning houses.

Upon further investigation, it was learned Mrs. Courtney sold a ring to Southeast Gold Buyers, 820 Highway 321, in Lenoir City. The ring had 3M and 25 on the bottom of it. It was a retirement ring from 3M Manufacturing out of Minnesota.

Further investigation revealed a victim who

lives on Doostoo Lane in Tellico Village, and checked the location of his 3M retirement ring and found it had been stolen. Mrs. Courtney had also been cleaning his residence prior to the theft. The ring was retrieved from Southeast Gold Buyers on April 12th, 2011 and the victim identified the ring as the one stolen from his residence. The ring was valued at \$700. The investigation is ongoing.

Courtney turned herself into the Loudon County Jail and was placed under arrest by Corporal Angi Martin Wednesday.

With each example he spoke of the impression left by these veterans. Even those battling

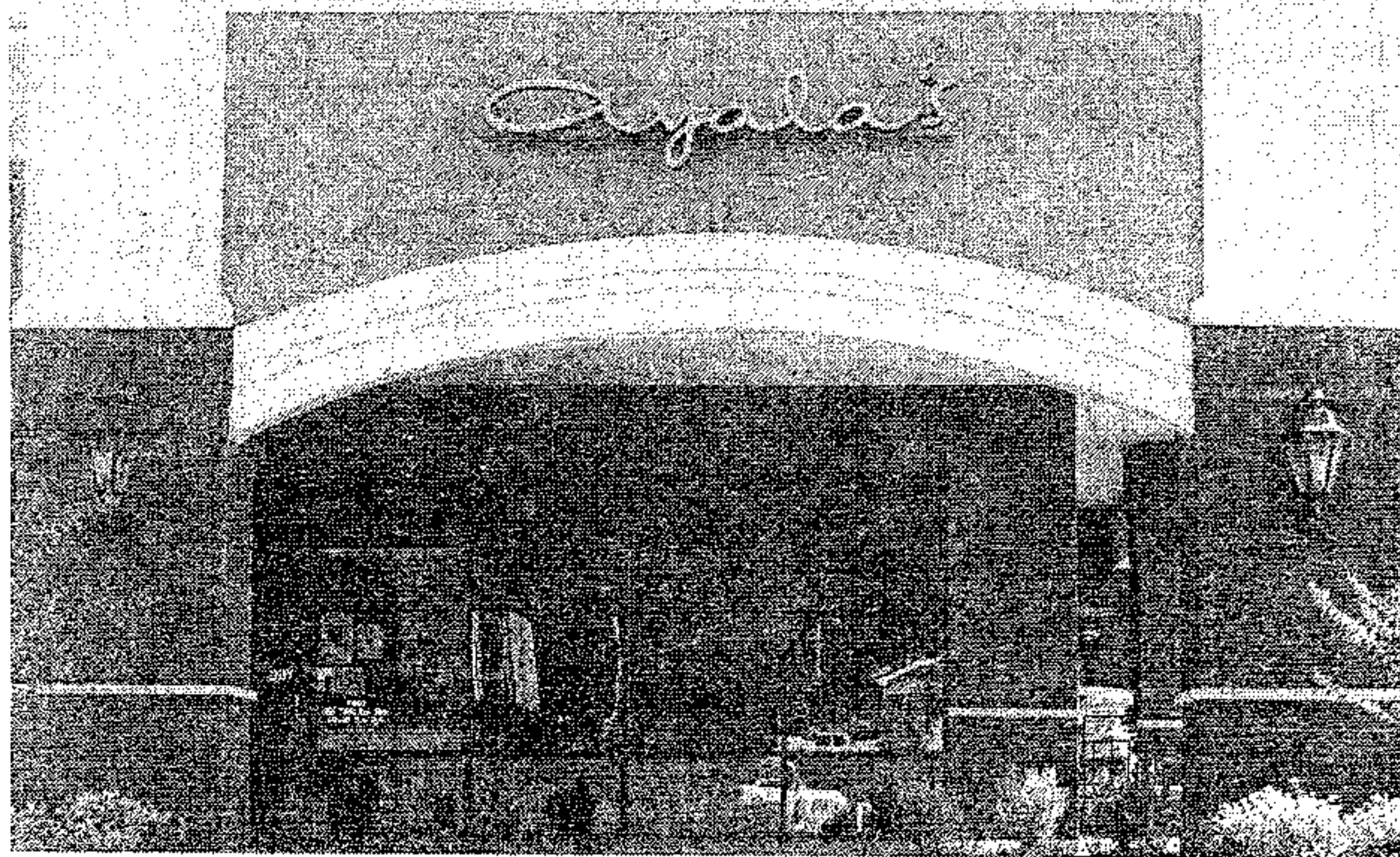
unfavorable physical odds and challenging adversities maintained their positive attitude.

deaths in 2009.

The 2011 Memorial Day weekend ran from 6 p.m., Friday, May 27 through 11:59 p.m., Monday, May 30. During that time, there were

10 fatal crashes that resulted in 10 fatalities. Six crashes were single vehicle wrecks, while four of them were multiple car crashes. Five of the people killed were vehicle occupants,

four were motorcyclists and one was a pedestrian. Three of the five (60 percent) vehicle occupants killed were not wearing safety restraints.

“Our enforcement

efforts don't stop once the holidays are over,” stated Tennessee Highway Patrol Colonel Tracy Trott. “We are in the business of saving lives, and wearing your seat belt is the single most effective way to protect you and reduce fatalities in motor vehicle crashes. We stress the importance of that year-round.”


The THP will continue its participation in the high visibility national Click It or Ticket campaign through June 5. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, in 2009 alone, seat belts saved 12,713 lives nationwide. When worn correctly, seat belts have been proven to reduce the risk of fatal injury to front-seat passenger car occupants by 45 percent, and by 60 percent in pickup trucks, SUVs and minivans.

Tennessee State Troopers also teamed up with the Governor's Highway Safety Office (GHSO) and law enforcement agencies in Georgia, Kentucky and Virginia for this year's “Hands Across the Border” campaign.

“Hands Across the Border” was created to bring about awareness of safety belt and child safety seat use across the southeastern states. Participating state and local enforcement agencies sponsor education and community outreach events and provide motorists with literature about the dangers of drunk driving, as well as the importance of safety belt and proper child safety seat use.

In 1973, 26 people were killed in traffic crashes in Tennessee during the 78-hour Memorial Day holiday period, the highest number of deaths on record. The lowest number of deaths occurred when five people were killed in traffic crashes during the 2002 Memorial Day 78-hour period.

A preliminary 2011 Memorial Day holiday statistical report, which includes the locations of the fatal crashes, accompanies this release. Please note the official traffic fatality count may rise due to delays in reporting and classification of traffic fatalities.

### Harvest

trickle into the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency.

The spring turkey statewide season came to a close on May 15. The harvest number stands at 33,968. The harvest is below the 2010 record harvest of more than 37,000 birds, but this year's harvest ranks as the state's third highest all-time.

"It was another strong year for our turkey harvest," said Gray Anderson, TWRA Turkey

Program Coordinator. "We can't expect to have record harvests every year, but we are at a stable point.

"We had a little less than 90 percent of the harvest being gobblers versus jakes this spring. This tells us our hunters are getting mature birds and we have a healthy population."

Maury County again was the top county with 949 birds being harvested. Greene County also had a strong year finishing second with a

harvest of 896.

Dickson County, a past leader for the spring season, was third with 852. Rounding out the top 10 counties were Montgomery 821, Sum-

ner 774, Rutherford 710, Henry 709, Hardin 628, Hickman 613, and Hardeman 609.

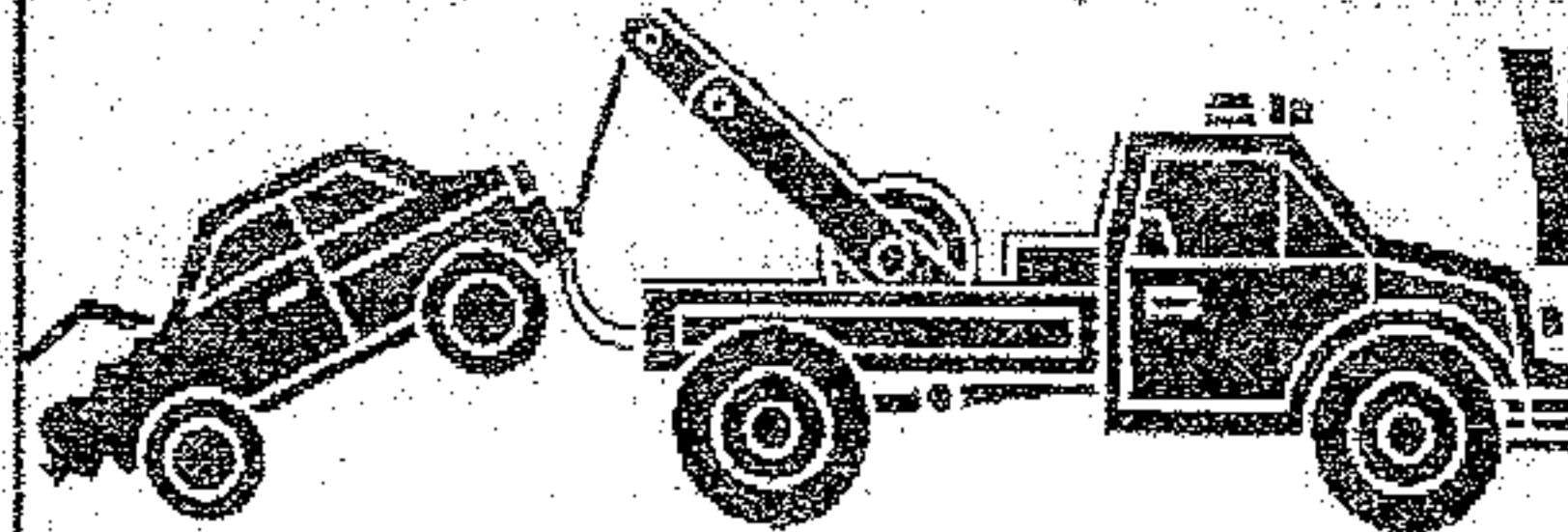
