
# Man finds stolen property at scrap yard, 1 charged





FEMA has approved 10 counties in east Tennessee and 15 counties in middle Tennessee as eligible to receive federal reimbursement in all categories of FEMA's Public Assistance program.

east Tennessee The counties include: Blount, Campbell, Fentress, Knox, Loudon, Pickett, Polk, Scott, Sequatchie and Sullivan.

middle Tennessee counties include: Franklin, Giles, Hickman, Houston, Humphreys, Jackson, Lawrence, Lewis, Lincoln, Marshall, Montgomery, Moore, Perry, Smith, and Wayne.

The designation for Public Assistance allows government entities and certain private non-profits in the designated counties to apply for reimbursement of specific expenses related to disaster response and recovery.

Mr. Purdy stated he was driving down the road and hit something, blowing his tire. Deputy Brewer found where he ran off the roadway and into a yard.





A check of Mr. Corley's license showed his driving privileges are suspended. Corley was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.




