coming an Outdoors-Woman (BOW) events to be held in June.

The 2011 BOW workshop will be held June 10-12 in Crossville at the Clyde M. York 4-H Center. The 2011 BOW Field Day is June 18 in

Knoxville at the John Sevier Hunter Education Facility.

The relaxed atmosphere of each of the BOW events is primarily aimed at women, and is an opportunity for anyone 18 or older to learn outdoor skills usually associated with hunting and fishing. However, it is useful for many other outdoor pursuits and interests. Participants will have a chance to take a variety of courses and the classes are taught by experts in their respective fields.

This year's workshop will include classes in firearms and firearms safety, basic fishing skills, advanced fishing techniques, all-terrain vehicle operation, basic archery, boating safety education, outdoor cooking, introduction to hiking/camping/backpacking, beginning fly fishing, nature photography basics, basic canoeing, basic shotgun, backyard habitat, map and compass, introduction to muzzleloading, introduction to turkey hunting, introduction to deer hunting, introduction to waterfowl hunting, reading the

woods, introduction to trapping and animal damage control, stream ecology, and boat trailer basics.

The workshop fee is \$175 and includes lodging at the Clyde M York 4-H Center, meals, T-shirt, and a 2011-12 Tennessee Hunting and Fishing License. Registration is taken on a first-come, first-serve basis.

At the field day, classes will be conducted in all-terrain vehicle operation, introduction to pistol shooting. Introduction to firearms, nature photography basics, dutch oven cooking, women's self defense, backyard habitat, boating safety education, and basic archery.

Participants will be able to participate in two classes. The cost is \$25 per person and includes lunch.

Mr. Rogers was unsteady on his feet and had slurred speech. He admitted to taking pain pills before he got to the residence.

Deputy Butler felt the man would be in danger if left alone. He was also very irate with the people outside next door and was shouting foul language when the officer arrived.

Mr. Rogers had been told by the homeowner several times on prior incidents, and in the presence of Deputy Butler, not to be back on the property. The homeowner is in fear of Scott Rogers.

Rogers failed to obey prior warnings that if he returned, he would face prosecution for trespass. Mr. Rogers was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

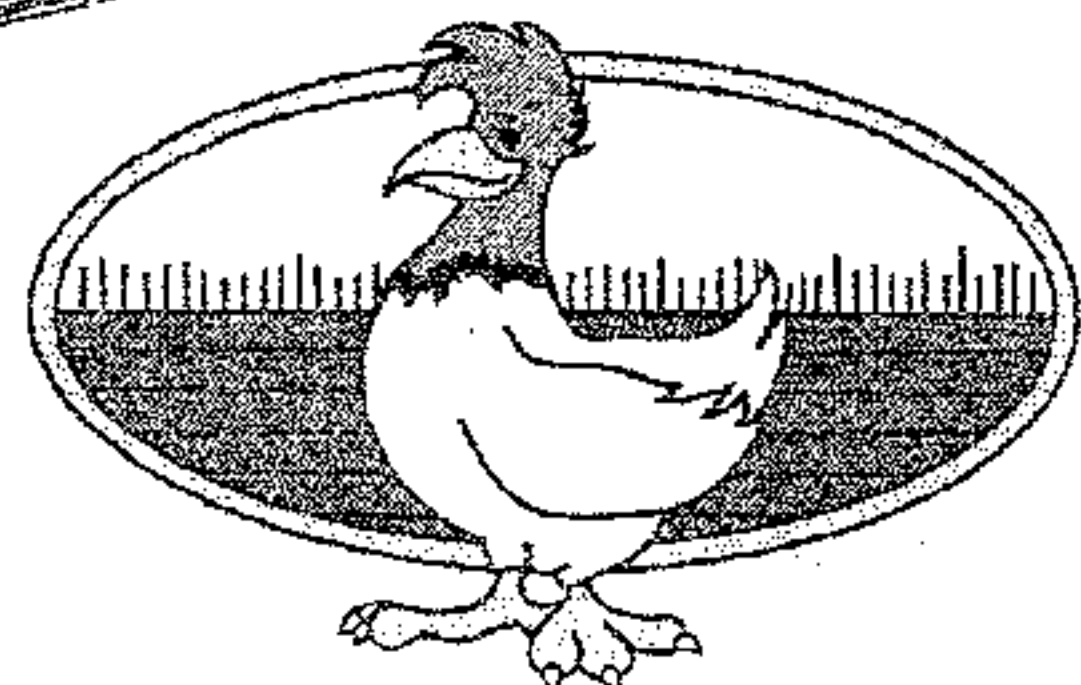

Deputy Branam noted in his report he saw where someone pried the screen window to the garage and attempted to pry the garage door open and then kicked it open.

The deputy also dis-

covered where someone pulled up to the rear of the residence in a vehicle.

Most cabinet doors and drawers had been opened and items strewn on the floor. Several items were taken from the residence including a black Taurus .40 pistol with wood grips, which had a gun lock on it, a Toshiba and a Sony black lap top computer with 17" monitors, Nintendo Wii game system along with several games and a tan Sentry fireproof safe with multiple items inside.

Investigator Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID responded to the scene and took fingerprints,

photographs and possible DNA samples from around the home.

Several pieces of jewelry and collectable coins were also stolen.

The estimated value of the items totaled \$2839.99. The investigation is ongoing.

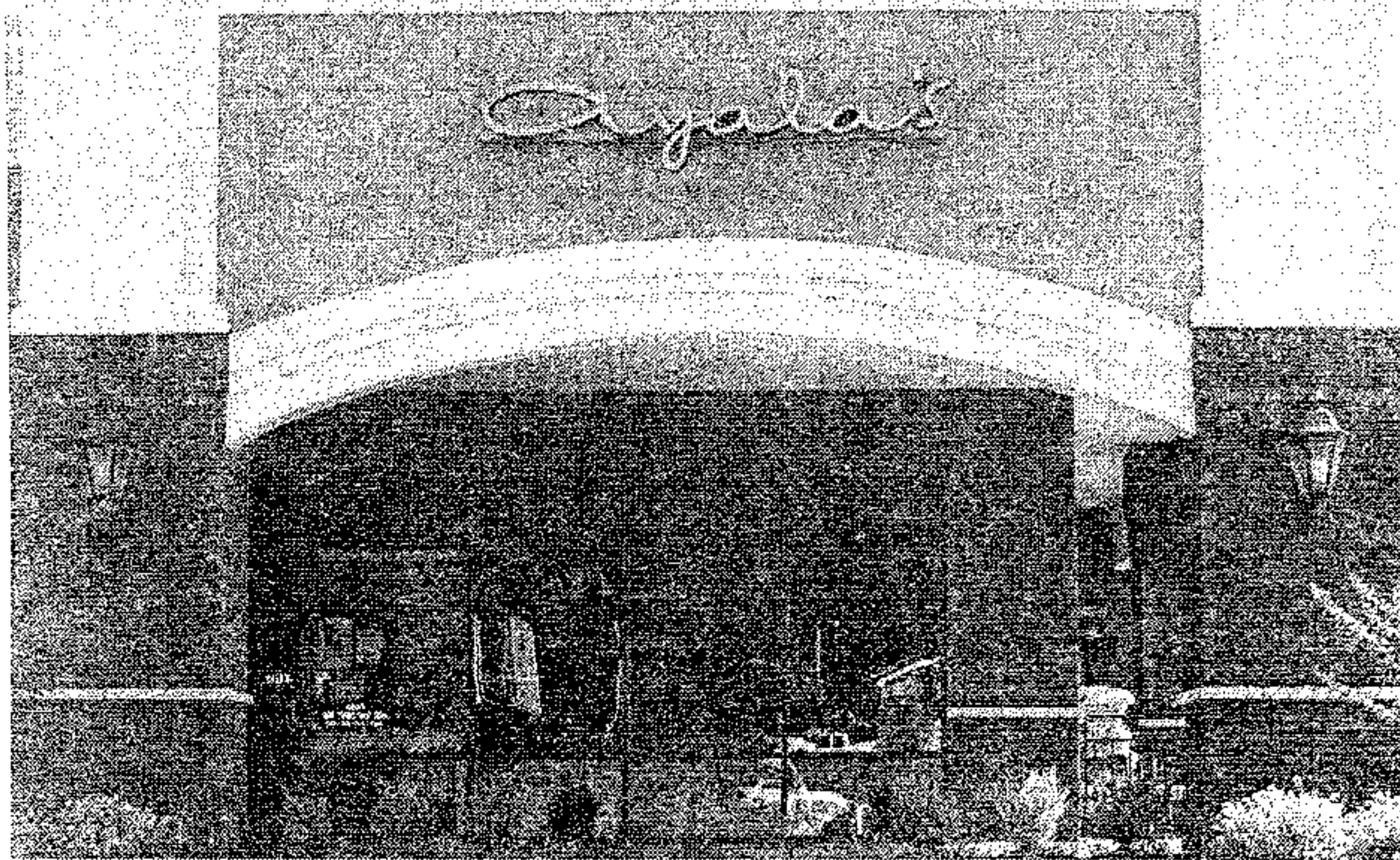

another aisle and concealing it in his shorts pocket.


The manager contacted dispatch and gave them the make and model of the car Mr. Sales got into, and Lenoir City Police Department apprehended him in the Burger King parking lot.
