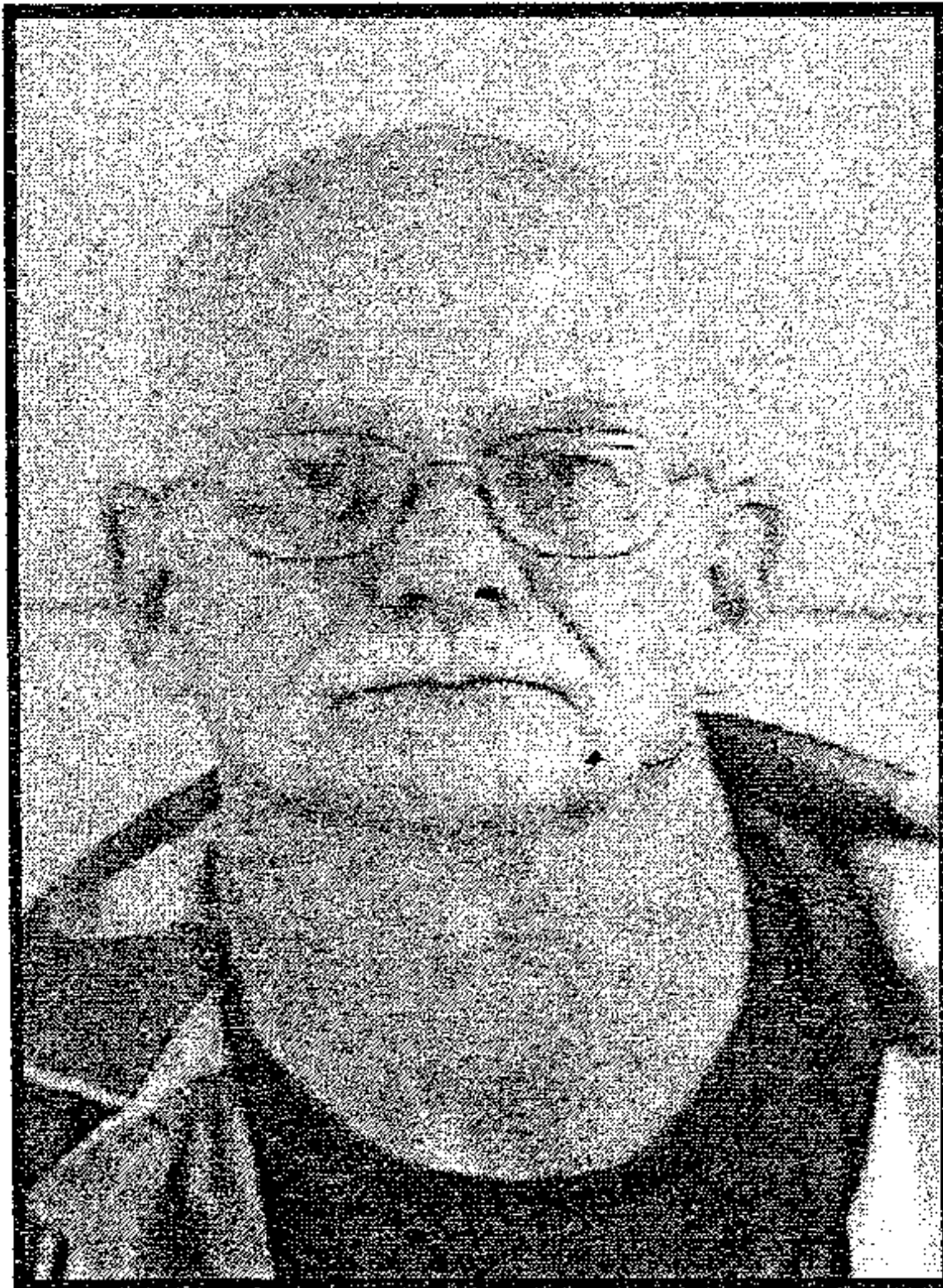

Self-overdosing big rig driver charged with DUI

An Ohio big rig driver was charged with DUI after his tractor trailer was stopped for weaving along I-75 and officials found he was under the influence of prescription drugs. The prescriptions reportedly were extremely shorted of the amounts that were supposed to have been in the bottles and were identified as a potent pain killer and a sedative/hypnotic drug.

David Michael Lawler, 53, Pinkerton Lane, Zanesville, Ohio was charged with

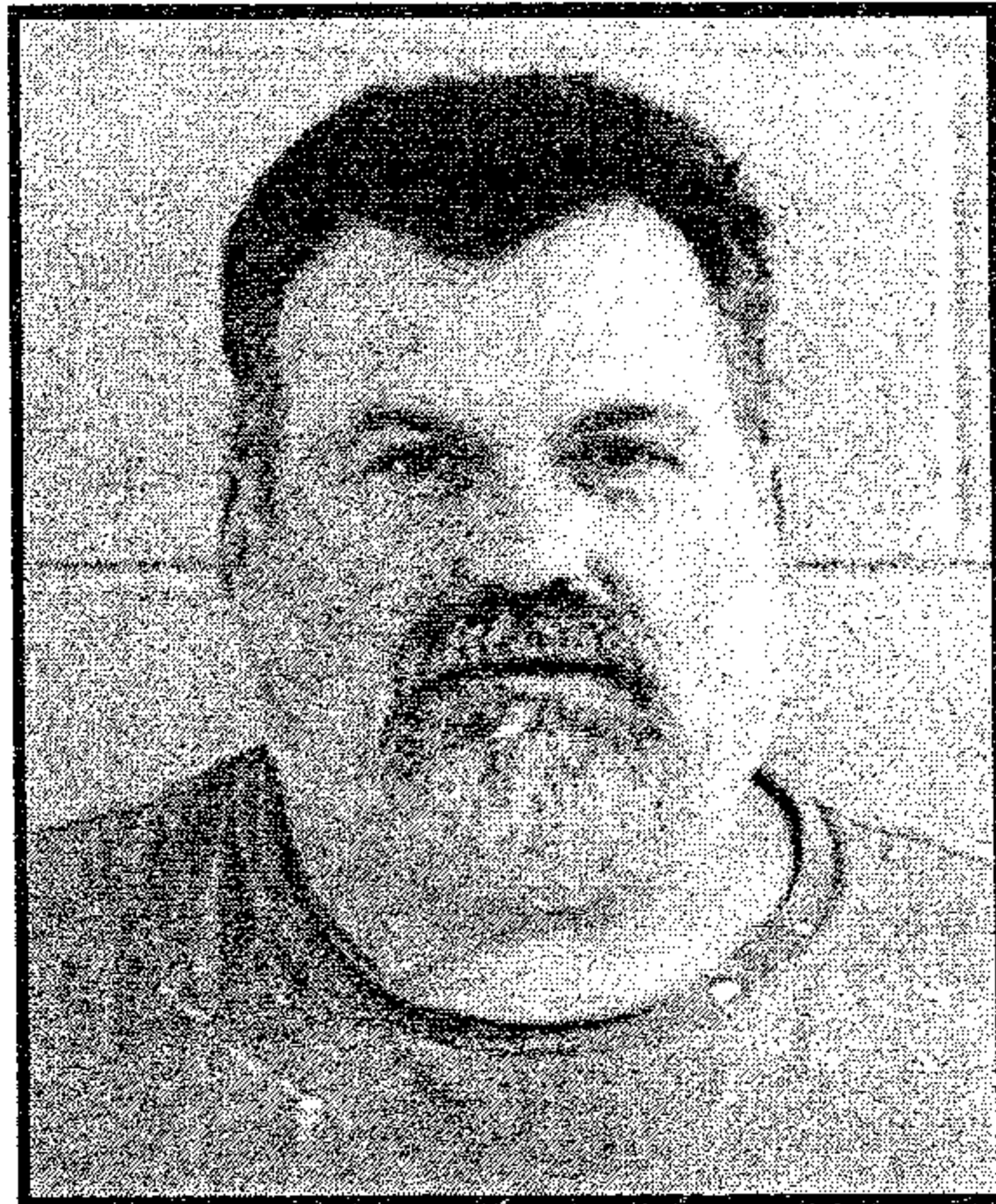
From boat to brig, Big Daddy goes to the big house for BUI, more

According to records, Deputy Bobby Hamilton, LCSO responded to Interstate 75 north Friday on a report of a tractor trailer driver who was possibly intoxicated. The deputy noted in his report when he got behind the big rig, Mr. Lawler he was unable to keep his tractor trailer in his lane.

He crossed the center line several times and looked like he was going to hit another vehicle.

When Deputy Hamilton activated his blue lights and siren, Mr. Lawler didn't even notice him. About a half a mile later the man noticed law enforcement was trying to stop him. When he finally stopped, the deputy had him exit his vehicle.

Mr. Lawler was very unsteady on his feet, his eyes were very glassy and he appeared to be intoxicated on something. He was given field sobriety tasks and couldn't follow instructions or complete them properly.

Mr. Lawler was deemed to be too intoxicated to operate a motor vehicle.

An inventory of the vehicle revealed sev-

eral medications in a cooler, including 2 mg. hydromorphone, with only 11 pills left in the bottle. The prescription was filled on Monday, five days earlier, with 60 pills and directions were to take one a day.

Another prescription was for 10 mg. chlordizaepoxide, also filled on Monday with 180 pills, but there were only 64 left. The directions were to take 1 or 2 three times a day.

Both medications had warning labels indicating they may cause drowsiness

Deputy Hamilton also found a empty bottle of 10 mg. diazepam. Mr. Lawler was arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Friday, at approximately 11:10 PM, Trooper R. Smith, THP stopped Ms. Muse's blue Mercury Sable on Highway 321 for following another vehicle too closely. She stopped at an intersection and was asked to pull to the shoulder. Instead, Ms. Muse drove the wrong way, down a one way street and stopped in the middle of the road.

Muse was unsteady on her feet, had slightly slurred speech and was unable to perform field sobriety tasks as instructed.

Ms. Muse stated she took 20 mg. of xanax and 20 mg. of hydrocodone earlier in the day prior to driving.

According to the report, Officer Jason Felts, LCPD had prior knowledge a driver had no license and stopped the vehicle Miller was driving.

an order of protection for service on Joshua King. An arrest warrant had also been issued for assault in connection with the order of protection.

Mr. King was placed under arrest for assault.

Loudon County Humane Society spay/neuter voucher pickup days

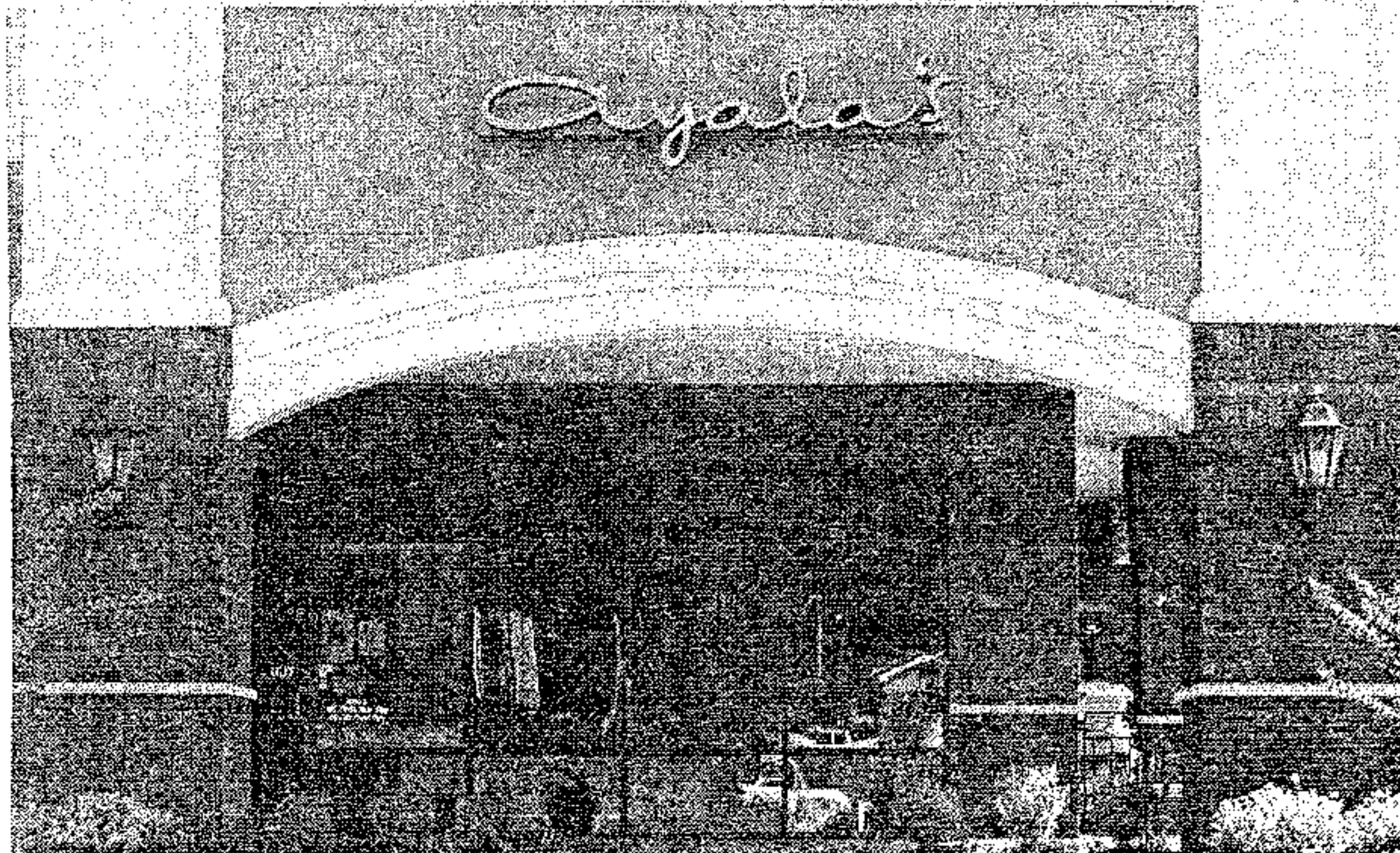

The officer conducted a safety inspection while he had the boat stopped. During the inspection, the officer smelled an odor of an alcoholic beverage on the operator's person.

The operator was identified as Mr. Cambron. Officer Julian asked him how much he'd been drinking and Cambron replied, 3 or 4. The officer asked him what time it was without looking at his watch, and he stated about 7:00 PM, but it was 8:22 PM at the time.

Mr. Cambron's eyes were glassy, his clothes were dirty and he wasn't wearing any shoes.

After administering

field sobriety tasks Mr. Cambron was placed under arrest for boating under the influence. He was read implied consent and refused.

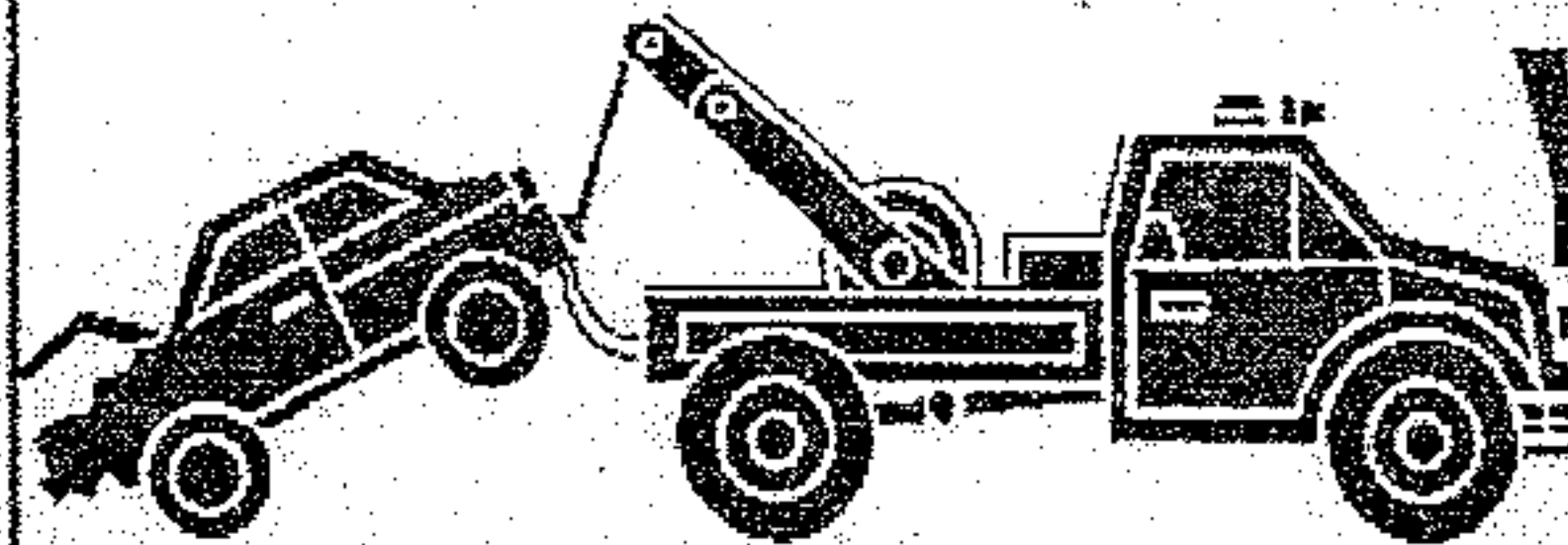
