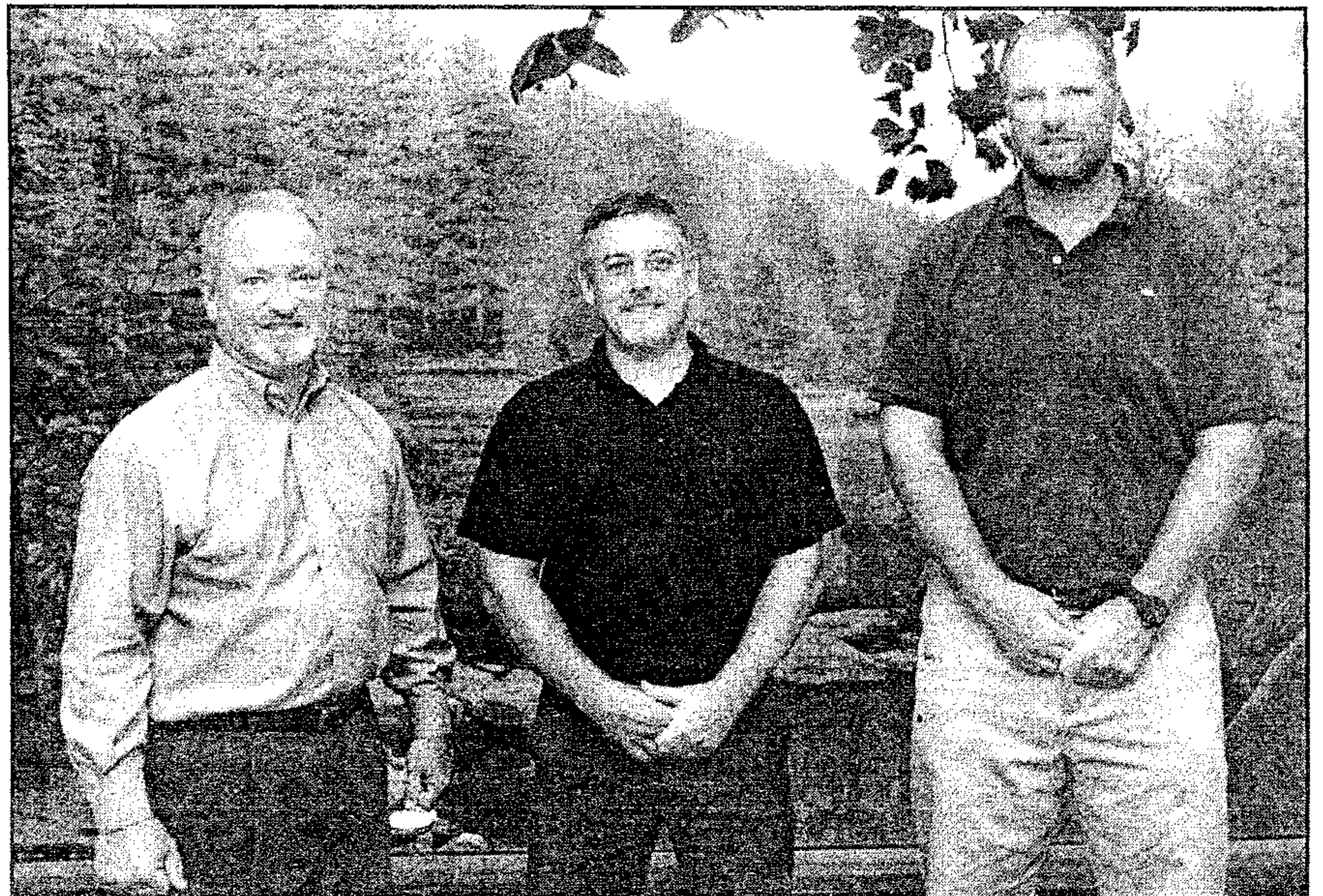
Him, but today I want to share another story, one

that displays consequences for deceiving, or better yet attempting to deceive the Lord.

After Jesus ascended to heaven His apostles were sent out to spread the gospel (The Great Commission) and many people were accepting Jesus. Many new Christians began to sell their property and possessions, bring the proceeds to the apostles, and they would divide and share with all who had needs. This may seem extreme but these people were filled with the Holy Spirit and chose to surrender their entire lives to the Lord and they were richly blessed for doing so. This story is about a married couple

who wanted it both ways. They wanted to do the right thing but also wanted to do their own thing which consisted of lying and cheating our Lord and Savior. They could have just stayed home, lived as many others and maybe not experience any consequences until their death but they wanted people to think they were dedicated to Christ and wanted to be seen as faithful without being faithful.

Acts 5: 1-11 (NKJV)

But a certain man named Ananias, with Sapphira his wife, sold a possession. And he kept back part of the proceeds, his wife also being aware of it, and brought a certain part and laid it at the apos-

tle's feet. But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and keep back part of the price of the land for yourself? While it remained, was it not your own? And after it was sold, was it not in your own control? Why have you conceived this thing in your heart? You have not lied to men but to God."

Then Ananias, hearing these words, fell down and breathed his last. So great fear came upon all those who heard these things. And the young men arose and wrapped him up, carried him out, and buried him.

Now it was about three hours later when his wife came in, not

knowing what had happened. And Peter answered her, "Tell me whether you sold the land for so much?" She said, "Yes, for so much."

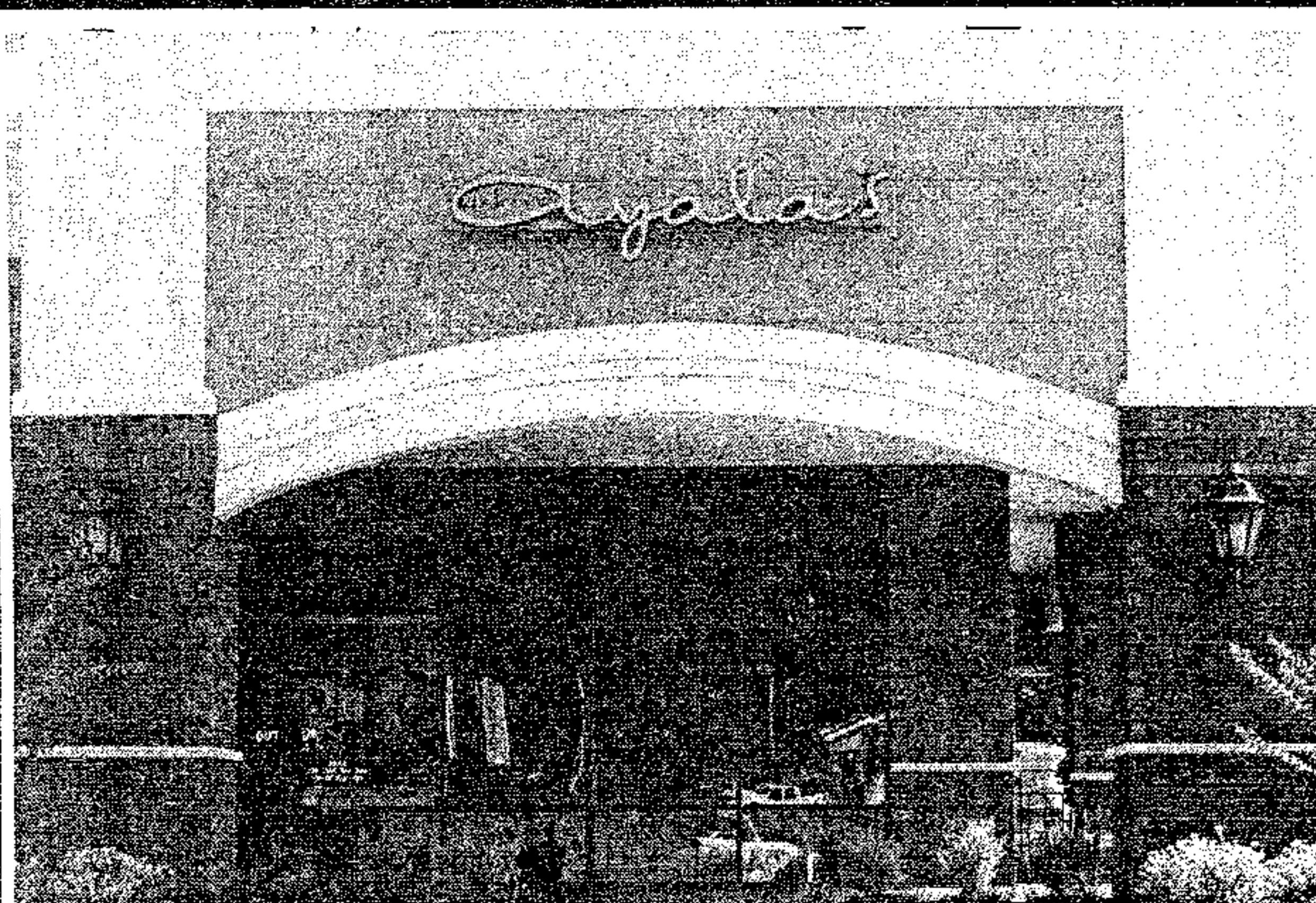
Then Peter said to her, "How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord?" Look, the feet of those who have buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out." Then immediately she fell down at his feet and breathed her last. And the young men came in and found her dead, and carrying her out, buried her by her husband. So great fear came upon all the church and upon all who heard these things.

In this true account,

Ananias and his wife Sapphira both immediately lost their lives because they were lying to God about money. Money is not the only way that we can try to deceive God either. We can try to cheat God with our time, our talents, our hypocrisy or just our sinful and selfish ways in general. God made some strong examples in the early church as to build the foundation that exists today, but that doesn't mean He couldn't do the same to you or me right now for trying to cheat Him in numerous ways.



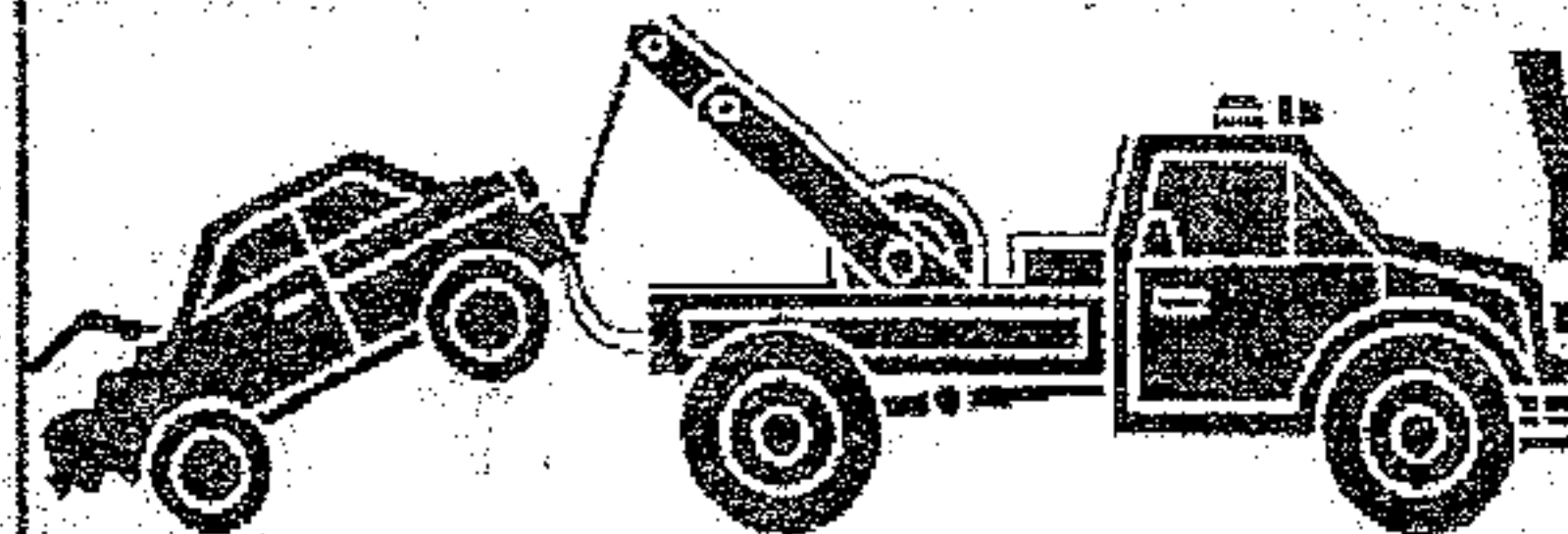
