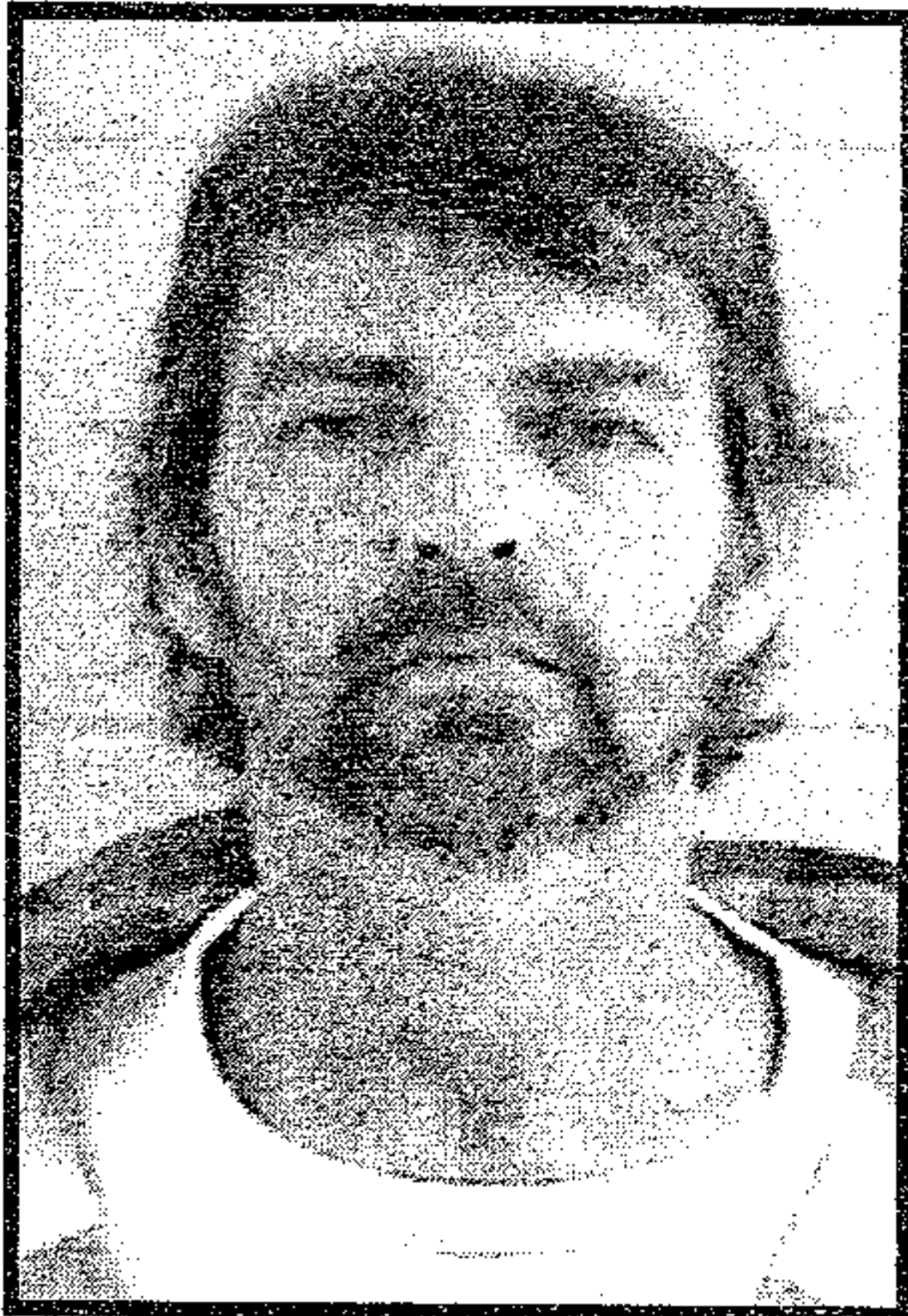
Investigator Jeff Russell is seeking information from the public in connection with Monday's burglary of a local market after three men broke in and took what another man earned by working hard for it.

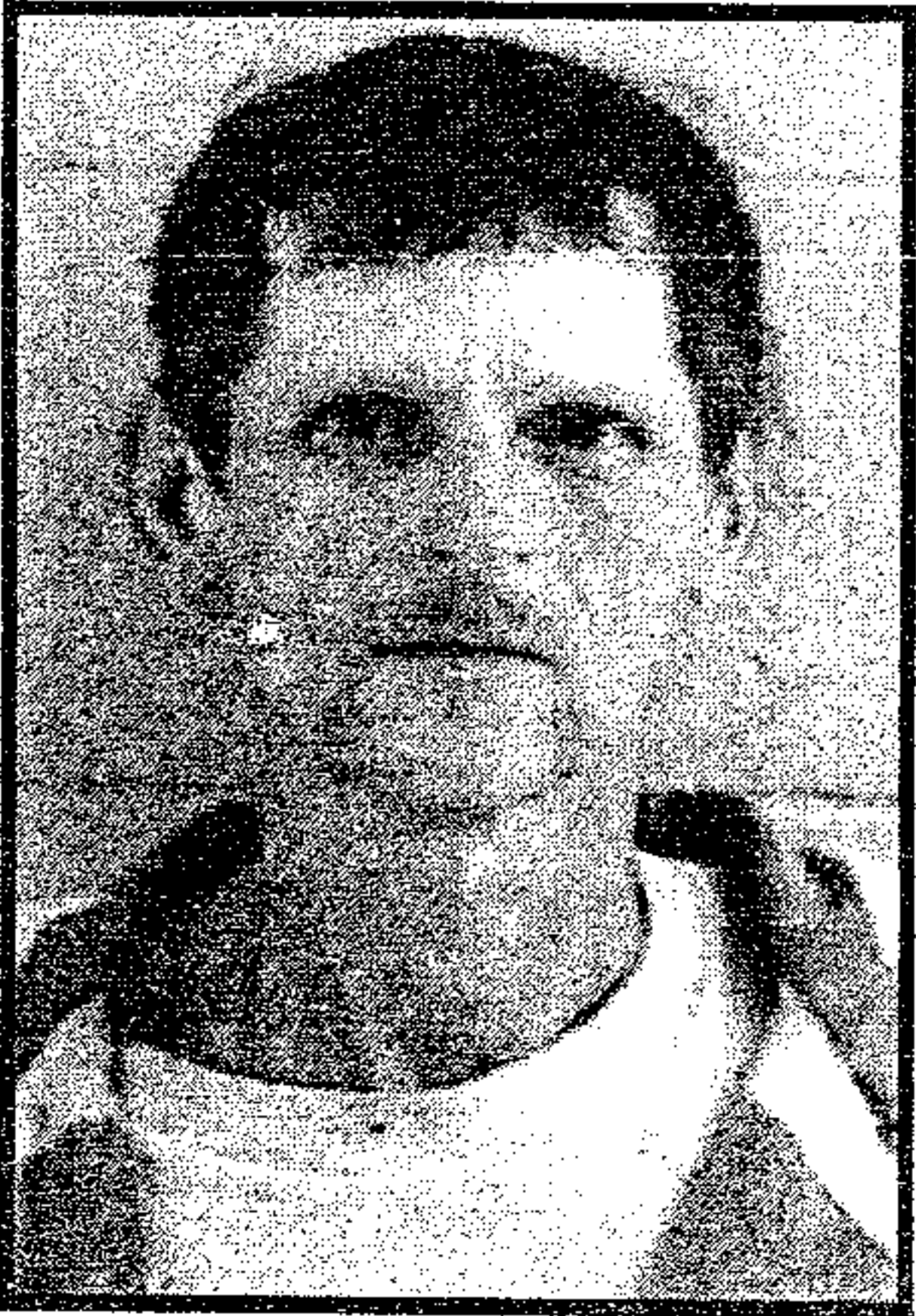

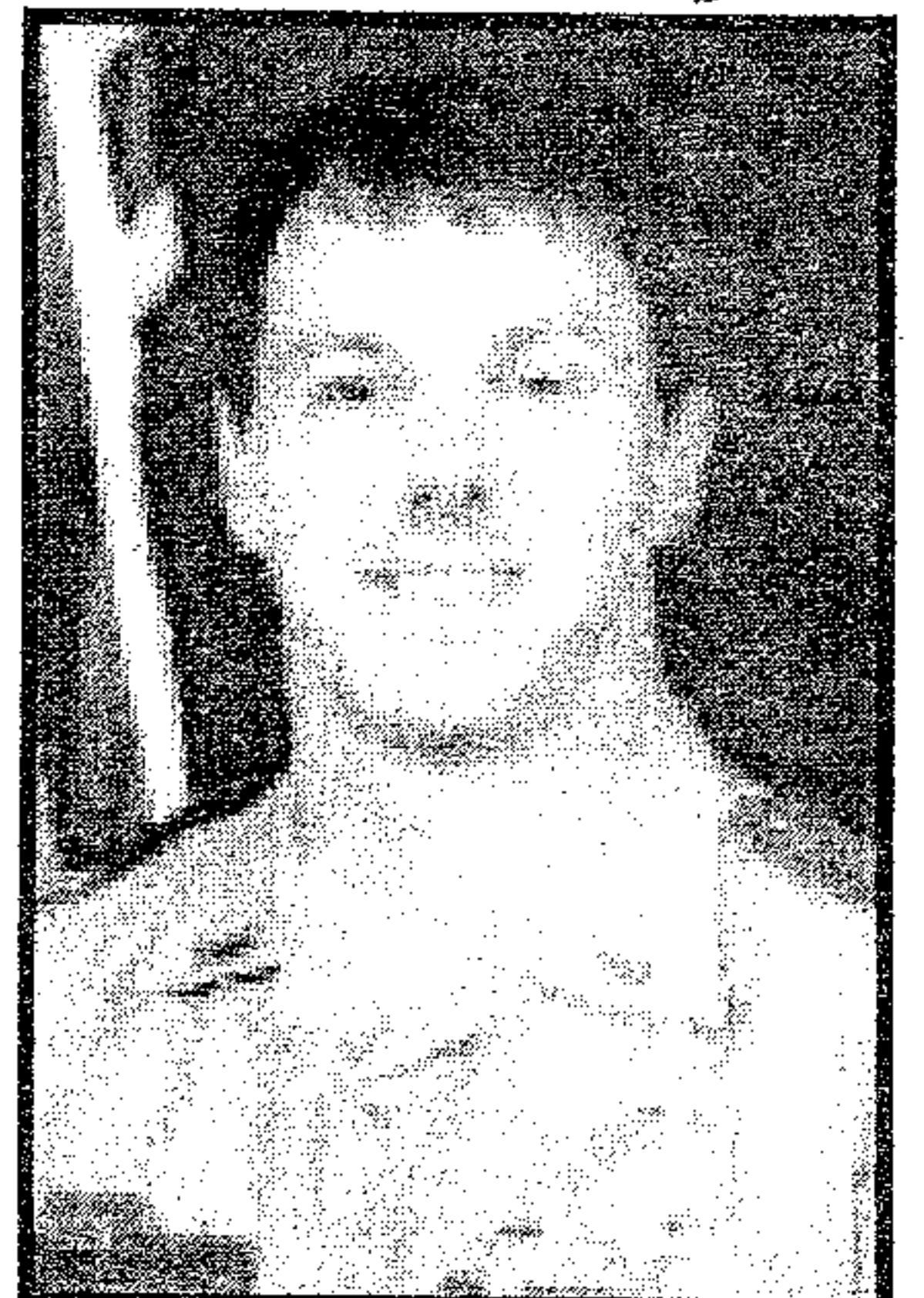

a steep back yard. I remember several Saturday mornings when my dad would tell me to mow before I could go play in the neighborhood. I hated to hear those words. At the time I would have considered this child abuse but he didn't agree.

I can recall dreading the work and wanting to get out of it. I would sometimes try to sabotage the lawn mower thinking that if it didn't start I wouldn't have to mow and could go on about my day-chore free. I took screws out of it, took the spark plug wire off or some other minor action to render it "non useable." Of course after I messed around for an hour or so telling Dad how I wouldn't be able to mow that day, he would always come out to the garage and find my secret demolition plot, fix it and then tell me to get to mowing. I can remember him telling me more than once how I could have already been done and playing if I weren't trying to get out of it. He was teaching me that it's better to just obey and then be rewarded, that I was wasting my own time trying to squirm out of my responsibility.

What does this have to do with The Good News of Jesus Christ you might ask? Well if you think about it, our Christian walk is very similar. We have a heavenly father and He sometimes requires us to do certain things as Christians

that we don't want to fit into our schedules.

If we will just do God's work and put Him first in our lives, He will make the reward much sweeter. There is room in heaven for all who will believe and it's our job to tell them. We should tell them verbally, yes, but if we have to tell them around here, that means they cannot see Jesus already in our hearts, lives and actions.

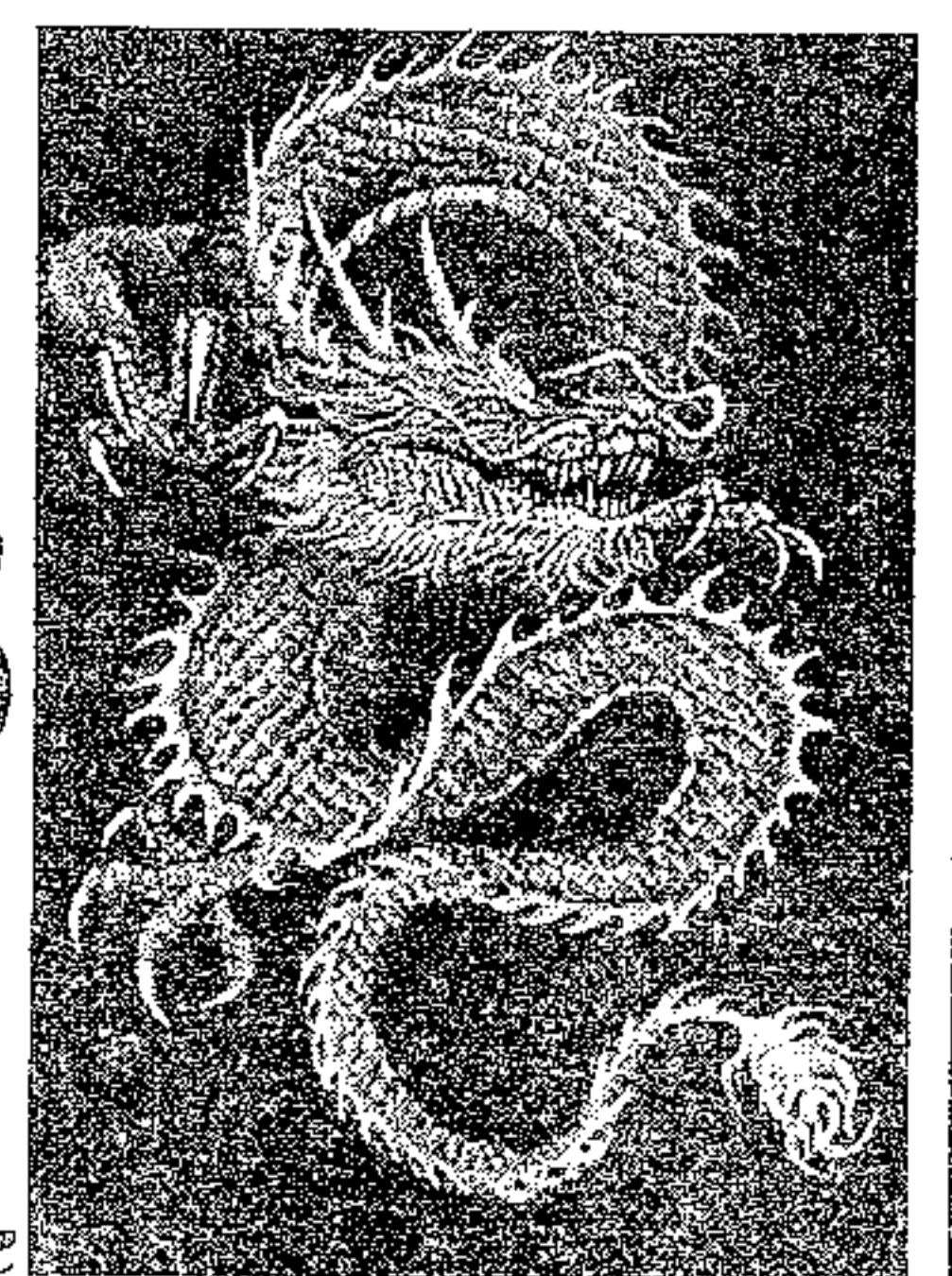

According to affidavits; on Tuesday Agent Jeff Vittatoe, 9th DTF responded to a residence on Highway 70 East across from Friendship Road in Lenoir City,

to assist Deputy Brian Smith, LCSO on a 911 fight call. Upon securing all parties present at the residence, Gilmore Dalton was discovered inside the residence.

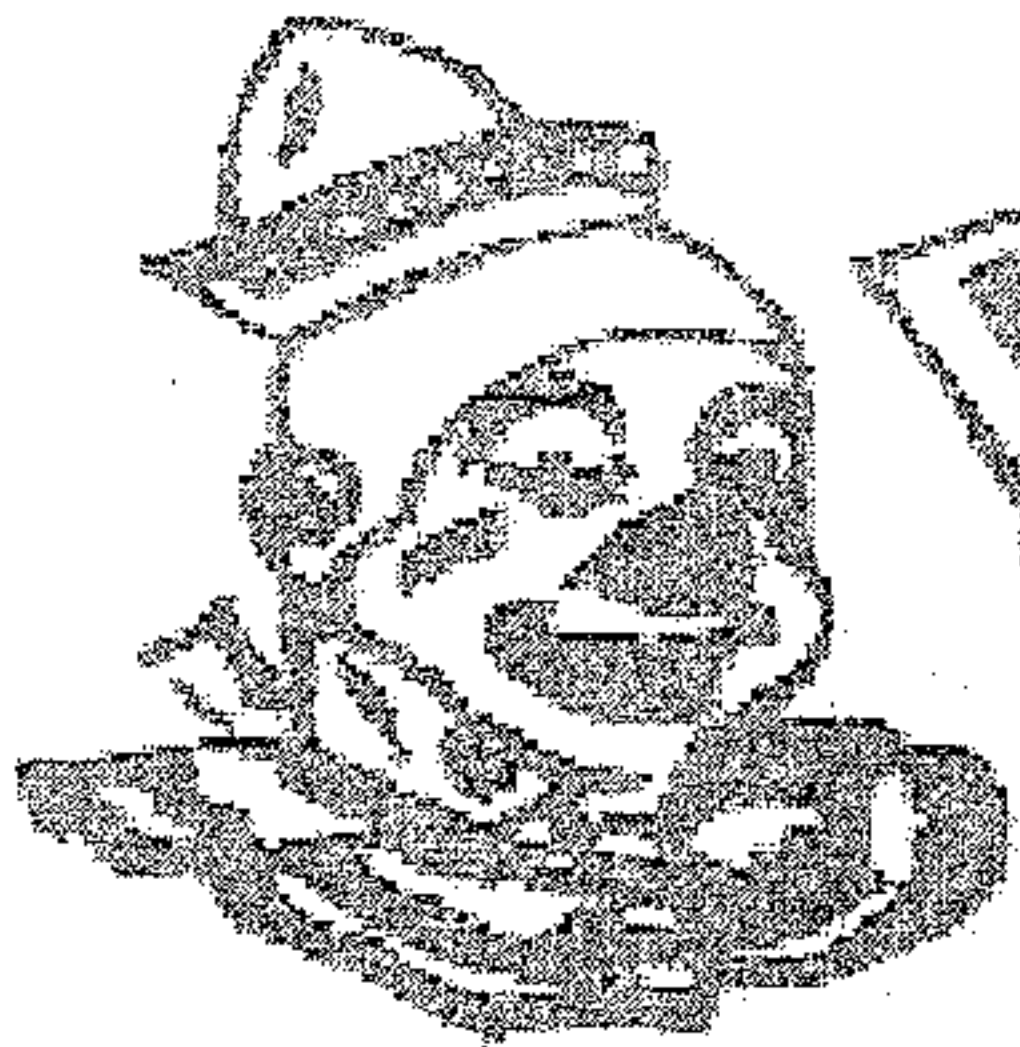
Dalton was asked to go outside while Depu-

ty Smith conducted the investigation. During a pat down for weapons, Mr. Dalton stated he had a needle in his pocket. He further stated he had some "dope" in his watch pocket.

Agent Brenden DeBoer, 9th DTF retrieved the needle from Mr. Dalton's pocket as well as a plastic bag containing a white powder substance believed to be approximately 1 gram of methamphetamine.

In the meantime, Deputy Marty Branam, LCSO was picking up James McBride's hat, which had been knocked off during the domestic dispute, when he noticed a plastic bag inside the hat containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana.

Mr. Dalton and Mr. McBride were placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Agent Vittatoe made the arrests.

According to affidavits filed by Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF, and Officer Jeremy Dishner, LCPD; on Tuesday, Agent DeBoer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle involved in a narcotics investigation at East Tennessee Discount Drugs in Lenoir City. The vehicle was described as a green Pontiac Grand Am driven by a female named Tammy. Agent DeBoer identified the female as Tammy Hair.

While speaking with Ms. Hair the agent received permission to search her vehicle. He located a prescription bottle in the trunk. The bottle had no label on it and the pills inside were tentatively identified as 8 ambien pills, a schedule IV narcotic.

Ms. Hair's passen-

ger was identified as Samuel H. Newcome. Mr. Newcome originally identified himself as John W. Hamby, with a similar date of birth as his own. After a short time, Officer Dishner determined he'd lied about his name.

Mr. Newcome advised he'd lied because he believed he had a warrant.

After receiving consent to search the vehicle, the officer asked Mr. Newcome to step out of the car and as he did so, Officer Dishner noticed something sticking out from a pocket. A search produced a hypodermic needle sticking from a right lower pant leg pocket. Mr. Newcome had no legitimate purpose for being in possession of the needle.

Agent DeBoer placed Ms. Hair under arrest and transported her to jail. Officer Dishner placed Mr. Newcome under arrest and transported him to the jail.

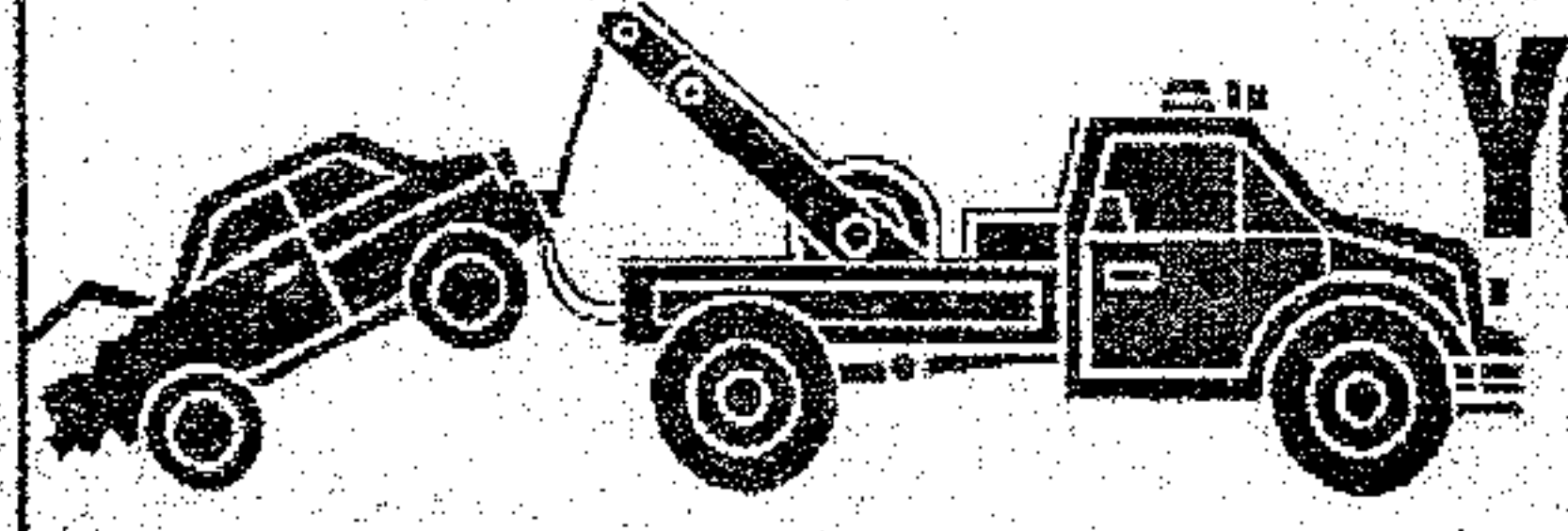
