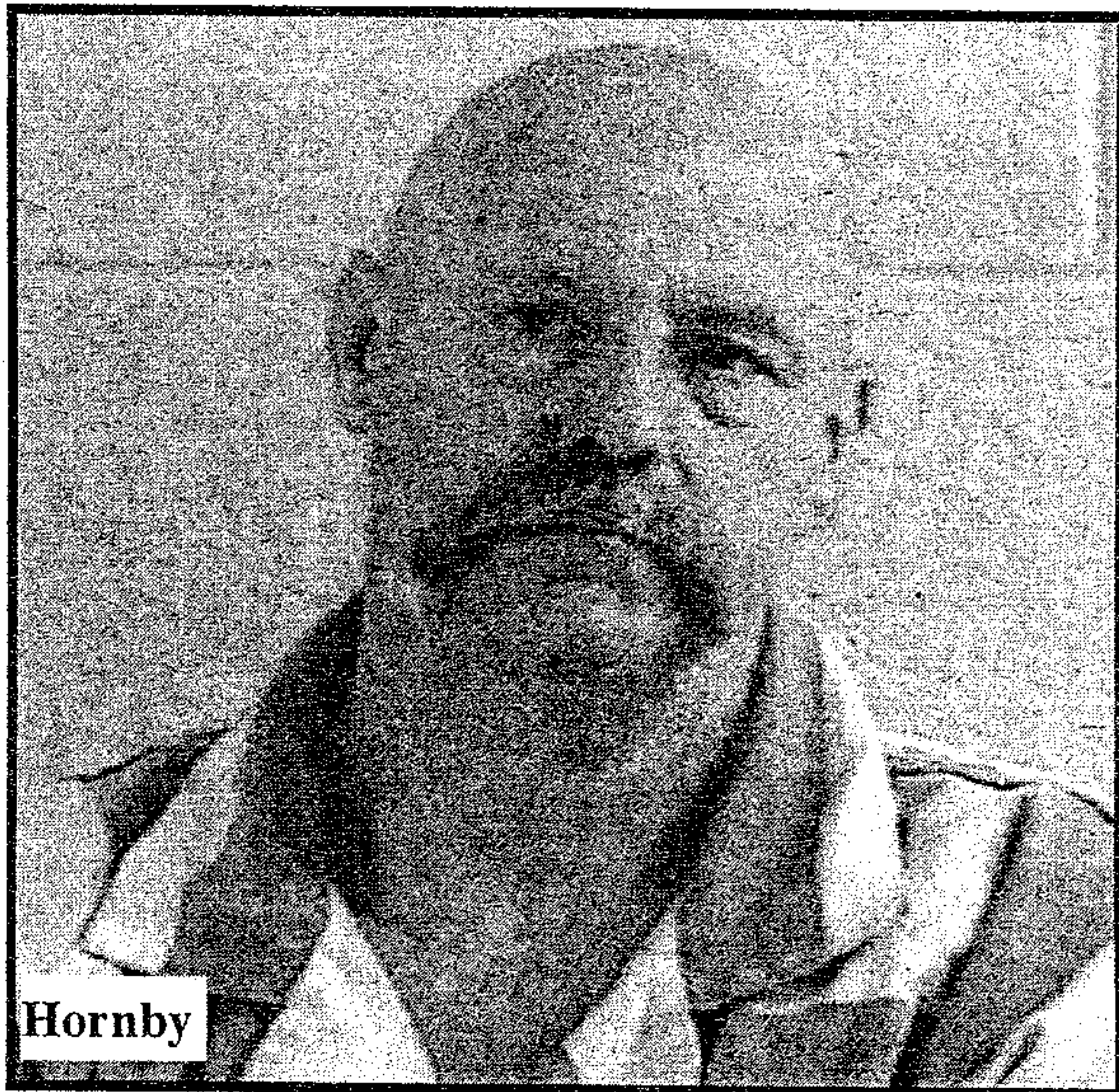

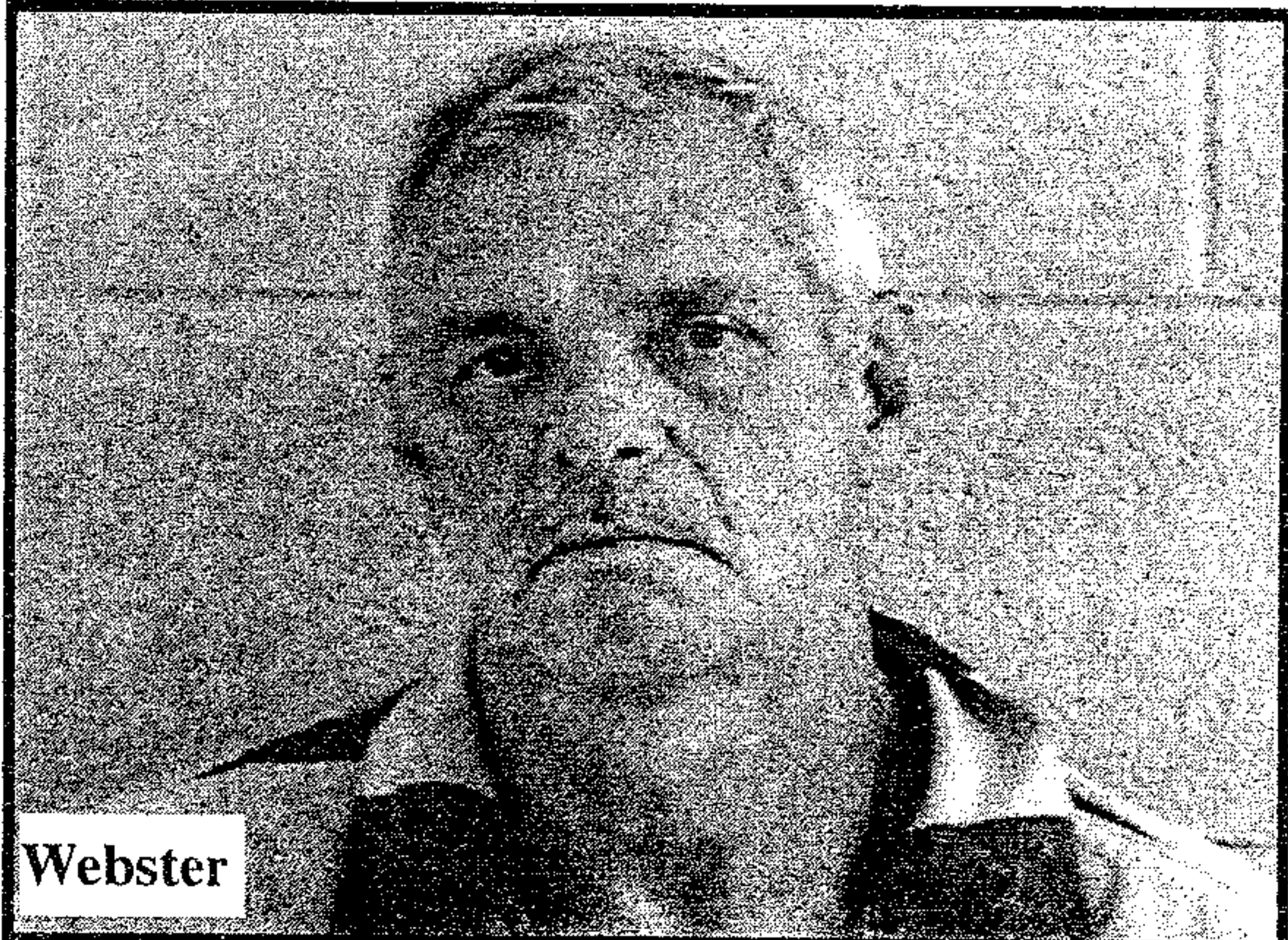

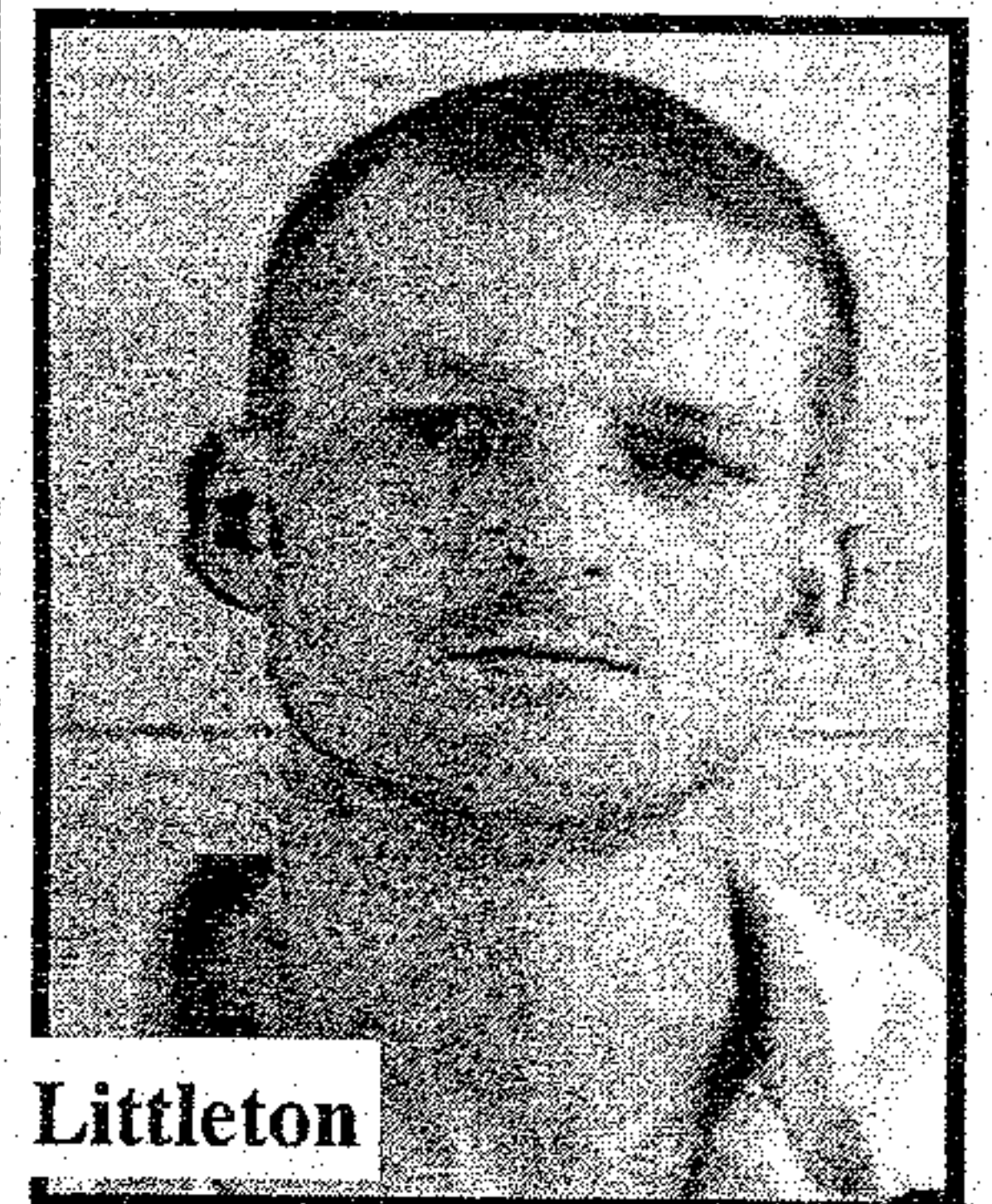

a child under twelve years of age.

Upon further investigation, the child was interviewed and it was learned that the subject (Hornby) did penetrate the victim.

The CID unit also conducted a search of Hornby's residence on April 26th. Evidence was taken from the residence and Hornby was interviewed.

Sheriff Guider advised that the case was presented for indictment and the Grand Jury, when they met on August 8th, did indict Hornby on one count of Rape of a Child, based

on the Investigator's evidence, including the interview of the suspect.

Hornby was arrested August 15th by the Loudon CID unit in Knoxville without incident and was brought to the Loudon County Jail. He remains in custody at this time under a \$25,000 bond.

If convicted, Hornby would face mandatory prison time.

## Davis

A Loudon woman accused of shoplifting from Walmart reportedly had illicit pills in her possession at the time of her arrest.

Denise Nicole Davis, 33, Vonore Road, Loudon was charged Tuesday with theft under \$500 and simple possession of schedule IV.

According to reports, Officer Allen Bean,

LCPD was dispatched to Walmart on a shoplifter call.

After placing Ms. Davis under arrest, Officer Bean asked for consent to search her purse for weapons or illegal drugs. During the search, the officer discovered a small black bag containing 16 zanax pills and 1 suboxone pill.

The total amount of the items taken was \$246.06.

Lavrinovich advised when he returned, the trailer was gone and described it as a 4'x8' trailer with a red mesh floor and gate, which was estimated at \$450.

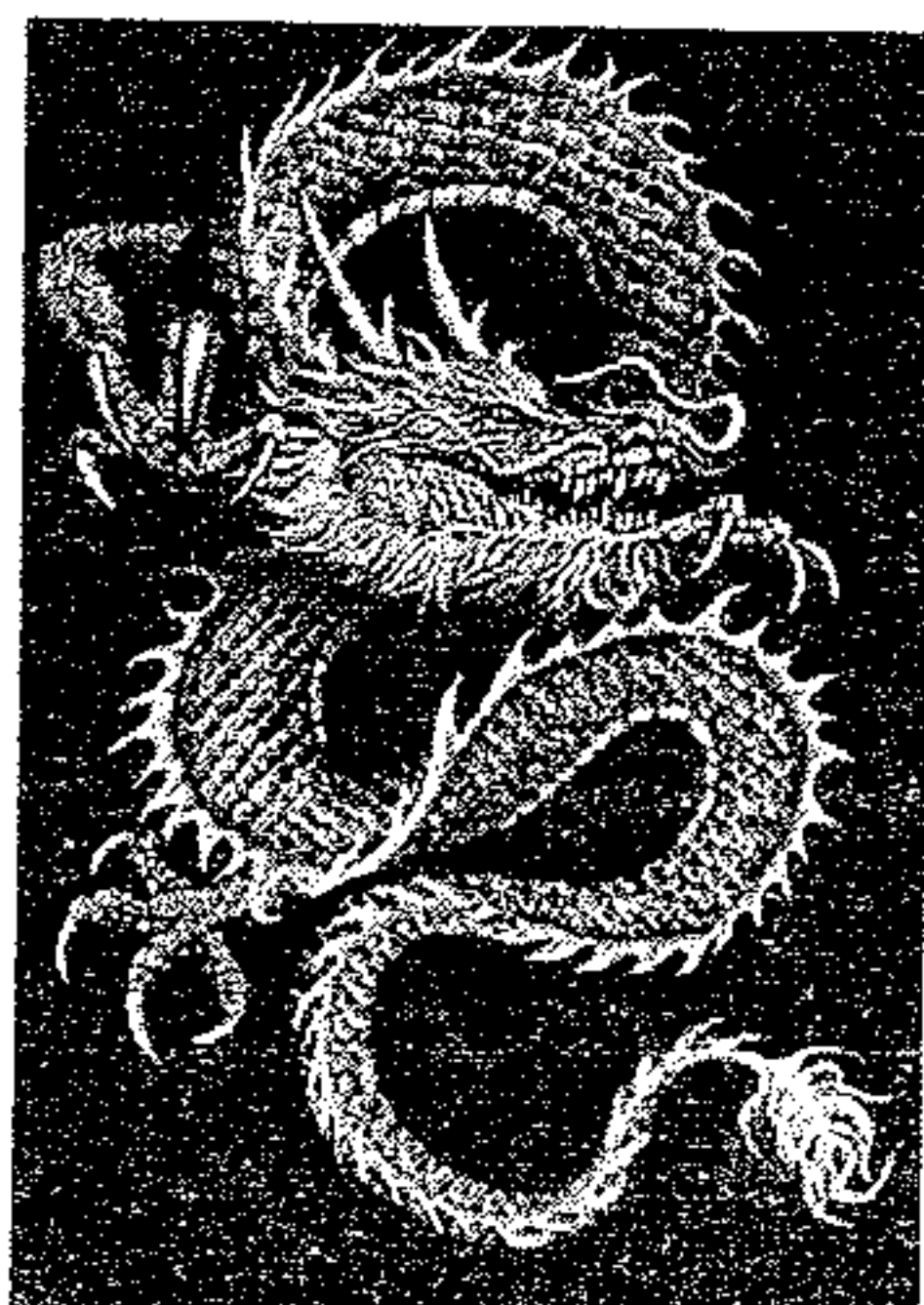

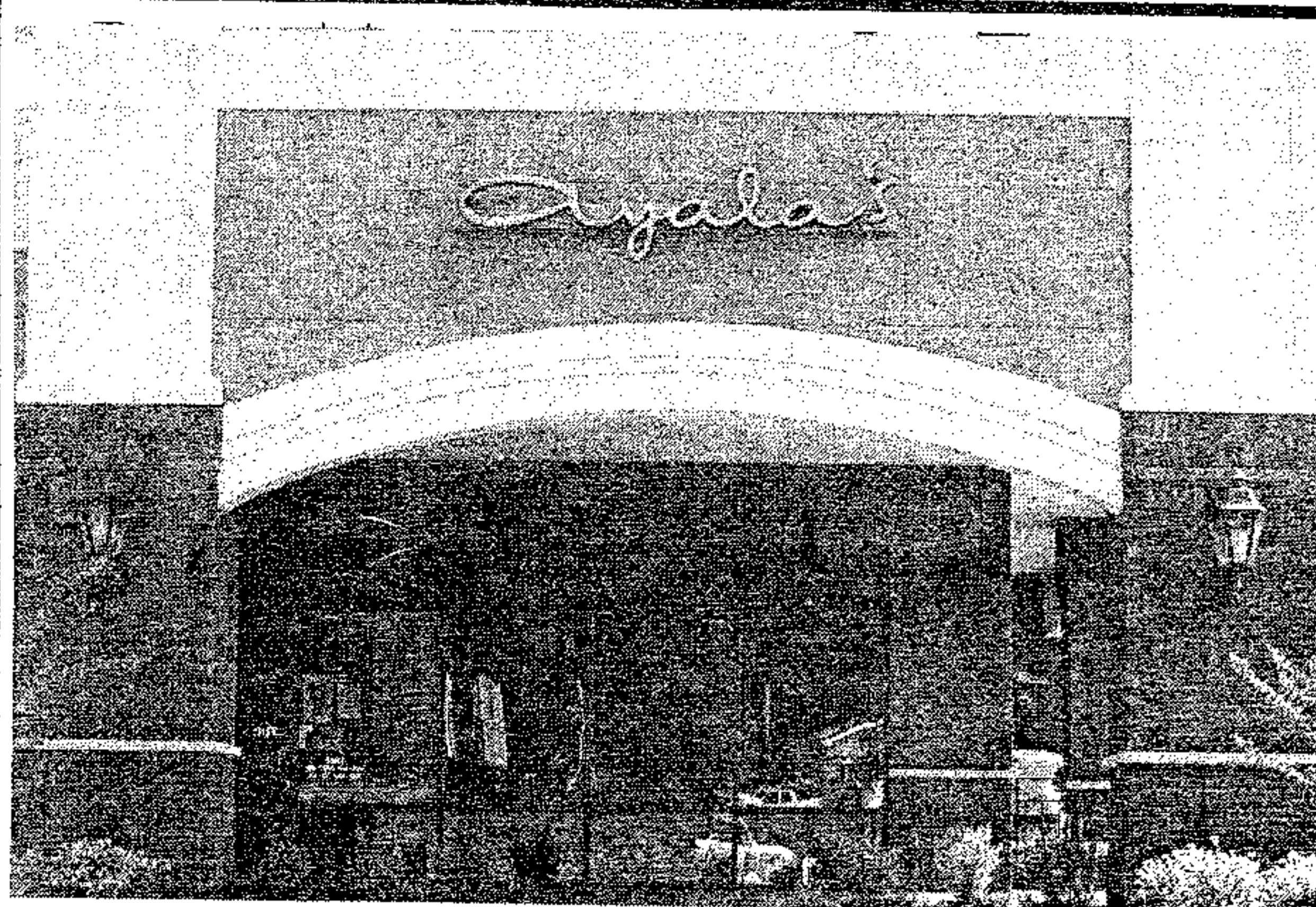

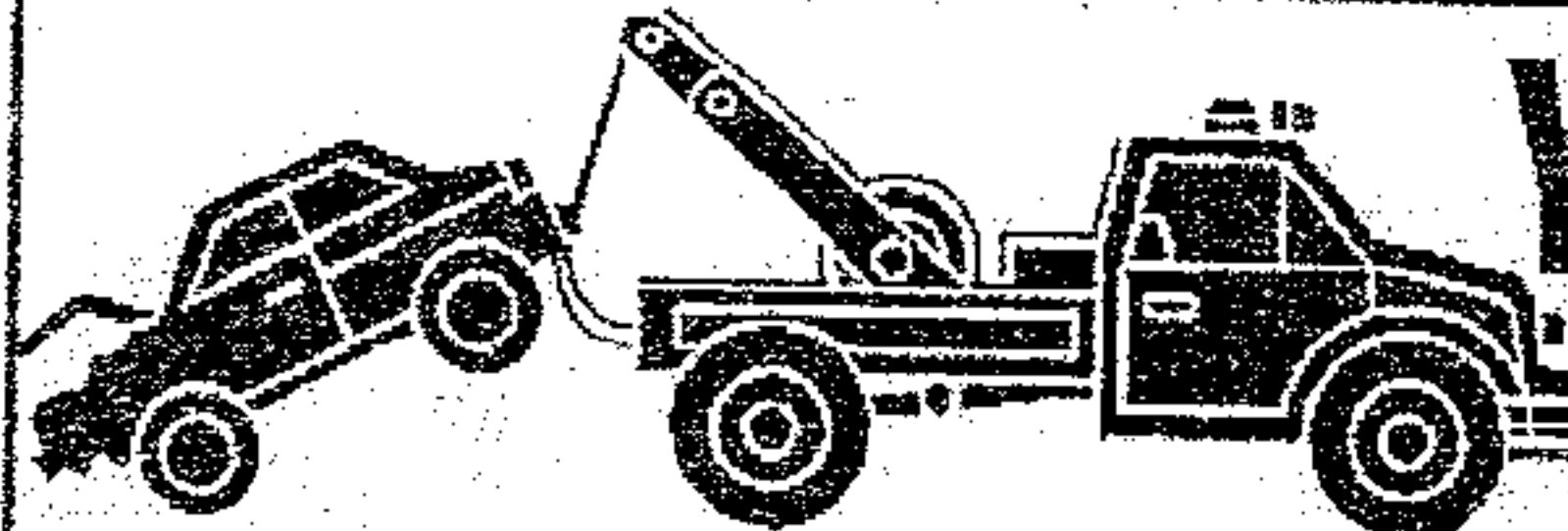
