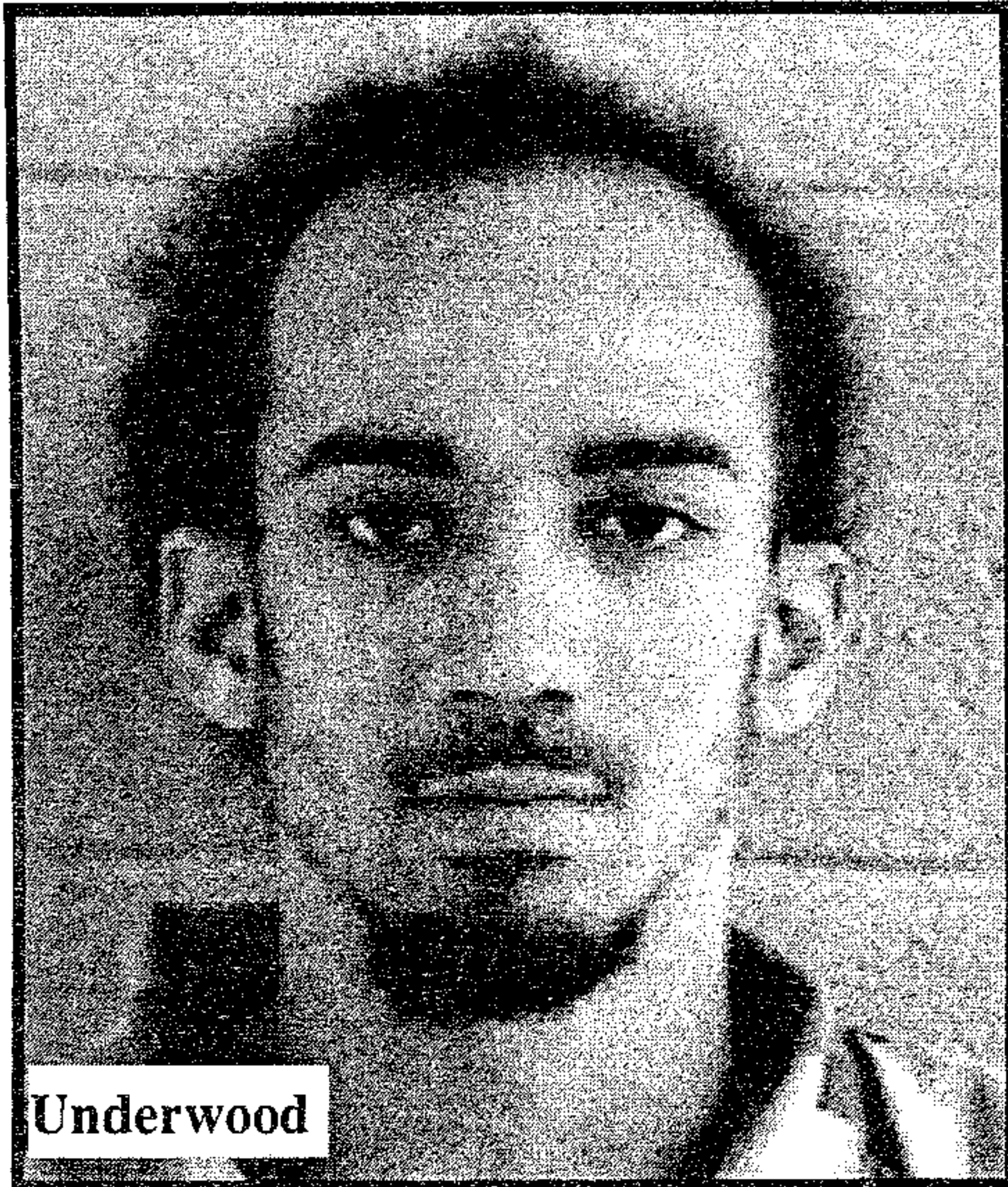

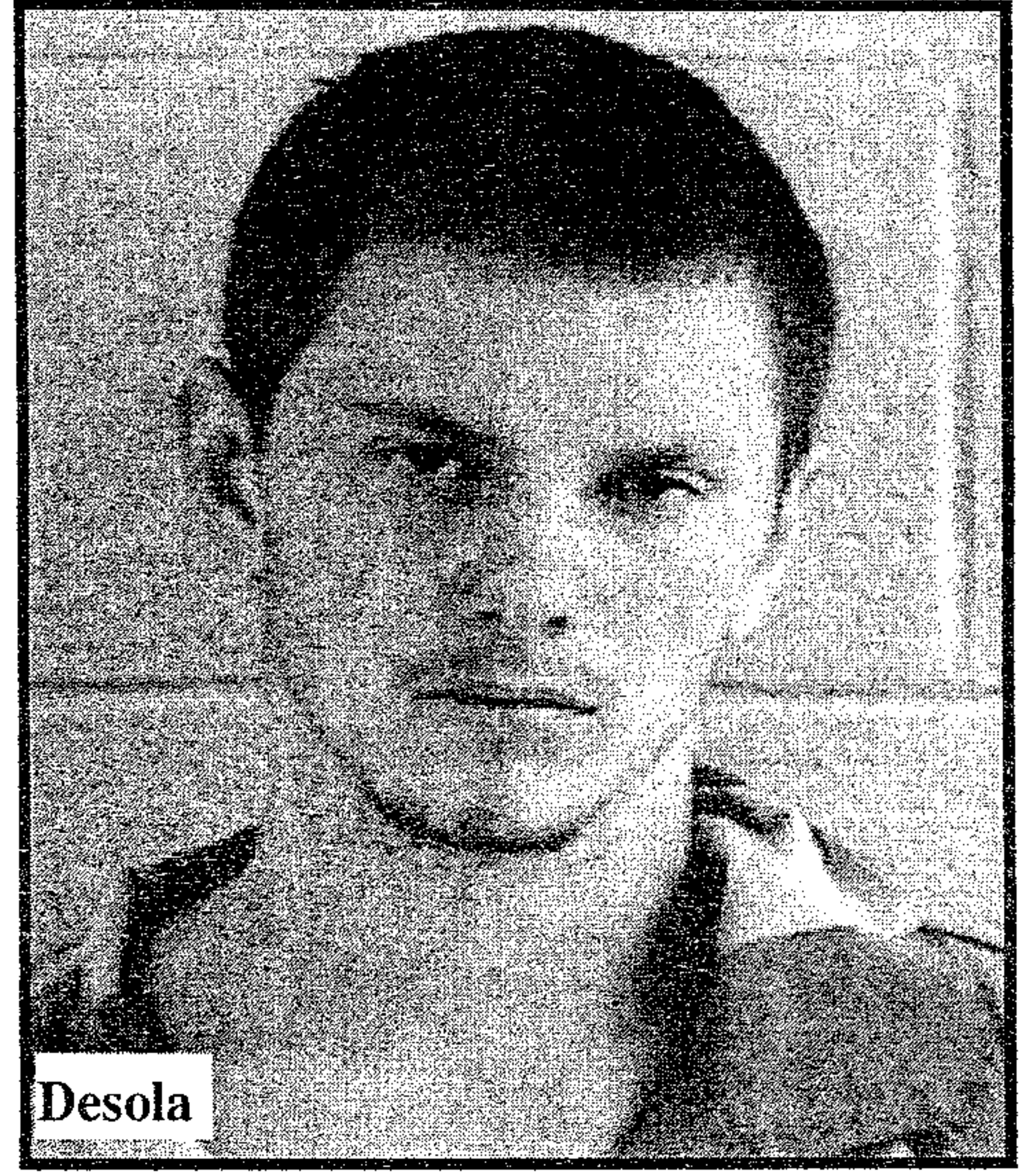

**Desola**

A young Lenoir City man was jailed after he reportedly was found in a pregnant woman's bed without permission at a McGhee Square apartment in spite of having been banned from McGhee Square property.

Anthony Louis Desola III, 19, Donna Drive, Lenoir City was charged with aggravated criminal trespass.

According to reports, Friday, at approximately 1:19 AM, Officer Emily Lawson, LCPD responded to a disturbance in progress at McGhee Square in which Anthony Desola refused to leave an apartment after previously being banned from the property.

Upon arrival, Sgt. Joe Foster, LCPD and Officer Lawson made contact with Desola in the common area beside

the 11 building. Records indicate the complainants were gone from the apartment and when they got home, they found Mr. Desola inside the residence lying in the female complainant's bed, refusing to leave. The woman was unable to lock her apartment door due to damage caused during a domestic violence incident in recent weeks in which Mr. Desola was

charged with domestic assault against her.

Desola's presence caused the complainant, who is pregnant, to be in fear for her personal safety.

Deputy Craig Brewer, who serves as Security Officer of McGhee Square, was contacted and confirmed Mr. Desola was on the list of persons who have been banned from the property.

Desola's was taken

into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

A Loudon man was jailed after he reportedly beat up a female and stole her vehicle when he became enraged at the breakup of their relationship.

Nathan Brandon Underwood, 23, Vale Street, Loudon, was charged with domestic assault, theft over \$1000 and felony vandalism.

According to affidavits; on August 8th, 2011, Corporal Ernie Brown, LCSO was dispatched to Shaw Ferry Road on a report of an assault and vandalism, and the theft of a vehicle. The complainant stated her ex-boyfriend, Nathan B. Underwood became enraged

because they broke up. He struck her and threatened to hit and spit on others at the scene.

The victim also said Underwood broke the hatch window of her vehicle and kicked and hit the passenger's side several times. There was broken tinted glass in the driveway.

Underwood then took the victim's vehicle without her permission. The vehicle was located at Mr. Underwood's parents house and did have a broken hatch window and two dents that still had shoe prints on them. Mr. Underwood had left the residence, taking the complainant's keys with him.

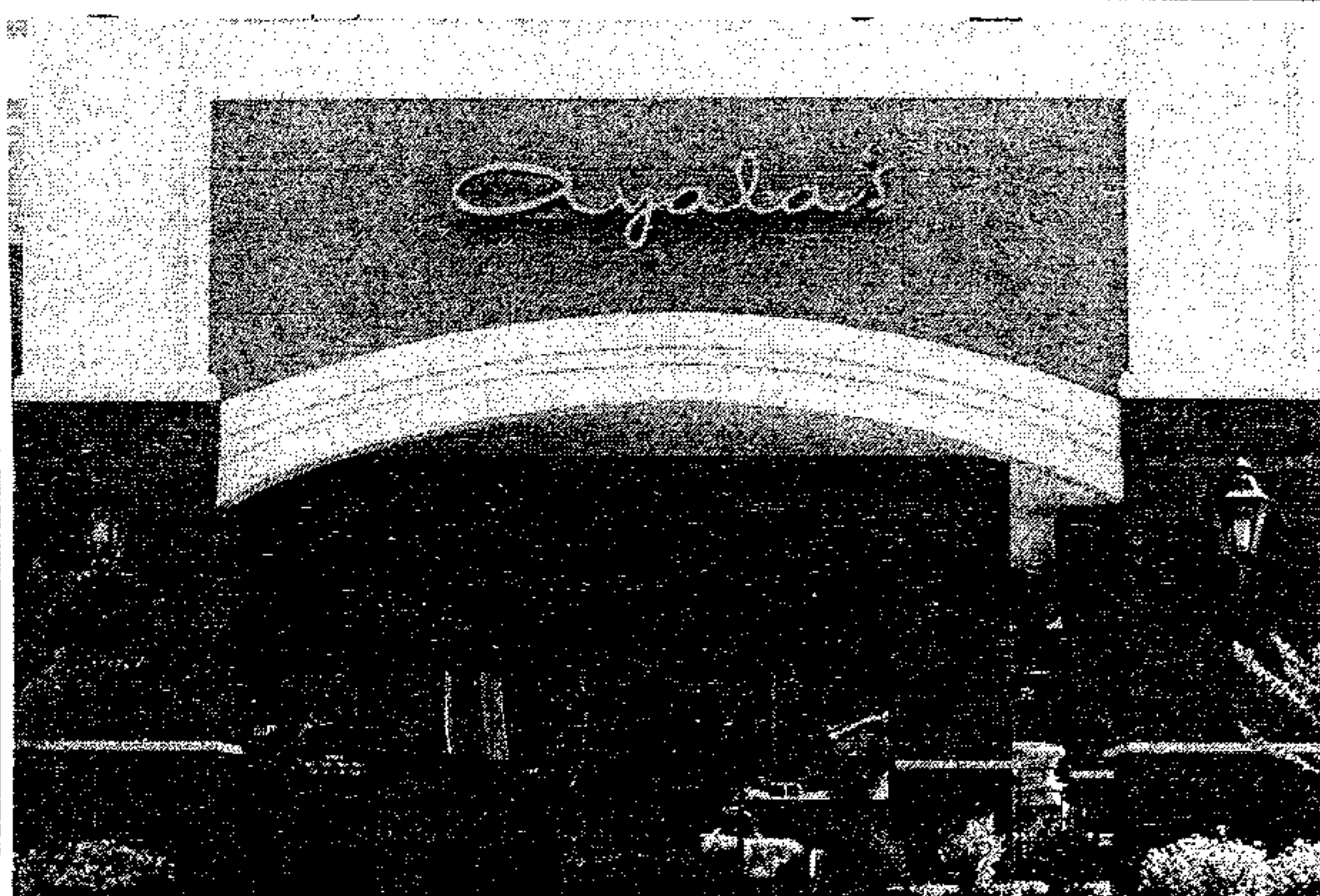

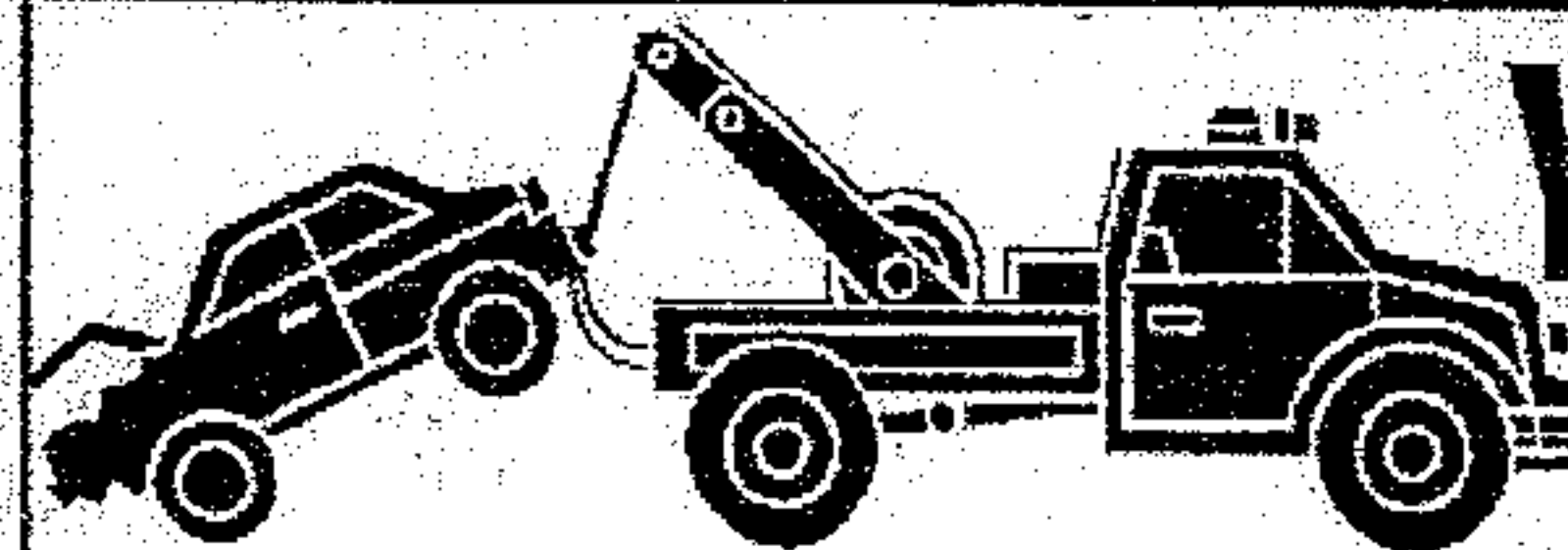
