1 of 3 in last week's chase brought to August Loudon County to face meth charges Unemployment

One of three people who reportedly were involved in a chase that ended in Monroe County September 14th has been brought to Loudon County to face methamphetamine and related charges in a case that resulted in the apprehension of two, and a stern advisement from the District Attorney for a third suspect to turn himself in to the nearest law enforcement agency.

Arnita Derinda Sikes, 38, Corntassel Road, Madisonville was charged with promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine, felony possession of drug paraphernalia, and fleeing lawful arrest.







According to records, on Friday, September 9, 2011, Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO observed a gray Chevy Lumina traveling south on Interstate 75 near the 81 mile marker. The license plate on the vehicle expired in April of 2011. A check through NCIC revealed the plate was registered to a 1991 Mercury.

Corporal Watkins conducted a traffic stop and the driver stated his name was Ronald Jack have a drivers license, they were revoked for DUI.

A check through NCIC confirmed Mr. Taylor's drivers license are revoked with a prior charge of driving on revoked in November of 2001.

Mr. Taylor admitted to driving the Chevy Lumina and striking the fire hydrant and the parked vehicle.






