


Lt. Patrick Upton charged a homeless man after he rented a trailer valued at over \$4000 and then failed to return it.



by unit: Unit A -4; Unit B -2; Unit L -3 per day. The antlered deer bag limit is a total of three for the year. A hunter may take his three antlered deer during any season, but no more than one per day.

In addition to deer, archers may harvest one wild turkey of either sex during the archery-only deer seasons in counties that have a fall turkey gun hunt. While hunting during the archery-only deer seasons, archers may take only wild turkey no matter how many counties they may hunt. (A list of counties in located on page 40 of the 2011 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide).

The TWRA suggests all archery hunters obtain a 2011 Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide. The guide lists the counties and bag limits for each of the different deer management units. The guides are available where hunting

and fishing licenses are sold and on the TWRA website, by clicking here.

During the opening weekend of the 2010 deer archery-only season, 2,401 were harvested an increase of 163 from 2009. All 95 counties reported harvests during the 2010 opening weekend.

Hunters are reminded that they must possess the appropriate licenses and permits. Any hunter born on or after Jan. 1, 1969 is required to carry proof of satisfactory completion of a hunter education class or be in possession of the Apprentice Hunting License (along with other required licenses) while hunting any species in Tennessee.

According to records, Wednesday, at 11:25 PM, a 911 hang-up call was made from a residence on Smith Val-


ley Road and several minutes later, another 911 call came in where the caller advised she was involved in a domestic dispute with her husband and he had a gun.

Just before Deputy Hall arrived, Mr. West fled the scene with the shotgun and was apprehended approximately 1/2 mile from the house.



es students will need to learn from kindergarten through high school graduation. The NGSS process is being managed by Achieve, an education reform non-profit organization.

"A growing number of jobs in Tennessee and around the country require a strong background in science, technology and engineering. This new, rigorous curriculum will be imperative in making our students competitive for those future jobs," said Kevin Huffman, Tennessee Education Commissioner.

The 20 lead state partners are: Arizona, California, Georgia, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota,

"This will be a collaborative process that will lead to a set of standards that provides America's students a strong foundation in science, and supports college and career readiness for

The development of the Next Generation Science Stan-

The first step was the building of a framework that identified the core ideas and practices in natural sciences and engineering that all students should be familiar with by the time they graduate. In July, the National Research Council released A Framework for K-12 Science Education, developed by a committee with expertise in science, teaching and learning, curriculum, assessment. and education policy.

The second step is the development of science standards based on the Framework. As a lead state partner, Tennessee will guide the standard writing process, gather and deliver feedback from statelevel committees and come together to address common tiative and, upon completion, give serious consideration to adopting the Next Generation Science Standards. In order to be considered, Tennessee had to submit a letter with the signature of the commissioner

separate capiases for two new bill indictments issued in August by the Loudon County Grand Jury charging the Goldmans (along with their son, Andrew Goldman, and his girlfriend, Renae Hasbrouck) with illegally manufacturing Schedule VI marijuana in an amount of more than one hundred (100) plants from the Goldman residence at 130 Inagehi Way.

The indictment stems from a search warrant executed by the LCSO Narcotics Unit after Sheriff's deputies responded to a domestic violence call from the Goldman house on

April 17, 2011. While investigating the domestic call deputies, according to the complaint, observed evidence of illegal drug use and took statements from the Goldmans that indicated the existence of an extensive indoor marijuana growing operation located in the basement of the Goldman residence.

The lawsuit filed by the district attorney places a lien on the real estate until the foreclosure hearing can take place, which will not occur until after the criminal charges have been resolved, according to Johnson.

texting people, telling them he was going to kill himself. Deputy Hall made contact with Mr. Dilly, driving the Saturn in the Pilot parking lot on Broadway.



Michael Helton, 27, North B Street, Lenoir City was charged with DUI 1st offense and violation of implied consent.


