

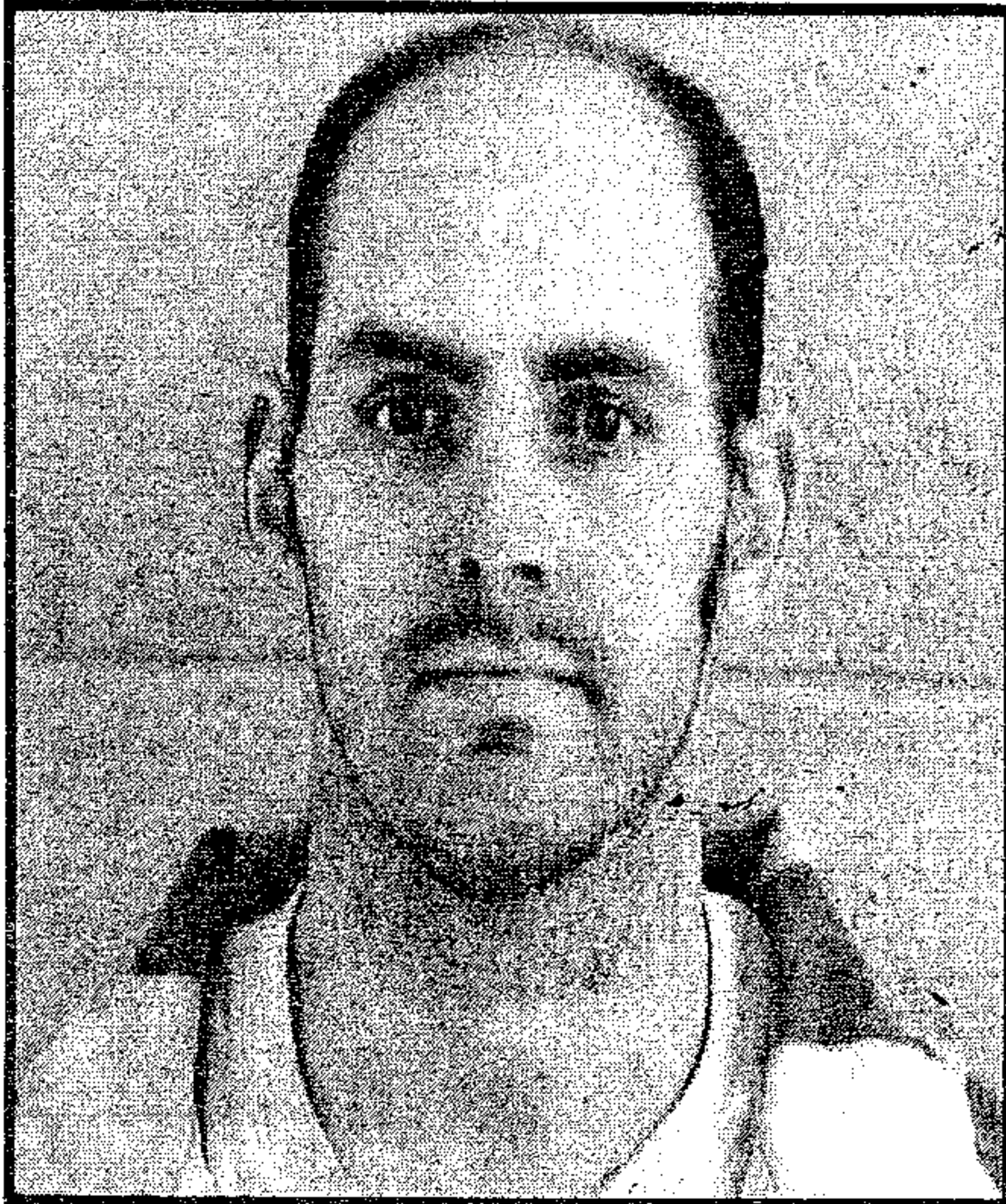
## Greenback man charged with theft of truck batteries

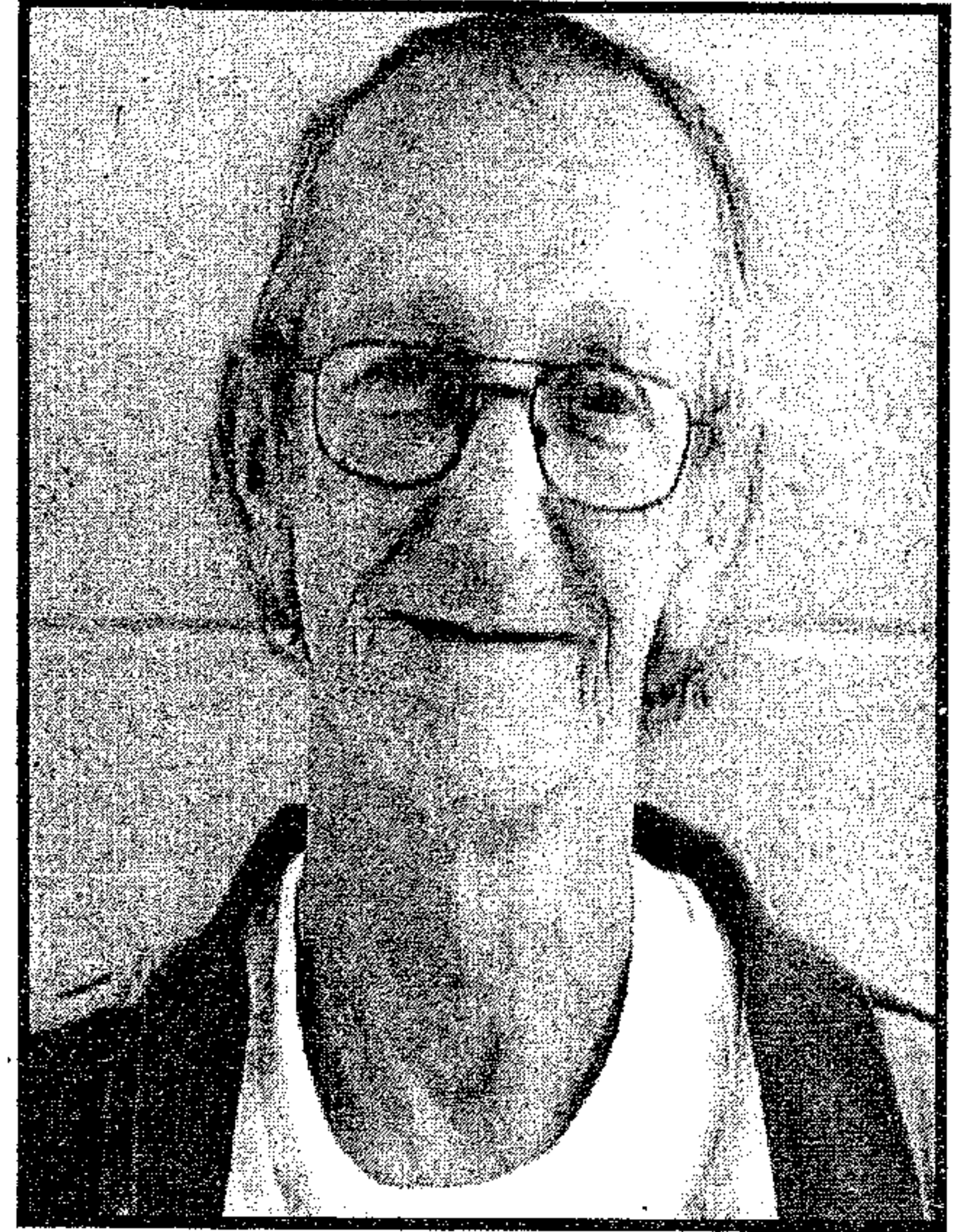
## LC man gets 4th DUI, more

and children trying to steal curb pins from the property Saturday and ran them off by yelling at them, but when the

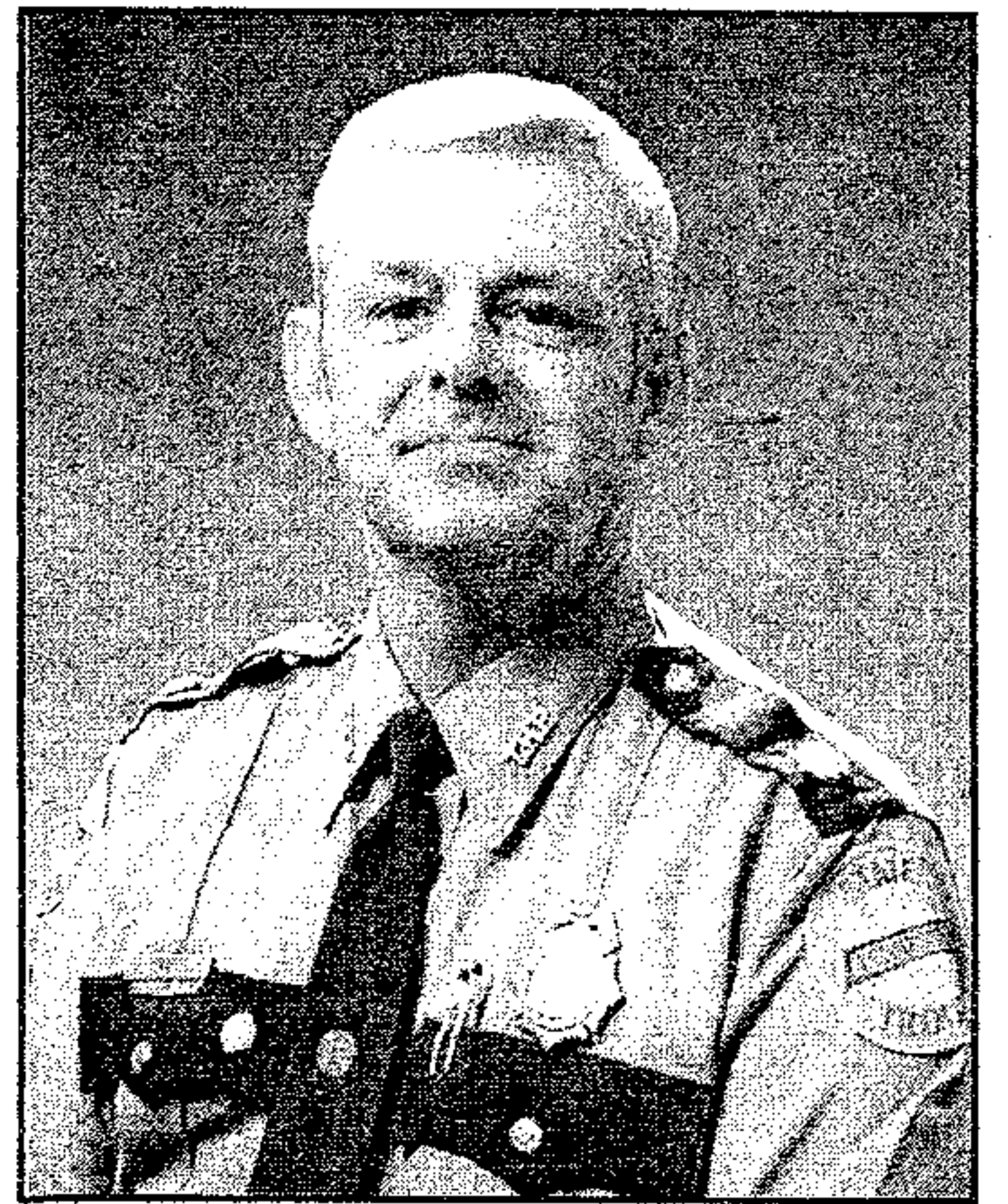

Also taken was an unknown amount of curb pins from a hill on the property. A female and two children were seen on the hill Saturday, and when workers yelled at them, they dropped the items and ran away.

The value of the bat-

teries was estimated at \$1500. The investigation is ongoing.

DUI enforcement is the most important duty of the Tennessee Highway Patrol. Our dedication to DUI enforcement is saving lives and making Tennessee roads much safer for all of our families," Trott said.

As of August 31, state troopers had made 3,407 arrests this year for DUI. That is an increase of 38.95 percent over the same time period in 2010, when troopers had made 2,452 arrests for DUI. As of August 31, there

had been 614 traffic fatalities this year on Tennessee roadways. That is a decrease of 13.8 percent compared to the same time period in 2010, when there had been 699 fatalities.

The 2012 Nashville Walk Like MADD event is scheduled for 9:31 a.m. on Saturday, June 2, 2012 in Bicentennial Mall Park in downtown Nashville.

### Screening Key to Beating Breast Cancer

NASHVILLE – October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and the Department of Health is challenging all Tennessee women over the age of 40 to get a clinical breast exam and mammogram. These screening tests are powerful weapons in the fight against breast cancer. The survival rate is greater than 95 percent for women whose breast cancer is found at an early stage.

"Mammograms and clinical breast exams are still the best method for finding cancer early and offering protection against the disease, leading women to get treatment before the cancer is in advanced stages," said Health Commissioner John Dreyzehner, MD, MPH, FACOEM. "We urge Tennessee women to get screened for breast cancer and talk to their health providers about ways to reduce their risk for this disease."

Early signs of breast cancer may include skin irritation, dimpling, swelling, a breast lump, tenderness, nipple changes or pain or an abnormality detected on a mammogram. Women should contact their health care provider if any of these symptoms appear and should follow guidelines for yearly breast health screenings.

All women are at risk for breast cancer, especially as

they age, and getting a mammogram has gotten easier and more accessible. Many areas in Tennessee now have mobile mammography units that travel to various sites to offer mammograms and breast exams. High-quality mammograms are also offered in some doctor's offices and other locations. Women can contact their local community health center or county health department for information on screening services and mammogram locations.

"Most insurance policies cover annual mammograms for women, and all women who have Medicare have this as an annual benefit," said Mary Jane Dewey, director of the Tennessee Breast and Cervical Screening Program. "We urge all women over age 40 to seek out this lifesaving screening test."

The Tennessee Breast and Cervical Screening Program is available in most county health departments and some community health centers across the state to enroll uninsured women with limited income for clinical breast exams, Pap tests and mammograms at no charge. 
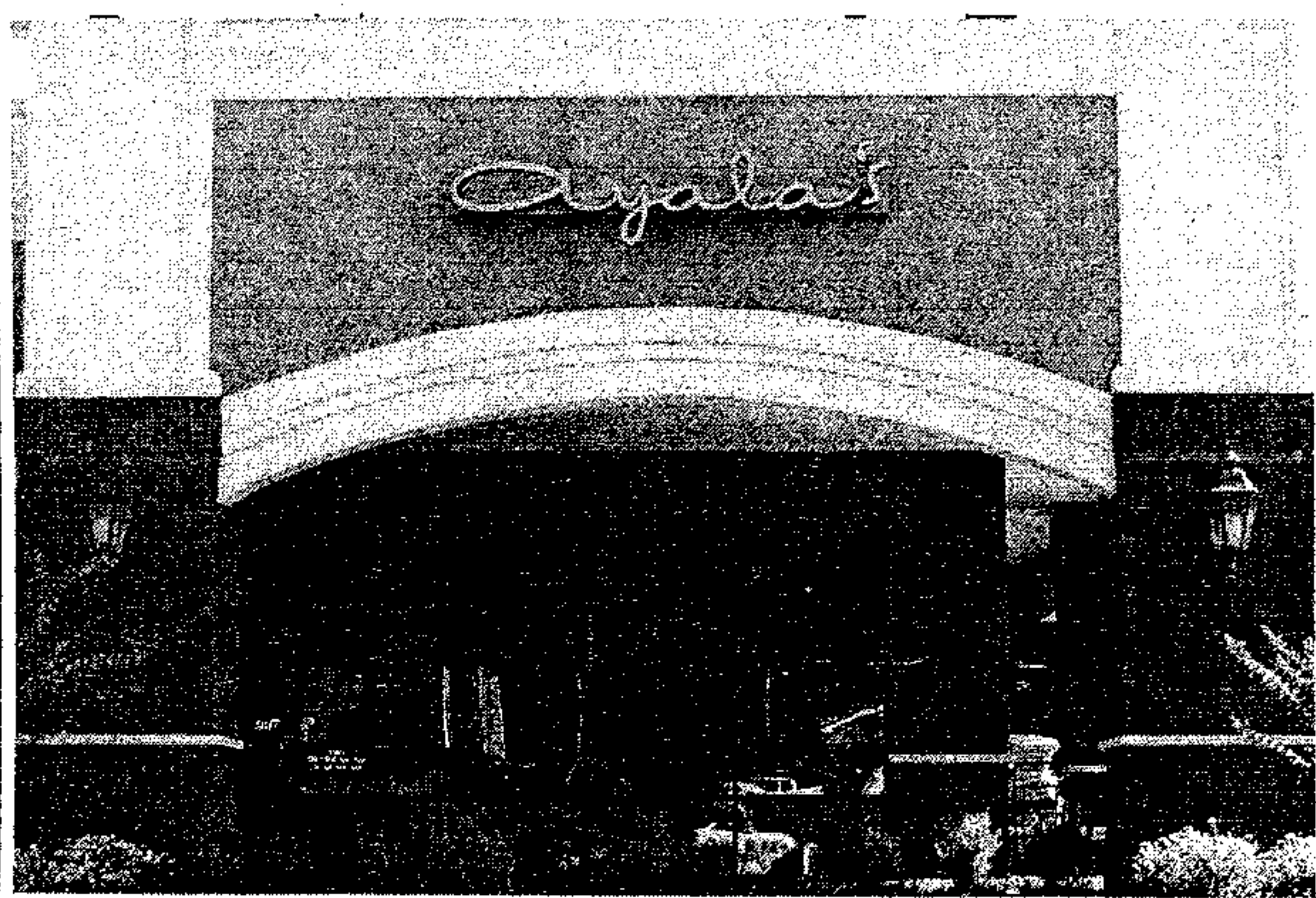

Ms. Shelton got out of her vehicle and came up to the passen-


ger side window that was rolled down. Ms. Shelton reportedly reached in the window and hit the victim in the face.
