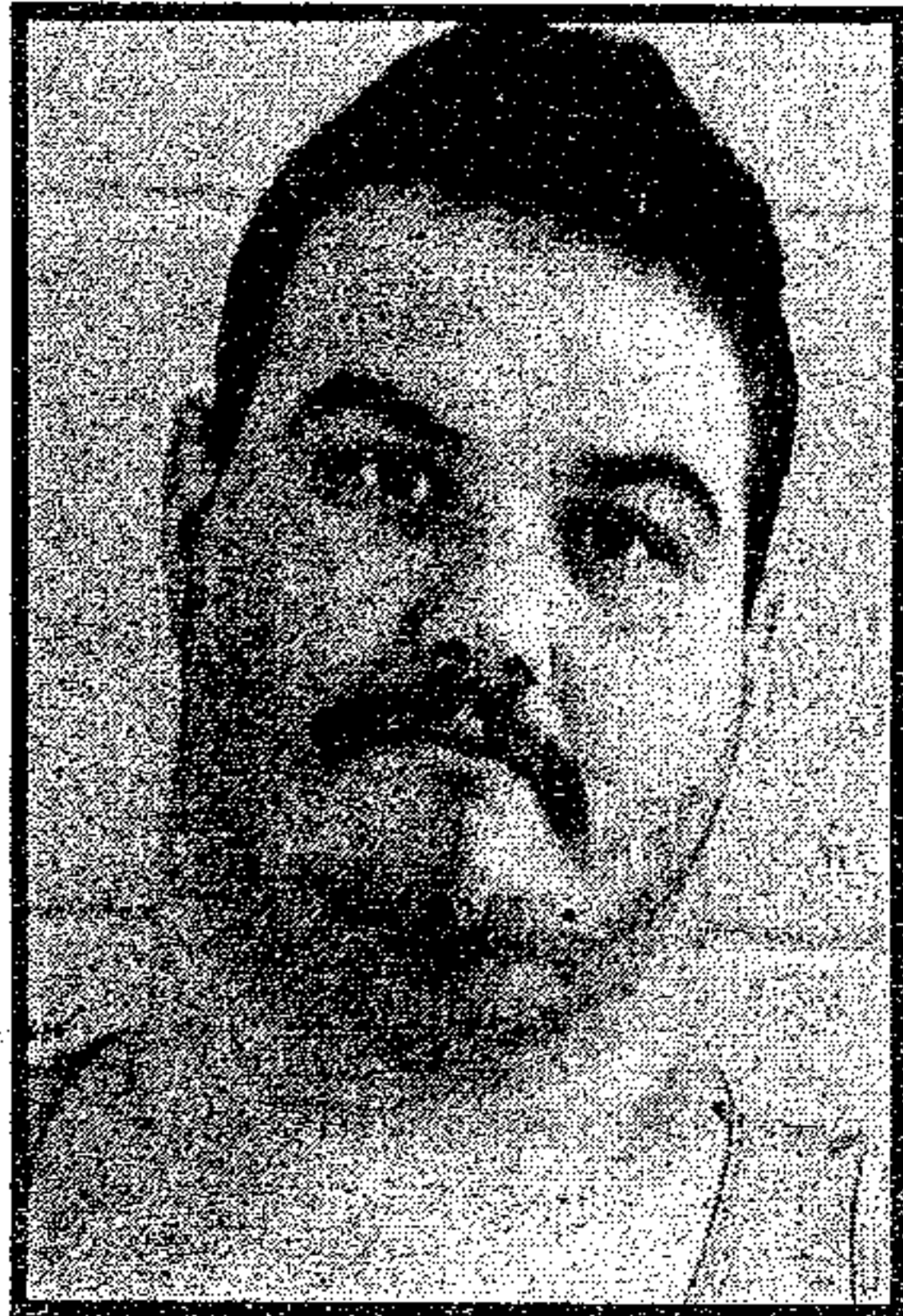

Deputy Jason Scott was shot and killed when he arrived at the scene of a domestic disturbance on Palmer Driver, in rural Loudon County at 0830 hours.

He was shot four times as he exited his patrol

car by a 16-year-old boy who had been beating his mother with a post. The boy had attacked the mother because she had refused to let him drive to school because he had been drinking the night before.

Another deputy, who arrived at the scene behind Deputy Scott, called for assistance. The suspect then barricaded himself in his house, armed with numerous rifles, and exchanged shots with responding officers. Three

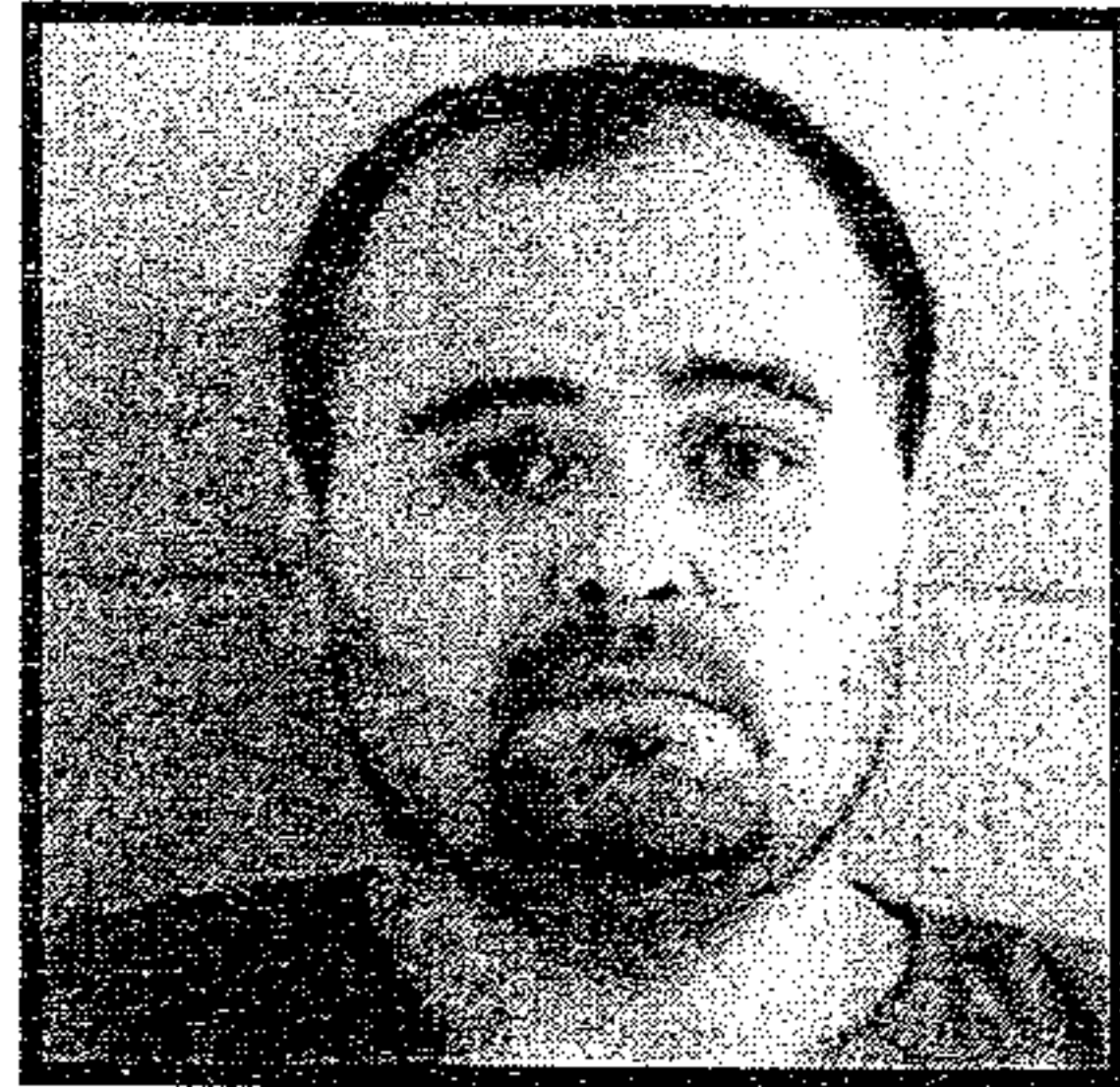

According to records, Pastor Brent Freeland stated he noticed a back basement window on the graveyard side of the church was broken out where entry was made.

Once inside, the perpetrator discovered the interior door was dead bolted from the hallway, then kicked a large

hole through the door and gained access to the rest of the church.

A 50" Phillips flat screen TV and a Magnavox DVD player were taken from the fellowship hall. Another 42" Phillips flat screen TV was ripped from the wall in the downstairs foyer.

Three Sannheifer wireless microphones and one Fhure wired microphone were also

taken from the main sanctuary.

The door that was used to gain entry also was destroyed.

The estimated value of the church's loss was \$5130. Investigator Charles Cosner, LCSO-CID responded, and took photographs of the scene.

other officers received minor wounds from flying debris when they were shot at by the suspect. Deputy Scott and the other initial responding officers were not aware that there were numerous weapons in the home.

Deputy Scott was flown to the University of Tennessee Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The suspect was found dead from a self-inflicted gunshot wound following a 28-hour standoff.

Deputy Scott had served with the Loudon County Sheriff's Department for 3 years. He is survived by his expectant wife, mother, father, and sister.

This year's memorial bike ride honoring Deputy Scott will benefit four-year-old Rory Lee-

Ann Eller of Loudon.

Rory was born on March 26, 2007. She has a twin brother, Noah, and a younger sister, Sophia. For four years, she has been a healthy, vibrant little girl.

That all changed in February of this year. Rory presented with flu like symptoms, as did the rest of our family. We all got rid of the flu, with the exception of Rory. Her symptoms persisted. She had fevers, headaches, and she vomited every morning. Her father and I took her to her pediatrician several times. They treated her for acid reflux, -ran blood work on her, and tested her for mono; all were negative. The vomiting and fever, then became intermittent, but still present.

The week of April 19th, we were taking

her to yet another doctor's appointment, when we found her in a state where we were unable to arouse her. Her nurses instructed us to take her to the Emergency Room. We took her and they ran all of the common tests, all again, that came back negative. They then assured us that her problem was not physical and instructed us to take her home. Her father and I were at a loss. In two months we had watched our beautiful, healthy little girl fade to this empty shell that did not have the strength to do anything. We were miserable, confused, and very concerned. We sat around for days trying to figure out what had happened and where we went wrong. On Easter weekend, she slept for 16 hours at a time, and began shaking all over

her body all the time. We made her another doctor's appointment. They assessed her new shaking and ordered a fasting blood work on Mother's day. On Saturday all of her symptoms came full force, so I just decided to take her to the Emergency room that evening. After we got to the Emergency Room they did a cat scan, and they found a mass on her brain. We spent 12 days in the hospital. She had 5 surgeries, to try and relieve the fluid on her brain, a biopsy, a port, and finally a shunt. They diagnosed her with a pilocytic astrocytoma. It is a very common, benign tumor, and typically surgery is the cure, but the location of my daughter's tumor makes things a lot more difficult. It is located on top of her thalamus.

That makes it inoperable, because, and operation could either kill or paralyze her.

Radiation is not an option at this point, because she is too young; so chemo was our last resort. They started two types, Carboplatin and Vincristine, after a couple of months on the chemo her symptoms came back. We found out that the tumor had grown, which was not supposed to happen, because it was supposed to be a slow growing tumor, but her doctors said that there was nothing slow growing about this. Her symptoms had also returned because the growth of the tumor had caused her shunt to malfunction, because the tumor had grown over top of the catheter



resources for His glory. Some folks have the mind set that being a Christian requires us to give up our happiness and walk around like we're sacrificing something in our lives for a ticket to heaven. Angie and I are perfect examples of how serving Jesus is just the opposite.

You may recall our recent efforts to raise some money for the missionary family that we were going to visit through making survival bracelets. As we began to take bracelet orders we both found ourselves making bracelets every night after work and on the weekends. Our goal was to raise a thousand dollars to give to this family and we met that goal the day before we left. We knew that the money would be appreciated but had no idea how God would bless us for the efforts.

Even before leaving home God was blessing this trip. Our research revealed the average cost of a rental car with limited mileage for ten days was between \$800 and \$1000. Just before leaving TN Angie spoke to a dealership who agreed to deliver a 2010 vehicle to the airport with unlimited miles for less than half of any rental agency. (Plus a VOLS t-shirt and a survival bracelet)

Our journey then began with a midnight landing and a three hour drive to Glacier National Park for two days of sightsee-

ing before arriving in Helena to meet this family. The savings on the rental allowed us to tour Glacier from a helicopter where God showed us a hint of how beautiful heaven must be.

Being a wildlife junkie I will confess that I made a selfish prayer while in Glacier. I asked God to let me see a real live grizzly bear in the wild. (I know, careful what you pray for) On Saturday morning we set out on a ten mile hike to Ice Berg Lake. We were only about a mile in when a guy up in front of us started waving us up to him whispering, "hurry, two grizzlies!" Sure enough we were hiking just below a sow and a cub grazing on the wide open hillside. (See photos on our web page in a few days, thank you Jesus)

On Sunday morning we met our new missionary friends before church and Pastor Darren delivered a powerful message about living a life for Christ. I always hate missing Preacher Mark's messages but this one stirred my heart as well. Darren's wife sang beautifully and their daughter played a primitive bongo type drum. Angie and I knew quickly that God has His hand on this couple which validated our efforts to visit and support them.

After church we went to lunch with Pastor Darren and his family. Angie and I presented the whole family with a survival bracelet and the story of how we started

making them. We then had the honor of presenting them with one thousand dollars raised from bracelet donations in Loudon TN. Pastor Darren was speechless and his wife (And Blondie) began to tear up at the dinner table. Pastor Darren's eighth grade daughter quietly said, "Praise the Lord." God knew that this family had needs and He knew I loved Montana. It wasn't my money it was God's, He just allowed Angie and I to be part of His divine plan and let survival bracelets be the means. We serve the God of the universe and He takes care of those who love Him!

Angie and I have been able to serve the Lord and Big Sky Fellowship in many other ways this week as well. We have painted, cleaned, built fences, participated in an expansion project, fellowshiped with church members, and even went to court with a new Christian who was in need of encouragement.

Tomorrow we have the opportunity to spend time with this young sister in Christ as well as her troubled daughter who most likely doesn't know Jesus as her personal Savior. We are praying that this family sees what Jesus is doing in our lives and that God will grant us the opportunity to share our faith.

It doesn't matter who you are, where you are or where you have been, Jesus wants to use us all in some way for His glory. The next time you have that small voice nudging you to sacrifice a little time or a few bucks for someone you don't know, go ahead and do it. It may just be Jesus trying to use you for something bigger than you know.

and clogged it with its particles. They did a shunt reconstruction surgery on Thursday, July 14th. Now we have to try two new chemos to see if the tumor will respond to those. We are kind of racing against time because if this tumor continues to grow it will eventually kill her. Rory has been a wonderful, strong person through all of this. I have only seen her cry a couple of times. She takes all of her medicines without a fight, she lets her doctors and nurses poke and prod her without a fight. She never says that this isn't fair or why me. Her brother is starting school in a couple of weeks which is no longer an option for her, nor is playing soccer or doing ballet like she wanted to. She has had to go back to her father and I leading her around, because her shaking makes it difficult for her to walk by herself. We take things day by day. We break down when it all becomes too much, but not in front of her because we do not want her to be afraid. We try to explain things the best we can to her brother and sister who are very concerned. They ask every day if she is okay and if the "ball" is out of her head yet. We wish that we could make this go away for her and our family. I know that there are a lot worse situations out there, and I have the most sympathy for those kids and their families. We have a really amazing support system of family and friends, they have made things easier on us. We are prepared to do anything and everything we have to do to get our daughter better and keep her with us as long as she has a good quality of life. Four years is not enough time with her. Rory is a wonderful person. She is loving and polite. She is very girly and fun, too. I know that given the chance, she will one day make an outstanding contribution to this world.

Cheryl Kathleen Irish, 53, Mashburn Road, Sweetwater was charged with four counts of promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine.

Jordan Matthew Summey, 31, Miller Road, Vonore was charged with promoting the manufacture of methamphetamine.

According to affidavits; on August 30th, 2011, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF observed a red Ford Windstar fail to yield to oncoming traffic while attempting to pull into the Pilot gas station on Broadway in Lenoir City. The van nearly caused an accident, forcing oncoming traffic to nearly come to a complete stop as it crossed the roadway. The vehicle stopped at the gas pumps and Agent

DeBoer parked his vehicle and approached the driver to speak with her about unsafe driving.

The female, later identified as Cheryl Irish was very apologetic and revealed she didn't have a valid license and knew she should not be driving. She appeared to be very nervous and during the conversation revealed to Agent DeBoer she asked her passenger to buy a pseudoephedrine based product at Walgreens in Lenoir City.

Ms. Irish further stated she was given money by a male she said was a "meth cook" and in return would be given \$20 from this person when she returned with the box.

The officer reported Irish does this on a regular basis and she said she's broke and

does it for the money. A check of her recent pseudo purchases showed four in the last 30 days in Loudon County with the full knowledge of it's intended use of making methamphetamine.

Ms. Irish's passenger was identified as Jordan Summey. Mr. Summey had knowledge of the purchase being used to manufacture meth and was receiving compensation in the form of cash for purchasing it.

Mr. Summey was also found

to be in possession of several types of drug paraphernalia and was found to have made several other purchases of pseudo based products in the month of August.

requirement applies not only to city and county governments, but other public entities that issue debt, including industrial development boards, utility districts and quasi-governmental agencies.

Comptroller Justin P. Wilson sent letters to local government leaders, reminding them of the deadline.

The standards designed by the Funding Board are intended to give local governments discretion in crafting their debt management policies, provided they follow four guiding principles. Those principles are:

1) Debt transactions should be clearly understood by those involved

in making the decisions about them

2) Citizens should be able to get clear explanations about the transactions

3) Steps should be taken to avoid conflicts of interest among the parties involved in the transactions

4) Costs and risks associated with the transactions should be clearly disclosed

Many organizations, including the University of Tennessee's Municipal Technical Advisory Service (MTAS) and the County Technical Advisory Service (CTAS), are providing assistance to local governments in developing or refining their debt
