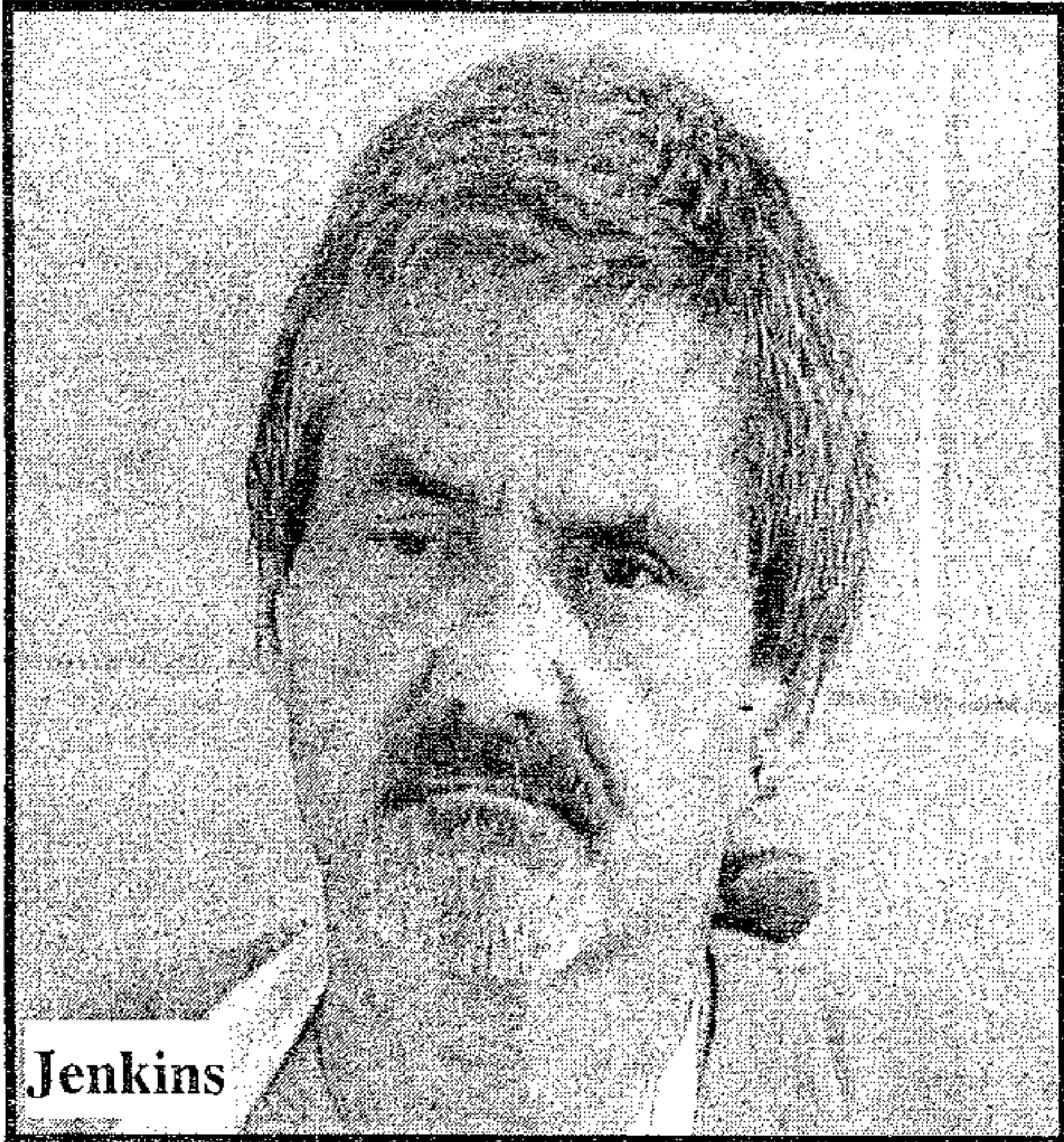


Parents dead, children injured in Labor day weeked crash on I-75

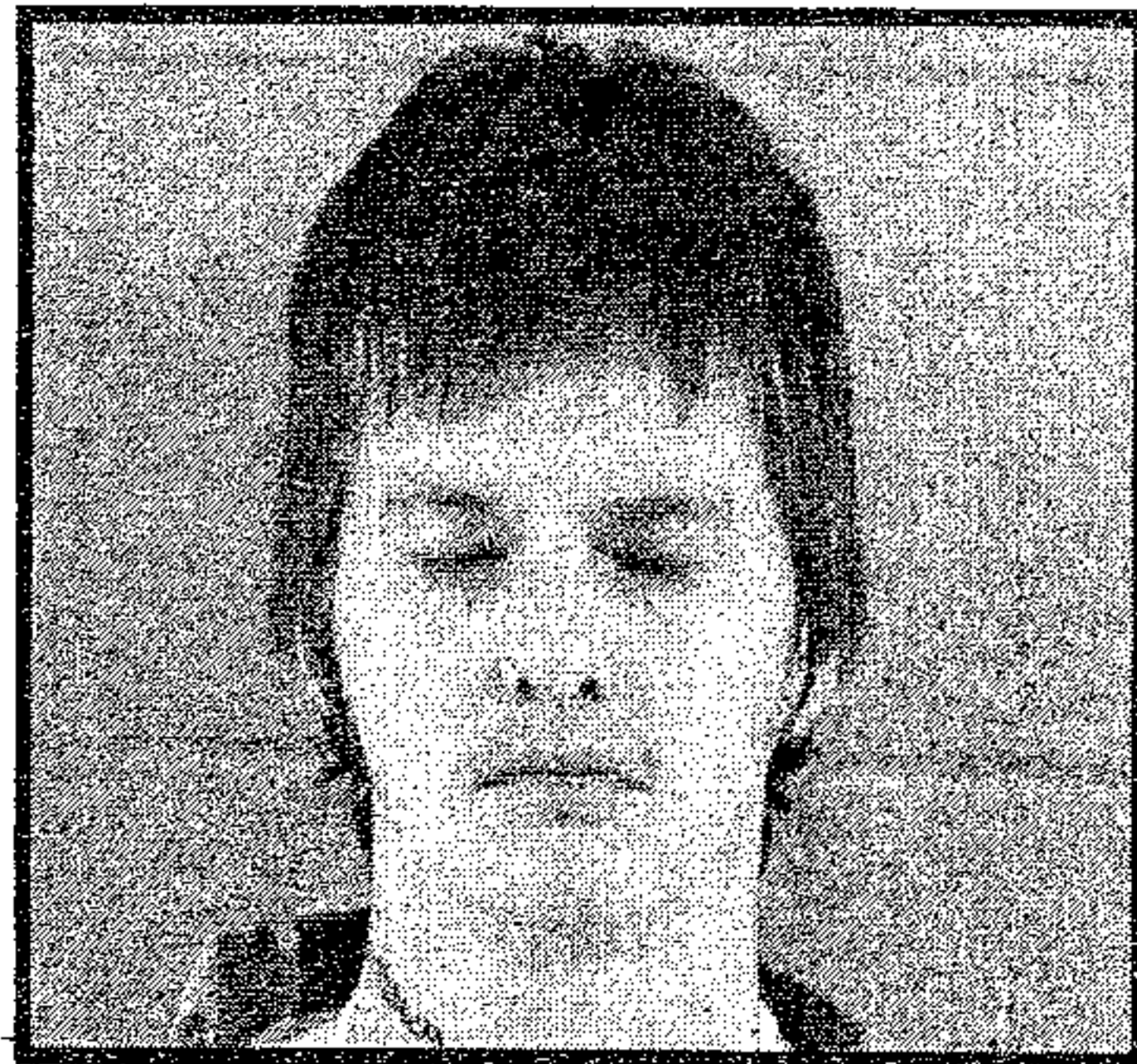

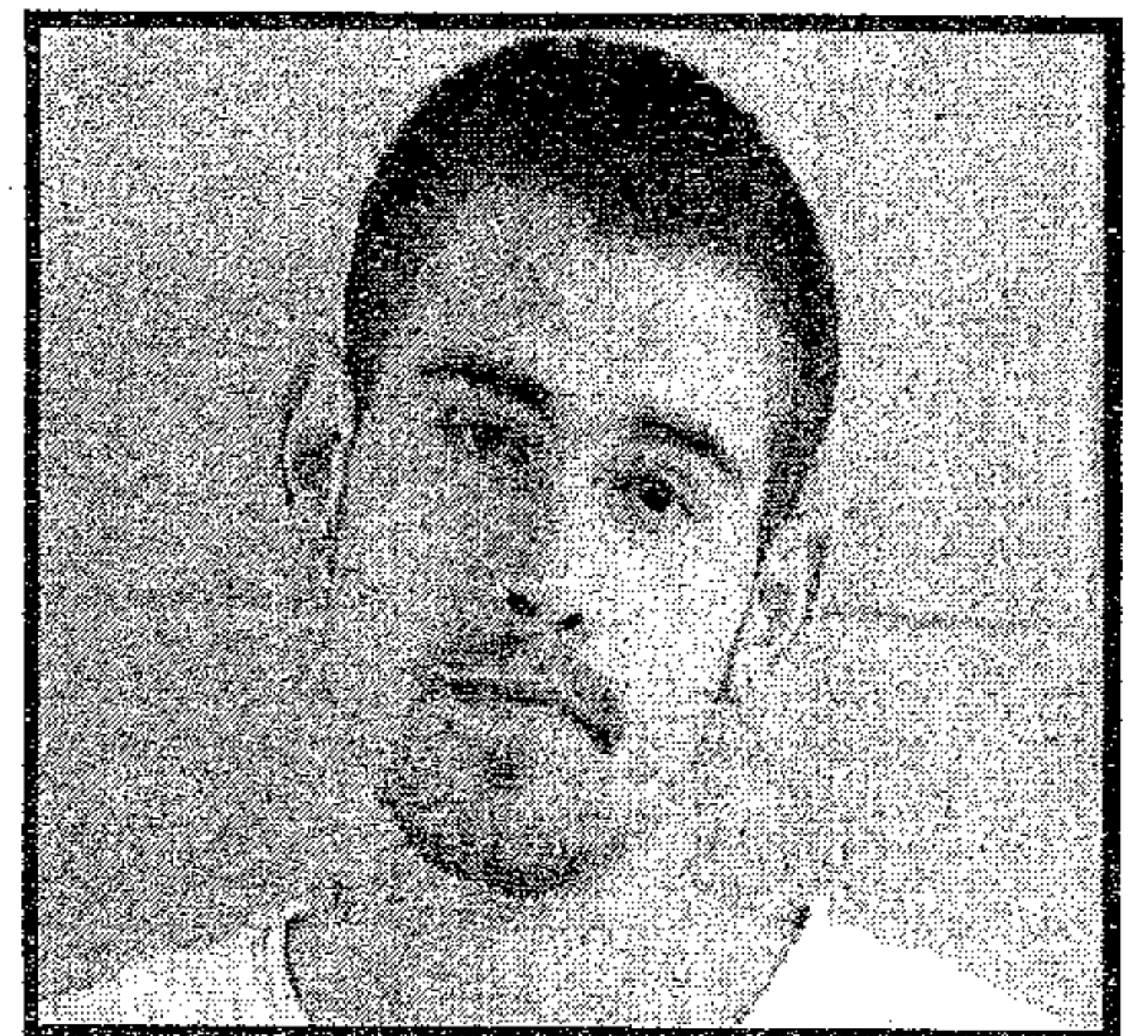

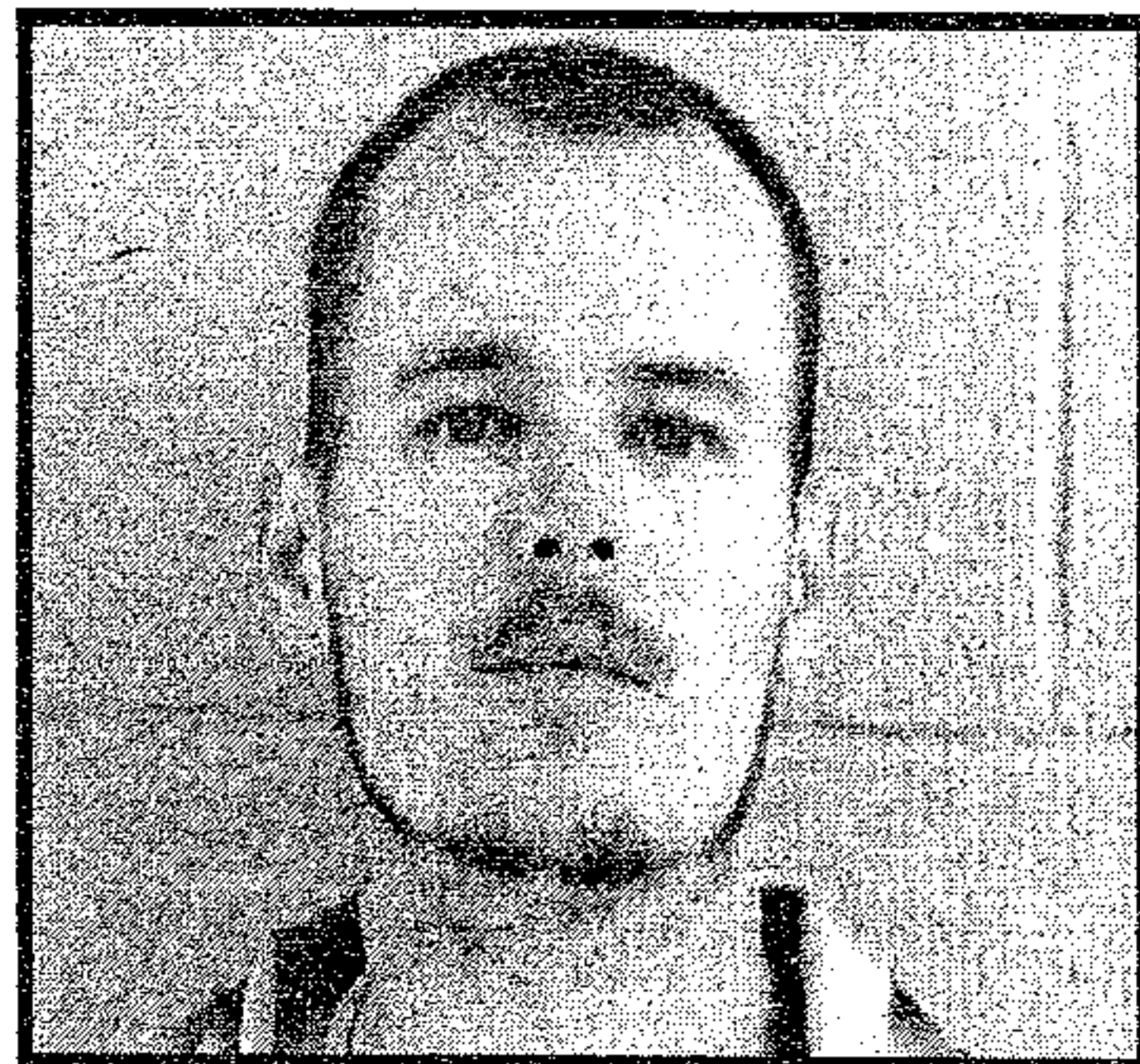

the Chevy Blazer from Interstate 40, all the way to a residence in Executive Meadows.

The witness advised the driver of the Blazer, identified as Connie R. Brandon, hit the guard rail at Interstate 75 and flattened her passenger front tire. Then, while traveling on Adesa Parkway, she hit a bicyclist on his bike, hitting his bike tire and running two others off the road.

After Brandon stopped at her residence, Officer Felts made contact with her and had her exit her vehicle. Mrs. Brandon had very slurred speech and she could hardly stand on her own.

Brandon was taken into custody and transported to the Fort Loudoun Medical Center where she consented to a blood test, before being transported to jail.

Bruce Winfred Jenkins, 53, West Second Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with possession of schedule II adderall, possession of drug paraphernalia, and maintaining a dwelling where narcotics are sold or possessed.

According to reports, Thursday, around 1:00 PM, Investigator Shane Ezell, Investigator Marty Stanley, LCSO-ND and Investigator Jason Butler, LCPD went to the residence of Bruce Jenkins in an attempt to locate Mr. Jenkins for several warrants out of Loudon County and Lenoir City. He was at the residence and was advised of the warrants.

Mr. Jenkins gave the officers verbal consent to search the house for any contraband or illegal narcotics. 14 new and used syringes, pieces of burnt aluminum foil and plastic tubes fashioned in a way commonly used to smoke methamphetamine, spoons with cotton and residue stains on them, a cut straw and a plate with a blue powder residue were found during the search.

An unlabeled pill bottle containing 17 blue oval pills identified as 10 mg. adderall was found inside a red leather fanny pack along with Bruce Jenkins' drivers license and veteran affairs card. Jenkins was taken into custody on Loudon County warrants and a Lenoir City warrant as follows;

An affidavit filed by Investigator Jason Butler, LCPD notes; on August 14th, 2011, at approximately 5:35 PM, a man identified by Dollar General store clerks as Bruce Jenkins entered into the Dollar General Store, 504 Bon Street, Lenoir City where he purchased three cold packs containing ammonium nitrate. Jenkins is a known methamphetamine user and cook.

Based on Investigator Butler's training and experience, Jenkins purchased the cold packs with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

Additional affidavits filed by Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO-ND indicate; on August 24th, 2011, Investigator Ezell was requested to assist Lenoir City Police at 502 West Second Avenue in Lenoir City. Upon arrival the investigator made contact with the owner of the residence, Bruce Winfred Jenkins. Bruce Jenkins was out on bond for previous charges of manufacturing methamphetamine.

Mr. Jenkins gave verbal consent to search the residence. Seven syringes, two mirrors with residue, a cut straw commonly used to snort narcotics, one glass marijuana pipe, approximately one gram of marijuana, and two round white pills identified as carisoprodol were all found on Bruce Jenkins' person.

Carisoprodol is a legend drug taken as a muscle relaxer. Mr. Jenkins advised he didn't have a prescription for the medication. Investigator Ezell made the arrest.

Debra Jean Dison, 51, New River Highway, Briceville was charged with DUI 1st offense, violation of open container and violation of implied consent.

According to reports, Sunday, around 6:16 PM, Officer Brandon Gentry, LCPD responded to a call of a reckless driver in the area of Highway 321 and Highway 11. He made contact with the vehicle in question, a red Chevy S-10, around McGhee Boulevard and Highway 321 and while behind it he witnessed it swerve across the dividing line.

When Officer Gentry and another officer activated their

emergency equipment the vehicle made a U-turn and drove in the opposite direction. The truck was not stopping for law enforcement.

The vehicle finally stopped approximately 300 yards from where she did the U-turn. The driver was identified as Debra Dison.

Ms. Dison had slurred speech, bloodshot eyes, and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage on her person. When she exited the vehicle she stumbled out and almost fell.

There was a cup with a clear liquid which had the odor of an alcoholic beverage in the console of her truck. Ms. Dison stated she'd had two alcoholic beverages earlier and she did

poorly on field sobriety tasks. She was placed under arrest.

Ms. Dison was read the implied consent form and agreed to give a blood sample, but once at the ER she changed her mind and refused.

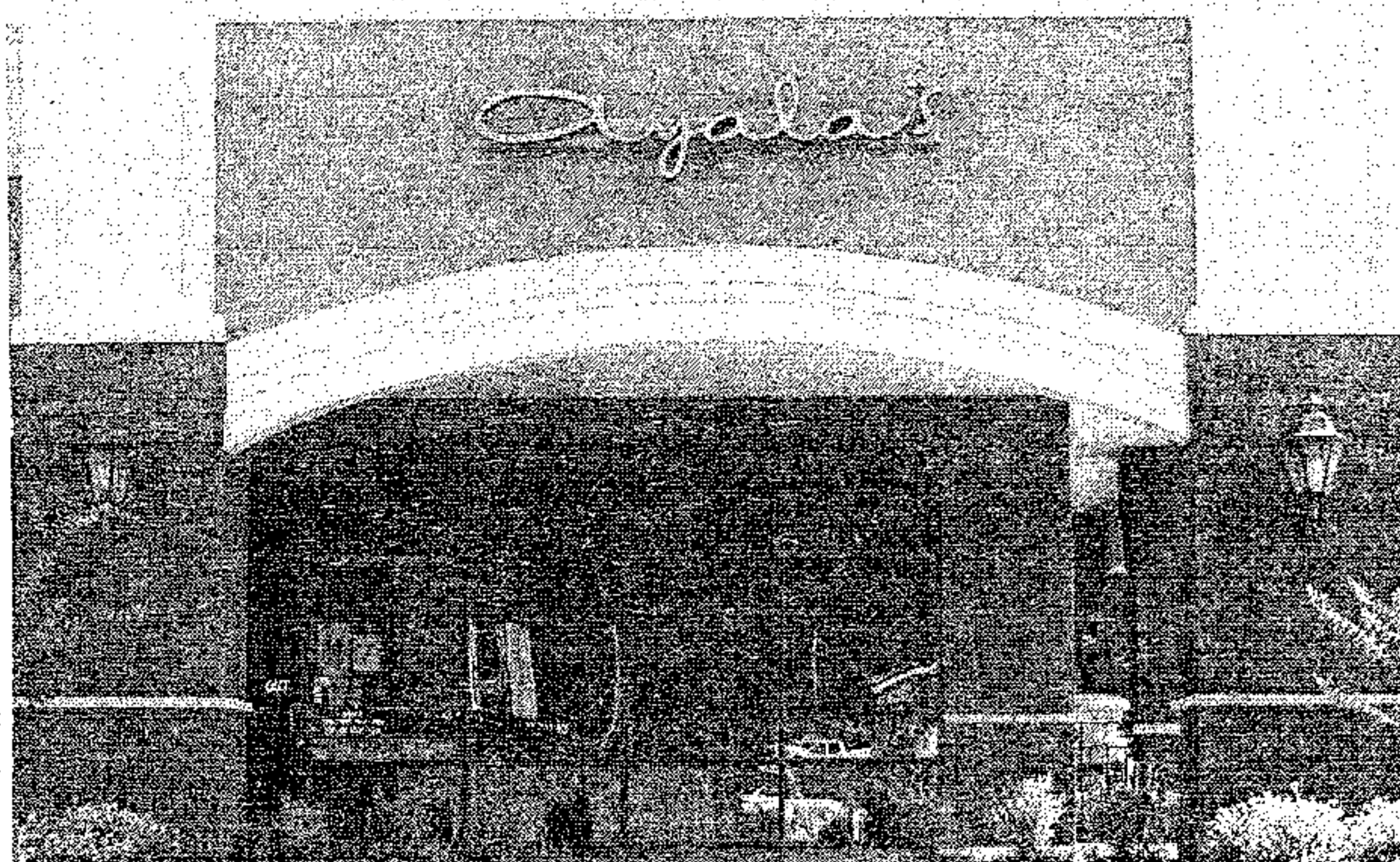
