

tified as Justin Webb. Mr. Webb had just left the Rite-Aid Pharmacy where he'd bought a pseudoephedrine based product. After receiving verbal consemt to search the vehicle, Agent DeBoer discovered a box of Aleve-D, a piece of burnt tinfoil with unknown residue on it, and two pills tentatively identified as 800 mg ibuprophen.

Mr. Webb stated he'd

purchased the box to trade to a known meth cook for \$50. Mr. Webb. dryer, having them dehad full knowledge of the intended use of the box of medication to manufacture meth. He was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

The total value of the appliances was \$899. Lenoir City and entered the arrest Thursday.





According to reports, Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF stopped a gold Ford Taurus at Food City in Loudon for an expired tag. The driver was identified as Jamey L. Coker and the officer had prior knowledge Coker's driver's license are suspended.

Mr. Coker also is a known felon with an extensive history of methamphetamine related charges.

Coker was observed purchasing a psuedoephedrine based product from the Rite-Aid Pharmacy. After he left the pharmacy, Coker went into Food City and stole a package of lithium Energizer batteries, which were

found in his shorts pocket.

Records indicate, a consentual search of the vehicle produced one yellow pill tentatively identified as vicoden. Also found in the vehicle was a container of brake fluid, which in combination with the pseudoephedrine and lithium batteries makes three components used in the manufacture of meth.

Mr. Coker was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

The officer reported he learned Coleman had just left Rite-Aid Pharmacy in Loudon after purchasing a pseudoephedrine based product and upon being asked,. Coleman advised he had several hypodermic needles in his pants pocket.

Records indicate the lawman retrieved the needles and during search of Coleman's vehicle two more needles were found in the console.

Agent DeBoer noted, "Mr. Coleman also revealed to me that he intended to sell the box of pseudoephedrine to a known meth cook in Madisonville for \$50."

Coleman and female reportedly both advised they'd purchased the box of medicine d other boxes in the past to provide to a meth cook with the understanding they would be used to manufacture methamphetamine.




