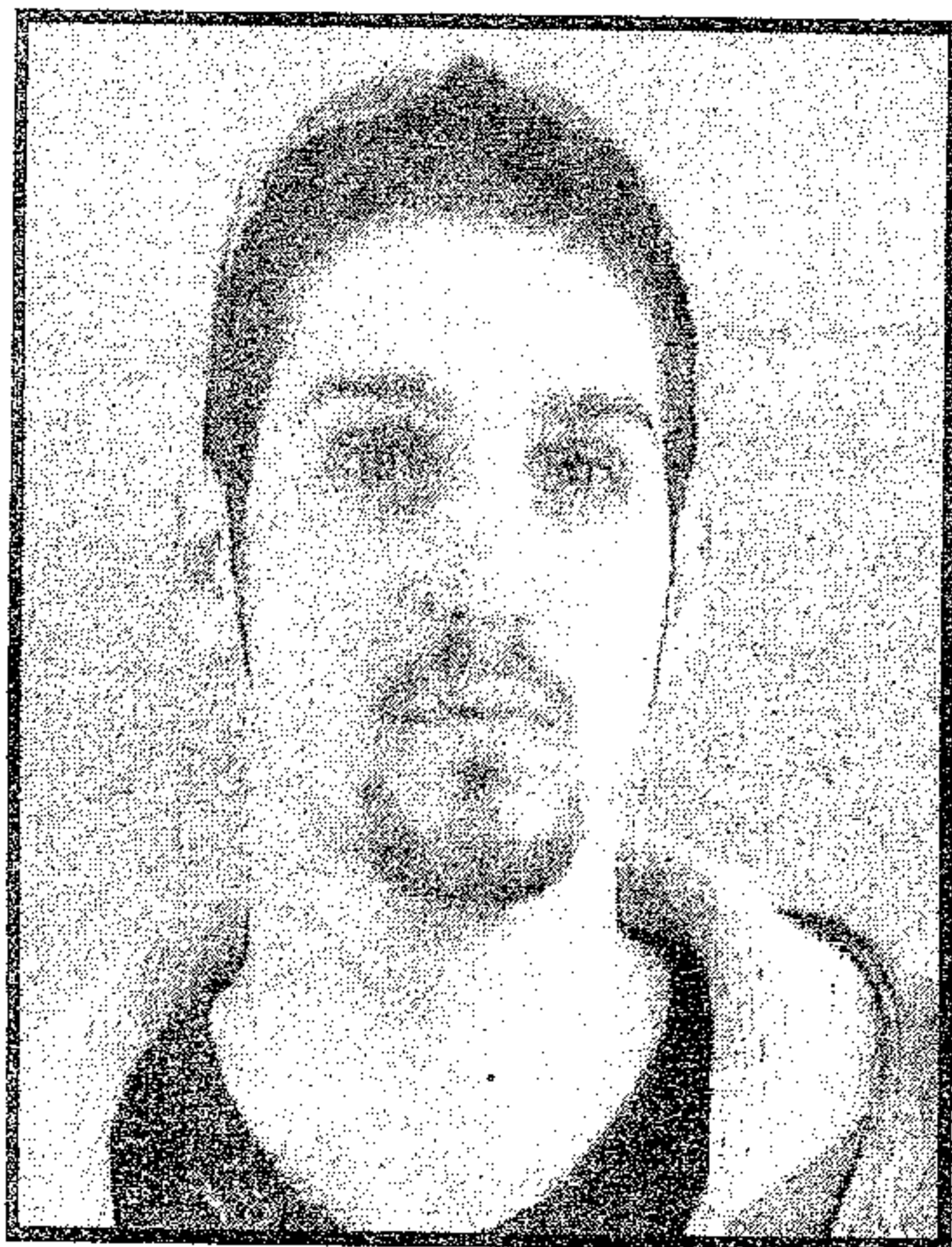


Village travel agent travels to jail for 3rd time on DUI

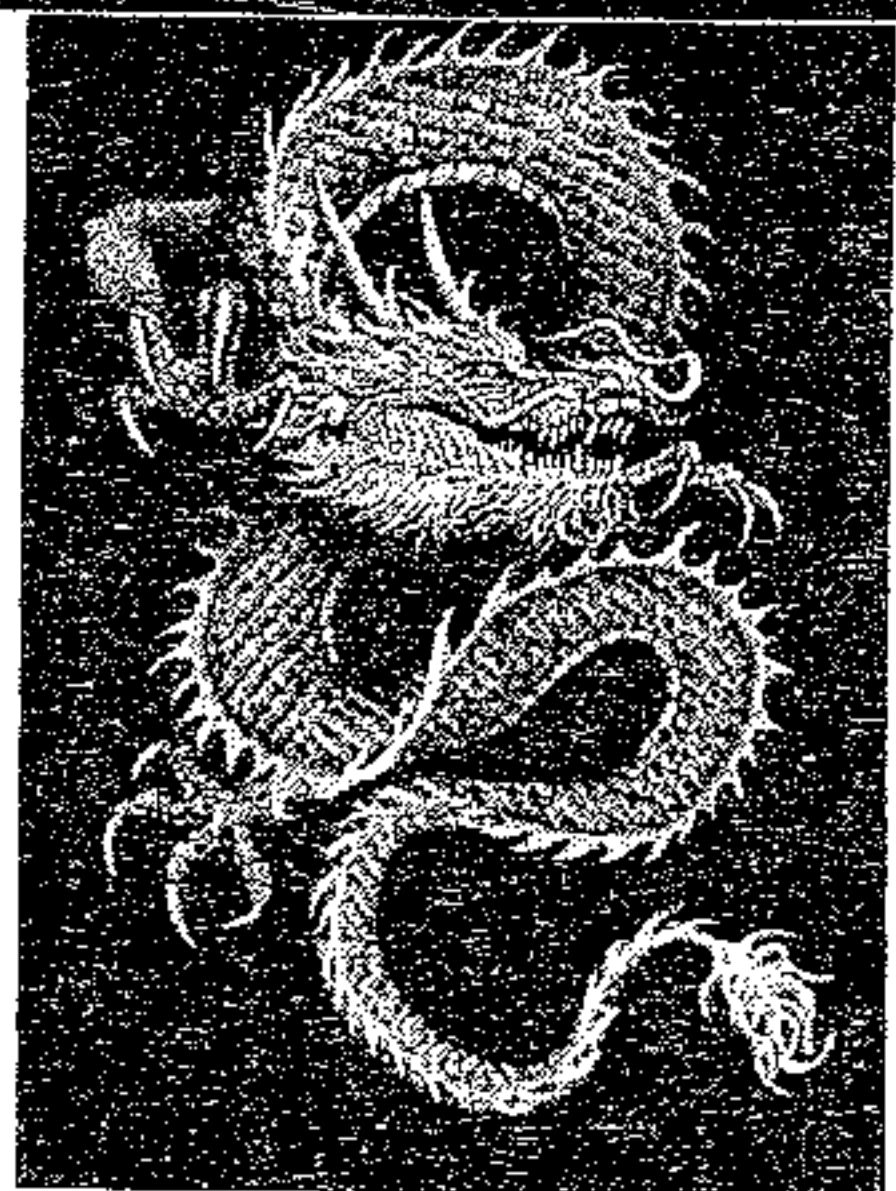

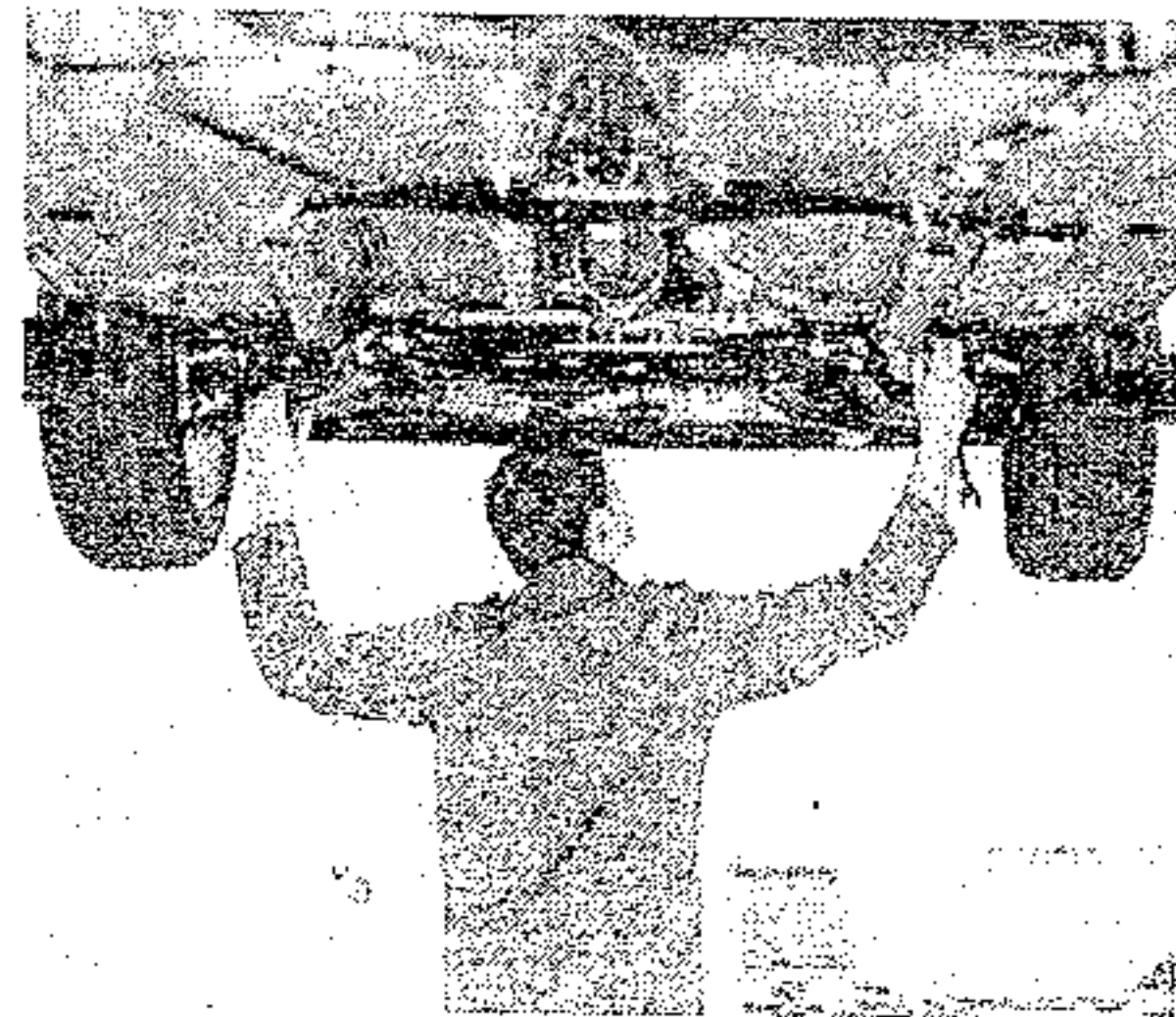

ing involved in multiple robberies of at least three banks in Tennessee.

The suspect is described as a white male with brown hair, a goatee and a mustache. He is approximately 6' to

6'2" tall and weighs between 220 and 240 pounds. He is possibly in his 30s and has been wearing a baseball cap during each of the robberies.
