Mr. Ordonez admitted to drinking three beers, was unable to perform field sobriety and was placed under arrest. A check of his license came back suspended for failure to pay a ticket. An inventory of the car produced two open beers under the front seat and two beers in the back floorboard.

The passenger in the Toyota, Mr. Marcial S. Avalos, had a strong odor of alcohol on his person, bloodshot eyes, was unsteady on his feet and admitted to drinking beer. He was deemed a danger to himself and others if left in public

and was taken into custody. An open beer was found under his seat. Once at the jail, the driver, Mr. Ordonez, agreed to a breathalyzer test, but failed to give a sufficient sample, three times, and was charged with violation of implied consent.

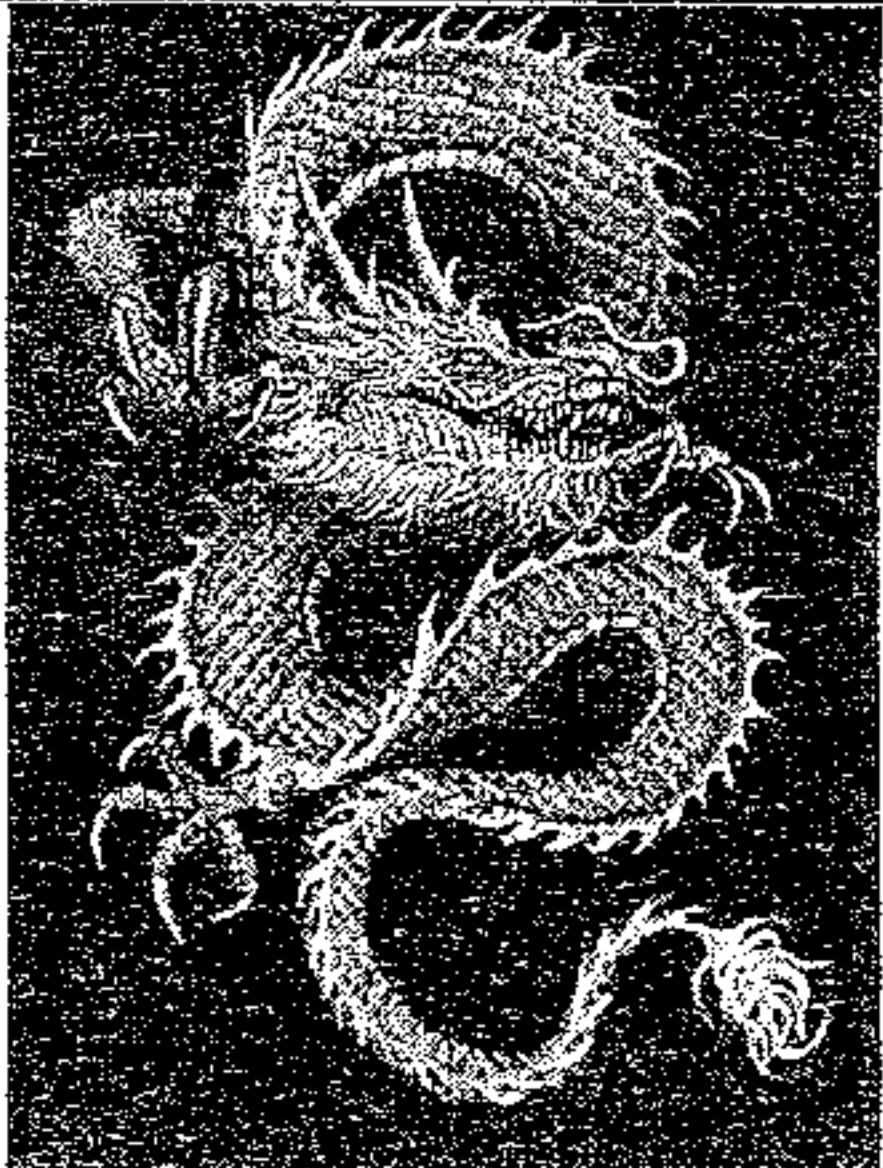
According to affidavits, filed by Mark Nix, Hotchkiss Valley Road, Loudon, on January 5th, 2011, around 3:10 pm, commissary was delivered to D Block at the Loudon County Jail. Mr. Nix stated he and Daniel Summers were trading food from the commissary. Nix and Summers spoke again that day, regarding commissary, then later, Mr. Summers stated he would "flail his head" if Nix didn't pay him back. Mr. Nix approached Mr. Summers about his comment and Mr. Summers came out of the cell and began punching Mr. Nix. When the fight began between the two, Jeremy Palmer, another inmate, in D Block, came up behind Mr. Nix and struck him in the head with a closed fist three to four times. Corporal Michael Wilson, LCSO, served the warrants and made the arrests Thursday.
