jumped out separate bathroom windows when she came into the house. Approximately 10 minutes after the dispatched call Deputy Michael Watkins found two white males walk-

ing within close proximity to the residence in question. The two males appeared out of breath and had fresh cut grass on their legs.

Deputy Watkins identified the two males as Addison So-

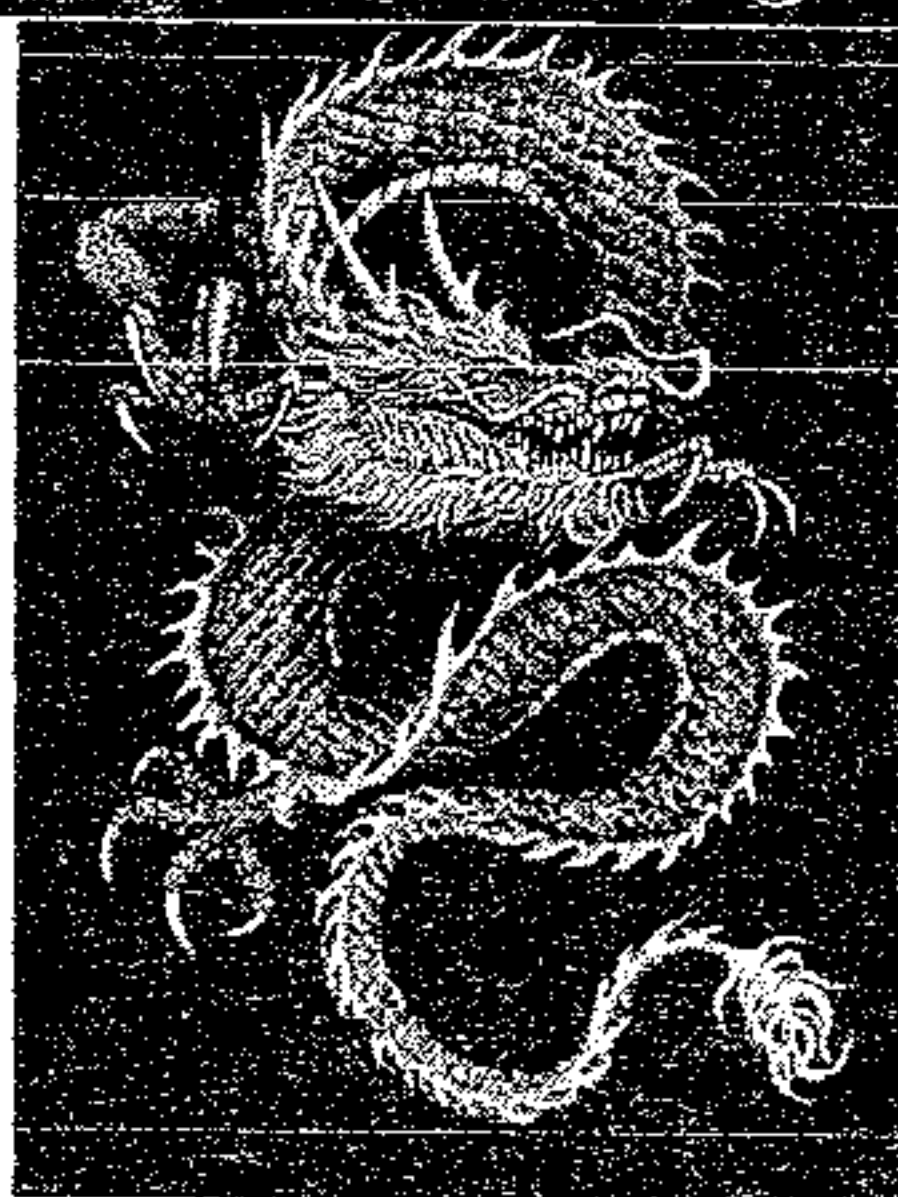

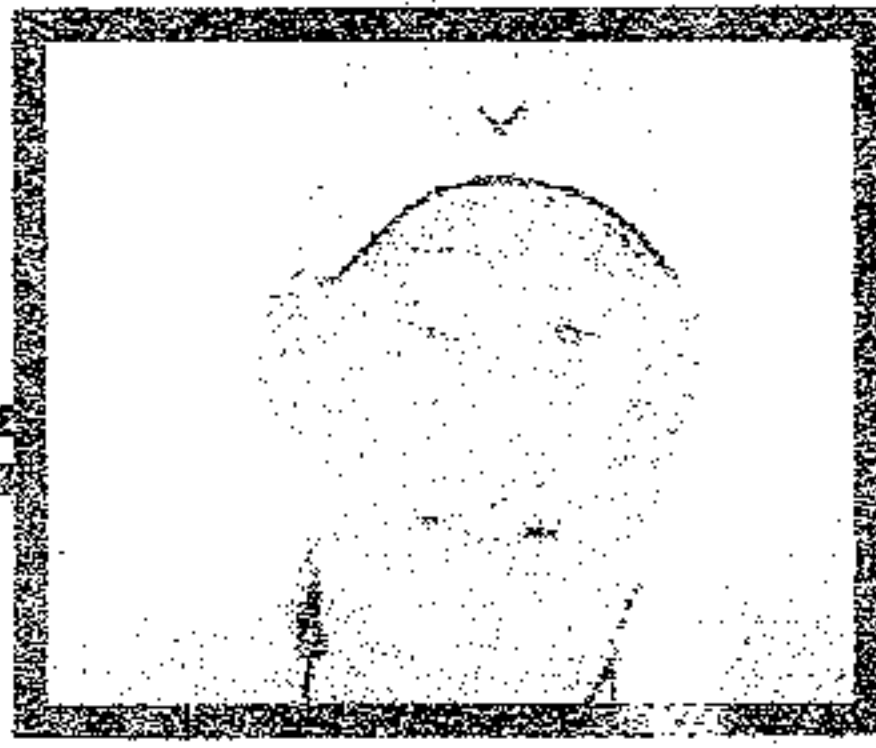
