Sex offender nabbed after violation

Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO was dispatched to Caldwell Road in Loudon in reference to a home visit made by the Tennessee Board of Parole on a sexual offender that lives at the residence. Upon arrival the deputy spoke with Officer Joey Walker of the parole board. The officer advised he arrived at the home to interview Ronald Alan Webb and to check the residence for minor children.

TALKING POINTS

- ACCOUNTABILITY:** I believe we need an appointed Ethics or Oversight Committee that would consist of at least ten city residents who are not related to (or business affiliates of) the Mayor or any member of City Council. (Presently, the City Attorney oversees ethics in our City government. The City Attorney is hired by the City Council.)

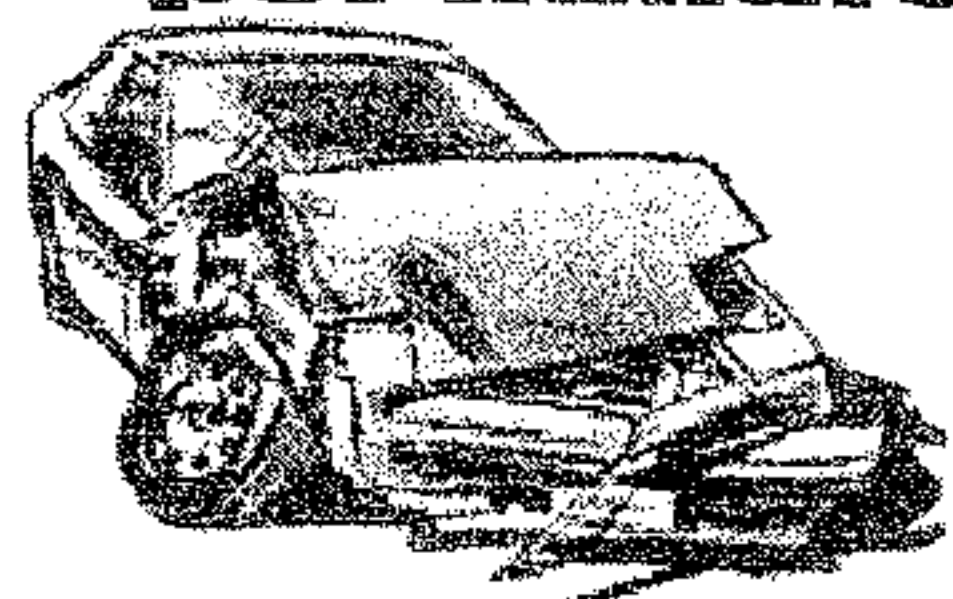

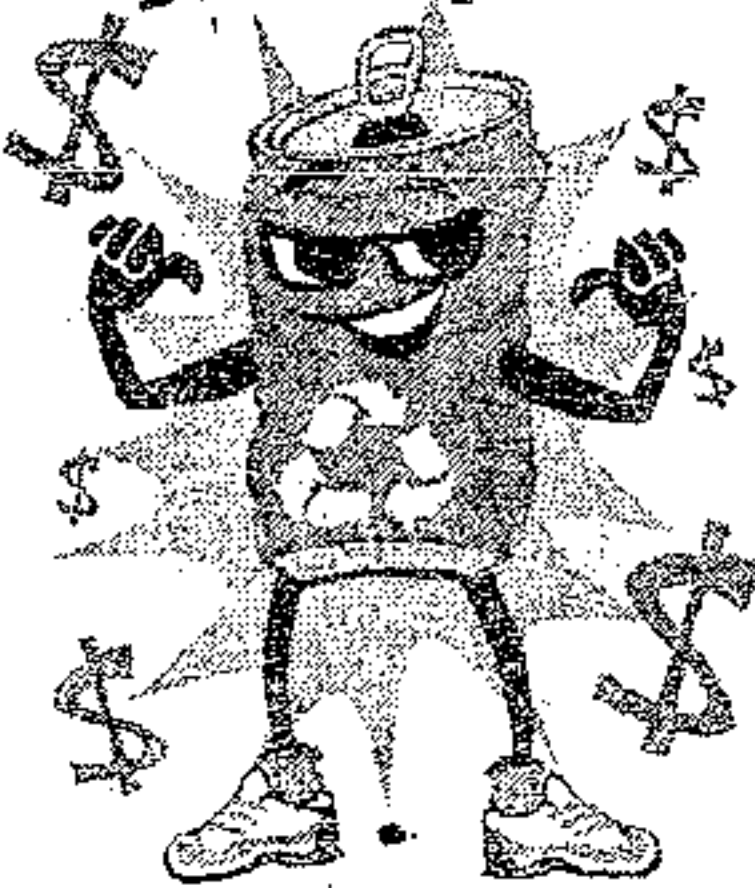
